SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT FOREST RESERVE IN THE PARISH OF PIAMBIE.,

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf do by this my Proclamation direct that the part of Victoria within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be a locality in which from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the Game Act 1928.

That Award No. 8 as amended to date be further amended as set out hereunder :-

By inserting the following new clauses in Division S immediately following clause 6:--

"(1) Time on duty between midnight on Friday and midnight on Saturday shall be overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half.

(8) Time worked on a Saturday-

(a) shall be taken into account in the computation of overtime on a fortnightly basis, and
 (b) shall be subject to a maximum payment of double the ordinary rate."

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING REGULATIONS (No. 2)-"JOINT COMMITTEES."

- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Act 1944, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):-
- 1. These Regulations may be cited as "Town and Country Planning Title. Regulations (No. 2)—Joint Committees" and shall come into operation upon the publication thereof in the Government Gazette.
- 2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context, or Interpretation. subject-matter--
 - "Act" means the Town and Country Planning Act 1944.
 - "Board" means the Town and Country Planning Board constituted under the Act.
 - "Committee" means Joint Committee.
 - "Joint Committee" means the representatives of more than one municipality appointed as the Responsible Authority to prepare a joint Planning Scheme.
 - "Minister" means the Commissioner of Public Works.
 - "Municipality" and "Municipal District" respectively include the City of Melbourne and the City of Geelong.
 - "Responsible Authority" as regards the preparation and submis-sion for approval of any joint planning scheme means the committee preparing the scheme or in the case of a scheme prepared by the Board on the request or with the consent of the Minister the Board and as regards the enforcement and carrying out of any scheme means the council of the municipality whose municipal district or any portion thereof is included in the area of the scheme.
- 3. (a) If any Municipal Council desires to commence a planning Joint Conference. scheme and considers that areas in the municipal districts of one or more adjoining municipal councils should be included in a joint planning scheme or if any municipal council is required by the Minister together with any other municipal council or councils to prepare a joint scheme it may invite such other municipal council or councils to a conference.
- (b) A representative of the council convening the conference shall preside at all meetings of the conference until the appointment of the Joint Committee.
- (c) The conference may make recommendations to the councils concerned as to-
 - (i) the appointment of a Joint Committee to be the Responsible Authority to prepare a joint planning scheme as set out in section 9 (2) of the Act;
 - (ii) the number of representatives on such committee from each council; and
 - (iii) generally any matters incidental to the appointment of a Joint Committee.
- 4. The Council of each municipality shall within three months of Action by the receipt of the recommendations notify the chairman of the conference of its concurrence with the recommendations in whole or in part or of its objection.

- 5. Upon agreement between the councils to appoint a Joint Committee each of the councils concerned shall appoint its representatives on such committee which shall be the Responsible Authority for the preparation of the joint scheme.
- 6. In the event of the councils failing to reach agreement upon the appointment of a Joint Committee the chairman of the conference shall so inform the Minister and shall forward to him a report of the negotiations.

General Provisions

- 7. (a) Subject to this regulation, every committee may regulate its own proceedings.
- (b) Every committee may meet from time to time and may adjourn from place to place as the committee thinks fit.
- (c) The committee at its first meeting and thereafter as often as a vacancy occurs in the office of chairman shall elect one of its members to be-chairman of the committee.
- (d) The person so elected chairman unless he ceases to be a member of the committee shall hold office as chairman for a period of twelve months and shall be eligible for re-election.
- (e) At all meetings of the committee all the members present shall vote and the questions there considered shall be decided by open voting and by the majority present.
- (f) If there is an equal division of votes upon any question the chairman at such meeting shall in addition to his own vote as a member have a second or easting vote.
- (g) No business shall be transacted at any meeting of the committee unless a majority of the members is present.
- (h) At all meetings of the committee if the chairman is not present one of the members present shall be appointed chairman.
- (i) The committee shall cause correct minutes of all meetings to be kept in a book to be kept for that purpose and such minutes shall be read and confirmed at the next meeting of the committee, and within seven days of the holding of any meeting of the committee a true copy of the minutes thereof shall be transmitted by the committee to the council of each municipality having a representative or representatives on such committee.
- (j) The chairman or any two members of a committee may at any time summon a meeting of the committee.
- (k) The council appointing any member of a committee may at any time remove any such member and may when the case so requires fill any vacancy (however arising) in its representation on a committee.

