PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF BACCHUS MARSH.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and

thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned which has been used as a street by the said Council within the said Shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1928*, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described and situated within the Shire of Bacchus Marsh aforesaid to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act:—

SHIRE OF BACCHUS MARSH.—PUBLIC HIGHWAY.

All that piece of land being part of Crown portion Township of Bacchus Marsh, Parish of Korkuperrin, County of Bourke: Commencing at a point on the southern boundary of Waddell-street, distant 263 ft. 11 in. west from the southern corner of Graham-street and Waddell-street; thence by a line bearing south 0 deg. 31 min. west for a distance of 262 ft. 9 in.; thence by a line bearing south 0 deg. 46 min. west for a distance of 267 ft. 7 in.; thence by a line bearing south 89 deg. 39 min. west for a distance of 50 feet; thence by a line bearing north 0 deg. 46 min. east for a distance of 266 ft. 2 in.; thence by a line bearing north 0 deg. 31 min. east for a distance of 264 ft. 8 in. to the southern boundary of Waddell-street; thence by the said southern boundary of Waddell-street bearing south 89 deg. 52 min. east for a distance of 50 feet to point of commencement.

Cemeteries Acts.

GOROKE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees of the Goroke Public Cemetery rescind the Rules and Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of 21st August, 1891, and 28th April, 1916, and make the following Rules and Regulations, which shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*:—

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made, when an Order in accordance with the Trustee's requirements will be given to the applicant upon payment of the charges set out in the scale of fees.
2. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the said cemetery without a certificate from a Registrar of Deaths or Coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered to the secretary or gatekeeper before the funeral enters the cemetery. No interment shall be permitted in a private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial or other satisfactory evidence, and, if required, a statutory declaration shall be made that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so.
3. Any two Trustees of the cemetery may, by written order addressed to the secretary, direct the burial of any poor person in such cemetery free of any charges whatsoever, provided after due inquiry they are satisfied such person, his relatives, or friends are unable to pay such charges, and if such person shall be known or believed to have belonged to any particular religious denomination he shall be buried in the part (if any) of the cemetery set apart for such denomination. All orders for free burial given under these Regulations or by Justices under section 50 of the *Cemeteries Act 1928*, shall be recorded by the secretary.
4. That every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicle except the hearse or mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter the cemetery or to stand opposite the entrance gates except by authority of the Trustees first had and obtained. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than a walking pace within the cemetery.
5. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery, the Trustees having full power to destroy same.
6. That every grave shall be at least 6 feet deep for one interment and at least 7 feet for two interments, and no coffin shall be interred within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years of age, when it shall not be less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in same grave, and in the case of a tomb or vault a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left above and around the uppermost coffin.
7. That the Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under directions of the sexton on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, and be air and water tight.
8. That any person desiring to construct, add to, or amend a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect, add to, or amend a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence,

or any other construction or erection on any part of the cemetery, shall apply in writing to the Trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit in writing a statement, plan, design, or drawing of the same, with full particulars, and shall obtain such permission in writing before proceeding with the work.

9. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by or at the expense of owner. Should the owner's residence not be known or be out of the State, the Trustees to have power to do the work and keep an account against the owner.

10. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and no vehicle conveying any such materials or soil shall be permitted to enter the cemetery during wet or unfavourable weather.

11. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the cemetery at once at the expense of the person causing the same. (See depth regulation.)

12. That any workman not employed by the Trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the Trustees or person authorized by them who shall have power to regulate his hours of labour, to see that his work is completed with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.

13. That any person prior to placing any inscription, epitaph, or other writing or drawing in any part of the cemetery, shall apply in writing to the Trustees and submit a copy thereof to the Trustees, and shall obtain their written permission for the same.

14. No person shall promote or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling either by advertising, solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards, or by any other means of advertisement whatsoever.

15. No person in the cemetery or its approaches shall commit any nuisance or trespass or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the cemetery any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any grass plot, border, railing, fence, or any other erection, or road therein, or remove or interfere in any way with anything laid, built, or placed on or in any grave or burying place.

16. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave without the permission of the Trustees. The Trustees further reserve to themselves the right to remove any monument, stone, border rail, or fence, which they consider beyond repair, unsightly, or in any way objectionable.

