POLICE GAOL, GEELONG.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section seven of the *Gaols Act 1928* it is enacted that the Governor in Council, upon a certificate from the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments that any lockup is fit for the reception of prisoners whose sentences do not exceed thirty days, may from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, proclaim any police lockup so certified to be a "police gaol" and may from time to time by like notice revoke any such Proclamation:

And whereas by notice published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of February, 1942, the Governor in Council proclaimed the police lockup at Geelong to be a "police gaol":

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this notice revoke the aforesaid Proclamation issued by the Governor in Council on the twenty-fourth day of February, 1942, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of February, 1942, such revocation to take effect from and inclusive of Tuesday, the twenty-fifth day of February, 1947.

DECLARATION THAT A MARKETING BOARD SHALL BE CONSTITUTED IN RELATION TO POTATOES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS in accordance with sub-section (5) of section 6 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*, more than sixty per centum of the producers of potatoes entitled to vote at a poll taken on the question whether a Marketing Board shall be constituted in relation to potatoes, voted thereat, and more than sixty per centum of the votes polled are in favour of the constitution of a Board. Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State by this my Proclamation hereby declare that a Marketing Board shall be constituted in relation to potatoes and that the provisions of the said Act shall apply to potatoes.

PUBLIC SERVICE OF VICTORIA.—VACANCIES.

ADMINISTRATIVE DIVISION.

Revenue Officer (Bendigo), Class "B1," Department of Water Supply.

Yearly Salary.—£592, minimum; £722, maximum.

Duties.—To supervise—(a) the collection of revenue and all matters appertaining to water rate assessments within the Coliban System, (b) the costing and accounting in respect of works and stores, and (c) the preparation of wages sheets and payment of wages, &c.; and to co-ordinate and supervise generally the work of the clerical staff attached to the district office.

Qualifications.—Experience in all classes of rating duties, a good knowledge of the Water Acts, Land and Local Government Acts and of the incidence of rating, and of industrial awards; ability to control staff, and to conduct negotiations and correspondence, and to take proceedings for recovery of rates. The possession of municipal clerkship or accountancy qualifications is desirable.

PROFESSIONAL DIVISION.

Superintendent of Works, Class "C2," Department of Water Supply.

Yearly Salary.—£527, minimum; £579, maximum.

Duties.—To organize and direct, under the Divisional Engineer, the development of soldier settlement holdings for irrigation, the construction of farm channels and of channel structures on these holdings, the grading of the land, the sowing of crops and the initial watering of these crops within the Murray Valley District.

Qualifications.—To have had extensive experience in supervising engineering works in country districts and to be a competent draughtsman. To possess ability to—(a) design and supervise the construction of farm irrigation channels and structures; (b) organize and control construction of works by contract and day labour on a large scale, including the use of mechanical plant; and (c) handle stores and other equipment. To have a good knowledge of the costing of engineering works and experience in the organization of works.

Valuer, Class "C1," Taxation (Land Tax) Branch, Department of Treasurer. (Two vacancies.)

Duties.—Position No. 1.—To act as Departmental Valuer for the western and portions of the northern and southern suburbs, and for country towns.

Qualifications.—A sound knowledge of the principles governing the valuations of land and improvements, together with practical experience in the application of same in accordance with the provisions of the Land Tax Act and the Regulations thereunder; a good knowledge of property movements and data affecting land values in the districts specified; ability to discuss valuations with taxpayers or their representatives.

Duties.—To examine and test explosives, to assist in the inspection of explosive factories, and to perform inspectional and other duties as directed.

Qualifications.—A degree or diploma of a recognized University or Technical College with Chemistry as a major subject.

Assistant Surveyor, Class "D," Department of Water Supply.

Duties.—To carry out general engineering surveys, including investigation of channel systems and other water supply undertakings.

Qualifications.—To possess a Technical School Diploma in Civil Engineering or training and experience in the class of work set out above.

Duties.—To assist and understudy senior scientific officers, to maintain collections in good order, to register specimens, and to assist in the general work of the Museum.

Duties.—To inspect stock under the *Stock Diseases Act 1928*, the *Cattle Compensation Act 1928*, and the *Swine Act 1928*, sheep under the *Sheep Dipping Act 1928*, bulls under the *Cattle Breeding Act 1938*, and huts under the *Shearers Hut Accommodation Act 1928*; to conduct post-mortem examinations, and such investigations under the *Sheep Owners Protection Act* and the *Stock Medicines Act* as are necessary or required by the Superintendent of Live Stock.

