AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c. WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3 and 6 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION

PROCLAMATION OF TOURISTS' ROADS

Duties.—To investigate and report upon the health of school children, to give to teachers and pupils such instruction as may be required by the Department in the fundamentals of personal, school, and domestic hygiene, and public health, to co-operate with school dentists, and to undertake such other cognate work as directed.

Qualifications.—To be a legally qualified medical practitioner registered or entitled to be registered in Victoria, and to furnish evidence of—(a) knowledge and experience in sanitary science, especially in regard to the study of infectious and other communicable diseases and their prevention, (b) study of the diseases of children, (c) study of the physiology and pathology of the special senses, and (d) knowledge of educational methods from the physiological and psychological standpoint. Police Regulation Act 1946. POLICE FORCE OF VICTORIA.

DETERMINATION No. 5 OF THE POLICE CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

The Police Classification Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Police Regulation Act* 1946, hereby makes the following Determination, that is to say:—

- 1. In this Determination unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:—
 - "Member of the Police Force" means any person (whether male or female) employed in the Police Force of Victoria and includes any Constable, First Constable, Senior Constable, Second Class Sergeant, First Class Sergeant, Sub-Inspector, Inspector, Chief Inspector, Superintendent, or Inspecting Superintendent.
 - "Officer" means any Inspecting Superintendent, Superintendent, Chief Inspector, Inspector, and Sub-Inspector of the Police Force of Victoria.
 - "Police Force" means the Police Force of Victoria.
- Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular to include the plural and the plural to include the singular, unless the contrary as to gender or number is expressly provided.

PART I.

Retention Examination.

- 3. A member of the Police Force shall, before the completion of twelve months' service, pass an examination which shall be called the "retention examination." The Chief Commissioner of Police shall arrange for each member of the Police Force concerned to sit for the retention examination before the expiration of such period of service.
- 4. The retention examination shall be conducted by means of written examinations upon the following subjects:—
 - (1) Examination in the educational subjects of Arithmetic, English, Civics, and Geography up to the standard of the proficiency certificate issued by the Department of Education of Victoria. Any member of the Police Force who is the holder of such certificate shall be deemed to have passed the said educational subjects.
 - (2) Examination in elementary law and police duties upon such matters as are contained in a syllabus approved of by the Chief Commissioner of Police after consultation with the examiner.
 - (3) The retention examination shall be conducted by the examiners appointed for the purpose by the Chief Commissioner of Police.
 - (4) Each examiner shall direct the work of the examination conducted by him and fix the duration thereof, and shall allot marks for such examination. Any candidate who secures at least 60 per centum of the maximum number of marks shall be deemed to have passed the examination.
 - (5) After each retention examination the examiners shall furnish to the Chief Commissioner of Police a list giving the examination number of each candidate who has passed the retention examination. The Chief Commissioner of Police shall publish in the *Police Gazette* a list of the names of members of the Police Force (together with their examination numbers) who have passed the examination and record the result of the examination on the record of each candidate.
- 5. The above-mentioned provisions shall apply only to members of the Police Force who are appointed to such Force subsequent to the first day of January, 1948.

PART II.

Conditions to be Observed in Effecting Promotions and Filling Vacant Positions.

Division I.

- 6. Subject to the completion of any necessary service a member of the Police Force shall be entitled as of right to present himself for any of the examinations prescribed by this Determination.
- 7. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Determination a constable shall, after the completion of ten years' service, be promoted to the rank of first constable provided he has for the last two years in

the former rank been free from punishment other than reprimand or caution, or if before the completion of such service he passes the examinations prescribed for promotion to the rank of senior constable he shall thereupon be promoted to the rank of first constable provided he has for the last two years in the rank of constable been free from punishment other than reprimand or caution.

