Land Act, 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS by virtue of the powers conferred by the *Town and Country Planning Act 1944* and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Act has been commenced by the Council of the Shire of Narracan (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority"), which hereby makes the following Interim Development Order:—

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

FREE PLACES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MELBOURNE.

APPLICATIONS are invited from officers (other than teachers) in the employment of the Government of Victoria for nominations during 1947 for free places in a course for a degree, diploma, or licence at the University of Melbourne.

The nominations will be made by the Minister of Public Instruction, on the recommendation of a Board consisting of the Chairman of the Public Service Board, as chairman, the Chief Inspector of Secondary Schools, and the Permanent Heads of three Departments other than the Education Department. The recommendations of the Board will be based on the age, suitability, qualifications, and period of service of the applicants, on the reports and recommendations of their Department Heads, and, if considered necessary, on the result of a personal interview. Applicants must be qualified for admission to the course upon which they desire to enter, and should have been in the employment of the Government of Victoria for at least one year, and, except in special cases, such as applicants who are returned soldiers or who have already completed part of their course, should be not more than 25 years of age.

Each officer nominated for one of these free places will be admitted without fee to all lectures and examinations in the subjects of his course, and will be granted the necessary leave of absence to enable them to attend essential lectures, practical and other work, and examinations. He will not, however, be granted any allowance for books, materials, or other expenses involved in attending the University. He will be required to enter into an agreement with the Minister of Public Instruction and an approved surety that he will observe the conditions of tenure of his free place, that he will not relinquish the course of studies to which he has been admitted without the permission in writing of the Minister, that he will not discontinue service with the Government of Victoria for any cause within his control during the period of the said course, and that, if required, he will remain and continue in the employment of the said Government during the period of three years after the termination of his free place, and, if his free place extends over more than three years, during an additional year for each year by which the term of his free place exceeds three years. The amount of liability under the terms of this agreement will not exceed £250.

The continuance of the free place will be dependent upon satisfactory reports by the Professorial Board as to the officer's attendance, conduct, progress at the University, and by the Departmental Head as to the manner in which he performs his official duties.

Forms of application are obtainable at this office. Each application must be made on the prescribed form, and must be forwarded through the Permanent Head of the Department in which the applicant is employed, to reach the Secretary, Education Department, Melbourne, not later than 2nd December, 1946.

1. For buildings constructed of materials other than timber, iron, or fibro-cement, and for all concrete construction work whatsoever, including work carried out by the shire council, Five shillings (5s.) per £100 of the contract price or estimated cost of labour and material of all brick, stone, concrete, and plastering work to be done.
2. For timber, iron, and fibro-cement buildings, 2s. 6d. per 1,000 for all bricks used in the construction of chimneys, foundations, &c.

Builders and others desiring to use water from the Trust's mains shall lodge at the office of the Trust a written application for permission to do so, stating the site of the proposed building or structure, the owner's name, the type of construction, and the contract price, the estimated cost, or the number of bricks to be used, and shall, at the same time, pay the prescribed charge. In no case shall water be available before payment of the charge.

SHIRE OF EUROA.

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS by virtue of the powers conferred by the *Town and Country Planning Act 1944*, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Act has been commenced by the Council of the Shire of Euroa (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority") which hereby makes the following Interim Development Order:—

Any owner of any land who, after the service of a copy of this Order contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road, or other works, and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works, and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section (3) of the Act.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme, in accordance with the *Town and Country Planning Act 1944*, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

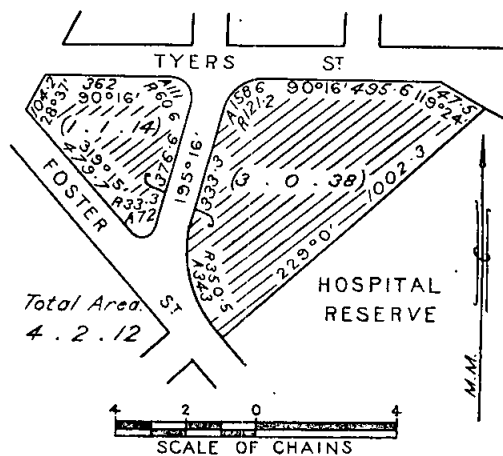

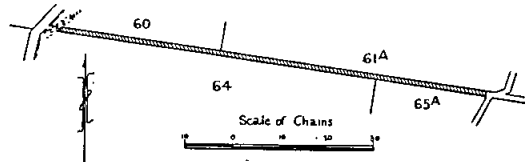

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION AND SHOW GROUNDS IN THE PARISH OF TARRAWARRA, AND KNOWN AS THE "YARRA GLEN RECREATION AND SHOW GROUNDS RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the reserved lands situated in the Parish of Tarrawarra, as are indicated in red colour on plan marked T/12.4.46 with Lands Department correspondence Rs.934, and known as the "Yarra Glen Recreation and Show Grounds Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 26 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, agricultural shows, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a charge not exceeding Two shillings may be made for the admission of each adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except in the fire-places provided for the purpose.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills, thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained, in writing.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve except in the part or parts thereof which are set apart for such purposes by the Committee, and then only on the payment of such fee and subject to such conditions as are determined by such Committee.