Qualifications.—To be acquainted with the requirements of the provisions of the above Acts and the Regulations thereunder, and to have a thorough knowledge of the contagious diseases of stock and the methods adopted for their control and a practical knowledge of sheep dips and sheep dipping.

Butter Substitutes Officer, Department of Agriculture.

Duties.—To carry out inspectional and sampling duties under the *Margarine Act*, to check books and accounts, to give evidence in Court proceedings, and to carry out inspectional and sampling duties under such other Acts as may be directed.

Qualifications.—To have had experience in inspectional work with, preferably, the certificate of the Royal Sanitary Institute, and some knowledge of book-keeping.

Senior Warden, Pentridge, Penal and Gaols Branch, Department of Chief Secretary. (Six vacancies.)

Yearly Salary.—£383, minimum; £409, maximum, with quarters when required to reside on premises.

Duties.—In the absence of the Chief Warden, to act as Chief Warden and to perform other duties as directed.

TEACHING SERVICE (TEACHERS TRIBUNAL) REGULATIONS.

THE Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers vested in it by the *Teaching Service Act 1946*, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

REGULATION 24.

Automatic Adjustment of Salaries and Wages in Accordance with the Variations in the Cost of Living.

1. The salaries or wages of members of the teaching service shall be subject to automatic adjustment in accordance with the variations in the cost of living upon the basis and method of adjustment prescribed in these Regulations.

2. The basis and method of such adjustment shall be as follows:—

- (i) The measure of increases or decreases in the cost of living will be the weighted average retail price index numbers for "five towns" in Victoria as shown in the "Retail Prices Court Index—Second Series" published from time to time by or at the direction of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration.
- (ii) Cost of living adjustments, where necessary, shall be made half-yearly as from the commencement of the first fortnightly pay period beginning in the months of August and February in each year according to the index numbers for the preceding six months ending on the 30th June and 31st December respectively.
- (iii) Increases above or decreases below salaries or wages determined by the Tribunal shall be adjusted according to the following table, the amount of the increase or decrease being determined by the amounts shown in the table opposite the index number group within which the index number for the six months ending on 30th June or 31st December in any year falls:—

- (iv) In the event of the index number being more than 109·7 or less than 52·3, salaries or wages shall be further increased or decreased on the basis of the table, that is, for each further rise or fall of 2·3 points in the index number salaries or wages shall be increased or decreased (as the case may be) by a further £6 a year for adult males and married male minors, £4 for adult females, and £3 for members of the teaching service (not being married males) under 21 years of age.

3. This Regulation shall come into operation on the 9th day of February, 1947.

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 21st October, 1942, approved by the Governor in Council on 2nd November, 1942, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th November, 1942, and any amendment thereto, are hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations."

2. Regulation No. 123 is repealed, and in lieu thereof the following Regulation is substituted:—

No person shall remove any goods from any wharf or shed within the fenced area without delivering to the person acting under the authority of the Commissioners at the gate to the fenced area a permit from the master, owner, or agent of the importing vessel to remove such goods.

3. Regulation No. 123A is amended as follows:—

(a) The letters "(d)" and "(e)" appearing therein are deleted and the letters "(e)" and "(f)" are substituted therefor.

(b) After sub-regulation (c) of Regulation No. 123A, the following new sub-regulation is inserted:—

(d) (i) Every permit for the removal as aforesaid of any goods in or on any such vehicle delivered by the person in charge thereof to the person acting under the authority of the Commissioners at the gate to the fenced area shall contain a complete and accurate record of all such goods then in or on such vehicle.

(ii) If any such permit delivered as aforesaid does not contain a complete and accurate record of all such goods then in or on any such vehicle the person so delivering such permit shall, whether the omission or inaccuracy therein was caused intentionally, by mistake, inadvertently, or howsoever otherwise, be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

(c) In the present sub-regulation (d) of Regulation 123A "or (c)" therein appearing is deleted and "(c) or (d)" is substituted therefor.

4. Regulation No. 300 (11) (b) is repealed, and in lieu thereof the following Regulation is substituted:—

(b) Before passing out from any compound or fenced area stop at the gate thereof and remain stationary until permission to proceed through the gate is given by the person acting under the authority of the Commissioners at the gate to the fenced area.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by the Country Fire Authority Acts it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for the payment of compensation—(1) (in the case of accident causing personal injury to or destruction or damage of the personal property of any officer or member of a brigade) to such officer or member; and (ii) (in the case of the death of any such officer or member resulting from any such accident) to the wife, family, and dependants of such officer or member; and for the creation and establishment or continuation of any fund or funds for the purpose:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Acts, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the "Country Fire Authority Compensation (Amendment) Regulations" and shall be read and construed with the "Country Fire Authority Compensation Regulations," which Regulations and these Regulations may be cited together as the "Country Fire Authority Compensation Regulations."