- 8. (1) No member of the Police Force shall be promoted to the rank of senior constable unless he has passed the theoretical and practical examinations prescribed in paragraph 10 of this Determination.
- (2) No member of the Police Force shall be permitted to present himself for the practical examination before he has completed seven years' service as a member of the Police Force, but he may present himself for the theoretical examination after the completion of two years' service as a member of the Police Force.
- 9. Any member of the Police Force who has passed the examinations conducted in connexion with the school which is established for the training of detectives in the Police Force shall, if or when he has completed seven years' service as a member of the Police Force, be deemed to have passed both the theoretical and practical examinations prescribed for promotion to the rank of senior constable.
- 10. (1) The examinations for promotion to the rank of senior constable shall be—
 - (a) an examination in respect of theoretical law; and
 - (b) a practical examination in respect of police duties.
- (2) The first-mentioned examination is hereinafter referred to as the first examination, and the last-mentioned examination is hereinafter referred to as the second examination.
- 11. (1) No member of the Police Force shall be promoted to the rank or grade of second class sergeant or first class sergeant unless he has passed the examinations prescribed in paragraph 12 of this Determination.
- (2) No member of the Police Force shall be permitted to present himself for the practical examination before he has completed fifteen years' service as a member of the Police Force or has been promoted to the rank of senior constable. Any member of the Police Force may present himself for the theoretical examination at any time after he has passed the theoretical examination for promotion to the rank of senior constable.
- 12. (1) The examinations for promotion to the rank of sergeant shall be— $\,$
 - (a) an examination in respect of theoretical law; and
 - (b) a practical examination in respect of police duties.
- (2) The first-mentioned examination is hereinafter referred to as the third examination, and the last-mentioned examination is hereinafter referred to as the fourth examination.
- 13. (1) No member of the Police Force shall be promoted to the rank of officer unless he has passed the examination prescribed in paragraph 14 of this Determination.
- (2) No member of the Police Force shall be permitted to present himself for the examination mentioned in paragraph 14 of this Determination until he has been promoted to the rank of sergeant.
- 14. The examination for promotion to the rank of officer (hereinafter referred to as the fifth examination) shall be a practical examination in respect of the police duties of an officer.
- 15. (1) No member of the Police Force who is appointed thereto on any date subsequent to the first day of January, 1948, shall be promoted to the rank of officer unless, before passing the examination referred to in paragraph 14 of this Determination, he has passed a written examination in the educational subjects of Arithmetic, English, Civics, and Geography, up to the standard of the Intermediate Certificate issued by the University of Melbourne.
- (2) Any member of the Police Force may present himself for examination in respect of the educational subjects after he has completed twelve months' service as a member of the Police Force.
- (3) Any member of the Police Force who is the holder of an Intermediate Certificate issued by the University of Melbourne, or any equivalent certificate issued by any other university, approved of by the Chief Commissioner of Police, shall be deemed to have passed the said examination in respect of educational subjects.

