Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASS INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 0) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby increase the area of Crown lands comprised in Class 3 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1947.—No. 18.

THE Koo-wee-rup Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and six pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Koo-wee-rup Urban District.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand, at the office of the Trust.

The secretary of the Trust for the time being is hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover on behalf of the Trust the rates and charges imposed by this By-law.

HENLEY-ON-YARRA.

Notice to Boatmen and Others.

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that permission has been granted to the Melbourne Amateur Regatta Association, in connexion with the Annual Regatta, to row races on the Henley Course on the Upper Yarra on the 23rd November, 1946, and that motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day must observe the following Regulations, viz.:—

Boat races must not be obstructed, nor public safety or order endangered.

Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand, with shovel or scoop, and carry—

- (a) a bucket with rope attached; and
- (b) an approved chemical fire extinguisher,

for fire extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit shall be exposed.

All non-competing boats must be kept off the course during the racing programme.

No boats (except racing boats) will be allowed to land or take up passengers at the boat stagings (south bank), or from the bank along the Henley Reserve except at the landing stage.

Passengers on any boat overcrowded or incompetently managed may be ordered to disembark.

No boat deemed by the River Officer or his Deputy to be too large or deemed to be offensive, dangerous, unsuitable, or unsightly shall remain on the river along the course or adjacent waters.

The direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly attended to.

All boats (except racing boats) must move up stream along the right hand (south) bank, and must move down stream along the opposite (north) bank.

No advertisement or objectionable device will be permitted to be shown on any boat.

No fireworks or firearms will be allowed to be discharged from any boat, except where permission of the River Officer or his Deputy has been given.

All motor boats shall hold a permit from the River Officer to enter or remain on that part of the River Yarra between Prince's-bridge and the Punt-road bridge, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

No motor or other boats will be allowed to ply for hire between Prince's-bridge and Punt-road bridge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day except under special permit from the Board.

All motor boats shall be moored in the positions allotted to them by 12.30 p.m., and shall remain moored until the finish of the racing programme.

All motor boats on south bank must moor bow up stream, and all motor boats on north bank must moor bow down stream.

An applicant for permit must apply at the office of the River Officer, 110 Spencer-street, Melbourne, and furnish the name and dimensions of the boat for which a permit is required; also the name and address of the owner, and of the person taking charge of the boat on Henley Day. If the boat is unnamed, some identification number must be affixed to each bow of the boat.

No permit shall be given to a motor boat exceeding a length of 35 feet from stem to stern, or with a beam exceeding 9 feet over all, unless the River Officer shall see fit to do so. It is recommended that row boats be in attendance on large motor boats for transporting passengers, also that a gangway be provided for each motor boat to enable passengers to reach the bank.

No permit shall be given for boats burning other than liquid fuel.

A permit shall not be transferable by the holder or in respect of motor boats.

A limited number of moorings will be available along the Henley Reserve, and early application to the River Officer for same is invited. An applicant must give name and dimensions of boat, and must provide his own mooring ropes. Pegs will be supplied.

Acceptance of a permit shall be a guarantee that its holder and the boat it is issued for will observe the regulations, whether general or special.

Motor boats not moored along the Henley Reserve must use the mooring pegs provided on the north or south side of the river, and must moor at post bearing same number as shown on permit.

Mooring or holding on to the booms or buoys will be strictly forbidden.

After sunset on Henley Day motor boats shall exhibit a red light and go slow in the centre of the river only. Motor boats shall not tow any boat.

On Henley Day the length of oars used by any boat, other than racing boats, between Punt-road bridge and Prince's-bridge, shall not exceed 8 feet.

The use of paddles as a means of propulsion for rowing boats is preferred.

Boats over 25 feet in length or boats with jibbooms or other objectionable projections, will not be permitted on the Yarra between Prince's-bridge and Punt-road bridge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

Rowing boats and canoes shall exhibit a white light after sunset on Henley Day.

All boats must give way to racing boats going up stream to the start of the course.

