EXCISION OF AN AREA FROM URBAN DISTRICT AT UPWEY IN THE THIRTEENTH FIRE CONTROL REGION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c.,

WHEREAS by Proclamation of the Governor in Council issued on the twentieth day of February, 1945, and published in the Government Gazette of the twenty-first day of February, 1945, the urban fire district at Upwey in the Thirteenth Fire Control Region was (amongst other things)







REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "BURRAWANG RESERVE," IN THE CITY OF KEW.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any land which has been reserved to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 2nd January, 1945, as a site for Public purposes in the Parish of Boroondara in the City of Kew, and now known as the "Burrawang Reserve," hereinafter referred to as "the reserve":—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public at all times except on such days (not exceeding 26 in any one year) as the Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the Committee) may otherwise determine, and admission thereto shall be free except on such days and at such hours as a charge or entrance fee is made under the authority of the Committee.

2. No charge or entrance fee to the reserve shall exceed Two shillings for each person over the age of twelve years, and One shillings for children under twelve years of age.

3. No person shall enter any portion of the reserve when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fee charged, unless authorized by the Committee.

charged, unless authorized by the Committee.

4. Except with the written permission of the Committee previously had and obtained, no person shall at any time play or practise cricket, football, golf. or other game. or engage in training or exercising for any sport, game, or contest in the

reserve.

5. No person shall cross or trespass on the playing ground during any cricket or football match, or sports games, or amusements, or during practice at football, cricket, or other games when any such crossing or trespassing would be injurious to, or be an undue interference with, the progress of the aforesaid football, cricket, or sports.

6. No person shall climb, jump, or get upon or over or under any fences or gates of the reserve, or cut or in any way remove or damage any of such fences or gates, or any of the buildings, seats, trees, or shrubs in the reserve, or stick bills or advertisements or writings on any such fences, gates, buildings, seats, or trees, or light a fire in the reserve, or dig or or advertisements or writings on any such fences, gates, buildings, seats, or trees, or light a fire in the reserve, or dig or remove any turf or soil, or enter any plots which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs or plants, or vommit any nuisance in the reserve, or damage or destroy any property or thing in the reserve.

7. No person shall throw or deposit any fitth, rubbish, or refuse, or cause any filth, rubbish, or refuse, to fall or to be thrown or deposited upon or in the reserve.

8. Persons using the reserve for any purpose shall, prior to leaving the area, collect and remove, or cause to be collected and removed, all waste material, scraps, bottles, glass, or litter of any kind brought or made by them.

9. No person shall bring, carry, or discharge any firearms in the reserve.

in the reserve.

10. No person shall throw or discharge in the reserve any missile to the damage, danger, or annoyance of any person.

11. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain

in the reserve.

12. No person in the reserve shall behave in a noisy or disorderly manner, or create or take part in any disturbance, or commit any act of indecency, or offend against decency in dress.

13. No person shall sell or offer for sale in the reserve any article of food or drink or any other commodity, or operate rany money-making amusement, or erect any tent, booth, stand. building, or other structure without the permission in writing of the Committee.

14. No person shall make any wager for money or play any unlawful game within the reserve.

15. No person shall, in the reserve, wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the reserve, or wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any member of the Police Force, or any servant of the Committee, in the proper execution of his duty or work.

16. No person shall remain in the reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any member of the Police Force, or any servant of the Committee, to leave the same.

- 17. No person shall camp in the reserve or assemble in the reserve for fetes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, without the permission in writing of the Committee.
- 18. No person shall make or cause to be made any violent out-cry, noise, disturbance, or sound, or shall play any musical or noisy instrument, or sing in the reserve, nor shall any person preach or declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public in the reserve without the per-mission in writing of the Committee.

19. No person shall give out or distribute any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers in the reserve, or litter the same by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets,

or papers.

20. No person shall ride a horse or other animal, or a bicycle or tricycle in or through the reserve, and no motor or other vehicle shall enter or pass over or through the reserve, except in, over, or through the portions of the reserve set apart by

the Committee for such purpose.

21. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord.

