Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 (No. 4337).

DECLARING THAT EGGS SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE EGG AND EGG PULP MARKETING BOARD FOR A FURTHER PERIOD OF TWO YEARS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 16 of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935, it is enacted that where a product has been declared a commodity and a Board has been appointed in relation thereof, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

 (a) Provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith, upon the date of publication of the Proclamation or on from and after a later date specified in the Proclamation, be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent Proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof; and

 (b) Make such further provision as will enable the
 Board effectively to obtain possession of the
 commodity as such owner, and to deal with the
 same: And whereas by a Proclamation made

 February, 1937, the Governor in Council appointed a marketing Board in relation to eggs
 and egg pulp and assigned to such Board the

 Board": Now therefore I, the Governor of the
 State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Aus-

tralia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on from and after the sixteenth day of August, 1947, all eggs shall, subject to and in accordance with the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935, be divested from the producers of eggs and become vested in and be the absolute property of The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any eggs coming into existence within two (2) years from the sixteenth day of August, 1947, they shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board as the owner thereof and to enable The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board as owners of the above-mentioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I do further provide that all such eggs shall, subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act be delivered by the producers thereof to The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by Regulations made under the said Act.

YEA WATERWORKS TRUST.

-BY-LAW RELATING TO RATES AND CHARGES FOR THE YEAR 1947.

THE Yea Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby makes the following rates and charges for the supply of water within the Yea Urban District:—

On lands and tenements liable to be rated, a rate of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation not exceeding Two hundred pounds, provided that in no case shall the amount of such rate payable in respect of any tenement (other than land on which is no building) be less than Two pounds, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Ten shillings.

On such lands and tenements the annual municipal valuation of which exceeds Two hundred pounds, a rate of Twenty pounds.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1947, and shall be payable on the 21st day of August, 1947, at the office of the said Trust, Shire Hall, Yea.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 5,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the said Trust, Shire Hall, Yea.







REGULATIONS FOR THE GRANTING OF CERTIFICATES OF QUALIFICATION AS ENGINEERS OF WATER SUPPLY.

- HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of provisions contained in section 297 of the Water Act 1928, as amended by section 7 of the Water Act 1946, and under all other powers enabling him in that behalf, doth make the following Regulations affecting the issue by the Board of Examiners of Engineers of Water Supply of Certificates of Qualification as Engineers of Water Supply. The Regulations shall take effect as on and from the date of this Order, and His Excellency doth by this Order revoke the Regulations made on the 21st day of September, 1937, and amended on the 8th day of March, 1943, and the 21st day of August, 1944.
- 1. The Board of Examiners of Engineers of Water Supply will issue Certificates of Qualification, after examination or without examination, as the case may be, to such candidates as have satisfied the Board that they have been properly educated and trained for the profession of a civil and hydraulic engineer, and have been engaged for not less than two years (exclusive of any period of training or pupilage) in the active practice of such profession, one year at least of which practice has been in connexion with waterworks or other hydraulic works, and who have complied with some one of the conditions following:-
 - (a) After examination—to every such candidate who satisfactorily passes an examination conducted by the Board in accordance with these Regulations.
 - (b) Without examination—to every such candidate who satisfies the Board that he has been em-ployed for not less than one year in some responsible professional capacity in charge of the construction and management of water-works, and that he is—
 - (i) A Member or Associate Member of the Institution of Civil Engineers, London;
 - (ii) a Bachelor or Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, or a person who holds educational qualifica-tions recognized by the University of Melbourne as an entitlement for admission ad eundem statum

and that he has sufficient knowledge of the Victorian Acts and regulations relating to

CERTIFICATES AFTER EXAMINATION.

- 2. Examinations of candidates for Certificates of Qualification will be held in Melbourne in October in each year, or at such other time as may be fixed by the Board from time to time, of which not less than one month's notice will be given in the Government Gazette. Each examination shall be held at such place in Melbourne as the Board may from time to time appoint.
- 3. An intending candidate must, at least 21 days prior to the date of examination, make application, in writing, for permission to present himself for examination, and must at the same time submit documentary evidence satisfactory to the Board—
 - (a) (i) That he is not less than 23 years of age; and
 - (ii) That he has passed the Leaving Examination of the University of Melbourne, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and
 - (iii) That he has obtained in Civil Engineering a University Degree satisfactory to the Board, or a Technical School Diploma or Certificate satisfactory to the Board, or such other examination qualification as shall in the opinion of the Board be equivalent thereto;