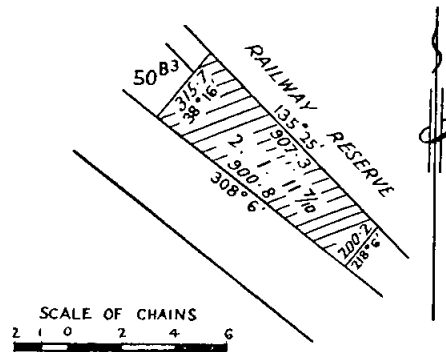

SHIRE OF MOUNT ROUSE WATERWORKS TRUST
CONSTITUTED.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby approve of the application of the Councillors of the Shire of Mount Rouse for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust and for a loan subject to the provisions of the said Acts to carry out works for the supply of water to the Town of Penshurst and the Township of Glen Thompson, and doth order and appoint as follows:—

1. The construction of the said waterworks.
2. That the councillors for the Municipal District of the Shire of Mount Rouse for the time being, and two other persons, shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust.
3. That the amount of the loan to be granted to such Trust shall be Sixteen thousand pounds (£16,000).
4. That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

PORTION 1.

Penshurst Reticulation Area.

Second Year—

Accounting Part II.
Auditing Part II.
Commercial Law Part II.
Bankruptcy, Receivers, and Liquidation of Companies.

Third Year—

Accounting Part III.
Banking and Foreign Exchange.
Company Law (excluding Liquidation).
Income Tax Law and Practice.

5. Candidates may proceed to subjects in the second or third year before completing the previous year or years, provided that they may not take a higher part of any subject unless they have already passed in the lower part or parts.

6. A Board of Examiners which may make recommendations concerning courses of study, examination standards, and all matters relating to the award of the certificate shall be appointed by the Director and shall consist of five members, two of whom shall represent accountancy institutes.

A By-law of the Shire of Cohuna, numbered 23, made under the powers conferred by section 80 (j), fixing for the purposes of section 72 (1) (a) the limits within which it shall be unlawful to keep swine.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1928*, and the *Local Government Act 1928*, and all other powers enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Cohuna order as follows:—

That the area described hereunder shall be and is hereby fixed as an area within which it shall be unlawful to keep swine or pigsties, that is to say:—The Township of Cohuna, being the area comprised within the boundaries herein set forth and described, viz.:—

SHIRE OF FERN TREE GULLY.

BY-LAW No. 57.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1928*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Rate-payers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. By-law No. 27 of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully is hereby expressly repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the following parts of the municipal district:—

North Riding.—The whole excepting that portion bounded by Burwood-road, Stud-road, Boronia-road, and Dandenong Creek.

Centre Riding.—The whole excepting that portion bounded by Burwood-road, Stud-road, Corhannwarrabul Creek, and Dandenong Creek.

South Riding.—The whole excepting that portion bounded by Wellington-road, the common boundary with Emerald Riding, the Old Emerald-road, the Cardinia Creek, the boundary with the Shire of Berwick, and the Dandenong Creek.

West Riding.—The whole.

Emerald Riding.—The whole, excepting that portion bounded by the Emerald-Macclesfield road, a Government road forming the boundary between Crown allotments 43B, 43A, 43E, 43D, and 57, Parish of Naigana, the Woori Yallock Creek, the Cockatoo Creek, and the main Emerald-Gembrook road.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context on subject-matter—

“Inspector” means any officer authorized by the Commission or Council, and includes any acting or assistant inspector.

“Proprietor” means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

“The Commission” means the Commission of Public Health.

5. The proprietor of any premises on which there is erected a pan-closet shall cause the space under the seat of such pan-closet on such premises to be prepared for the accommodation of a pan as prescribed herein, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause each pan-closet to be kept in a fit state for such service.

6. The proprietor shall cause every pan-closet to be supplied by the Council or otherwise with a pan for the reception of night-soil, and shall (except when being exchanged), cause such pan to be always kept in proper position under the seat of each pan-closet, and shall also provide a lid capable of being fitted tightly to such pan when being removed from the premises to the depot, so as to prevent the spilling of the contents and the emission of offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia from the contents of such pan.

