AMENDMENT OF PROCLAMATION OF FOREST
ROADS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 (1) of the *Country Roads (Forest Roads and Stock Routes) Act* 1943 the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Country Roads Board after consultation with the Minister of Forests and the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey did on the nineteenth day of February, 1946, make a Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of the 20th idem proclaiming certain roads described in a Schedule attached to the said Proclamation to be Forest Roads for the purposes of the said Act:

And whereas it has been deemed advisable by the above-mentioned authorities to amend the said Proclamation:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the said Proclamation of the nineteenth day of February, 1946, by the substitution of the words "Bairnsdale-Dargo road" for the words "Cob-bannah-Lindenow road" appearing in line 3 of the said Schedule.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—BOROUGH OF RINGWOOD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act* 1946 (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Ringwood has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street by the said Council within the said Borough, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the Borough of Ringwood aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

BOROUGH OF RINGWOOD.—PUBLIC HIGHWAY.

Commencing at a point on the west side of Wonga Park-road; thence westerly 3,028.4 links along a line bearing 270 deg. 5 min. to the east side of Wonga-road; thence northerly along the east side of Wonga-road for a distance of 100 links; thence easterly along a line bearing 90 deg. 5 min., as shown on lodged plan 4315, for a distance of 3,030.3 links; thence south-westerly to the commencing point.

SUPERANNUATION SCHEME.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Sewerage Districts Act 1945* (No. 5021), and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby approve of the establishment by the Bendigo Sewerage Authority of a scheme to make provision for its employees, or their dependants, on death, resignation, or retirement from or ceasing to be in the service of the Trust, as set forth in the subjoined rules of the scheme, adopted by the Trust on the 26th day of May, 1947, and designated the Bendigo Sewerage Authority Superannuation Scheme.

RULES.

Definition of Terms.

- "Authority" means Bendigo Sewerage Authority.
 "Society" means The Australasian Temperance and General Mutual Life Assurance Society Limited.
 "Commencement date" means the twelfth day of April One thousand nine hundred and forty-six.
 "Scheme" means the Bendigo Sewerage Authority Superannuation Scheme.
 "Employee" means a person of either sex who is designated by the Authority as being appointed, or having been appointed, to the Authority's staff.
 "Present employee" means an employee as above defined who is in the employ of the Authority at the commencement date.
 "New employee" means an employee as above defined who enters the employ of the Authority after the commencement date or who, having been previously employed by the Authority and having ceased for any reason to be in that employment, is re-employed by the Authority after that date.
 "Member" means an employee who is a contributor to the said scheme, and is entitled to benefits thereunder.
 "Salary" means the employee's fixed rate of salary or wages from the Authority, but does not include payments made for overtime, travelling allowances, commission, bonus, gratuity, any other payment of a special nature, or any deduction from or suspension of salary or wages of an employee in respect of his absence from duty or otherwise.
 "Rules" mean these rules, together with any alterations and additions thereto, which may be from time to time in force.
 Unless the context otherwise requires—
 (a) The words appropriate to the masculine gender shall include the feminine.
 (b) The singular number shall include the plural, and vice versa.

GENERAL RULES.

- Object of Scheme.*—The object of the scheme is to provide for a lump sum to be available for employees or their dependants on death, resignation, or retirement from or ceasing to be in the service of the Authority.
- Constitution of Scheme.*—The scheme, including the welfare fund described in rule 18, shall be controlled by the Authority.
- Basis of Participation.*—The basis under which an employee shall participate in the scheme will depend upon his age next birthday at the time he becomes eligible for membership as follows:—
 (a) In the case of males not more than 55 years of age next birthday, and females not more than 45 years of age next birthday, participating endowment assurance or non-participating pure endowments will be effected with the society on the lives of such employees as hereinafter provided.
 (b) In the case of males in the service of the Authority at the commencement date who are more than 55 years of age next birthday, non-participating pure endowments will be effected with the society on the lives of such employees as hereinafter provided.

4. *Service.*

- War Service.*—Any person who was an employee immediately prior to undertaking war service and who shall return or shall have returned to the Authority's service immediately after being discharged from war service or within three calendar months thereafter, his period of war service shall be regarded as continuous service with the Authority for the purposes of determining the Authority's contribution under the scheme, except where his service with the Authority subsequently shall be terminated and recommended, in which event he shall, on recommencement of service with the Authority, be treated as having commenced his service with the Authority on the date of such recommencement without regard to prior war service.
- Non-continuous Service.*—Where a member shall have been in the employment of the Authority, but not continuously (except as provided under paragraph (a) of this rule (4)), his period of service shall be reckoned from the date of commencement of his last current period of continuous service before entering the scheme.
- Length of Service* shall be computed on a completed year or years.