- (4) The examination in respect of the educational subjects shall be conducted by an examiner appointed by the Chief Commissioner of Police in conformity with a syllabus approved of by the Chief Commissioner of Police after consultation with the examiner. Such examiner shall direct and conduct the work of such examination, fix the duration thereof, and be responsible for the conformity of the examination papers to the syllabus. The Chief Commissioner of Police shall arrange for such examination to be held at least once in every calendar year. The examiner shall allot marks for such examination, and any candidate who secures at least 60 per centum of the maximum number of marks shall be deemed to have passed the examination. After each examination the examiner shall furnish to the Chief Commissioner of Police a list giving the examination number of each candidate who has passed the examination. The Chief Commissioner of Police shall publish in the Police Gazette a list of the names of members of the Police Force (together with their examination numbers) who have passed the examination and record the result of the examination on the record of each candidate.
- (5) Any member of the Police Force whose name does not appear in the list of those who have passed such examination, and who has secured a pass in two or three of the prescribed subjects, may present himself at any subsequent examination in respect of the remaining subjects or subject for which he did not secure a pass. If at any subsequent examination he secures a pass in the remaining subjects or subject he shall be deemed to have passed the examination in the above-mentioned educational subjects.
- 16. (1) The first and third examinations shall be conducted by a person appointed for that purpose by the Chief Commissioner of Police, and such examiner shall be known as the first examiner.
- (2) The second, fourth, and fifth examinations shall be conducted by a person appointed for that purpose by the Chief Commissioner of Police and such examiner shall be known as the second examiner.
- 17. The first examiner shall prepare the examination papers in respect of the first and third examinations, and shall direct the work of such examinations and shall be responsible for the conformity of the examination papers to the appropriate syllabus.
- 18. The second examiner shall prepare the examination papers in respect of the second, fourth, and fifth examinations and shall direct the work of such examinations and shall be responsible for the conformity of the examination papers to the appropriate syllabus.
- 19. (1) The first, second, third, fourth, and fifth examinations shall in each case be written and consist of a two-hour paper.
- (2) Such examinations shall be held at the building known as the Police Depot, St. Kilda-road, Melbourne, or such other premises as may be selected by the Chief Commissioner of Police.
- 20. The first examiner and the second examiner shall allot marks for the respective examinations conducted by them, and any candidate who secures at least 60 per centum of the maximum number of marks in each examination shall be deemed to have passed the same.
- 21. Upon completion of the first, second, third, fourth, or fifth examinations (as the case may be) the examiner concerned shall cause to be sent to the Chief Commissioner of Police a return setting forth the examination number of each member of the Police Force who has passed the examination in question, and it shall be the duty of the Chief Commissioner of Police to make an appropriate record of each examination passed by a member of the Police Force from time to time, and to publish in the *Police Gazette* a list of the names of members of the Police Force (together with their respective examination numbers) who have passed any of the said examinations.
- 22. The first, second, third, fourth, and fifth examinations shall be held at least once in every calendar year on such date or dates as may be determined by the Chief Commissioner of Police after consultation with the examiner concerned.
- 23. The Chief Commissioner of Police after consultation with the examiner concerned shall approve of a syllabus in respect of the first, second, third, fourth, and fifth examinations and shall cause such syllabi to be published in the *Police Gazette* as soon as practicable after the preparation thereof.
- 24. The Chief Commissioner of Police shall cause to be published in the *Police Gazette* notice of the day upon which each prescribed examination (other than the retention examination) will be conducted. Such notice shall be published at least ten weeks before the day fixed for the holding of the examination in question.

- 25. A member of the Police Force who desires to present himself for any prescribed examination (other than the retention examination) shall, through the officer in charge of his district, make a written application in that behalf to the Chief Commissioner of Police at least fourteen days before the day on which the examination will be hold
- 26. (1) The Chief Commissioner of Police shall allot every candidate for any examination a number before holding such examination.
- (2) Before the holding of each examination the Chief Commissioner of Police shall furnish to the examiner concerned a list of the numbers which he has allotted to the respective candidates for the examination concerned.
- 27. Any candidate sitting for an examination shall be regarded as on duty on the day on which such examination is held.
- 28. No member of the Police Force shall without the consent of the Chief Commissioner of Police be permitted to present himself for any examination after he has failed to secure a pass at such examination upon his third attempt.
- 29. (1) Any member of the Police Force, who, before the operation of Division I. of Part II. of this Determination, has passed the theoretical examination for promotion to senior constable shall be deemed to have passed the first examination prescribed by this Determination, and if before the operation of Division I. of Part II. of this Determination he has passed the practical examination for promotion to senior constable he shall be deemed to have passed the second examination prescribed by this Determination.
- (2) Any member of the Police Force who, before the operation of Division I. of Part II. of this Determination, has passed either the theoretical examination for promotion to officer or the practical examination for promotion to the rank or grade of second class sergeant or first class sergeant (as the case may be) shall be deemed to have passed the third and fourth examinations prescribed by this Determination.
- (3) Any member of the Police Force who, before the operation of Division I. of Part II. of this Determination, has passed the practical examination for promotion to the rank or grade of sub-inspector shall be deemed to have passed the fifth examination prescribed by this Determination.
- 30. Where practicable the Chief Commissioner of Police shall arrange for suitable persons to conduct courses of lectures upon the said syllabi to enable candidates to prepare themselves for the various examinations hereinbefore prescribed. Before such lectures are held the Chief Commissioner of Police shall prescribe such text-books, papers or other documents which are considered necessary for reference purposes.
- 31. Each examiner shall in respect of any examination conducted by him make memoranda as material for a report which he shall, upon a request, furnish to the Chief Commissioner of Police, or to an unsuccessful candidate.