7. Such pan shall be cylindrical in shape, and formed of galvanized iron of not less than 22 gauge, or other approved material, presenting on the inside and outside an impervious, hard, smooth, and durable surface, and those surfaces which come into contact with night-soil shall also be free from any projections. It shall be watertight, strongly constructed, reinforced with meal bands where necessary, and provided with properly-attached side-lifting handles. Each such pan shall have a capacity of 1½ cubic feet, and shall have an internal depth of 14 inches, a diameter of not less than 14 inches, and a suitable rim or lugs to permit an airtight lid to be affixed. The seams of the pan shall be folded, grooved, and sweated with solder.

8. The proprietor of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a supply of liquid deodorant or lime, saw-dust, or some other dry material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such pan-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectively deodorize the contents of such pan.

9. The proprietor shall provide every urinal with an approved apparatus for the regulated automatic discharge into such urinal of sufficient approved deodorant for the purpose of keeping such urinal constantly deodorized.

10. No person shall place, or cause or permit to be placed, any slops, water, or rubbish in any pan.

11. The proprietor of any premises whereon there is a pan-closet or urinal shall—

(a) maintain such pan-closet and urinal in good repair, and in a cleanly condition; and

(b) when required by an inspector effectually disinfect such pan-closet and urinal and/or the contents thereof, and effect any repairs thereto that such inspector may deem necessary.

12. At least once a week, and in any case as often as may be necessary to prevent the level of the contents of such pan approaching within 2½ inches of the brim thereof, the pan in use shall be closed with a lid and removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council with its contents from the premises and another pan thoroughly cleansed and in good order shall be left in its place.

13. Such contractor or person removing such pans shall report to the Council at the earliest available opportunity the discovery of any pan found to be over-flowing or leaking, and shall forthwith cause the place whereon the contents have been dropped or spilled to be properly cleansed.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for that purpose shall cause all pans to be removed in a suitable covered vehicle in such manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness, and forthwith cause such vehicle to be removed to the approved depot.

15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of night-soil shall cause such night-soil to be deposited at the depot and disposed of in such manner as may be authorized by the Regulations.

16. If such night-soil be disposed of in trenches such trenches shall be not less than 9 nor more than 18 inches in depth, nor exceed 2 feet in width, and the bottom thereof shall be broken up by suitable means to facilitate percolation of liquids, and the night-soil shall be deposited therein in layers not more than 6 inches deep, and shall be left at such depth that there shall be below ground level a covering of at least 6 inches in depth of clean, thoroughly broken-up soil upon the night-soil and pan washings when covered in.

17. No trench shall be used for the disposal of night-soil where the bottom consists of rock or other impermeable material.

18. Immediately after the deposit of the night-soil and washings in any trench, such trench shall be filled in with thoroughly disintegrated earth. The necessary filling shall be obtained by excavation of another trench in a position parallel to but not less than 12 inches from the aforesaid trench required to be filled in, and using the material so obtained as a covering over the night-soil so deposited. Trenches shall be excavated and used and filled in in consecutive order.

19. Seed of grass or any forage or cereal crops or other such form of vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve shall be seasonably planted or sown on any land into which night-soil has been deposited provided that vegetables or seeds of vegetables shall not be planted therein or thereon until six months have elapsed since the last deposit of night-soil in such land.

20. Every pan used for the reception or conveyance of night-soil shall immediately on being emptied be thoroughly washed or otherwise cleansed. The resultant washings or other filth shall be disposed of in a similar manner as the night-soil.

21. Every pan, after the disposal of its contents and after being cleansed in manner aforesaid, and before it again leaves the depot or disposal ground, shall on every such occasion be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected by—

(a) immediately after washing and scrubbing with water subjecting the pan to a current of steam from a boiler at 60 lb. pressure to the square inch for not less than 2 minutes in a steam-tight box or chamber; or

(b) thorough washing and scrubbing in water, then rinsing in clean water, and finally submerging for not less than five minutes in an aqueous solution containing not less than 1 per cent. of acsol, cyllin, kerol, izal, hycol, or other disinfectant of equal efficiency; or

(c) thorough washing and scrubbing in water, and afterwards submerging for not less than five minutes in boiling water; or

(d) any other method approved in writing from time to time by the Commission.