17. That the secretary shall, subject to the Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, and carry out and enforce these Rules, and subject to the provisions of the *Cemeteries Act*, the direction of such person shall in all such matters and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Trustees.

18. That any person committing any breach of any of these Rules or Regulations or of any other Rules, Regulations, or By-laws, lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall be thereupon forthwith removable from the cemetery by the Trustees, secretary, or sexton, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly, in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such person may be subject.

19. A plan of the ground and a register, also a register of all certificates of rights of burial which are issued, will be kept by the secretary.

20. The Trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time to these charges and regulations, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council.

21. All foundations for monuments to be at least 2 ft. 6 in. deep in concrete or brick.

22. The shifting of any stone, slab, monument, kerb, or railing necessary to effect a burial or exhumation shall be arranged by and done at the expense and responsibility of the person placing the order for interment, but in the absence of any such arrangement the Trustees will then carry out such work at the full risk, responsibility, and expense of the person aforementioned.

DECLARATION OF MAIN ROADS IN THE SHIRES OF BRIGHT, CRESWICK, DUNDAS, DUNMUNKLE, FERNTREE GULLY, GORDON, KORONG, LILLYDALE, MINHAMITE, MOUNT ROUSE, MULGRAVE, NARRACAN, OXLEY, RODNEY, TULLAROOP, BOROUGH OF WANGARATTA, TOWN OF HAMILTON.

WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the seventeenth day of June One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) being of opinion that the highways in the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule to the same are of sufficient importance to be main roads and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid: And whereas the said Act amongst other things provides that the Governor in Council may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such Resolution whereupon any roads mentioned in such Resolution shall be main roads: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm such Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the roads mentioned in the Schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board main roads within the meaning and for the purpose of the *Country Roads Act 1928*.

Resolution Declaring Main Roads under the Country Roads Act.

The Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) at a meeting now holden being of opinion that the highways within the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule hereunder written are of sufficient importance to be main roads acting under the powers conferred upon it by the said Act doth by this Resolution hereby declare such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the said *Country Roads Act 1928*.

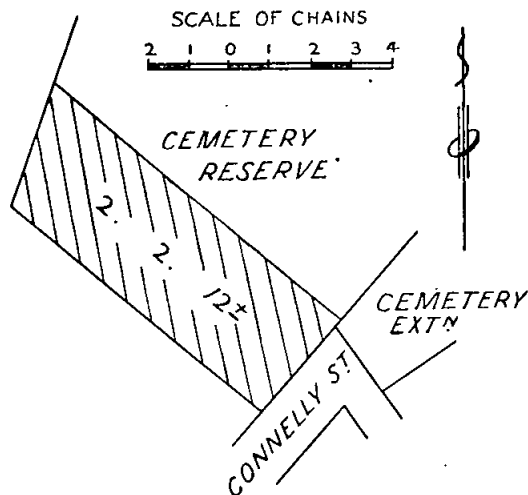

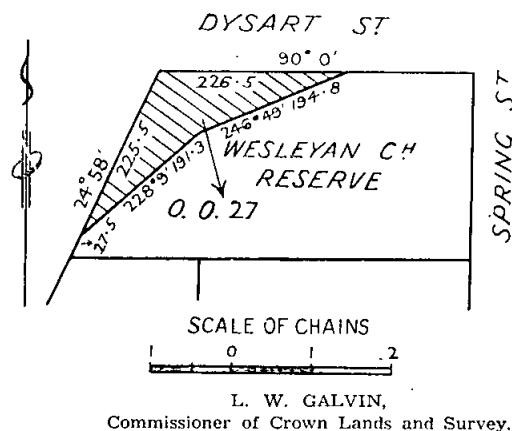

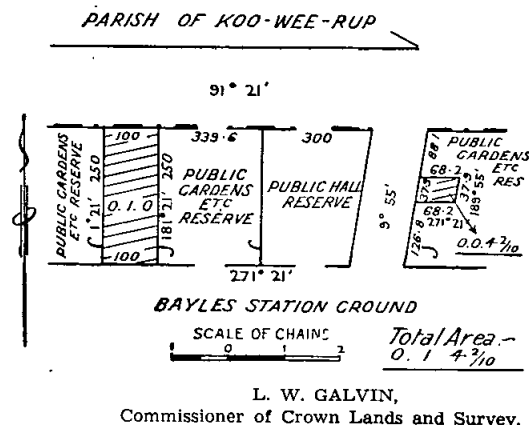

BY-LAW 122.

