

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "ESK PARK RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purpose searched. Now therefore and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land reserved by Order in Council of 15th August, 1898, as a site for a Racecourse and Public Recreation in the township of Eskdale, and known as the "Esk Park Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve," such reservation having been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

# REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 26 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for football or cricket matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Three shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.
- No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve.

  4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, or stick bills or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, or roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

  5. No person shall light a fire within the Reserve, except with the permission of the Committee first obtained.

- 6. No person shall erect within the Reserve any tent, booth or structure without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

  7. No person shall offer for sale within the Reserve any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 8. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses,
- sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

  9. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

  10. No person shall carry or discharge any firearms in

  11. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

  12. The Committee shall have the right to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, or person, for the purpose of holding fêtes, carnivals, entertainments, or physical recreation, subject to such terms and conditions and to the payment of such fees as the Committee may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations. REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE UNDER-MENTIONED RESERVES FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE PARISHES OF NEPEAN, WANNAEUE, AND KANGERONG, KNOWN AS THE "RYE," "TOOTGAROOK," "ROSEBUD," AND "DROMANA" FORESHORE RESERVES.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the under-mentioned Reserves:—

1. Such portion of the Reserve for Public purposes in the Parish of Nepean as is indicated by red colour on plan marked R.13/3/23 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs. 3565, and known as the "Rye Foreshore Reserve."

2. Such portion of the Foreshore Reserve in the Parish of Wannaeue as is indicated by pink tint on plan marked W.9/7/26, attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.4291 and known as "Tootgarook Foreshore Reserve."

3. Such portion of the Reserve for Public purposes in the Parish of Wannaeue as is indicated by red colour on plan marked A.11/2/1937 with Lands Department correspondence Rs.3351, and known as the "Rosebud Foreshore and Recreation Reserve."

4. (a) The remaining portion of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 2nd June, 1891, as a site for Public Park in the Town of Dromana and Parish of Kangerong.

(b) Such portion of the Reserve for Public purposes in the Parish of Kangerong as is indicated by pink tint on plan marked B.2/1/19 with Lands Department correspondence Rs.1018.

(c) The land temporarily reserved for Wharfage purposes in the Parish of Kangerong at Dromana, and indicated by blue colour on tracing marked A.18/1/22 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.2458.

# REGULATIONS

- 1. The Reserves shall be open to the public at all times, free of charge, except on such days not exceeding Twenty-six (26) in any one year as any portion of the Reserves, exclusive of the beach, may be set aside for purposes consistent with the reservation and with the consent of the Committee of Management.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage or interfere in any way with the trees, shrubs, marram grass, or flowers in the Reserves, nor shall fires be lighted therein except with the written consent of the Committee of Management.
- 4. No person shall in any way injure any of the buildings, fences, or seats in the Reserves, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserves.
- 5. No person shall remove from the Reserves any gravel, stone, shellgrit, sand, or loam.
- 6. No person shall cut, saw, dig, move, or displace any tree, bough, live or dead timber, wood or other material which may be in or around the Reserves without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- 7. No person shall put or graze in the Reserves any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, sheep, or any other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of management being first obtained.

(i) No person, without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management, shall cause or suffer or knowingly permit any dog belonging to him, or in his charge, to enter or remain in the Reserves unless such dog be and continues to be under proper control on a chain, cord, or leash, and be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person, or from damaging or interfering in any way with the property of the said Committee of Management, or bring into the Reserves any dog for training or exercising for coursing or other purposes of sport.

  (ii) Any dog found in the Reserves expect as provided.
- (ii) Any dog found in the Reserves, except as provided in these Regulations, shall be liable to be seized and/or destroyed by the Committee of Management, and the owner or any person having the custody of any dog so found shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and may be required to make compensation for any damage done to the property of the said Committee of Management by such dog.

No person shall camp or erect any tent or other structure on any site on any portion of the Reserves, except on such portion as may be specially set apart for the purpose in each Reserve, and then only with the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management and on payment of such fees and subject to such conditions as the Committee of Management may determine.

