PROCLAMATION

State Electricity Commission Act 1928.

RESTRICTIONS ON USE OF ELECTRICITY REGULATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made on the twentieth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-two, under the *State Electricity Commission Act 1928*, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirtieth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-two, under the Regulations made under the said Act cited as Restrictions on Use of Electricity Regulations it was proclaimed that an emergency had arisen at the whole of the electrical undertakings and works of or operated by the Commission, and that for the protection of electrical works or lines of the Commission, and for the prevention of any interference therewith, it was necessary on and after the date of the publication in the *Government Gazette* of the said Proclamation, to prohibit or restrict the use of electricity by consumers and that such state of emergency should be deemed, under the said Regulations, to continue until the publication in the *Government Gazette* of a Proclamation that such a state of emergency had ceased to exist: Now I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby proclaim that the said emergency has ceased to exist.

PROCLAMATION OF FOREST ROADS

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 (1) of the *Country Roads (Forest Roads and Stock Routes) Act 1943* it is provided that the Governor in Council may on the recommendation of the Country Roads Board made after consultation with the Minister of Forests and the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey and on the recommendation of the Commissioner of Public Works by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim any road or any part of any road to be a Forest road for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas the Country Roads Board (after consultation with the Minister of Forests and the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey) and the Commissioner of Public Works have recommended that the roads described in the Schedule hereunder be so proclaimed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby proclaim the said roads to be Forest roads for the purposes of the said Act.

TALBOT WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1945-46.

THE Talbot Shire Council, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Two shillings in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Talbot Water Supply district.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Two pounds (£2), and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Five shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said land and tenements for the year commencing 1st day of October, 1945, and shall be payable on the 19th February, 1946, at the office of the said Council.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Council is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of Eighteen pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year. The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Council in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Eighteen pence per 1,000 gallons.

Water supplied to the Government Departments shall be by measure at Eighteen pence per 1,000 gallons, or by agreement.

Private water troughs shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum.

For water supplied for irrigation by pipe service for market gardens, orchards, and lucerne plots, the following charges shall be paid in addition to the annual assessment of the land:—

For one $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. service, £2 per acre; minimum One pound (£1).

For two $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. services, £3 per acre; minimum One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).

For one $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. service, £3 an acre; minimum One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).

For two $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. services, £4 per acre; minimum Two pounds (£2).

For water supplied for irrigation purposes from open race, the charge shall be as follows:—

For $\frac{1}{2}$ acre Two pounds (£2).

For $\frac{3}{4}$ acre Three pounds (£3).

For 1 acre Four pounds (£4).

For 2 acres Seven pounds (£7); and

Three pounds (£3) per acre for each additional acre.

The minimum charge shall be Two pounds (£2).

For water supplied for stock purposes to occupiers of properties adjoining race frontages, a minimum charge of £3, or by agreement. The charges for water supplied by measure or agreement shall be payable, on demand, at the offices of the Council.

Such person or persons as may from time to time be appointed for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

AVOCA TOWNSHIP WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1946.

THE Avoca Township Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Two shillings in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Avoca Township Waterworks Trust Urban District.

- (5) Such person or persons as The Ballarat Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate and charges.

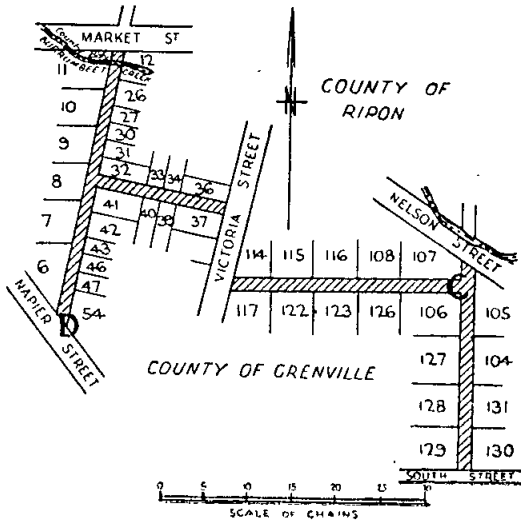

- (d) For a certificate of competency as battery manager, one year in charge of works or under a competent manager.
- (e) For a certificate of competency as cyanide works manager, one year in charge of works or under a competent manager.

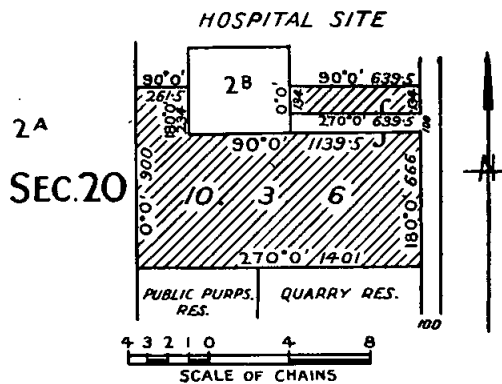

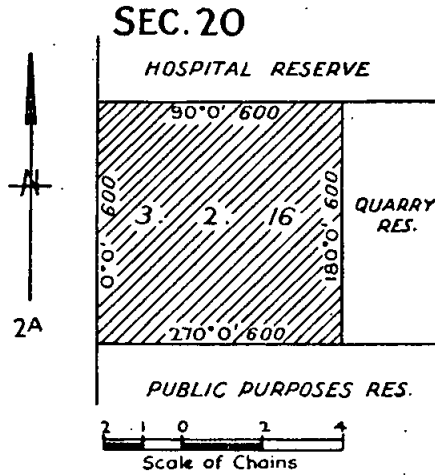