 Certificate, or Qualification he has been
 engaged for not less than two years in the
 active practice of the profession of a civil
 engineer, of which at least one year shall have been in connexion with waterworks or other hydraulic works; or

 - (i) That he is not less than 27 years of age; and

 - " Act " means the ${\it Country Fire\ Authority\ Act\ 1944}$ as amended by any Act.
- ² 2. In sub-clauses (1) and (2) of clause 8 of the said Regulations, the words "in unploughable ground" are hereby revoked.
- 3. Sub-clause (5) of clause 8 of the said Regulations is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor:—
 - "5. No such fire shall be lighted before Four o'clock in the afternoon and every such fire shall be thoroughly extinguished before sunrise on the following day.

Provided that the Proper Officer or the appropriate Chief Officer or other officer exercising the powers of such Chief Officer may, as a written condition in any permit issued to the officer in charge of a fire brigade registered by the Country Fire Authority, authorize the said officer in charge to light such fire not earlier than Two o'clock in the afternoon."

- (ii) two ploughed strips each at least five feet wide and at least five feet apart with such intervening space cleared by burning against the wind at least twenty-four hours before the main fire is lighted; or
- (iii) a cleared strip at least fifteen feet wide constructed by burning against the wind as hereinafter provided at least twenty-four hours before the main fire is lighted—

shall be made around the whole of the land upon which the burning is to take place, and around all trees and timber less than one hundred feet within the boundary of the area to be burnt.

- (2) No firebreak shall be constructed or partly constructed by burning unless permission to do so is contained in a permit issued under section 38 of the Country Fire Authority Act 1944, and then only in accordance with the following conditions and restrictions:—
 - (a) No such firebreak shall be less than fifteen feet wide or more than one hundred and thirty-two feet wide.
 - (b) (i) A strip of land at least five feet wide on either side of the proposed firebreak shall be completely cleared of all inflammable material before the fire is lighted, and the length of break burnt at any one time shall not exceed two hundred yards; or
 - yards, or

 (ii) a strip not less than five feet wide shall be thoroughly wet with water on all sides of the proposed firebreak except any side upon which there is a strip at least five feet wide cleared of all inflammable material and the interior shall be burned while the strip is still wet; provided that the length of such firebreak burned at any one time shall not exceed one hundred yards before the next section is wet and burned.
 - (c) At no time shall any fire lit for the purpose of making a firebreak be left unattended.

 (3) Not less than twenty-four hours before the fire is lighted, notice in writing of intention to burn, in the form of the Fifth Schedule to the Country Fire Authority (Permits) Regulations 1945 or to the like effect shall be given by the holder of any such permit to the owners or occupiers or persons in charge of any land or building immediately adjoining the land whereon such burning is to take place or separated therefrom only by a road and to the officer in charge of the nearest fire brigade. If notice as aforesaid cannot be given to any person to whom notice is required by

this paragraph to be given, by reason of the absence of such person from his place of residence or for any other reasonable cause, notice as aforesaid shall in lieu thereof be given to the member of the Police Force in charge of the police station nearest to the land whereon the burning is to take place.

- (4) At least three men equipped with adequate fire-fighting appliances and with an adequate supply of water shall be present at the fire, from the time it is lighted until it is thoroughly extinguished, to assist in keeping it under control and prevent it from spreading beyond the land whereon the burning is to take place.
- (5) No such fire shall be lighted before Four o'clock in the afternoon, and every such fire shall be thoroughly extinguished before sunrise on the following day.

Provided that the Proper Officer or the appropriate Chief Officer or other officer exercising the powers of such Chief Officer may, as a written condition in any permit issued to the officer in charge of a fire brigade registered by the Country Fire Authority, authorize the said officer in charge to light such fire not earlier than Two o'clock in the afternoon.

- (6) No such fire shall be lighted at any time if at that time the shade temperature in the vicinity exceeds 90° Fahrenheit, or if the wind velocity exceeds that of a very light breeze.





- Conditions of Contract.

CITY OF MORDIALLOC.

BY-LAW No. 87.