NOTICE is hereby given that a By-law intituled as follows, and a summary of which appears hereunder, was duly made by the Council of the City of Geelong, by resolution dated the 27th day of May, 1947, and confirmed by the Council on the 24th day of June, 1947, a copy of which By-law is open for inspection, free of charge, during office hours, at the Town Clerk's office, City Hall, Geelong:—

Title.

A By-law of the City of Geelong, made under the provisions of the *Carriages Act* 1928, and numbered 122, for (*inter alia*) the following purposes, or with respect to:—

- (a) Licensing, regulating, and limiting the number of hackney carriages plying, kept, or let out for hire within the City of Geelong, and 8 miles from the corporate limits of the said city.
- (b) Application for licences, and the terms and conditions thereof, and the refusal, suspension, or cancellation of such licences.
- (c) Constructional requirements.
- (d) The conduct of owners, drivers, and passengers.
- (e) Hiring agreements.
- (f) Lost or forgotten property found or left in hackney carriages.
- (g) Stands for hackney carriages.
- (h) Recording instruments fitted to hackney carriages.
- (i) The fares to be charged for hirers and passengers.
- (j) Repealing and consolidating the By-laws of the City of Geelong relating to hackney carriages.

Summary of the Contents.

- Clause 1.—Defines the words therein referred to.
Clause 2.—Repeals By-laws set out in First Schedule.
Clause 3.—Provides that except by permit under clause 12—

- (1) No carriage to operate unless duly licensed as hackney carriage.
- (2) Private hire cars not to ply for hire in a public place.
- (3) Hirer of hire-and-drive-yourself carriage not to operate it as a hackney carriage.

Clause 4.—Prescribes procedure on application for hackney carriage licence.

Clause 5.—No unsuitable carriage to be licensed.

Clause 6.—Prescribes constructional requirements for motor cars.

Clause 7.—Prescribes form of hackney carriage licence.

Clause 8.—Provides that inspector shall fix number of passengers carriage is designed to carry, and method of arriving at same. Also that number so fixed be legibly painted on outside of vehicle.

Clause 9.—Prescribes fees to be charged for hackney carriage licences.

Clause 10.—Prescribes for issue to owner and user, and affixing of number and tariff plates, and for deposit of 1s. 6d. thereon.

Clause 11.—New licence to be issued on substitution of new vehicle for old.

Clause 12.—(1) Prescribes procedure for obtaining consent to substitution of a carriage for licensed carriage to enable repairs to be effected, and effect of such substitution.

Clause 13.—Prescribes lighting for inside of cab.

Clause 14.—Owner is to keep licensed carriage sound, clean, and in good order.

Clause 15.—Prescribes inspector's duty and powers re examination of all licensed vehicles.

Clause 16.—Prescribes duties of inspector where licensed carriage is found unfit for use.

Clause 17.—Owner to report sale of licensed carriage.

Clause 18.—Owner not to entrust licensed carriage to any one except in case here specified.

Clause 19.—Owner or driver is not to exhibit advertisements, except such as are here specified.

Drivers' Licences.

Clause 20.—Driver must be licensed.

Clause 21.—Prescribes form of application for driver's licence.

Clause 22.—Prescribes form of driver's licence, and fee payable therefor, 5s.

Clause 23.—Provides for issue to every driver of a badge bearing licence number, and fee therefor, 2s. 6d.

Clause 24.—Prohibits driver from lending or parting with his licence or badge, or his licensed carriage, to another, unless so authorized by the owner.

Clause 25.—Provides that owner is, with the exception here specified, to retain a duplicate licence of driver.

Clause 26.—Prescribes procedure to be observed when driver leaves employ of owner.

Clause 27.—Owner, when requested, is to give inspector name and address of drivers employed by him.

Licences Generally.

Clause 28.—Prescribes duration of hackney carriage and drivers' licences.

Clause 29.—Applicant for licence to be of good fame and character.