5. *Eligibility.*—All present employees of the Authority shall be eligible for membership of the scheme. New employees shall be eligible for membership immediately they enter the service of the Authority provided they are then in the case of males not more than 55 years of age next birthday, and in the case of females not more than 45 years of age next birthday. It shall be compulsory for an eligible new employee to apply for membership.

All present employees desiring to join the scheme, and all new employees, shall make application for membership of the scheme on the prescribed form immediately they become eligible therefor, and shall, on acceptance of their applications by the Authority, be bound by these rules as from the date of such application. Notwithstanding anything in these rules contained, the Authority may refuse to accept any employee as a member, and its decision shall be final.

6. *Assurable Lives.*—Subject to the acceptance of his application for membership as provided in rule 5, the Authority shall effect, in respect of each employee referred to in rule 3 (a), and notwithstanding anything in the said rule 3 (a), provided in respect of certain male employees in the service of the Authority at the commencement date over the age of 55 years at that date who shall be acceptable to the society as an assurable risk, a participating endowment assurance on their respective lives for the amounts required under the scheme as hereinafter provided, and under which the respective sums assured will be payable with bonuses upon the attainment by the employee of the age of 65 years if male, and of the age of 55 years if female (or at such later age or the arrival of a later time as the Authority, in its sole discretion, may decide upon in any individual case of a present employee), or in the event of earlier death.

7. *Non-assurable Lives.*—Subject to the acceptance of his application for membership as aforesaid, the Authority shall effect, in respect of each employee referred to in rule 3 (a), which shall not in the opinion of the society be an assurable life, and in respect of each employee referred to in rule 3 (b), except certain present male employees who, although over the age mentioned in the said rule 3 (b), have had effected in respect of them under the scheme, participating endowment assurances as provided in rule 6, a non-participating pure endowment providing for payment of the sum assured thereunder upon the attainment by the employee of the age of 65 years if male, and of the age of 55 years if female (or at such later age, or the arrival of a later time as the Authority, in its sole discretion, may decide upon in any individual case of a present employee). A "non-participating pure endowment" means an assurance issued without participation in the profits of the society which provides for payment of the sum assured only upon the arrival of a specified time during the lifetime of the person whose life is assured thereunder whilst such person is in the employ of the Authority, and under which provision is made in the event of his employment with the Authority terminating on account of his death, or for any other reason prior to the expiration of the specified term, for payment of an amount equal to the sum of the premiums received by the society in respect of such assurance, together with compound interest thereon, at the rate applicable thereto as contained in the policy referred to in rule 13 hereof, up to the date of such termination of employment.

S. Contributions—

(a) *By Members.*—Each employee shall upon his application for membership being accepted by the Authority, and upon the society accepting an assurance on his life in accordance with the foregoing provisions of these rules, contribute to the scheme an amount equal to 2½ per cent. of his weekly salary. The Authority shall in respect of each member deduct the amount of the member's contribution from any sum which may be due by the Authority to the member by way of salary on each pay day.

(b) *By the Authority.*—Subject to the payment by each of the members of the contributions referred to in paragraph (a) of this rule 8, the Authority shall each week contribute in respect of each such member an amount equal to the member's contribution, and in respect of each male member in the employ of the Authority at the commencement date who had then attained the age of 30 years, an additional contribution equal to one-quarter per centum of the member's weekly salary for each completed year of service with the Authority after such age was attained up to the commencement date, such additional contribution to be calculated on the weekly salary being paid to the member at the commencement date.

9. *Salary Increases.*—On the anniversary of the commencement date in each year, both the member's contributions and the contributions then being paid by the Authority in respect of him shall be increased in accordance with any increase in salary which the member shall have received since entering the scheme, or since the last anniversary of the commencement date, whichever shall be applicable, and in the case of such member being a male, and having then attained the age of 55 years, or being a female, and having then attained the age of 45 years, or in any event, being a non-assurable life, as referred to in rule 7, the necessary increase in the amount of assurance cover shall be effected by way of a non-participating pure endowment, and in every other case the necessary increase in the amount of assurance cover shall be effected by way of a participating endowment assurance. The contributions payable by the Authority and the member in respect of any such increase in salary shall each be calculated at the basic rate of 2½ per centum. No increase in salary shall take effect unless a sum assured of at least £25, or an increase of 6d. per week, in the combined contribution of the member and the Authority shall be involved.