(2) These Regulations shall come into operation on the nineteenth day of February, 1947.

2. The Country Fire Authority Compensation Regulations made by the Governor in Council on the twenty-seventh day of March, 1945, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-eighth day of March, 1945, are hereby amended as follows:—

(a) In clause eight of the said Regulations—

(1) sub-clause (1) is hereby revoked and the following sub-clause substituted therefor:—

8. (1) If in the course of service as a volunteer officer or fireman personal injury by accident arising out of or in the course of the said service is caused to a volunteer officer or fireman enrolled in accordance with the provisions of the Country Fire Authority Acts and the Regulations made thereunder the Authority shall be liable to pay compensation from the fund to such volunteer officer or fireman.

(2) At the end of sub-clause (1) there shall be inserted the following sub-clause:—

(2) In the case of the death of any such volunteer officer or fireman resulting from such accident the Authority shall be liable to pay compensation from the fund to the wife, family, and dependants of such volunteer officer or fireman.

(3) For the expression "(2) Service" there shall be substituted the expression "(3) Service."

(b) In clause nine of the said Regulations—

(1) After the words "Every claim to compensation pursuant to" there shall be inserted the words "the next preceding clause of."

(2) For the expression "(b) accompanied" there shall be substituted the expression "(b) (in case of accident causing personal injury) accompanied."

(c) At the end of clause eleven there shall be inserted the following clause:—

12. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations if at any fire—

(a) any wearing apparel or personal effects worn by or upon the person of any volunteer officer or fireman while engaged in fire fighting at the fire;

(b) any vehicle or equipment or property which is the personal property of any volunteer officer or fireman and which is used in connexion with his attendance or fire fighting at the fire,

is or are destroyed or damaged, such volunteer officer or fireman shall be entitled to such compensation from the fund as the Authority considers reasonable to indemnify him for such destruction or damage, and the determination of the Authority shall be final and without appeal:

Provided that—

(a) the amount of compensation payable pursuant to paragraph (a) of this sub-clause in any particular case shall not exceed Ten pounds; and

(b) no compensation shall be payable under any provision of this sub-clause in any case where the volunteer officer or fireman is entitled to adequate reimbursement under any policy of insurance or from any other source whatever.

(2) For the purposes of this clause "fire-fighting" means—

(a) performing under the control or direction of the officer in charge of operations at the fire any act or operation at or about the scene of the fire which is necessary or expedient for or directed towards the suppression of the fire, or the prevention of the spread of the fire, or the saving of life and property; and

(b) proceeding at the direction of the said officer to the scene of the fire exclusively for the purpose of performing any such act or operation as aforesaid.

(3) Every claim for compensation by any volunteer officer or fireman pursuant to the foregoing provisions of this clause shall be made in writing to the Authority through the captain of the brigade, with which the said volunteer officer or fireman is enrolled, and every such claim shall be verified by statutory declaration.

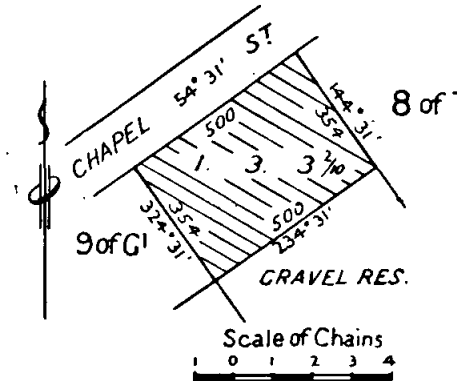

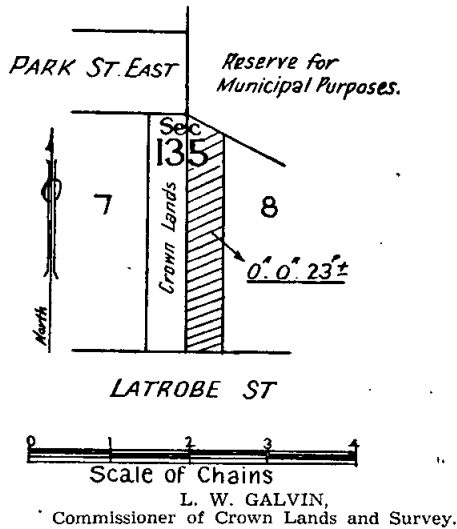