No person shall erect any bathing box, boathouse, shed, or any other building structure or erection or booth on any site on the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, fees, and conditions as may be deemed reasonable and advisable by the Committee of Management consistent with these Regulations, but no person shall use or cause to be used or knowingly permit to be used any such bathing box, boathouse, shed or any other building structure or erection or booth for residential purposes.

  11. The Committee of Management shall have full
- structure or erection or booth for residential purposes.

  11. The Committee of Management shall have full power to order the removal from the Reserves of any bathing box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, or erection or booth which has been placed, erected, or established without its consent or which has not been properly erected or properly painted or which in its opinion has not been satisfactorily maintained or kept in repair or in respect of which the term of permission for the use of the site has expired or the permission to use the site for a building or buildings has expired or been withdrawn.
- 12. No person shall neglect or refuse to remove any bathing box, boathouse, shed or other building, structure, or erection or booth erected or placed by him on any site in or on the Reserves, within fourteen (14) days after the Committee of Management has sent by registered post to his last known address, a notice requiring such person to remove such bathing box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure or erection or booth. Such notice may be signed by either the Chairman or Secretary for the time being of the said Committee of Management.
- 13. In the event of any such neglect or refusal as abovementioned continuing after the expiration of the said fourteen (14) days, the Committee of Management may remove such bathing box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure or erection or booth and recover the cost and/or expense of such removal from the person so, neglecting or refusing to remove the same but without prejudice to proceedings by way of information for breach of these Regulations being taken against such person so neglecting or refusing.
- 14. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, or any other litter on any part of the Reserves, except in the receptacles provided for the purpose.
- 15. No person shall bet publicly on any part of the Reserves, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserves.
- $16.\ No$  person shall carry or discharge firearms in the Reserves.
- 17. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure, on the occasions of any fêtes, sports or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding f10, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 30th May, 1916, as a site for a Public Park in the Municipal District of Creswick, and known as "Calembeen Park," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve."

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 52 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for swimming carnivals, fêtes, sports, holiday amusements or band recitals, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

  3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, cut reeds, or other vegetation in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein except at the camp fireplaces provided by the Committee of Management.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

  5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, there gates pigs or other animals without the permis-
- sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 6. No person shall carry or discharge any firearms within the Reserve.
- 7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and any such dog shall not be allowed to enter the swimming pools in the Reserve.
- 8. No person shall camp in the Reserve other than a the specified camping area and after having duly paid the camping fees as may be determined by the Committee of Management from time to time.
- 9. No person shall erect in the Reserve any building, booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 10. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort or in any organized game or sport in the Reserve at any time without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 11. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
- 12. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
- 13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time

determine, not exceeding £10, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management Management.

14. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

- 15. No person shall disturb the surface of or remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.
- 16. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his work and duty.
- 17. No assemblies for concerts or for the purpose of public worship, preaching or public speaking of any kind shall take place in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- 18. No person shall ride a bicycle anywhere within the

The Council of the Shire of Creswick has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

# SHIRE OF HEALESVILLE.

# By-LAW No. 26.

- A By-law of the Shire of Healesville, made under section 197 of the Local Government Act 1928, and numbered 26, for appointing in streets and roads standing places for motor cars and for regulating the use of any such standing places.
- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1928 and every other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Healesville order as follows:—
- In this By-law and the Schedule thereto, unless the context otherwise requires-
  - "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Heales-
  - "Driver" includes any person in charge of a motor
  - "Limit of Parking" where parking lines are painted on a street or road means within the lines indicat-ing the space in which a motor car may be parked or left standing.
  - "Motor Car" means a motor car within the meaning of section 3 of the Motor Car Act 1928, not being a vehicle of any class for which stands or standing places may be fixed or appointed by the council of any municipality under the powers conferred by any enactment other than subsection 7 of section 197 of the Local Government Act 1928.