22. No dog shall be allowed in the reserve except as provided in clause 22. and all dogs, goats, pigs, and poultry found in the reserve shall be liable to be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation to be recovered before any justice for any

make compensation to be recovered before any justice for any damage done.

23. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, sheep, or other animal, and the Committee or any servant thereof shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle, sheep, or other animal found trespassing therein, and the owner of such cattle, sheep, or other animal shall be liable to the penalties provided in these Regulations.

24. No person shall remove, displace, or disfigure any board, plate, or tablet, or any support, fastening, or fitting used or constructed for the exhibition of any regulation or notice fixed or set up by the Committee in the reserve.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

Distance from Street Alignment.—Specifying the minimum distance from street alignment of the outer walls of any building of Class I, or Class II. occupancy as defined by the Uniform Building Regulations.

Building Regulations.

Sites Below Minimum Requirements.—Provides for the construction of a building of Class I. occupancy on land having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage or at a lesser distance from boundaries than those specified in columns 2, 3, or 4 (as the case may be) of Table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations, or in clause 7 of the By-law, or for the construction of a building of Classes III., V., VI., VII., or VIII. occupancy or a building to which a building of Class IV. occupancy is attached on land having an area, depth or width of frontage less than that prescribed in clause 809 of the Uniform Building Regulations in any case where, on the date of commencement of the Regulations, such land existed as a separate allotment, and has not since been reduced in area, or is shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles. Office of Titles.

Rear Access.—Provides that on any land forming part of a subdivision, approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles before the date of commencement of the Uniform Building Regulations, if no altotment has a greater frontage than 20 feet, a building may be constructed without direct access from the rear of the building to a street.

- A By-law of the City of Sandringham, made under section 198 of the Local Government Act, with the approval of the Governor in Council, and numbered 132, for regulating restricting, restraining, or prohibiting the erection, construction, conversion, and alteration of and any addition to buildings or erections, and regulating and restraining the erection and construction of fences abutting on or within 10 feet of any street or road.
- N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act and of every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandringham, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:
 - 1. That clause 1 of By-law No. 64 be amended by substituting for the words "600 square feet" the words "1,000 square feet."

- 2. No fence on or within 10 feet of the street alignment shall be constructed or added to or reconstructed for more than one quarter of its length or for more than 15 feet in any 50 feet except in accordance with a plan and specification submitted to and approved by the surveyor, and subject to the following conditions:
 - (a) Timber.—All timber used in posts, plinths, and strutting shall be of red gum or jarrah. All timber used in rails shall be of red gum, jarrah or hardwood.
- (a) Timber.—All timber used in posts, plinths, and strutting shall be of red gum or jarrah. All timber used in rails shall be of red gum, jarrah or hardwood.
 (b) Gate and Corner Posts.—Gate-posts and corner posts shall be not less than 5 inches by 5 inches in sectional area, plated and strutted on all four sides, unless otherwise allowed by the surveyor.
 (c) Intermediate Posts.—Intermediate posts shall be not less than 5 inches by 3 inches in sectional area spaced not more than 9 feet apart, and every post shall be plated and strutted on two sides.
 (d) Sole Plates and Struts.—Sole plates shall be not less than 4 inches by 2 inches housed half an inch for post, and not less than 3 feet in length. Struts shall be not less than 2 feet in length, cut to correct levels, and securely nailed to posts and plates.
 (e) Depth in Ground.—Posts shall be fixed vertical, and shall be sunk below the surface of the ground not less than 2 feet in the case of fences under 5 ft. 6 in. in height, and 2 ft. 6 in. in the case of fences 5 ft. 6 in. or over in height. —
 (f) Rails.—Rails for paling or corrugated iron fences shall be not less than 3 inches by 2 inches, spaced not less than 2 ft. 6 in. apart, centre to centre, except in the case of fences 5 feet or under in height, where the centre rail may be a 3 inch by 1 inch batten. Rails shall be in lengths sufficient to span two panels, and shall break joints on alternate posts.
 (g) Plinths.—Where a plinth is used at the bottom of a fence it shall be not less than 6 inches by 1 inch full (full) shall be not less than 6 inches by 1 inch full (full) shall be in lengths to span two panels, and be securely nailed to posts and supported on the inner side by a short upright, driven 15 inches into the ground, halved on to the bottom rail, and nailed thereto. One such upright shall be provided in the centre of each panel of fencing.
 (h) Palings.—Split palings used as a covering shall he not less than § inch in thickness

- tical. It shall be of new iron of not less than 26 gauge, and finished to a regular line along the top.

