REGULATION XX.—ALLOWANCES FOR SCHOOL REQUISITES AND MAINTENANCE TO PUPILS ATTENDING POST-PRIMARY SCHOOLS AND CLASSES.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Education Act 1928* and all other powers thereto enabling, doth hereby amend Regulation XX.—Allowances for School Requisites and Maintenance to Pupils Attending Post-Primary Schools and Classes—in the manner following, that is to say:—

Rescind clause 2 and clause 3 (a) and substitute the following new clause and sub-clause:—

“Clause 2 (a).—An allowance for school requisites up to £1 5s. per annum may be granted to a pupil taking the first or second year of the post-primary course at a district high school, higher elementary school, girls' school, junior technical school, central school, or central class.

(b) An allowance for school requisites up to £2 10s. per annum may be granted to a pupil taking the third or fourth year of the post-primary course at a district high school, higher elementary school, girls' school, junior technical school, or to a pupil taking the course for the ninth or higher school year in a consolidated school or an approved post-primary school.

(c) An allowance for school requisites up to £3 per annum may be granted to a pupil taking—

- (i) the course at a senior technical school, or
- (ii) the fifth or sixth year of the post-primary course at a district high school, higher elementary school, or girls' school.

Clause 3 (a).—No allowance under the provisions of sub-clause (b) or (c) of clause 2 of this Regulation shall be granted unless the pupil shows special aptitude and promise.”

CITY OF BENDIGO.

BY-LAW No. 69.

A By-law of the City of Bendigo, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 67, for appointing in streets and roads standing places for motor cars and providing for openings through any such standing places, and prescribing the conditions on which and the days and hours and period of time for which all or any of such standing places may be occupied by motor cars, and regulating the use of any such standing places and the number of motor cars to be allowed to stand thereon, and the manner in which motor cars may be placed and left thereon or removed therefrom, and prohibiting the occupation by motor cars of any openings through such standing places.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Bendigo order as follows:—

1. In this By-law and the Schedule thereto, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Council" means the Council of the City of Bendigo.

"Driver" includes any person in charge of a motor car.

"Limit of parking" where parking lines are painted on a street or road means within the lines indicating the space in which a motor car may be parked or left standing.

"Motor car" means a motor car, within the meaning of section 3 of the *Motor Car Act 1928*, not being a vehicle of any class for which stands or standing places may be fixed or appointed by the Council of any municipality, under the powers conferred by any enactment other than subsection 1 (22) of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946*.

"To park" means to place or leave in a parking area.

"Parking area" means any standing place for motor cars duly appointed by the Council under any By-law.

"Parking lines" means the lines painted on the streets or roads to indicate the position to be taken up by a motor car and to define the limit of parking or standing space within which a motor car shall park or stand.

2. By-law Number 39 is hereby repealed.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout that part of the municipal district of the City of Bendigo set out in the Schedule hereto.

4. The streets and roads and or part of streets and roads mentioned or set forth in the Schedule hereto, with the exception of those parts in or on which parking is prohibited by clause 26 of the *Road Traffic (Country) Regulations 1944*, shall be and are hereby appointed standing places for motor cars within the City of Bendigo, and are hereinafter called "parking areas."

5. The parking areas mentioned or set forth—

(a) in Part 1 of the Schedule shall be called "day parking areas";

(b) in the Part 2 of the Schedule shall be called "limited parking areas."

6. The days and hours during which day parking areas and limited parking areas shall be available for parking shall be as follows, viz.:—

On every day of the week between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m.

Provided that no driver may park his motor car in a limited parking area for a period longer than two consecutive hours on Mondays and Fridays between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. and on Saturdays between the hours of 9 a.m. and 1 p.m.

7. Every driver of a motor car shall, in any parking area, conform to the following:—

(a) where parking lines are painted on the roadway park his car within the limits of and at the angle indicated by such parking lines,

(b) where parking lines are not painted park his car at an angle of not more than 60 degrees and not less than 35 degrees to the line of the kerb or channel and in the direction in which a vehicle is proceeding when on its proper side of the road or street and within 10 inches of the kerb or back of the channel,

(c) comply with directions from the parking attendant in charge if an attendant is present, or

(d) if no such attendant is present, shall take up his position in the order of his arrival there at and in such a manner as will enable him to take up or leave such position without disturbance to a motor car already parked and in such a manner as not to cause obstruction to a motor car parking or moving from the place occupied by it.