Clause 30.—All licences to be signed by the City Treasurer.

Clause 31.—Licensee shall notify change of address, in writing, within two days.

Clause 32.—Prescribes procedure and conditions under which the Council or Court may suspend, cancel, or revoke any licence.

As to Hiring.

Clause 33.—Owners and drivers to fulfil agreements with persons hiring.

Clause 34.—Driver plying for hire on stand not to refuse passengers.

As to Hirers and Passengers.

Clause 35.—Prohibits other than the sole hirer from smoking in carriage.

Clause 36.—Controls conduct of passengers.

Clause 37.—Hirer to pay legal fare.

Clause 38.—On a dispute arising, hirer to give name and address to driver.

Lost or Forgotten Property.

Clause 39.—Passengers finding property in carriage to deliver same to the driver.

Clause 40.—Driver to examine carriage at conclusion of journey for property left therein.

Clause 41.—Owner or driver of carriage to deposit any lost property found therein in the office of the Town Clerk.

Clause 42.—Specified conditions, and the procedure under which lost property may be sold.

Conduct of Drivers.

Clause 43.—Every driver to carry a copy of this By-law and his licence, and produce licence on demand.

Clause 44.—Provides that no driver of a licensed carriage plying for hire on a stand may refuse to carry passengers, except in the event here specified.

Clause 45.—Driver to be in constant attendance when operating licensed carriage.

Clause 46.—Driver not to obstruct traffic.

Clause 47.—Owner or driver (except as here provided) not to permit licensed carriage to stand longer than necessary in the places here specified.

Clause 48.—Drivers to conform to the rules of the road.

Clause 49.—Competitive driving forbidden.

Clause 50.—Driver is not to permit any person to travel in licensed carriage without hirer's permission.

Clause 51.—Prohibits driver from smoking whilst driving carriage under hire.

Clause 52.—Prohibits the carrying of diseased persons, coffins, or deceased human bodies in licensed carriage.

Clause 53.—No merchandise to be carried, and all luggage carried shall be clean.

Clause 54.—Driver may refuse to carry intoxicated or offensive persons, with the exceptions here specified.

Clause 55.—Driver to take up and set down passengers as near as conveniently may be to the side of the street.

Clause 56.—Driver not to carry any animal in licensed carriage.

Clause 57.—Prohibits soliciting passengers, except as here specified.

Clause 58.—In cases here specified, drivers to obey lawful instructions of police or inspector.

Taxi Cabs.

Clause 59.—Specifies equipment for taxi cabs.

Clause 60.—Provides for standard taximeter, or one of approved type.

Clause 61.—Taximeters to be tested, sealed, &c., as here prescribed.

Clause 62.—Provides for testing and keeping of taximeter in good order.

Clause 63.—Provisions *re* user of, and testing of, taximeters.

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Clause 64.—Fees for testing of taximeters.

Clause 65.—Provisions to be observed by driver of taxi-cab in the use of the taximeter.

Clause 66.—Limits number of taxi-cabs to be licensed to 55.

Private Hire Carriages.

CITY OF MORDIALLOC.

By-Law No. 86.

A By-law of the City of Mordialloc, made under section 326 of the *Health Act* 1923, as amended by the *Health Acts* 1935 and 1941, and numbered 86, for prescribing the fees for registration and renewal and transfer of registration of premises.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Acts*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Mordialloc, with the approval of the Governor in Council, do hereby order as follows:—

1. From and after the date of this By-law coming into operation By-laws 42 and 67 of the City of Mordialloc shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. The following fees shall be payable for granting or annual renewal of registration of the following premises respectively:—

(a) Offensive trades premises (other than those referred to below)—Five pounds.

Offensive trades premises (being fat extracting or melting or rendering works which are conducted at premises occupied principally as a butcher's shop and at which fat is extracted, melted, or rendered only from materials derived from such shop)—One pound.

(b) Boarding houses—Ten shillings.

(c) Common lodging houses—Ten shillings.

(d) Eating houses—Ten shillings.

(e) Premises (whether a licensed victualler's premises or not) on which are manufactured or prepared for sale ice cream, ices, ginger beer, hop beer, or any other similar beer, lemonade, cordials, soda water, lithia water, or other mineral water, or any artificially aerated water—Five shillings.