 (j) Special Fences.—The methods of construction of ornamental wire fences, picket fences, brick fences, concrete fences, or other fences of special design must be approved by the surveyor before being creeted.

 (k) Cyclone or Wire Fences.—The condition as to spacing of posts hereinbefore mentioned shall not apply to cyclone or plain wire fences which may, in the discretion of the surveyor, have the posts spaced at longer intervals, provided that metal or timber droppers are fixed at such intervals as may be directed by the surveyor, and the wires are tightly strained. In this class of fence, the gate posts and corner posts must be braced to the approval of the surveyor.

 (l) Short Lengths.—The use of short lengths of timber in posts, rails, pickets, or palings will not be permitted.

 (m) Height.—No fence or any addition thereto shall exceed 7 feet in height.

- 5. Hoods, Pergolas, &c.—(a) Hoods, pergolas, and ornamental heads to gateways or fences shall be constructed in accordance with a design and of materials approved by the
- (b) No part of any such hood, pergola, or ornamental head shall project more than 12 inches beyond the building alignment, and no projection shall be at a lesser height than 9 feet from the level of the footpath.

Paths, &c., Not to be Broken.—No person shall dig, break, remove, or damage tar painted gravel, asphalt, flagging, pitchers, or concrete of any road, path, or other public highway for the purpose of erecting any strutted fence posts, or for similar purposes, without first obtaining a road opening permit, in addion to the fencing permit, to do so.

- 7. Seepage to be Diverted.—All retaining walls or brick or concrete fences shall have seepage a verted in a manner approved by the surveyor, but in no case shall seepage be discharged on to a public footpath.
- 8. Barbed Wire Adjacent to Streets.—Where barbed wire is erected adjacent to any street it shall be set back not less than 6 inches from the street alignment up to a height of 7 ft. 6 in. above the level of the street, but in no case shall barbed wire project beyond the street alignment,

TOWN OF NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL. By LAW No. 38.

- A By-law of the Town of Newtown and Chilwell, made under the Health Acts and the Local Government Acts and every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, and numbered 38 for-
 - (a) regulating or prohibiting the keeping of any place or any animals (including birds) or the storage of any things in the opinion of the Council offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous;
 - (b) fixing the distance from any dwelling within which it shall be unlawful to keep any such place or animal, or to store any such thing;
 - (c) providing for the health of the residents in the municipal district and against the spreading of contagious or infectious diseases and for other purposes.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Newtown and Chilwell, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and the Local Government Acts and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law and order as follows:—

- 1. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or
- "Adjimals" shall mean horses and dogs.

 "Birds" shall mean fowls, ducks, geese, turkeys, and all other classes of poultry, and pigeons and doves.

 "Dwelling" shall include bathrooms, kitchens, sculleries, and all rooms used for sleeping, living, cooking, or for like purposes.
- 2. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept any bird and/or animal in any dwelling or in the yard of or attached to any such dwelling, or in any land whatsoever in such a manner as to be offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous.

