AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASS INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby increase the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section two of section four of the Gountry Fire Authority Act 1944, it is enacted that the Governor in Council, after consultation by the Chief Secretary of Victoria with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette proclaim any period as the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria or any specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may proclaim different summer periods in respect of different parts of the said country area.

And whereas the said Chief Secretary and the said Minister have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I. the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fric Authority Act 1944, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the period commencing on the eighteenth day of December, 1946, and ending on the fifteenth day of March next following to be the summer period in respect of the parts hereimatter specified of the country area of Victoria, that is to say:—

- The Second Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the City of Bendigo, the Borough of Eaglehawk, and those portions of the municipal districts of the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye within the aforesaid fire control region;
- those portions of the Sixteenth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Shires of Avoca and Stawell;
- the Seventeenth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Town of Horsham and the Shires of Arapiles, Dimboola, Dunmunkle, Kaniva, Kowree, Lowan, Warracknabeal, and Wimmera;
- the Eighteenth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the City of Mildura and the Shires of Birchip, Karkarooc, Mildura, Walpeup, and Wycheproof;
- the Nineteenth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Boroughs of Inglewood and St. Arnaud, and the Shires of Bet Bet, Charlton, Donald, Kara Kara, and Korong:
- the Twentieth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Borough of Swan Hill, and the Shires of Cohuna. Kerang, and Swan Hill;
- the Twenty-first Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Borough of Castlemaine, the Shires of East Loddon, Gordon, Huntly, Maldon, Metcaife. Rochester, and those portions of the municipal districts of the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye within the aforesaid fire control region;
- the Twenty-second Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Boroughs of Echuca and Shepparton, and the Shires of Deakin. Euroa. Goulburn, McIvor. Numurkah, Pyalong, Rodney. Seymour, Shepparton, Tungamah, Violet Town, and Waranga; and
- those portions of the Twenty-third Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Borough of Wangaratta, and the Shires of Benalla, Rutherglen, Wangaratta, and Yarrawonga,

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1928 (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Cranbourne has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved as a road by the said Council within the said Shire, he so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a road hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Cranbourne aforealid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act. viz:—

WHEREAS by virtue of the powers conferred by the Toton and Country Planning Act 1944 and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Act has been commenced scheme in accordance with the said Act has been commenced by the Geelong and District Town Planning Committee representing the municipalities of the whole of the Cities of Geelong, Geelong West, Town of Newtown and Chilwell, and portions of the following shires:—South Barwon, Bellarine, Barrabool, Bannockburn, and Corio (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority"), which hereby makes the following Interim Development Order:—

- 1. The development of all land referred to in the Schedule and the erection, construction, and carrying out of any buildings, roads, or other works on any of the said land is hereby prohibited.
- 2. Any person may apply to the Responsible Authority for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works during the operation of this Order.
- 3. Any application for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any building, roads, or other works may be granted by the Responsible Authority subject to such conditions as are specified in the permit, or may be refused.
- 4. Any owner of any land who, after the service of a copy of this Order contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice, in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road, or other works, and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works and recover all expenses incurred, of the owner, lesses and for after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section (3), of the Act.
- 5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.
- into operation of this Order.

 6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the Planning Scheme in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Act 1944, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

 7. The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling and nine pence (1s. 9d.) per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling and nine pence (1s. 9d.) per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.



REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided and also except on such days (not exceeding twenty-six in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for shows, sports, fêtes, cricket, football, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Three shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except in fireplaces previously approved by the Committee.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, trees, gates, fences, seats, tennis courts, or swimming pool in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any paper, glass, straw, manure, or any rubbish, nor throw stones or missiles of any kind to the danger of any nerson. of any person.
- 5. No person shall drive or bring any carriage or vehicle of whatsoever nature into the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 6. No person shall put into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, or any other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained. Any such stock trespassing on the Reserve will be impounded.
- 7. Without the permission of the Committee previously obtained, no person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a cord or chain.
- 8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, except in an area set apart by the Committee for the purpose, nor shall any person erect therein any booth or other structure for any purpose whatsoever without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 9. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker on any portion of the Reserve other than in enclosures set apart for bookmakers, and then only when he shall have obtained the consent, in writing, of the Committee.
- 10. No person shall dig or remove any sand, soil, or other material in or from the Reserve.

11. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, fitting, or written notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Committee in the Reserve.

12. The Committee may set apart portions of the Reserve for the purposes of a camping ground or a swimming pool, and make the same available for use by the public, subject to such conditions and the payment of such fees as it may consider reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

13. No person shall bathe within the Reserve unless decently attired in a suitable bathing costume, and no person shall leave, enter, or loiter on the Reserve in bathing costume

only.