Division II.

- 32. (1) Whenever any vacancy occurs in any male rank or grade within the Police Force, it shall, subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, be filled forthwith by promoting thereto the senior member of the Police Force—
 - (a) who is in the rank or grade next below the rank or grade in which the vacancy occurs or if there is no such person in the first-mentioned rank or grade, the senior member of the Police Force in the next rank or grade thereto;
 - (b) who has passed the prescribed examination (if any) necessary to fill the vacant rank or grade; and
 - (c) who has for the last three years of his service been free from punishment other than reprimand or caution.
- (2) Whenever any position below the male rank of sub-inspector become vacant within the Police Force it shall, subject to the provisions of this Determination, be filled by transferring to such vacant position the senior male member of the Police Force—
 - (a) who is in the rank or grade concerned;
 - (b) who has applied for such vacancy in the manner hereinafter provided; and
 - (c) who has for the last three years of his service been free from punishment other than reprimand or caution.

- (3) Whenever any vacancy occurs in any rank of the female members of the Police Force it shall, subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, be filled forthwith by promoting thereto the senior female member of the Police Force—
 - (a) who is in the rank or grade next below the rank or grade in which the vacancy occurs or if there is no such person in the first-mentioned rank or grade, the senior female member of the Police Force in the next rank or grade thereto:
 - (b) who has passed the prescribed examinations (if any) necessary to fill the vacant rank or grade; and
 - (c) who has for the last three years of her service been free from punishment other than reprimand or caution.
- (4) Whenever any position for female members of the Force becomes vacant it shall, subject to the provisions of this Determination, be filled by transferring to such vacant position the senior female member of the Police Force—
 - (a) who is in the rank or grade concerned;
 - (b) who has applied for such vacancy in the manner hereinafter provided; and
 - (c) who has for the last three years of her service been free from punishment other than reprimand or caution.
- (5) Whenever any vacant position arises in any of the branches, sections, or positions contained in the Schedule to this Determination it shall be filled by transferring thereto the applicant selected by the Chief Commissioner of Police and who in addition has passed the prescribed examinations (if any) to fill the vacant position.
- (6) Whenever any position above the male rank of sergeant becomes vacant within the Police Force it shall be filled by transferring thereto the applicant selected by the Chief Commissioner of Police and who in addition has passed the prescribed examinations (if any) to fill the vacant position.
- (7) Any member of the Police Force who is about to be promoted to the next higher rank or grade, or is likely to be so promoted, and who does not desire to accept such promotion shall, as soon as practicable, notify the Chief Commissioner of Police in writing of his intention not to accept the promotion.
- (8) If any member of the Police Force is about to be promoted to the next higher rank or grade, in accordance with this Determination, and he is notified in writing by the Chief Commissioner of Police that to effect such promotion it will be necessary for such member to be transferred to another position within the Police Force and that such transfer will, for the time being, adversely affect his emolument as a member of the Police Force, he, the said member of the Police Force, shall thereupon inform the Chief Commissioner of Police in writing either that he is unwilling to accept the proposed promotion and transfer or that he is willing to accept his promotion in order of seniority, and is prepared to accept the proposed transfer for the purposes of receiving his promotion.
- (9) In any case where the Chief Commissioner of Police receives a notification (under either of the last two preceding sub-paragraphs) from a member of the Police Force that he does not intend to accept promotion, the member of the Police Force who is next in order of seniority shall, subject to and in accordance with the provisions of this Determination, be promoted.
- 33. In every case where a position becomes vacant within the Police Force the Chief Commissioner of Police shall within twenty-eight days of such vacancy occurring cause an advertisement of the said vacancy to be published in the *Police Gazette* to afford eligible members of the Police Force a reasonable opportunity to apply therefor.
- 34. (1) Such advertisement shall contain a date on or before which applications for transfer to such vacancy may be made to the Chief Commissioner of Police and a summary of the duties of and the appropriate qualifications relating to the vacancy.
- (2) Such date shall be a date which is at least ten days after the date on which the advertisement was published in the *Police Gazette*.
- 35. Every applicant for transfer to a vacant position advertised in accordance with the provisions of this Determination shall apply therefor by an application in writing addressed to the Chief Commissioner of Police through the officer in charge of the district in which the applicant is stationed or attached.