A By-law, made under section 80 of the Health Act 1928 and numbered 87, for the purpose of regulating or prohibiting of the keeping of any place or any animals (including birds), or the storage of any things, in the opinion of the Council, offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 80 of the Health Act 1928, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Mordialloc, with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. Throughout this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter-
 - "City" shall mean the City of Mordialloc. "Council" shall mean the Council of the City of Mordialloc. "Inspector" shall mean the Inspector of Health of the City of Mordialloc or person authorized by the Council to act under this By-law. "Animal" shall mean and include every animal other than an animal described as a domestic animal. "Domestic animal" shall mean and include the ass, mule, cow, sheep, dog, and cat. "Bird" shall mean and include every bird other than described as a domestic bird. "Domestic bird" shall mean and include turkey, goose, duck, fowl, pigeon, and song bird. "Property" shall include any tenement or land in separate occupation. "Dwelling house or dwelling" shall include a living room, sleepout, or tent. Words importing the masculine gender shall include the feminine and words in the singular shall include the feminine and words in the plural shall include the singular, and words relative the feminine and words relative the the plural shall include the singular, and words relating to persons shall include corporations.
- 2. No person shall keep, or cause or permit to be kept, 2. No person shall keep, or cause or permit to be kept, any animal or bird other than domestic animals or domestic birds on any property without the written permission of the Council. Before granting such permission, the Council shall satisfy itself that the accommodation provided for the housing of same is adequate and not offensive or injurious to health.
- 3. No person shall keep, or cause, or permit to be kept on any property more than three of any one kind of domestic animal.
- 4. No person shall keep, or cause, or permit to be kept on any property any horse or domestic animal other than a dog or cat so that the same will be within 40 feet of any dwelling
- 5. No person shall keep, or cause, or permit to be kept any domestic birds other than song birds, except in yards or runs having an area of not less than 200 square feet, provided that if more than ten head of birds are kept at any one time, then for every five head in excess of such number there shall be an additional space of 100 square feet, but nothing in this clause contained shall be interpreted to make that more than twenty adult birds may be feet, but nothing in this clause contained shall be interpreted to mean that more than twenty adult birds may be kept on any property within the areas described in Schedules 1 and 2 of By-law No. 84 relating to residential areas. Provided further that such yard or run shall be securely fenced with a fowl proof fence and shall be kept in a clean, wholesome, and sanitary state. Every such yard or run shall be a clear 40 feet from any dwelling house, and the Council may, upon reasonable notice to the occupier of any property on which is situated such yard or run, require such occupier to remove or alter such yard or run so that no part thereof shall be within 40 feet of any dwelling house as aforesaid, and such yard or run shall be at least 100 feet distant from the street on which the land upon which such yard or run is situated abuts as a frontage, and is at least 30 feet distant from any side street in which such land abuts and is at least 5 feet distant from any other boundary of such land.

 6. No domestic bird other than song birds shall be kept
- 6. No domestic bird other than song birds shall be kept in any house, yard, or shelter unless such house, yard, or shelter complies with the following requirements:—
 - (a) It is at least 40 feet distant from any dwelling house erected on the land on which it is situated or any other land; and
 - (b) It is at least 100 feet distant from the street on which the land on which it is situated abuts as a frontage, and is at least 30 feet distant from any side street on which such land abuts, and is at least 5 feet distant from any other boundary of such land; and
 - (c) Any such house or shelter is constructed of iron of a standard approved by the Building Sur-veyor of the City of Mordialloc, or person acting as such for the time being, and does not exceed 7 feet in helght from the ground.

- 7. In clauses 5 and 6 of this By-law where land is situated at the corner of two streets the word "frontage" therein used shall mean the shorter of the frontages to such streets, and where the land abuts at the front and rear thereof on streets at least 40 feet wide, then any such house, shelter, yard, or run as mentioned therein shall be at least 70 feet distant from the front street and 40 feet distant from the representations. distant from the rear street.
- 8. - 9. Any animal, bird, or domestic animal or domestic bird which shall develop diphtheria, tubercle, or other contagious or infectious disease injurious to human beings shall be forthwith destroyed or caused to be destroyed by the person keeping the same or causing or permitting the same to be kent the same to be kept.
- 10. The occupier of any property upon which any animal or bird or domestic animal or domestic bird is kept shall. or bird or domestic animal or domestic dird is kept shall, at all reasonable times, afford free access to every part thereof respectively to the Health Officer or Inspector of the City, or either of them, or to any person or persons appointed by the Council to act under this By-law.
- 11. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any act directed to be done by this By-law, and any person guilty of an offence against this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

This By-law shall have force and apply throughout the whole of the Municipal District of Mordialloc, and shall come into operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the Victoria Government Gazette.