Authentication

8. All documents whatever purporting to be given or issued by or under the direction of any Joint Committee and purporting to be signed by the chairman and one other member thereof shall be received as evidence in all courts of law and shall be deemed to have been given or issued by or under the direction of the Joint Committee in question without further proof unless the contrary is shown.

Secretary and other officers.

9. A Joint Committee may with the approval of the respective councils of the municipalities represented on such committee appoint a secretary and other officers at such salaries and under such conditions as may be agreed upon between the committee and such councils.

Defraying expenses of Joint Committee.

10. The expenses of a Joint Committee shall be defrayed by the councils concerned or some or one of them as they may agree and if any question arises as to the council or councils by whom or the proportions in which such expenses are to be defrayed, that question shall be determined by the Minister.



Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE MINING ENGINE-DRIVERS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which, since 16th April, 1935, has had the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed in the occupation of—

- (a) a fireman, boiler attendant, boiler cleaner, or engine-driver in connexion with steam engines or steam boilers in or about mines or in or about plants for crushing metaliferous ores,
- (b) an engine-driver or attendant in connexion with the use of internal combustion engines, compressed air engines, or electrical engines in or about mines or in or about plants for crushing metallierous ores, has made the following Determination, namely:—
- 1. That as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after the 1st September, 1946, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

An engine-driver or fireman who is responsible for repair work on any portion of the plant other than the packing of glands and the replacing of gauge glasses for the mounting of boilers, will be deemed to be in charge of the plant as stipulated herein and the 6s, referred to shall apply to each engine-driver and/or fireman employed on each shift.

Greasers doing engine-drivers' work other than starting and stopping engines under the supervision of an engine-driver, shall be paid engine-drivers' rates.

Any person engaged inside the gas or water space of any boiler, flue, or economizer, in cleaning or scraping work shall be paid whilst so employed, in addition to his ordinary or overtime rate, 9d. per hour extra.

WEEKLY ENGAGEMENT.

- WEBLY ENAGEMENT.

 4. (a) Except as horeinafter provided all employment shall be by the week. Employees to become entitled to payment on a weekly basis shall perform such work as the management shall from time to time require on the days and during the hours usually worked by the class of employees effected. Employment shall be terminated only by a week's notice being given on either side, such notice to be given at any time during the week. This shall not affect the right of the management to dismiss any employee without notice for malingering, inefficiency, neglect of duty, or misconduct, and in such cases wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only, or to deduct payment for any day the employee cannot be usefully employed because of any strike or through any break-down of machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause for which the employer cannot reasonably be held responsible. Provided that where an employer orders employees not to work on rainy days because of the state of the weather, such order shall not deprive such employees of their claim for payment under the weekly engagement, but if such employees cease work on lainy days without being ordered to do so they shall not be entitled to payment for time so lost.

 (b) Any employee, compotent to do the work he is engaged to do, who is employed for less than six days from the date
- (b) Any employee, competent to do the work he is engaged to do, who is employed for less than six days from the date he starts work, and is refused work or dismissed without any fault of his own shall be entitled to be paid for each day so worked 10 per cent. more than one-forty-fourth of the weekly rate prescribed by this Determination for the work performed by him, multiplied by the number of hours actually worked.

OVERTIME.

- 5. (NOTE.—Nothing in this clause shall apply to persons working underground in a coal mine.) Time and a half shall be
 - (a) In excess of four hours on Saturday and eight hours on other days worked on six week's work is and eight hours on other days
 - (b) On Saturdays, and in excess of eight where an ordinary week's work is worked hours 48 minutes on other days on five week days (Monday to Friday).

The hourly rate on which the overtime additional rates shall be computed shall be one-forty-fourth of the weekly rate prescribed in clause 2 for the class of work done.

In reckoning the time of duty any time necessarily occupied in raising steam, in starting up or closing down orgines, or in banking fires, shall be included.

MEAL INTERVAL.