22. The internal surface of every pan before it is first used shall be properly coated with well-boiled tar, crude creosote or other approved material, and such coating shall thereafter be renewed when deemed necessary by the Council, but not less than once a month.

23. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of night-soil shall cause all vehicles used for the transport of pans to the depot to be properly constructed, kept clean, and disinfected daily at the depot, and maintained in a proper state of repair.

24. The proprietor or any other person within the area defined by this By-law shall not bury or cause to be buried any night-soil in any yard, or garden, or other place not being a place set apart for such purpose by the Council.

25. The inspector shall have full power to enter into or upon any premises, yards, or lands at any time for the purpose of inspecting closets, urinals, pans, receptacles, vehicles, plant, and all other things and places therein and thereon, and for the purposes of carrying out any provisions of this By-law.

27. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall, for every breach, be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence, to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

 (a) in any week in which two or more public holidays occur .. At the ordinary wages rate with an addition of fifty per centum.
 (b) in any other week At the ordinary wages rate, with an addition of thirty-three and one-third per centum.

For time worked beyond the 23 hours aforesaid, he shall be paid the ordinary wages rate up to but not exceeding the rate prescribed by this Determination for an ordinary week's work, together with any overtime rate which is applicable.

7. **ALLOWANCES.**
 (a) Where, in conformity with the custom of the trade, an employee wears, when at work, a washable outer garment, the laundering of which is not paid for by the employer, such employee shall be paid 2s. 6d. per week in addition to the ordinary rate.
 (b) Where an employer directs an employee to use his bicycle in the performance of his duties, such employee shall be paid an allowance of sixpence for each day or part thereof upon which he is so required to use such bicycle.

8. **TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.**
 Except in a case where an employee has been guilty of misconduct, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker. If such notice be not given, a week's wages shall be paid or forfeited, as the case may be, in lieu thereof.

9. **MEAL INTERVAL.**
 A meal interval of at least one hour shall be allowed between the hours of 12 noon and 2 p.m. daily.

10. **SPECIAL RATES.**
 Time and a half shall be the special rate payable for all work done on Show Day (in such localities mentioned in the Twelfth Schedule to the *Public Service Act 1928*, as are within the area to which this Determination applies), and double time the special rate payable for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day or Boxing Day; but, if any other day be substituted by Act of Parliament or Proclamation for any of the above-mentioned holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

11. **MEAL MONEY.**
 For each day upon which more than one hour's overtime is worked, each person who works such overtime shall be paid 2s. 6d. meal money in addition to the prescribed overtime rate.

12. **ANNUAL HOLIDAY.**
 The annual holiday shall be as prescribed by the provisions of the *Factories and Shops (Annual Holidays) Act 1946* and any amendments which may be made thereto from time to time.

13. **REFERENCES.**
 Every employee, on the termination of his engagement, shall be given by the employer, if the employee so desires, a certificate setting out the employee's length of service and qualifications.

14. **RENT OF RESIDENCE.**
 The employer shall not charge any manager or assistant who is required to reside on the premises in connexion with the shop in which the business of such employer is carried on, a greater sum as rent for such premises than 10s. 0d. per week.

15. **SICK PAY.**
 (a) Any employee not attending for duty shall lose his or her pay for the actual time lost unless such employee has had not less than twelve months' service with the same employer, and he or she produces or forwards within twenty-four hours of the commencement of such absence evidence satisfactory to the employer that his or her non-attendance was due to personal ill-health or accident necessitating such absence, but such employee shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the grounds of personal ill-health or accident for more than six days in each year.
 (b) If the full period of sick leave as prescribed above is not taken in any year such portion as is not taken shall be cumulative from year to year up to a period not exceeding 18 days, which shall be the maximum amount of leave to which an employee may be entitled in any year of service without deduction of pay.

16. **PAY DAY.**
 Payment of wages, including overtime, meal money, special rates, and allowances shall be made not later than Thursday of each week.

