NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ALTER THE CONDITIONS GOVERNING NETTING IN MALLACOOTA INLET.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is It is nereby notified, for general information, that it is intended after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the Government Guzette, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation revoking the Proclamation made the twenty-fourth day of April, 1939, and published in the Government Guzette of twenty-sixth day of April, 1939, respecting conditions governing netting in Mallacoota Inlet, and providing as follows:—

coota Inlet, and providing as follows:—

1. The use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, shall be prohibited in Mallacoota (sometimes called Mallagoota) Inlet, within an imaginary line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such inlet enter the ocean, from the fifteenth day of October in each year to the thirtleth day of April in the following year (both days inclusive).

2. The use of nets to be employed in fishing between the first day of May in each year and the fourteenth day of October next following (both days inclusive), shall be restricted in the above-mentioned inlet as follows:—

(b) Use a "mesh" or "set" net of any kind.
(c) Use a "seine" or "hauling" net in a manner similar to that used for "mesh" or "set" nets. Any "seine" or "hauling" net shall, after having been shot or placed in the water, be continuously hauled from both ends of such net until the haul or "shot" has been completed, i.e., the wings of the net hauled out of operation and the fish in the bunt of the net.

If any such "seine" or "hauling" net during the operation of "shooting" or hauling becomes snagged or fouled so that the haul or "shot" cannot be completed the net shall be immediately lifted and not left set in the water.

- (c) registered infant welfare nurses engaged in infant welfare work or in work requiring an infant welfare certificate, and who are employed—
 - (i) by any municipality or industrial or commercial corporation; or
 - (ii) in any---

infant welfare training school, mothercraft training school, babies' home,

pre-school centre (including any creche, nursery school, kinder-garten, or play group);

- (d) certificated nurses engaged in connexion with any industrial or commercial undertaking;
- (a) certificated nurses employed in his practice by a qualified medical practitioner or dentist, or employed by any medical, dental, or nursing society, association, clinic, or service.

And the Honorable Percy James Clarey, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.







3. (a) The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building from the street alignment of any land is hereby specified as 15 feet.

(b) No person shall construct any building closer to the street alignment of any land than 15 feet without the written permission of the Council.

Sites Below Minimum Requirements.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulation, any person may-

(a) construct a building of Class I. occupancy on land having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage, or at a lesser distance from the boundaries than those specified in column 3 of table 803 of the Regulations, or in clause 3 of this By-law (as

Regulations, or in clause 3 of this By-law (as the case may be); or

(b) construct a building of Class III., V., VI., VII. or

VIII. occupancy, or a building to which a building of Class IV. occupance is attached on land having an area, depth, or width of frontage less than that prescribed in clause 809 of the Regulations, in any case where on the date of commencement of the Regulations such land existed and the contract allothers and has not since been as a separate allotment and has not since been reduced in area or is shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the Council, and lodged in the Office of Titles.