8. A driver of a motor car shall not cause, allow, or permit a motor car to be parked or left standing in such a manner as to extend beyond the painted lines marking the limit of parking in any parking area.

9. A driver shall not cause, allow, or permit a motor car or motor car with an attached trailer of a greater overall length of 20 feet to be parked in any "parking area" in which angle parking is permitted, nor in any parking space defined by lines painted on the roadway of a length less than 20 feet.

10. A driver of a "motor car" shall not cause, allow, or permit a motor car to be parked in any parking area in a position—

(1) Marked on the street or road "no park," or "hire car stand," or "bus stand," or "safety zone" or by a standard placed on such street or road and marked "no parking" or "hire car stand" or "bus stand" or "safety zone" or over any fire plug marked or indicated as such.

(2) In any position prohibited as set out in clause 26 of the *Road Traffic (Country) Regulations 1944*. (Copy of clause 26 is set out at the foot of this By-law for information of persons consulting this By-law.)

11. The Council may from time to time fix or appoint openings through and in any parking area for cross traffic and may vary such openings.

12. A driver of a "motor car" shall not park or permit or allow a motor car to obstruct or occupy in a parking area any opening prescribed or established or set apart for any purpose prescribed by this By-law or for any cross traffic, and the parking of or occupation by any motor car or any such opening is prohibited.

13. The Council may by resolution from time to time—

(a) discontinue for such period as it thinks fit any standing place for motor cars appointed under any By-law, and

(b) may appoint or employ officers and attendants for any standing places so appointed and remove any such officer or attendant.

14. No person not being an officer or employee of the Council or otherwise authorized by the Council shall destroy, damage, delete, remove, or in any other manner interfere with any marking on the street or road or any standard under paragraph 10 of this By-law.

15. Any wilful contravention of the foregoing provisions by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law, and every person who is guilty of any such offence shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Clause 26 of Road Traffic (Country) Regulations 1944.

The driver of a vehicle (other than a tram car) shall not permit such vehicle to remain stationary in any of the following places:—

- (i) within 30 feet of an intersection,
- (ii) within 30 feet of a place on a tram route indicated by either of the notices "Cars Stop Here" or "Halt Cars Here," and on the side thereof which is the nearer to approaching vehicular traffic.
- (iii) between a safety zone and the adjacent footway or within 20 feet of points on the kerb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone.
- (iv) within 15 feet of a fire hydrant or a postal pillar box or a petrol pump erected on the kerb of any street,
- (v) in front of a right-of-way, passage, or private drive,
- (vi) alongside or opposite any street, excavation, or obstruction when traffic would be thereby obstructed.

Provided that this Regulation shall not apply to a fire brigade vehicle standing at or near a fire hydrant or to a postal vehicle standing at or near a postal pillar box or to a motor car whilst being supplied with petrol from a petrol pump erected on the kerb of any street or to a horse or horse-drawn vehicle which is standing at or near a trough or other fixed receptacle for the purpose of watering such horse, or to a bicycle standing in a bicycle rack erected by the Council of any municipality. Penalty £10.

1. By-law No. 90 is hereby amended by inserting after sub-clause (d) of clause 4 the following new sub-clause:—

"(e) In streets immediately opposite any exit, or passageway from theatres, halls, or other public buildings during an entertainment."

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Mordialloc.

A resolution adopting the foregoing By-law was passed by the Council of the City of Mordialloc on the 14th day of July, 1947, and confirmed on the 11th day of August, 1947.

SHIRE OF BENALLA.

BY-LAW No. 46.

Removal and Destruction of Refuse or Rubbish.

A By-law of the Shire of Benalla made under the provisions of the *Local Government Acts*, and numbered 46, for—

1. Prohibiting the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on streets, roads, lanes, or passages.
2. Prohibiting or regulating the deposit or leaving of rubbish on any land.