10. *Decreases in Salary.*—If at any anniversary of the commencement date a member's salary shall be less than that upon which his and the Authority's contributions shall be at that time based, the Authority's and the member's contributions shall be reduced accordingly.

To the extent of any increases in contributions previously made under rule 9, the decrease shall be at the basic rate mentioned in that rule, and beyond that limit at the rate otherwise applicable to the contributions of the member and Authority respectively.

No decrease shall take effect unless a sum assured of at least £50 or a reduction in the combined contribution of the member and the Authority of at least 1s. per week shall be involved.

That portion of his assurance, if a participating endowment assurance, represented by the amount of the reduction in his own and the Authority's contributions shall be converted into a paid-up policy and held by the Authority for the member until the date of his retirement, death, or leaving the service, whichever shall first happen, and the sum for which he shall be assured shall be reduced to the amount appropriate to the reduced contributions.

11. *Amount of Assurance.*—The amount of assurance, either endowment assurance or non-participating pure endowment, on the life of each member shall be that which, having regard to all the circumstances of the case and to the requirements of the society, the society shall be prepared to grant for a premium made up of the member's and the Authority's contributions as determined by rules 8 and 9, subject always to the provisions of rule 10.

12. *Payment of Premiums.*—When an assurance on the life of an employee of the Authority is effected in accordance with the foregoing provisions of these rules, the Authority shall duly and punctually pay to the society all premiums which shall become payable in respect of such assurance. The receipt of the cashier, secretary, manager, or other proper officer of the society shall be a sufficient discharge to the Authority for any payment made to the society.

13. *Master Policy.*—A master policy covering all members under one contract will be issued by the society to the Authority, and any moneys payable thereunder shall be paid to the Authority.

14. *Assurance Certificate.*—A certificate will be issued to each member to the effect that his life is assured as a member of the scheme. This certificate will show the initial sum assured and the name of the beneficiary nominated by the member. A member may arrange to change his beneficiary by giving notice to the Authority and having the change recorded by endorsement on his certificate. On the death of a member, the Authority shall pay the moneys becoming payable to the beneficiary, or should the member not nominate a beneficiary, or should a beneficiary so nominated predecease the member, the Authority shall be entitled to pay the amount payable at the death of the member to such person as shall appear to the Authority to be entitled to apply for probate of the last will and testament of the member, or for letters of administration of his intestate estate as the case may be, or alternatively at the Authority's discretion, to pay the amount to the legal personal representative of the deceased member after probate or letters of administration of his estate shall be or shall have been granted, and the receipt of such person or the legal personal representative, as the case may be, shall be a complete discharge to the Authority for such payment.

15. *Non-assignment of Benefits.*—A member shall not assign, alienate or dispose of, or in any way charge or otherwise encumber his interest in the benefits secured to him under the scheme to any other person, or nominate or purport to nominate any other person to be the recipient thereof, except that a member may nominate, in writing, a beneficiary to receive the benefit available upon the death of the member while in the employ of the Authority.

16. *Bankruptcy, &c.*—Any right, interest, or benefit of a member of the scheme is strictly personal, and if any such member shall become bankrupt, or shall attempt to assign, charge or dispose of, or otherwise to alienate or do, or suffer any act whereby or by reason whereof he would, but for this present provision, be deprived of the personal enjoyment of such right, interest, or benefit, the same shall immediately be forfeited to the scheme. Provided that in any such event the Authority, in its absolute discretion, may apply the moneys representing such right, interest, or benefit, or such part thereof as it may think fit, in or towards the maintenance or otherwise, for the benefit of such member, and the wife, husband, children, and dependants of such member, or such one or more to the exclusion of the other or others of them, and in such shares and proportions as the Authority shall deem fit. Any portion of the moneys not applied under the provisions of this rule shall be paid to the welfare fund referred to in rule 18 hereof.