- 36. An applicant for transfer to a vacant position so advertised shall not be required to have passed any prescribed examination in respect of any rank or grade which is higher than the rank or grade necessary to fill the vacant position so advertised.
- 37. (1) The relative seniority of members of the Police Force shall be determined by the relative seniority of the offices or positions in which such members are employed or classified.

Provided that-

- (a) Where members of the Police Force are employed or classified in offices or positions of equal seniority, the member of the Police Force first appointed to one of such offices or positions shall be the senior;
- (b) Where two or more members of the Police Force are appointed to offices or positions of equal seniority on the same day, the relative seniority, inter se, of such members before the date of such appointment shall not be affected.
- (2) In the relative seniority of offices or positions the office or position with the higher or highest pay attached thereto shall be the senior. In this provision "pay" means only the salary of a member of the Police Force and does not included any allowances or any money equivalent for any allowances which (in addition to his salary) a member of the Police Force is entitled to receive as such.

PART III.

Miscellaneous.

- 38. In order to maintain the discipline and efficiency of the Police Force, members of such Force may be transferred at any time to any police station or part of Victoria for the performance of any temporary duty.
- 39. Any member of the Police Force who has rendered meritorious service or is possessed of special qualifications may be promoted to brevet rank. Provided however no such promotion shall be effected unless such member has passed the prescribed examinations in respect of the rank to which he is promoted.
- 40. The Chief Commissioner of Police shall, in a book kept for the purpose, register the names of members of the Police Force in order of their seniority.
- 41. In any case where no application is received by the Chief Commissioner of Police in respect of a vacancy advertised in accordance with this Determination a suitable and qualified member of the Police Force may be transferred to fill such vacancy.
- 42. Upon a member of the Police Force being transferred for the purpose of filling a vacant position, the Chief Commissioner of Police shall publish in the *Police Gazette* the name of the member of the Police Force so transferred. After such publication the Chief Commissioner of Police, shall, where practicable, cause the transfer to be effected within twenty-eight days thereafter.
- 43. No member of the Police Force shall be promoted from the rank of sergeant to the rank of sub-inspector after he attains his fifty-seventh birthday.

PART IV.

Operation of Determination.

44. Part II., Division II., and Part III. of this Determination shall come into operation on the first day of September, 1947, and Part I. and Part II., Division I., thereof, shall come into operation on the first day of January, 1948.

WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the twenty-first day of July One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven the Country Roads Board incorporated under the Country Roads Act 1928 (No. 3662) being of opinion that the highways in the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule to the same are of sufficient importance to be main roads and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid: And whereas the said Act amongst other things provides that the Government Gazette confirm such Resolution whereupon any roads mentioned in such Resolution whereupon any roads mentioned in such Resolution the Resolution so made and passed by the said shall be main roads: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm such Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the Government Gazette the roads mentioned in the Schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the Country Roads Act 1928.