3. Requiring the removal or destruction by the owner or occupier of any land of refuse or rubbish thereon (other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under section 39 of the *Health Act 1928*).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Benalla order as follows:—

1. No person shall deposit or leave on any land within the Central Riding of the Municipal District of the Shire of Benalla any refuse or rubbish, comprised of bottles, broken glass, old or broken bricks, paper, hedge clippings, garden refuse, loppings from trees, or of scrap material comprising plaster or cement, sheeting, bags, rags, feathers, kitchenware, tins, drums, kegs, or metal.

2. No person shall deposit or leave on any land within the Central Riding of the Municipal District of the Shire of Benalla any refuse or rubbish comprised of scrap timber or wood shavings which are not required for domestic use by the occupier of such land.

3. No person shall leave on any land within the Central Riding of the Municipal District of the Shire of Benalla any sawdust which is not firmly covered with earth filling to a depth of one foot at least.

4. Every person who deposits any sawdust on any land within the Central Riding of the Municipal District of the Shire of Benalla shall forthwith cover the same firmly with earth filling to a depth of at least one foot.

5. The owner or occupier of any land within the Central Riding of the Municipal District of the Shire of Benalla upon which there is any refuse or rubbish comprised of any of the items of material referred to in paragraphs one and two of this By-law, or of sawdust which is not firmly covered with earth filling to a depth of at least one foot, and not being refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under section 39 of the *Health Act 1928*, shall remove or destroy such refuse or rubbish within four days after the service upon such owner or occupier of a notice in writing from the Council over the signature of the Shire Secretary requiring such owner or occupier so to do.

6. In the event of default being made by an owner or occupier of land in complying with the provisions of paragraph 5 of this By-law the Council may by its Inspector with a sufficient number of workmen and necessary vehicles enter upon the land upon which there is refuse or rubbish which has not been removed or destroyed by such owner or occupier pursuant to a notice served on him under paragraph 5 of this By-law, and for that purpose (if necessary) break down any fence surrounding the said land and remove or destroy such refuse and rubbish, and in addition to any penalty incurred by such owner or occupier any expenses incurred by the Council in removing or destroying such refuse or rubbish shall be paid to the Council on demand by the owner or occupier of the said land who made such default, and in default of payment of such expenses the sum may be recovered by the Council in a court of competent jurisdiction.

7. Every person so guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every first offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds and for every subsequent offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. In the event of any offence being continued after a conviction, or order imposed, or made on or against such person by any court, such person shall be liable to a further penalty of One pound for each day such offence is committed.

8. In this By-law the words "street," "road," "lane," or "passage" shall mean and include any street, road, lane, or passage within the Central Riding of the Municipal District of the Shire of Benalla, whether or not the same be a public highway or set out on private property on made or unmade, or under the care and management of the Council.

9. (a) Every notice which by this By-law is required to be given to the owner or occupier of any land shall be addressed to the owner or occupier of such land, and shall—

- (i) If such owner or occupier and his residence are not known to the Council be served on such owner or occupier or left with some adult inmate of his abode.

- (ii) If such owner and his residence are not known to the Council be served on the occupier (if any) of such land or left with some adult inmate of his abode, or if there is no occupier be put up on some conspicuous part of such land.
- (iii) If such occupier and his residence are not known to the Council be put up on some conspicuous part of such land.

9. (b) But any such notice may also be served by post by pre-paid letter addressed to such owner or occupier, and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that such notice was properly addressed to such owner or occupier and was put into the post.

9. (c) Any such notice may be addressed by the description of "the owner" or "the occupier" of the land (naming it) in respect of which the notice is given, without further name or description.

10. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Central Riding of the Municipal District of the Shire of Benalla.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the 14th day of July, 1947, and confirmed the 11th day of August, 1947.

A BY-LAW OF THE SHIRE OF DANDENONG, MADE UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 4 OF THE POLICE OFFENCES ACT 1928, FOR APPLYING THE PROVISIONS OF PART 1 TO THE SHIRE OF DANDENONG, AND NUMBERED 90.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 4 of Part 1 of the *Police Offences Act 1928* and every other power it thereunto enabling in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 12 or 12A for adopting Part 1 of the *Police Offences Act 1890* is hereby repealed.