8. No person shall erect therein any building, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

12. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

13. No person shall bring into the Reserve or use or carry therein any firearm or offensive weapon.

14. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, litter, or rubbish in the Reserve except in the place provided for the purpose and indicated by notice board.

15. Any person committing on any part of the Reserve, or in any of the rooms, buildings, structures, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon any of the following offences, shall be guilty of breach of these Regulations:—

- (a) Assaulting or threatening any person or persons.
- (b) Being under the influence of liquor.
- (c) Entering, crossing, being on, or trespassing on any playing ground area, enclosure or course, or building, room or structure, or any part thereof whilst any sport, game, competition, race, entertainment or amusement is being played, conducted or carried on, or at any time between the commencement and conclusion of such event without the consent of the Committee.
- (d) Using profane, indecent, obscene, or unseemly language.
- (e) Using threatening, abusive, offensive, or insulting words.
- (f) Behaving improperly, offensively, or riotously.
- (g) Interfering with, or interrupting any game, sports, competition, entertainment or amusement or practice thereat.
- (h) Obtaining or attempting to obtain admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to admission under these Regulations.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC GARDENS IN THE TOWN OF TATURA.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purposes whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred, doth hereby make the following Regulation in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of 21st October, 1889, and 15th January, 1894, as a site for Public Gardens in the Town of Tatura, in lieu of Regulation 12, approved by the Board on 28th day of March, 1928, which is hereby rescinded.

REGULATION.

No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve, at any time, without the previous consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR THE RECREATION, CONVENIENCE, AND AMUSEMENT OF THE PEOPLE IN THE CITY OF SOUTH MELBOURNE.

(d) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

(e) Regulating the removal and regulating and restraining the re-erection within the municipal district of wooden buildings.

(f) Prescribing the minimum area and the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling-house or any shop, or any dwelling-house and shop combined, may hereafter be erected.

(g) Prescribing the distance of buildings from boundaries or from other buildings.

(h) Providing with respect to buildings hereafter erected for:—

- (1) Regulating or limiting the height of buildings.
- (2) The prevention of fires in buildings.
- (3) The ventilation and lighting of buildings.
- (4) The minimum area to be covered by any dwelling-house, or any dwelling-house and shop combined.

(i) Requiring any work or thing to be executed or done of such materials, within such time, or in such manner as may be directed or approved in any particular case by the Council, or any officer or person authorized in that behalf by the Council.

(j) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings erected, adapted for use, or used contrary to this By-law, and authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings erected, adapted for use, or used contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law; and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

(k) Regulating or prohibiting the writing, painting, printing, stencilling, placing, or affixing of any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement upon any footpath, street, or road, or upon any building, fence, or other property vested in the municipality or under the control or management of the Council thereof.

(l) Regulating, restricting, or preventing the exhibition of advertisements in such places and in such manner or by such means as to affect injuriously the amenities of a public park or pleasure promenade, or to disfigure the natural beauty of a landscape.

(m) Regulating and controlling all advertisements attached or fixed to, or painted on any boardings, or on any building, or on any fence, rock, cliff, or tree.

(n) Prohibiting or regulating the use of private property situate at the junction of streets or roads for the growing of trees, shrubs, or hedges abutting on any such street or road or within 10 feet therefrom.

(o) Requiring the removal or lopping of trees, shrubs or hedges (whether planted before or after the 16th October, 1934), from or on private property so situated where such trees, shrubs, or hedges abut on or within 10 feet of such street or road.

(p) Requiring the reduction to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. of any portion of a fence within 10 feet of the junction of any streets or roads.

(q) Authorizing the Council at the expense of the owner (the amount of which expense may be recovered by the Council in a Court of Petty Sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily)—

(1) To remove or lop trees, shrubs, or hedges growing or being on private property so situate which are not removed or lopped as required by or under this By-law.

(2) To reduce in height any portion of a fence which is not reduced in height as required by or under this By-law.

(r) Determining, applying, dispensing with, or regulating such matters or things as are left to be determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council under the Uniform Building Regulations of Victoria.

(s) Appointing fees for any inspection or service made or performed by any Inspector in connexion with scaffolding.

(t) Leaving any matter or thing to be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council by resolution, or by any officer authorized in that behalf by the Council, either generally or for any class of cases, or in any particular case.

(u) Repealing by-laws, regulations, and parts thereof, respectively, heretofore in force in the municipality inconsistent with or repugnant to this By-law.

The manner of construction shall be the usual manner of construction of the class or type of fence proposed to be used, and the plans and specifications thereof shall be submitted to the proper officer of the Council for his approval in accordance with the building regulations of the Council, and when so approved the fence shall be erected in a workman-like manner.