17. **TIME AND WAGES RECORD.**
 The employer shall keep a time and wages record showing the name of each worker, the number of hours worked each week, and the wages and overtime paid each week. Such record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited representative of the Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Federation of Australia or of the Grocers' Association of Victoria.

18. **PAYMENT OF FARES.**
 Where an employee is required by his employer to work at a shop or branch other than that at which he is ordinarily employed, he shall be paid the additional fares, if any, incurred by him in so doing. Provided that this clause shall not apply to any employee who is transferred to another store or branch for a period of not less than one week.

Factories and Shops Acts

DETERMINATION OF THE SALTWORKERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than persons subject to the determination of any Wages Board heretofore appointed) employed in the process, trade, business or occupation of—

(a) producing, gathering, extracting, manufacturing, treating or refining salt:

(b) extracting products (other than salt) from sea water or from natural brines and bitterns and treating such products"—

has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after the 4th October, [1946, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(b) Employees on shifts commencing in the afternoon or at night shall receive the wages provided in sub-clause (a) with the addition of 5 per cent. for afternoon shift workers and 7½ per cent. for night shift workers.

SPECIAL RATES.

3. In addition to the wages prescribed in clause 2 hereof, the following special rates and allowances shall be paid to employees, including apprentices, improvers, and juvenile workers:—

Confined Spaces.

(a) Working in confined space 3d. per hour extra.

Hot Places.

(b) Working for more than one hour in the shade in places where the temperature is raised by artificial means to between 115 and 130 degrees Fahrenheit, 1½d. per hour extra; in places where the temperature exceeds 130 degrees Fahrenheit, 3d. per hour extra. Where work continues for more than two hours in temperature exceeding 130 degrees Fahrenheit, employees shall also be entitled to twenty minutes' rest after every two hours' work without deduction of pay. The temperature shall be decided by the foreman of the work after consultation with the employees who claim the extra rate.

Employee within Call.

(c) When work is being performed under sub-clauses (a) and (b) hereof, another person shall always be within call.

Special Rates not-Cumulative.

(d) Where more than one of the disabilities entitling a workman to extra rates exist on the same job the employer shall be bound to pay only one rate, namely, the highest for the disabilities so prevailing.

TIMES OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK.

4. (a) When day shift only is worked—

The above-mentioned times of beginning and ending work may be varied on any job by mutual consent of the employer and a majority of the employees.

(b) Shift workers—

(i) *Where Two Shifts are Worked.*—An employer may require two shifts a day to be worked provided that the time of beginning the first shift shall be not earlier than 7 a.m. and that the time of ending the second shift shall be not later than 2 a.m. on the following morning, and also provided that the ordinary spread of hours of each shift shall not exceed eight hours forty-eight minutes.

(ii) *Where three shifts are worked—*

	Time of Beginning.	Time of Ending.

(iii) Provided that the times of beginning and ending shifts stated in this sub-clause may be varied by agreement between an employer and his employees.

HOURS FOR A WEEK'S WORK.

5. The hours for an ordinary week's work for all employees shall be 44 hours per week provided that the hours of shift workers may be fixed by agreement between an employer and an employee so that an average of 44 hours of ordinary working time may be worked in three consecutive weeks subject to 48 hours of ordinary working time being the maximum in any one week.

OVERTIME.

6. Except as provided in sub-clause (c) overtime shall be payable as follows:—

(a) Any employee who works in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed for a week's work shall be paid for such work at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours, and thereafter at the rate of double time.

(b) Any employee who works outside the hours fixed in clause 4 shall be paid for such work at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and thereafter at the rate of double time.

(c) The overtime rate for shift workers shall not apply to arrangements between employees themselves or in cases due to rotation of shifts or when the relief does not come on duty at the proper time. Provided that where not less than eight hours' notice has been given to the employer by the employee that he will be absent from work, and the employee whom he should relieve is not relieved, such unrelieved employee shall be paid time and a half for all time of duty after he has finished his ordinary shift.

EMPLOYEE REPORTING FOR WORK AND NOT-ALLOWED TO START.

7. An employee who reports for work and is not allowed to start shall be paid for two hours' work. Provided that this clause shall not operate if a stoppage of work has taken place through some cause over which the employer has no control.