- 6. (a) Except on shift work, provision shall as far as practicable be made by the employer to enable an employee to have a midday meal interval of not less than 45 minutes nor more than one hour on all working days except Saturday. Such meal interval shall not be deemed to be time worked, and the time of ceasing work shall be extended by time equal to the duration of the meal interval.
- (b) Employees on shift work shall be given a meal interval of half-an-hour whilst "standing by "their engines. Such interval shall be included as part of the day's work, and if an employee is required for work during same he shall be paid for such work at the rate of time and a half.

SUNDAYS AND HOLIDAYS.

- 7. (a) For maintenance work necessarily done on a Sunday time and a half-shall be paid, but for all other work performed on a Sunday or holiday, double time shall be paid.
- (b) An employee shall be entitled to the following six holidays without deduction of pay, viz.:—New Year's Day, Good Friday or Easter Monday, (alternately at the option of the employer to be declared on or before the Monday before Good Friday), Labour Day, Anzac Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, or any day which by Act of Parliament or proclamation shall be substituted for any of the above-mentioned holidays, or any such other days not less than six as the employer may ubstitute for the employee with the consent of the Union through its nearest local representative.
- (c) In the event of an employee being called upon to work on any of the above holidays or substituted holidays, he shall be paid for each day so worked an additional sum of one-sixth of his ordinary weekly wage.

ANNUAL HOLIDAY.

8. The annual holiday shall be as prescribed by the provisions of the Factories and Shops (Annual Holidays) Act 1946, and any amendments which may be made thereto from time to time.

SICK PAY.

9. All employees necessarily absent on account of sickness, or through an accident whilst at work, shall be entitled to six days' leave on full pay in each year of service, provided satisfactory evidence of such illness or accident is produced to the management within 24 hours of his first absence from work.

Provided that the balance of sick leave not taken shall accumulate from year to year and shall be available to the employee for a period of two years, but no longer, from the end of the year in which it accrues.

Sick pay shall be payable on the first pay day after becoming due.

HANDLING OF FUEL.

10. Any Winding Engine-driver responsible for his own firing shall not be required to handle fuel stacked at a distance greater than 15 feet from the boiler furnace.

First-Aid Outfit.

11. In places where employees are regularly employed, the employer shall provide and continuously maintain at a place or places reasonably accessible to all employees a first-aid ambulance chest equipped and supplied with the following articles:—

DEFINITIONS.

12. (a) "Engine-driver" shall mean and include any person who operates or drives any engine or engines, the motive power of which is steam, and shall include the operator or driver of an internal combustion engine, a compressed air engine, or electrical engine.

(b) "Winding and haulage engine-driver" shall mean and include an engine-driver who takes charge of the principal winding plant or plants (other than a Holman or similar baby hoist) on or below the surface of a mine, whether the motor power is steam, air, water, gas, oil, or electricity.
(c) "Winch driver" shall mean and include an engine-driver (other than a winding or haulage engine-driver, as defined in sub-clause (b)) in charge of and working a geared winding engine.

PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.

13. The wages rates set out in clause 2 are based upon the following basic wage rates and, pursuant to the provisions of section 21 of the Factories and Shops Act 1934, shall be automatically increased or decreased by the same amount, and at the same time, as such basic wage rates, provided that the amount of wages for all junior employees shall be adjusted proportionately to the basic wage rate in the same place calculated to the nearest 6d., every change of amount not exceeding 3d, to be disregarded.

The basic wage rates shown hereunder shall be adjusted as prescribed in clause 14.

ADJUSTMENT OF BASIC WAGE.

14. (a) Until the beginning of the first pay period to commence in November, 1946, the amounts of the basic wage shall be as prescribed in clause 13.

(b) For each future period of or near a quarter beginning with the first pay period to commence in a November, a February. a May, or an August, the amounts of such basic wage shall be adjusted by the following method according to the position and fluctuations (if any) of the Commonwealth Statistician's "All Items" rotail price index numbers.

For the purposes of this Determination the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's retail price index numbers or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such index numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting, to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer, or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician.

(1) The index number set to be applied to a place is that assigned thereto in clause 13.

(2) The index number for the calendar quarter next preceding the period for which the adjustment is made is to be ascertained.

(3) The amount assigned in the following table (or in any extension thereof) to the index number division comprising that number is to be ascertained.

(4) The basic wage shall be of that assigned amount during such period of or near a quarter.