(f) Premises at or in any part of which eggs for sale are received or stored for the purpose of being chilled—One pound.

3. For any transfer of registration—Two shillings and six pence.

4. This By-law shall have force and apply throughout the whole of the Municipal District of Mordialloc, and shall come into operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

separate heading of "Upwey" shall be added the words "The land abutting on the north-western boundary of Mast Gully-road, being lots 1, 2, 3, and 4 on plan of subdivision 6051, lodged in the Office of Titles."

3. The principal By-law shall be altered as follows:—

In the Second Schedule of the By-law under the heading "Emerald" the words commencing "the land abutting to a depth of 300 feet on the south side of the main Belgrave-Emerald road" and ending with the words "intersection with the Emerald-Monbulk road" are hereby repealed and the following shall be substituted therefor:—

"The land abutting to a depth of 165 feet on the eastern and south-eastern boundary of the main Belgrave-Emerald-Gembrook road commencing at its intersection with the southern boundary of a Government road known as Paternoster's-road and proceeding for a distance of 430 feet southerly and south-westerly."

The land abutting to a depth of 200 feet on the western boundary of the main Belgrave-Emerald-Gembrook road commencing at its intersection with the south-western boundary of the Emerald-Monbulk road and proceeding for a distance of 750 feet southerly and south-westerly.

The land abutting to a depth of 165 feet on the northern boundary of the main Belgrave-Emerald road commencing at the eastern boundary of a Government road abutting on the Gembrook railway line and proceeding easterly to a point, distant 163 feet east of the south-western corner of Crown allotment 9, section A, Township of Emerald.

The land abutting to a depth of 165 feet on the south-eastern boundary of the main Belgrave road and the eastern boundary of the main Beaconsfield-Emerald road and comprising Crown allotments 4B, 4C, 4D, 4E, 4F, 4G, 4H, 4I, 4K, 4L, 4M, section A, Township of Emerald.

The land within the Township of Emerald bounded on the north by the southern boundary of the main Belgrave-Emerald road, on the east and south-east by the western and north-western boundaries of the main Beaconsfield-Emerald road, and on the south-west by the rails of the Gembrook railway line."

3. This By-law shall apply to, and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

REGULATION No. 10.

Regulation No. 10, made under section No. 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, for the care, protection, and management of Public Reserves within the Shire of Lillydale.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lillydale do hereby make the following Regulation:—

1. All previous Regulations passed by the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lillydale, relating to the care, protection, and management of Public Reserves within the Shire of Lillydale, are hereby repealed.

2. This Regulation shall have effect in, and be applicable to, every Public Reserve within the Shire of Lillydale, owned by or vested in the Lillydale Shire Council.

3. The Reserves shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.

4. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to any Reserve on such days as such Reserve may be set apart for sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, shall be as follows:—

For admission of every adult, such sum as the Committee of Management appointed by the Lillydale Shire Council may determine, not exceeding Two shillings.

For admission of every saddle horse, exclusive of rider, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings.

For admission of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings.

For the admission of every additional horse, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

5. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

6. No society, club, picnic party, or other combined body shall use the Reserves without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, cut names on the fences, trees, seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in or around the Reserves, or pollute any water thereon, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, or manure.

8. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, or other property in the Reserves, or roll or throw any stones or other missiles thereon, or commit any nuisance, or leave in the Reserves any bottles, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter.

9. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserves, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

10. No person shall light any fire in the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

11. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserves, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations for young trees or shrubs.

12. No person shall bring into the Reserves any dog, unless led by a cord or chain, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management; and all dogs, goats, and poultry found wandering in the Reserves shall be liable to be destroyed.

13. No person shall place in the Reserves any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

14. No person shall engage in any game or sport or dancing in the Reserves on Sundays, excepting the games of tennis and cricket, which may be played between the hours of Two o'clock and Six o'clock in the afternoon on the condition that competitive games between teams are not played.

15. Every person hiring or erecting in the Reserves any booth, tent, table, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or for the purpose of any game or amusement, shall pay such fee as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine.

16. No person shall play any unlawful game, or make any wager for money, or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within the Reserve.

17. Any person offending against this Regulation shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.