EMPLOYEE WORKING IN WET PLACES.

8. (a) Any employee who is required to work in water, slurry or mud exceeding two inches in depth shall be provided with gum boots or shall receive an allowance of 1s. per day for each day he is so required to work.

(b) Unless oilskins and gum boots are provided for men required to work in rain double time shall be paid for work done in such rain. Provided that this sub-clause shall not apply to salt loaders from stacks.

HOLIDAYS.

9. (a) Weekly employees shall be entitled to the following holidays without deduction of pay:—The days observed as New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

(b) When an employee fails without reasonable cause, proof whereof shall be upon him, to attend for work on the working day immediately following or immediately prior to any of the holidays prescribed in sub-clause (a) hereof, he shall not be entitled to be paid for such holiday.

SPECIAL RATE FOR WORK DONE ON SUNDAYS AND HOLIDAYS.

10. Double time shall be payable for all work done on Sundays or on any of the days mentioned in clause 9 (a) except in the case of employees effecting repairs to or renewals of plant or machinery—which it is necessary to effect on Sundays or holidays to enable work to be safely resumed on Monday or the earliest working day—in which case payment shall be made at the rate of time and a half. This exception does not apply to the work of installing new machinery.

TERMS OF ENGAGEMENT.

11. (i) An employer shall have the option of engaging any employee either by the week or casually.

(ii) (a) If the engagement is by the week it shall be for a continuous period of at least eight weeks, and thereafter shall be terminated by a week's notice on either side, given at any time during the week, or by payment or forfeiture of a week's wages in lieu thereof, as the case may be: Provided that this clause shall not affect the employer's right to dismiss forthwith at any time an employee because of the latter's incompetence or misconduct, in which case the employee shall be entitled in respect of wages for the then current week's employment, only to payment proportionate to the aggregate of time worked by him, and of such other previous time (if any) in that week as to which under this Determination no deduction from his week's wages is allowable.

(b) An engagement shall be deemed to be and to continue casual unless the employer, at the commencement of the engagement or before any change by him of a casual engagement of the employee to one by the week, expressly notifies the employee that he is to be engaged by the week.

(c) A casual employee is one engaged and paid as such. A casual employee for working ordinary time shall be paid per hour one-fortieth of the weekly rate prescribed by this Determination for the work which he performs.

(d) The employer shall have the right to deduct payment for any day upon which the employee cannot be employed usefully because of any strike, or through any breakdown of machinery, or any stoppage of work, or any cause for which the employer cannot reasonably be held responsible.

ANNUAL HOLIDAYS.

12. The annual holidays for employees covered by this Determination shall be in accordance with the provisions, as may be amended from time to time, of the *Factories and Shops (Annual Holidays) Act 1946*—No. 5111.

SICK LEAVE.

13. (a) A weekly employee who is absent from work on account of personal illness, or on account of injury by accident arising out of and in the course of his employment, shall be entitled to leave of absence with pay, subject to the following conditions and limitations.

(i) He shall not be entitled to paid leave of absence unless he has been in the service of the employer concerned as a weekly employee for at least six months immediately prior to such absence;

(ii) He shall not be entitled to paid leave of absence for any period in respect of which he is entitled to Workers' Compensation;

(iii) He shall, within 24 hours of the commencement of such absence inform the employer of his inability to attend for duty and, as far as practicable, state the nature of the illness or injury and the estimated duration of the absence;

(iv) He shall produce to the employer a medical certificate or other reasonable evidence justifying the absence;

(v) He shall not be entitled in any year of service to paid leave of absence in excess of forty-four hours of working time.

For the purposes of this sub-clause a year of service shall be deemed to commence from the date of engagement.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-clause (a) hereof, if the full period of sick leave as proscribed above is not taken in any year, such portion as is not taken shall be cumulative from year to year up to a period not exceeding 88 hours of working time, which shall be the maximum amount of leave to which an employee may be entitled in any year of service without deduction of pay. For the purposes of this sub-clause service prior to the 4th October, 1946, shall be disregarded.