OVERTIME.

- 3. (a) Any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of 47 hours within the City area and 48 hours elsewhere shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.
- (b) Any employee who is required to work between 12.45 p.m. and 4 p.m on any Saturday shall be paid for such work at the rate of double time. TIME WAGES.
- 4. (a) (This clause shall not apply to an employee at a Railway Bookstall sub-let to a newsagent.) Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 23½ hours within the City area and 24 hours elsewhere be paid at the ordinary wage rate with an addition of 33½ per cent. and thereafter the ordinary wage rate up to but not exceeding ordinary wages rates for an ordinary week's work.
- (b) An employee at a Railway Bookstall sub-let to a newsagent who works less than 48 hours in any week shall only be entitled to be paid pro rata according to the number of hours worked.

5. (Nothing in this clause shall apply to any employee who is required to work on any day mentioned therein in connexion with the sale or distribution of newspapers.) Employees shall be entitled to the following holidays without deduction of pay:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Melbourne Cup Day (Metropolitan District only), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, and after 12.30 p.m. on Show Day in localities mentioned in the Twelfth Schedule to the Public Service Act 1928 within the area to which this Determination applies; but the part of the Public Service Act 1928 within the area to which this Determination applies; but the part of the above area of the above pared holidays this architical for the control of the above pared holidays. any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclemation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, this condition shall only apply for the day so substituted.

Any employee who is required to work on any day mentioned in this clause shall receive double time for such work.

MEAL MONEY.

6. Any employee who is required to work overtime in excess of one hour on any day shall receive an allowance of 2s. 6d. as meal money in addition to the rates provided in clause 3.

ANNUAL HOLIDAY.

- 7. The annual holiday shall be as prescribed by the provisions of the Factories and Shops (Annual Holidays) Act 1946 (No. 5111) and any amendments which may be made thereto from time to time.
- (In his or her own interests each employer of labour should obtain a copy of the above Act, which may be purchased from the Government Printer, Melbourne, at a cost of 9d., plus postage.)

SICK LEAVE.

- 8. (a) Any employee not attending for duty who has had not less than twelve months' service with the same employer shall not less his pay for the actual time lost if such employee produces or forwards within 24 hours of the commencement of such absence evidence satisfactory to the employer that his non-attendance was due to personal ill-health or accident necessitating such absence, but such employee shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the grounds of personal ill-health or accident for more than six days in each veer. each year.
- (b) If the full period of sick leave as prescribed above is not taken in any year such portion as is not taken shall be cumulative from year to year up to a period not exceeding 18 days, which shall be the maximum amount of leave to which an employee may be entitled in any year without deduction of pay. MEAL INTERVALS.
 - 9. Employees shall be entitled to meal intervals as follows:-
 - (a) Between the 7th December and the 24th December in each year—three-quarters of an hour ... Between the hours of 11.45 a.m. and 2.45 p.m., and on a late trading night between the hours of 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. ..}
 - each year—three-quarters of an hour
 (b) At any other period of the year—one hour

TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.

10. Except where the conduct of an employee justifies instant dismissal seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or employee or one week's wages shall be paid or forfeited in lieu thereof.

DEFINITION.

- 11. "City area" shall mean the Central Area of the City of Melbourne enclosed by and including Flinders, Spencer, Latrobe, Victoria, and Spring streets. PAY DAY.
 - 12. Employees shall be paid weekly on a regular pay day other than a Friday or a Saturday.

REST PERIOD.

- 13. A rest interval of ten minutes shall be given to all employees during each morning and afternoon, and shall be counted as time worked. BIOYCLE ALLOWANCE.
- 14. If an employee is required to use his own bicycle in the business of his or her employer, an allowance of 6d. per day or part thereof shall be made for such use. TIME AND WAGES RECORD.
- 15. Employers shall keep a Time and Wages Record, showing the name, age, and sex of each employee, the number of hours worked each day and each week, and the wages and overtime payments (if any) to each such employee. Such record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited representative of the Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees Federation of Australia (Victorian-Tasmanian Branch).
- 16. On an employee being dismissed or leaving his or her employment he or she shall be entitled to and shall receive from the employer a reference stating length of service and qualifications. This reference must be given to the worker immediately on the termination of his or her employment.