2. Part 1 of the *Police Offences Act 1928*, other than section 6, is hereby extended to the Shire of Dandenong.

SHIRE OF HAMPDEN.

BY-LAW No. 43.

A By-law of the Shire of Hampden, made under the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 43, for the purposes following:—(a) Appointing in streets and roads standing places for motor cars and for regulating the use of such standing places, (b) prohibiting the leaving (whether unattended or not) of motor cars or other vehicles standing in any street or road or part thereof specified in the By-law, (c) regulating traffic.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and every other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Hampden order as follows:—

1. In this By-law and the Schedules thereto, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Council" means the Council of the Shire of Hampden.
"Driver" includes any person in charge of a motor car or other vehicle.

"Park" means to leave standing (whether unattended or not) any motor car or other vehicle, and derivatives thereof shall have a corresponding meaning.

"Limit of Parking" where parking lines are painted on a street or road means within the adjacent lines indicating the space in which a motor car may be parked.

"Motor Car" means a motor car within the meaning of section three of the *Motor Car Act 1928*, not being a vehicle of any class for which stands or standing places may be fixed or appointed by the Council of any municipality under the powers conferred by any enactment other than sub-section 7 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*.

"Parking Area" means any standing place for motor cars duly appointed by the Council under any By-law.

"Parking Lines" means the lines painted on the streets or roads to indicate the position to be taken up by a motor car and to define the limit of parking space within which a motor car shall be parked.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout that portion of the municipal district within the Townships of Camperdown and Terang set out in the Schedules hereto.

3. The streets and roads and or parts of streets and roads set out in the First and Second Schedules hereto (hereinafter called "parking areas") shall be and are hereby appointed standing places for motor cars within the Townships of Camperdown and Terang on the days, during the hours, and for the periods of time as set out in the said Schedules.

4. No person shall park any vehicle other than a motor car in any parking area.

5. The method of parking in the several parking areas shall be as set out in column 2 of the First and Second Schedules hereto opposite the parking area described in column 1 of each of the said Schedules.

6. Every driver of a motor car shall conform to the method of parking set out in the said First and Second Schedules hereto, and—

- (a) as directed by the Council's parking attendant in charge of the parking area if an attendant is present, and
- (b) if no such attendant is present, shall take up his position in the order of his arrival thereat and in such manner as will enable him to take up or leave such position without disturbance to a motor car already parked and so as not to cause obstruction to a motor car parking or moving from the place occupied by it and so that no part of the motor car or any trailer attached thereto shall be a distance from the face of the adjacent kerb or back of the adjacent channel greater than 18 feet measured at right angles to the line of such kerb or channel and where parking lines have been painted the driver of a motor car or motor car with trailer attached shall park such motor car or motor car and trailer within an adjacent pair of parking lines and so that no part of such motor car or trailer shall extend beyond the parking space defined by such pair of parking lines.

7. A driver of a motor car or other vehicle shall not cause, allow, or permit such motor car or other vehicle to be parked in any street or road or portion of a street or road specified in the Third Schedule hereto, nor in any position—

- (a) marked on the street or road "no parking" or by a "no parking" traffic standard, or
- (b) marked on the roadway "bus stop," or
- (c) marked on the roadway "safety zone," or
- (d) prohibited as set out in clause 26 of the Road Traffic (Country) Regulations 1944 (copy of clause 26 is set out at the foot of this By-law for information of persons consulting this By-law).

8. The Council may from time to time fix or appoint openings through and in any parking area for cross traffic and may vary such openings.

9. A driver of a motor car shall not park or permit or allow a motor car to obstruct or occupy in a parking area any opening prescribed or established or set apart for any persons prescribed by this By-law or for any cross traffic, and the parking of or occupation by any motor car or any such opening is prohibited.

10. The Council may by resolution from time to time—

- (a) discontinue for such period as it thinks fit any standing place for motor cars appointed under any By-law, and—
- (b) may appoint or employ officers and attendants for any standing places so appointed and remove any such officer or attendant.

