### PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF SANDRINGHAM.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1928 (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or

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thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Sandringham has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a road by the said Council within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a road hereinafter described and situated within the City of Sandringham aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

### PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF SANDRINGHAM.

Public Highway.—City of Sandringham.

All that piece of land being part of a road known as Grange-road and shown on lodged plans numbered 15439 and 13249, and being part of Crown portion 20, Parish of Moorabbin, County of Bourke; commencing at a point being the intersection of the western boundary of Bluff-road with the northern boundary of Grange-road; thence bounded by a line 55 feet bearing south 0 deg. 53 min. west to a point being the intersection of the western boundary of Bluff-road with the southern boundary of Grange-road; thence by a line 691 ft. 2 in. long, bearing south 89 deg. 39 min. west, along the southern boundary of Grange-road; thence by a line 9 inches, bearing south 0 deg. 15 min. west; thence by a line 549 ft. 4 in. long, bearing south 89 deg. 39 min. west along the southern boundary of Grange-road; thence by a line 50 feet long, bearing north 1 deg. 21 min. east to a point on the northern building line of Grange-road; thence by a line 548 ft. 8 in. long, bearing north 89 deg. 39 min. east along the northern building line of Grange-road; thence by a line 5 ft. 8 in. long, bearing north 89 deg. 39 min. east; thence by a line 691 ft. 8 in. long, bearing north 89 deg. 39 min. east; thence by a line 691 ft. 8 in. long, bearing north 89 deg. 39 min. east to the commencing point.

Any owner of land who, after the service of a copy of this Order, contravenes any of the provisions contained herein shall, when directed by notice, in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road, or other works, and if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works, and recover all expenses incurred after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier, in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section 3, of the Act.

  5. None of the Provisions of this Order shall prohibit
- 5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.
- 6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme, in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Act 1944, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

### FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACTS

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourteenth day of January, 1947.

### PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Field Mr. Slater Mr. McKenzie.

### HOLIDAYS IN CERTAIN TRADES.

TINDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and—

1. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Animal Manure Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The fifteenth day of January, 1947, shall, within the whole of the State of Victoria, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed in the process, trade, or business of the manufacture of manure from animal matter.

2. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Sausage Casings Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The fifteenth day of January, 1947, shall, within the whole of the State of Victoria, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed in the process, trade, or business of preparing or cleaning casings for sausages or similar products.

3. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Shops Board No. 3 (Butchers), doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:-

The fifteenth day of January, 1947, shall, in the Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed—

- (a) in the process, trade, or business of a butcher or seller of fresh uncooked meat, or maker or seller of small goods;
- (b) delivering fresh uncooked meat or small goods.
- 4. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Slaughtering for Export Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The fifteenth day of January, 1947, shall, within the whole of the State of Victoria, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed in the meat export trade as—

- (a) slaughterers or dressers of sheep, lambs, cattle, pigs, or calves;
  (b) boners, trimmers, or labourers;
  (c) drovers, stockmen, or penners-up;
  (d) skin store workers.

- 5. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Tennis Strings Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The fifteenth day of January, 1947, shall, within the whole of the State of Victoria, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed in the process, trade, or business of making strings for tennis racquets.

6. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Horsehair Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:-

The twenty-first day of January, 1947, shall, within the whole of the State of Victoria, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of preparing horse hair, cow hair, or pig hair for trade or sale.

7. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Manufacturing Chemists Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The twenty-first day of January, 1947, shall, within the whole of the State of Victoria, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed subject to the Determination of the Manufacturing Chemists Board.





A By-law of the City of Bendigo, made under the Local Government Act and the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, and numbered 66, for determining, applying, dispensing with, or regulating such matters or things as are left to be determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council of the said city under the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regula-tions, Victoria, and of any and every other power it there-unto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Bendigo order as follows:—

1. The areas set out and described in the First Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as brick areas, and no person

hereto are hereby prescribed as brick areas, and no person shall in any such area construct or cause to be constructed any building the external walls of which are of material other than brick, stone, or concrete.

2. The areas set out and described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as areas in which buildings of Classes II. and III. occupancy shall not be constructed to contain more than two storeys, including the ground storey, and no person shall in any such area construct a building of Class II. or Class III. occupancy to contain more than two storeys, including the ground. two storeys, including the ground.

3. The areas set out and described in the Third Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as areas in which buildings of Class II. and III. occupancy shall not be constructed to contain more than three storeys, including the ground storey, and no person shall in any such area construct a building of Class II. or Class III. occupancy to contain more than three storeys, including the ground storey.

4. The minimum area, depth, and width of frontage and distance of outer walls from boundaries specified in column 2 of Table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria (hereinafter called the Regulations), are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage of land on which a building shall be constructed throughout the whole of the municipal district.

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations, the Council may permit any person to—

(a) Construct a building of Class I. occupancy on land having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage or at a lesser distance from boundaries than those specified in column 2 of Table 803 of the Regulations, or

(b) Construct a building of Classes III., V., VI., VII. VIII. occupancy, or a building to which a building of Class IV. occupancy is attached, on land having an area, depth, or width of frontage less than that prescribed in clause 809 of the Regula-

in any case where on the date of commencement of the Regulations such land existed as a separate allotment and has not since been reduced in area, or is shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles.

6. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged with the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations the requirements of clause 811 of the Regulations are hereby dispensed with.
