3. For the said rescinded Regulation substitute the following:—

(a) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of six years—

1st year—at the rate of 22s. 0d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 30s. 6d. per week.
3rd year—at the rate of 42s. 3d. per week.
4th year—at the rate of 57s. 6d. per week.
5th year—at the rate of 74s. 3d. per week.
6th year—at the rate of 92s. 0d. per week.

(b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—

1st year—at the rate of 25s. 6d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 34s. 9d. per week.
3rd year—at the rate of 48s. 9d. per week.
4th year—at the rate of 67s. 6d. per week.
5th year—at the rate of 92s. 0d. per week.”

AMENDMENT OF ELECTRICAL MECHANIC TRADE
REGULATIONS (No. 1).

(ii) The satisfactory completion, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission, of a two years' course of study in a Junior Technical School or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.

(b) If he satisfies the Commission, in accordance with subsection 18 (a) of the Acts, that he has not had sufficient opportunity to obtain the preparatory educational qualifications prescribed for entry into the said trade.

MAKING TRADES REGULATIONS (No. 1).

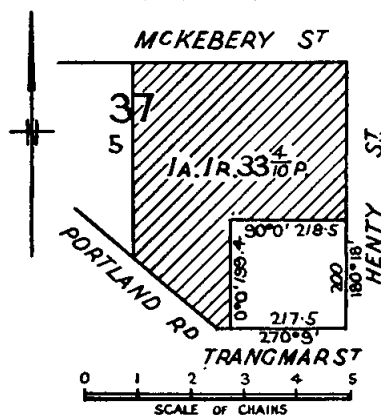

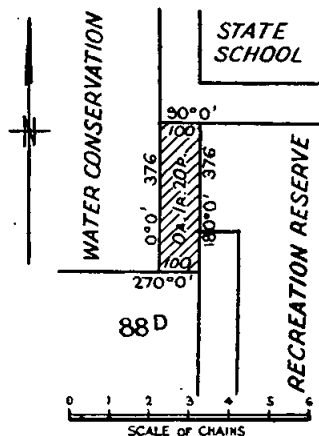

2. (a) The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building from the street alignment of any land is hereby specified as 20 feet.
(b) No person shall construct any building closer to the street alignment of any land than 20 feet.
3. Where any allotment of land (hereinafter called the principal allotment) is adjoined on two of its sides by other allotments (hereinafter called the adjoining allotments) fronting the same street or road as the principal allotment, and there is erected on each of two adjoining allotments a building, and the outer walls of one or both of such buildings are at a lesser distance from the street alignment of their respective allotments, nothing contained in clause 2 hereof shall prevent the outer walls of any building erected on the principal allotment being constructed at a distance from the street alignment of the principal allotment not less than 15 feet, or a distance equal to the sum of the distances from their respective street-alignments of the buildings erected on the adjoining allotments divided by two, whichever is the greater.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations, any person may construct a building of Class I. occupancy on land having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage, or at a lesser distance from boundaries than those specified in column 2 of Table 803 of the Regulations, in any case where, on the date of commencement of the Regulations, such land existed as a separate allotment and has not since been reduced in area, or is shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles.

A By-law of the Town of Horsham, made under the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria, and numbered 30, for determining, applying, dispensing with, or regulating such matters or things as are left to be determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council of the said Town of Horsham under the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria.

THAT in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Horsham order as follows:—

1. The areas set out and described in the First Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as brick areas, and no person shall in any such area construct or cause to be constructed any building the external walls of which are of material other than brick, stone, or concrete.

2. All land within the Municipal District of the Town of Horsham is hereby prescribed as the area in which buildings of Classes II. and III. occupancy shall not be constructed to contain more than three stories, including the ground story, and no person shall in any such area construct a building of Class II. or Class III. occupancy to contain more than three stories, including the ground story.

3. The minimum area, depth, and width of frontage specified in column 3 of Table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria (hereinafter called the Regulations) are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage of land on which a building shall be constructed throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Town of Horsham.

4. (a) The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building from the street alignment of any land is hereby specified as 20 feet.

(b) No person shall construct any building closer to the street alignment of any land than 20 feet.

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations, the Council may by Resolution permit any person to—

(a) Construct a building of Class I. occupancy on land having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage, or at a lesser distance from boundaries than those specified in column 3 of Table 803 of the Regulations, or in clause 4 of this By-law (as the case may be), or

(b) Construct a building of Class III., V., VI., VII., or VIII. occupancy, or a building to which a building of Class IV. occupancy is attached, on land having an area, depth, or width of frontage less than that prescribed in clause 809 of the Regulations.

In any case where, on the date of commencement of the Regulations, such land existed as a separate allotment and has not since been reduced in area, or is shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles.

6. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged with the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations, the requirements of clause 811 of the Regulations are hereby dispensed with.

THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

Land within the Municipal District of the Town of Horsham—

(a) Having a frontage to Firebrace-street or within a distance of 100 feet from such frontage, between Baillie-street and Hamilton-street.