- 3. The occupier of the yard of or attached to any dwelling or of any other land in which any animals and/or birds are kept or housed, shall cause the place of keeping of such animals and/or birds to be maintained in a good state of repair, and thoroughly cleansed and effectually deodorized from time to time as may be necessary for the purpose of keeping such place in a clean, wholesome, and sanitary state and condition
- 4. The occupier of any land on which is erected any stable for the keeping or housing of horses shall
 - (a) Cause all manure, refuse, and rubbish produced or accumulated therein to be placed in a properly constructed receptacle of brickwork walls 9 inches in thickness, with brick or concrete floor 6 inches in thickness, lined throughout internally with cement rendering composed of 2½ parts sand to 1 part cement;
 - (b) maintain such receptacle in a good state of repair as to prevent the escape or leakage of the contents;
 - (c) keep such receptacle constantly covered, and from time to time effectually deodorize the same and the contents thereof;
 - (d) cause the contents of such receptacle to be removed from such land at least once in each and every
 - (e) cause the floor of such stable to be properly drained and paved or flagged with brick, stone, concrete, or other impervious material;
 - (f) keep such stable in a good state of repair and in a cleanly and sanitary condition.
- 5. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept any fowls, ducks, geese, turkeys, or other classes of poultry within 30 feet of any dwelling, nor in the yard thereof, or attached thereto, the area of which yard is less than 1,500 square feet, nor within 60 feet of the alignment of any street of 33 feet or more in width, nor unless such fowls, ducks, geese, turkeys, or other classes of poultry are housed or kept in a properly constructed and securely fastened shed, shelter, erection, structure, or other enclosure.
- 6. No such shed, shelter, erection, structure, or other enclosure for the housing or keeping of any fowls, ducks, geese, turkeys, or other classes of poultry shall be erected or placed within 30 feet from any dwelling, nor in the yard thereof, or attached thereto, the area of which yard is less than 1,500 square feet, nor within 60 feet of the alignment of any street of 33 feet or more in width.
- 7. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept any fowls, ducks, geese, turkeys, or other classes of poultry on any land within 60 feet of the alignment of any street of 33 feet or more in width.
- 8. No such shed, shelter, erection, structure, or other enclosure for the housing or keeping of any fowls, ducks, geese, turkeys, or other classes of poultry shall be erected or placed in the yard of or attached to any dwelling house, nor any other land, unless a plan and description thereof be first submitted to and approved of by the Engineer.
- 9. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept any pigeons or doves within 25 feet from any dwelling nor in the yard thereof or attached thereto, the area of which yard is less than 750 square feet, nor on any other land unless such pigeons or doves are housed or kept in a properly constructed pigeon loft or dove cote.
- 10. No pigeon loft or dove cote shall be erected or placed within 25 feet from any dwelling nor in the yard thereof or attached thereto the area of which yard is less than 750 square feet, nor to a greater height than 7 feet from the ground, nor unless a plan and description thereof be first submitted to and approved of by the Engineer.
 - 11. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept-
 - (a) More than one animal (excluding horses) in the yard of or attached to any dwelling, the area of which yard is less than 750 square feet;
 - (b) more than two animals (excluding horses) in the yard of or attached to any dwelling, the area of which yard is less than 1,000 square feet;
 - (c) more than three animals (excluding horses) in the yard of or attached to any dwelling, the area of which yard is less than 1,500 feet;
 - (d) more than four animals (excluding horses) in the yard of or attached to any dwelling;

 - (f) such animals shall be kept not less than 30 feet from any dwelling.

- 12. Any shed, shelter, erection, structure, loft, cote, or other enclosure for the housing or keeping of any animals and/or birds erected or placed in the yard of or attached to any dwelling, or on any other land, contrary to the provisions of this By-law, shall be removed by the owner or occupier of such land, yard or dwelling within seven days after being required so to do by notice, in writing, under the hand of the Health Inspector.
- 13. No occupier of any yard or other land in or on which has been erected or placed any shed, shelter, erection, structure, loft, cote, or other enclosure for the housing or keeping of any animals and/or birds shall leave or suffer to remain therein for a longer period than is absolutely necessary any waste food or other matter likely to become offensive or injurious to health or attract or harbor rodents or other
- 14. No person shall keep or store or cause or permit to be kept or stored any food for consumption by animals or birds unless such food is kept or stored in rat-proof receptacles.
- 15. Any animals and/or birds which shall develop infectious or contagious disease injurious to the health of the residents of the municipal district shall be forthwith destroyed, or caused to be destroyed, by the person keeping
- 16. Any contravention of any of the foregoing sections by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds for each offence, to a further penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day such offence is continued after a conviction or order of any Court.

Brick construction. Drainage, drains, and sewerage. Penalties and enforcement of Regulations. Buildings constructed contrary to law. Provisions for appeal.

Third Schedule.—Minimum area of a house of six squares
—area of shire to which it applies.

Fourth Schedule .- Brick areas in the shire.