- "Parking Lines" means the lines painted on the street or roads to indicate the position to be taken up by a motor car and to define the limit of parking or standing space within which a motor car shall park or stand.
- 2. By-law No. 23 is hereby repealed.
- 3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout that portion of the municipal district within the township of Healesville set out in the Schedule hereto.
- 4. The streets and roads and/or parts of streets and roads set out in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto (hereinafter called "parking areas") shall be and are hereby appointed standing places for motor cars within the township of Healesville, on the days during the hours and for the periods of time as set out in the said Schedule in columns 2, 3, and 4 thereof.
- 5. The method of parking in the several parking areas shall be as set out in column 5 of the First Schedule hereto opposite the parking area described in column 1 of the said Schedule.
- 6. Every driver of a motor car shall conform to the method of parking set out in the said First Schedule hereto and—
  - (a) as directed by the parking attendant in charge of the parking area if an attendant is present, and
  - (b) if no such attendant is present, shall take up his position in the order of his arrival thereat and in such a manner as will enable him to take up or leave such position without disturbance to a motor car already parked and in such a manner as not to cause obstruction to a motor car parking or moving from the place occupied by it.
- 7. A driver of a motor car shall not cause, allow or permit a motor car to be parked or left standing in such a manner as to extend beyond the painted lines marking the limit of parking in any parking area.
- 8. A driver shall not cause, allow or permit either a motor car of a greater overall length of 20 feet or a motor car with an attached trailer having together a greater overall length than 20 feet to be parked in any parking area in which angle parking is permitted nor in any parking space defined by lines painted on the roadway of a length less than 20 feet.
- 9. A driver of a motor car of the commercial or utility type used or adapted for use in the carrying of live stock shall not cause, allow or permit such motor car to be parked in any parking area set out in the Second Schedule to this By-law.

- 10. A driver of a motor car shall not cause, allow or permit a motor car to be parked in any street or road or portion of a street or road in a position—
  - (1) (a) marked on the street or road "no park" or by a "no parking" traffic standard, or
    - (b) marked on the roadway "bus stop," or
    - (c) marked on the roadway "safety zone."
  - (2) In any position prohibited as set out in clause 26 of the Road Traffic (Country) Regulations 1944.

(Copy of clause 26 is set out at the foot of this By-law for information of persons consulting the By-law.)

- 11. The Council may from time to time fix or appoint openings through and in any parking area for cross traffic and may vary such openings.
- 12. The Council may appoint, alter, or vary the hours during which parking areas or any of them shall be available for use.
- 13. A driver of a motor car shall not park or permit or allow a motor car to obstruct or occupy in a parking area any opening prescribed or established or set apart for any purpose prescribed by this By-law or for any cross traffic and the parking of or occupation by any motor car of any such opening is prohibited.
  - 14. The Council may by resolution from time to time-
    - (a) discontinue for such period as it thinks fit any standing place for motor cars appointed under any By-law and,
    - (b) may appoint or employ officers and attendants for any standing places so appointed and remove any such officer or attendant.
- 15. No person not being an officer or employee of the Council or otherwise authorized by the Council shall destroy, remove or in any other manner interfere with any notice (including any standard or other erection supporting any such notice) which has been fixed or placed by the said Council upon any street, roadway, or building or other public place, or upon any verandah or other building.
- 16. No person not being an officer or employee of or otherwise authorised by the Council shall affix any notice, sign or other thing on to or in any street or footway or erect, drive, or fix any post, spike, peg, erection or other thing upon or into any street or footway.
- 17. Any wilful contravention of the foregoing provisions by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law, and every person who is guilty of any such offence shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty of not exceeding Ten pounds.

- (iv) Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant or a postal pillar box or a petrol pump erected on the kerb of any street.
- (v) In front of a right-of-way, passage, or private drive.
- (vi) Alongside or opposite any street, excavation, or obstruction when traffic would be thereby obstructed.