AMENDMENTS TO REGULATIONS RE SCHOOLING, ETC.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprentice-ship Acts and the Acts Interpretation Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke the Regulations mentioned in the Schedule hereto to the extent that the same are expressed in the said Schedule to be revoked, and doth hereby make the following Recyclicity. following Regulations:-

Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "General Regulations (No. 7)." $\,$

Interpretation.

2. In these Regulations "Applicant" has the same meaning as is assigned to it by section 26 of the *Apprenticeship Act* 1928, as amended by any Act.

Attendance at Prescribed Classes for Instruction.

- 3. Every apprentice and applicant in any apprenticeship trades shall attend the classes for instruction in the subjects of his apprenticeship course at such times and at such place or places and on such occasions while the classes are open for instruction as the Commission directs by notice in writing in the form prescribed by General Regulations (No. 1) made under the Acts, provided that the number of evenings on which such apprentice or applicant shall be required to attend shall not exceed two in any one week.
- 4. Every apprentice and applicant who has been notified to attend classes as $\operatorname{directed}\!\!-\!\!\!\!-$
 - (i) shall attend punctually at the time appointed for the commencement thereof and shall not with-out the permission of the instructor leave the same before the appointed time for leaving;
 - (ii) shall be diligent and behave in a decorous manner while in the school or class;
 - (iii) shall not destroy and shall take care of any material or equipment provided for his use in the school or class;
 - (iv) shall in each term attend at least 80 per cent. of the day classes and of the evening classes prescribed for his apprenticeship course.
- 5. Where attendance at technical school classes is impracticable every apprentice or applicant shall enrol for and undertake a correspondence course for instruction in the subjects of his apprenticeship course as the Commission directs by notice in writing in the form prescribed by General Regulations (No. 6).
- 6. Every apprentice or applicant who has been notified to enrol and undertake a correspondence course shall complete or make a bona fide attempt to complete at least 80 per cent. of the test papers forwarded to him for completion and shall duly return the same to the correspondence school from which he received the same.

Employer to Permit Apprentice or Applicant to Attend Classes.

7. Every employer who has been given notice in writing in the form prescribed by General Regulations (No. 1) shall, while the classes are open for instruction, permit his apprentices and applicants to attend for instruction at the school or schools and class or classes at the hours and on the occasions specified in such notice.

Where attendance at technical school classes is im-Where attendance at technical school classes is impracticable every employer who has been given notice in writing in the form prescribed by General Regulations shall permit the apprentice or applicant, without deduction from his wages during ordinary working hours for not more than eight hours in any week during his apprenticeship course, to perform on the employer's premises the theoretical and/or practical work of or incidental to the correspondence course.

Apprentice or Applicant shall Submit Himself for Examination.

8. Every apprentice or applicant attending the aforesaid class or classes shall submit himself for examination in the subjects of his apprenticeship course at the places and times determined by the Commission.

Apprentice or Applicant to Provide Books, Materials, &c.

9. Every apprentice or applicant shall, at his own cost and expense, provide himself with the necessary books, drawing instruments, and materials required at the classes for instruction, unless otherwise provided by the school authorities or other bodies.

Penalties for Non-attendance, Misbehaviour, &c.

10. If any apprentice or applicant fails to comply with the provisions of clauses 3-6 of these Regulations, the Commission may impose on him a fine not exceeding £1 for a first offence and not exceeding £2 for a second or any subsequent offence.

Penalties for Breach of Indentures of Apprenticeship.

11. If any apprentice commits a breach of any covenant of his indentures of apprenticeship, the Commission may impose on him a fine not exceeding £1 for a first breach and not exceeding £2 for a second or any subsequent

12. The employer of any apprentice who has been fined by the Commission, under the provisions of Regulations 10 or 11 hereof, shall, when notified by the Commission of such fine, deduct the amount of such fine from the wages of the apprentice or applicant and pay the same to the Commission within fourteen days of such deduction.