17. *Retirement.*—A member shall retire from the Authority's service when he shall attain the age of 65 years if male, and the age of 55 years if female, or in the case of an employee in the service of the Authority, at the commencement date on the attainment of such age, or the arrival of such time as the Authority, in its absolute discretion, may decide in any individual case, and the amount of a member's retiring allowance shall be the proceeds of the assurance in respect of him under the scheme.

18. *Welfare Fund.*—As an integral part of the scheme, the society shall endow a welfare fund for the benefit of the members.

This fund shall be controlled by the Authority, and shall be applied wholly and solely for the benefit of the members in such manner and in such proportions as regards individual members as the Authority may, in its absolute discretion, think fit.

This fund may be used to meet the expense of a prolonged illness of a member, to assist in necessitous cases, to pay premiums during absence on account of illness, or in such other cases as the Authority shall deem fit in order to secure to the member the benefits on resignation, retirement, or death.

19. *Terms of Employment Unaffected by Membership.*—The operation of the scheme shall not in any way restrict the right of the Authority to terminate the employment of any member, or be used as an aggravation of damages in any action brought by any member against the Authority in respect of termination of the employment of such member.

20. *Leaving the Service.*—Should the services of a member as an employee of the Authority be terminated by the Authority or by the member other than by death

or retirement, he shall be entitled to the following benefits:—

(i) If he shall have—

- (a) Left the service on account of ill health, or had his services terminated for that reason, or
- (b) been compulsorily retired owing to the shortage of work after not less than ten completed years' service with the Authority,

he shall be granted title to the whole of the assurance in respect of him under the scheme, or in the case of a non-participating pure endowment, be entitled to receive the amount payable thereunder on such termination of employment on the basis that the whole of the contributions of the member and the Authority in respect of him are taken into account.

(ii) If, being a female member, she has married and leaves the service, or leaves the service to marry, and in either case has at the date of her so leaving the service served continuously with the Authority for five completed years, she shall, on submitting to the Authority such proof of marriage as it may require, be granted title to the whole of the assurance on her life under the scheme, or in the case of a non-participating pure endowment, be entitled to receive the amount payable thereunder on such termination of employment on the basis that the whole of the contributions of the member and the Authority in respect of her are taken into account.

(iii) In any other case he shall be granted a title only to that portion of the assurance on his life under the scheme represented by his own contributions, or in the case of a non-participating pure endowment, be entitled to receive so much of the amount payable thereunder on such termination of employment which bears to the full amount so payable the same ratio as the contributions paid by the member in respect of such non-participating pure endowment bears to the total contributions paid by the member and the Authority in respect thereof.

The member may, in respect of the portion of the assurance to which he shall be granted a title, and provided that same is an endowment assurance convert such assurance to an ordinary department policy the benefits under which shall be in all respects similar to those under the group assurance. Premiums under this policy shall be payable direct to one of the society's offices at monthly intervals, and the rate of premium shall remain unchanged. Alternatively he may, if two years' premiums shall have been paid, convert the assurance to a paid-up policy for a reduced sum assured on which no further premiums shall be payable.

If the member shall not wish to exercise either of the options described in the preceding paragraph, such assurance, being an endowment assurance, may be surrendered for cash in accordance with the society's table of surrender values for the time being in force.

Any portion of the assurance to which the Authority shall not grant the member a title shall be surrendered for cash, and the proceeds of such surrender, and any amount not made available to the member in respect of a non-participating pure endowment shall fall into and form part of the welfare fund hereinbefore referred to.

21. These Rules shall operate as from the 12th day of April, 1946.

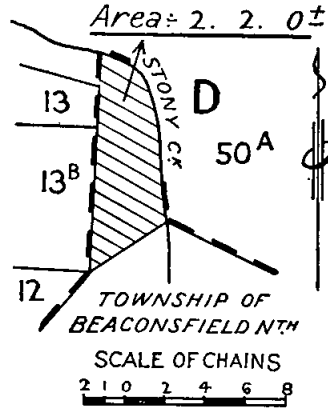

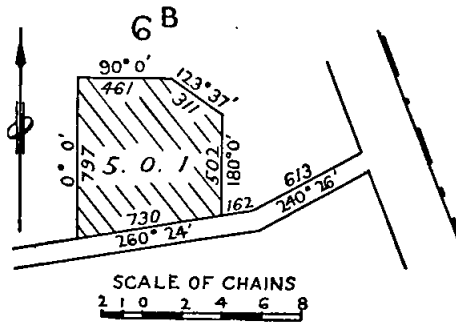