MIXED DUTIES.

14. An employee who is required to do work for which a higher rate is fixed than that provided for his ordinary duties shall if such work exceeds a total of two hours on any day be entitled to be paid for all work done on such day at the higher rate.

TOOLS.

15. The employer shall provide an employee with all tools necessary for the work to be done.

PAYMENT OF WAGES.

16. Wages shall be paid weekly during an employee's ordinary working hours, and such payment shall be made on Tuesday, except at Laverton when it shall be not later than Wednesday.

CRIB TIME.

17. An employee on shift work shall be allowed a crib time during each shift. For the purpose of administering this clause crib time shall be deemed to mean time taken for a meal at suitable opportunities in a shift so as not to interfere with an employee's duties.

MEAL ALLOWANCE.

18. An employee required to work overtime for more than two hours without being notified the day before that he will be so required shall either be supplied with a meal by the employer or paid 2s. Provided that where the employee was notified the previous day of the intention to work overtime and such overtime was not worked, he shall be entitled to the meal allowance herein provided.

RIGHT OF ENTRY OF UNION OFFICIAL.

19. Provided he reports to the works manager before so doing a duly accredited representative of the Australian Workers Union not more often than once a fortnight shall have the right to enter during the midday meal hour the portion of any employer's establishment in which any of the classes of labour covered by this Determination are employed for the purpose of interviewing employees on legitimate union business.

If any representative is unduly interfering or is creating disaffection amongst the employees or is offensive in his methods the employer may refuse the right of entry.

SHELTERS.

20. Suitable shelters shall be provided for all employees within reasonable distances from places of work.

EMPLOYEE RECALLED TO WORK.

21. Any employee who having ceased work for the day is recalled to work shall be paid for a minimum of two hours' work at the rate of time and a half.

FIRST AID KIT.

22. A first aid kit shall be provided and kept in good order on all works.

PROVISION OF DRINKING FACILITIES.

23. Water bags and good drinking water shall be provided on all jobs.

TRAVELLING ALLOWANCE.

24. When an employee is required by the employer to work away from his usual place of employment and cannot return nightly to his usual place of residence he shall be provided with free board and lodging or paid an additional amount at the rate of 35s. per week and all fares necessarily incurred in travelling to the temporary place of employment and on returning to his usual place of residence at the termination of the work.

Time occupied in travelling to and from the temporary place of work shall be paid for at ordinary rates of pay.

PIECEWORK.

25. The Board determines under the provisions of Section 150 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* that any employer may fix and pay piecework prices to any person employed at any work for which the Board has fixed a minimum wage, provided that any such employer shall base such piecework prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piecework prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rates that are fixed by the Board for such work.

PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.

26. The wages rates set out in clause 2 are based upon the following basic wage and pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of section 21 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, the Board hereby determines that such rates shall be automatically increased or decreased by the same amount, and at the same time as such basic wage. Provided that the wages of apprentices, improvers, juvenile workers, and adult female employees shall be adjusted proportionately to adjustments of the basic wage, such adjustments to be to the nearest 6d., half or less than half of 6d. to be disregarded.

The basic wage shown hereunder shall be adjusted as prescribed in clause 27.

ADJUSTMENT OF BASIC WAGE.

27. (a) Until the beginning of the first pay period to commence in November, 1946, the amount of the basic wage shall be as prescribed in clause 26.

(b) During each future successive period beginning with the first pay period to commence in a November, a February, a May, or an August, the amount of the basic wage shall be adjusted by the following method according to the position and fluctuations (if any) of the Commonwealth Statistician's "All Items" retail price index numbers.

For the purposes of this Determination the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's retail price index numbers" or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such index numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting, to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer, or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician:—

- (1) The index number set to be applied to a place is that assigned to Melbourne.
- (2) The index number for the calendar quarter next preceding the period of or near a quarter for which the adjustment is made is to be ascertained.
- (3) The amount assigned in the following table (or in any extension thereof) to the index number division comprising that number is to be ascertained.
- (4) The basic wage shall be of that assigned amount during such successive period plus the additional constant loading as proscribed in clause 26.
