TAKING OF WILD DUCKS PROHIBITED EXCEPT BY MEANS OF CERTAIN GUNS AND RIFLES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia. &c., &c. &c.

T. THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commony wealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation probibit the taking or killing of wild ducks of all kinds throughout the whole of each year by any means or device other than the ordinary shot-gun of the calibre now known as 12 bore or gauge or under or a rifle not exceeding a calibre of .250 of an inch. And 1 do hereby prescribe a penalty of not less than Two Pounds (£2) nor more than Twenty Pounds (£20) for any contravention of this Proclamation.

DECLARING THAT ONIONS SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE ONION MARKETING BOARD FOR A FURTHER PERIOD OF TWO (2) YEARS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 16 of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935, it is enacted that when a product has been declared a commodity and a Board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

- (a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the Proclama-tion or on from and after a later date specified in the Proclamation be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent Proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof; and
- this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof; and (b) make such further provisions as well enable the Board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the same: And whereas by a Proclamation made on the 9th day of December, 1935, under the provisions of section 6 of the said Act the Governor in Council declared onions to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Order made on the 26th March, 1936, the Governor in Council appointed a Marketing Board in relation to onions and assigned to such Board the name of "The Onion Marketing Board": Now therefore, I. the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on and from the lifth day of April.