11. No person not being an officer or employee of the Council or otherwise authorized by the Council shall destroy, remove, or in any other manner interfere with any notice (including any standard or other erection supporting any such notice) which has been fixed or placed by the said Council upon any street, roadway, or building or other public place or upon any verandah or other building for the purposes of or in connexion with this By-law.


12. No person not being an officer or employee of or otherwise authorized by the Council shall paint or affix any notice or sign relating to the parking of cars or other vehicles or to the regulation of traffic on or upon any street or footway.

13. Any wilful contravention of the foregoing provisions by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law, and every person who is guilty of any such offence shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty of not exceeding Ten pounds.



For the information of the persons consulting this By-law, Clause 26 of the Road Traffic (Country) Regulations 1944 is as follows:—

The driver of a vehicle (other than a tram car) shall not permit such vehicle to remain stationary in any of the following places:—

1. Within 30 feet of an intersection.
2. Within 30 feet of a place on a tram route indicated by either of the notices "Cars Stop Here" or "Hail Cars Here" and on the side thereof which is the nearer to approaching vehicular traffic.
3. Between a safety zone and the adjacent footway or within 20 feet of points on the kerb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone.
4. Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant or a postal pillar box or a petrol pump erected on the kerb of any street.
5. In front of a right-of-way, passage, or private drive.
6. Alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when traffic would be thereby obstructed.

Provided that this Regulation shall not apply to a fire brigade vehicle standing at or near a fire hydrant or to a postal vehicle standing at or near a postal pillar box or to a motor car whilst being supplied with petrol from a petrol pump erected on the kerb of any street or to a horse or horse-drawn vehicle which is standing at or near a trough or other fixed receptacle for the purpose of watering such horse or to a bicycle standing in a bicycle rack erected by the Council of any municipality. Penalty £10. 1730

SHIRE OF MORTLAKE.

BY-LAW No. 21.

A By-law of the Shire of Mortlake, made under section 197 (1) (xxx) (d) of the Local Government Act 1946, and numbered 21, for authorizing the placing on roads in situations approved by the municipal engineer (subject, in the case of State highways, main roads, and tourists' roads to the further approval of the Country Roads Board) of stands or platforms for milk and cream cans, and prescribing the nature and size, and regulating the use of such stands and platforms.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1946, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mortlake order as follows:—

Definitions.

1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

- "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Mortlake.
- "Engineer" means the officer appointed by the Council of the Shire of Mortlake to carry out the duties of Shire Engineer and Municipal Surveyor.
- "Stands or platforms" include any existing stand or platform on any road reserve.
- "Formation" means that portion of the road reserve prepared for the use of traffic, and shall include the pavement of the road.

2. The Council may authorize the owner or occupier of any property who is engaged in dairy farming and supplying milk or cream to any factory that treats such milk or cream to erect a stand or platform on any road reserve to facilitate the collection of such milk or cream.

3. Every such owner or occupier shall, prior to the erection of every such stand or platform, make written application to the Council for permission so to do, and shall not erect or commence to erect any such stand or platform without the written consent of the engineer so to do, and where the stand or platform is to be erected on any State highway, main road, or tourist road without the further written consent of the Country Roads Board.

4. All such written applications to the Council referred to in the preceding paragraph shall state the full name, address, and occupation of the applicant, the nature of the materials from which the stand or platform is to be made, its dimensions, height from the ground, distance from the

centre of the roadway, Crown allotment numbers of adjoining property, and be accompanied by a sketch plan showing location, on the road reserve, of the proposed stand or platform, and the direction of travel which the vehicle collecting the milk or cream will take.

5. All such stands or platforms shall be built in a proper and workmanlike manner, and shall be constructed of substantial materials.

6. All such stands or platforms shall be placed clear of the formation so that the vehicle collecting the milk and cream cans, whilst so collecting, is parked clear of the formation of the roadway, and so that the vehicle will not obstruct other traffic.

7. The owner or occupier shall, where necessary, construct and maintain a passage from the edge of the road formation to his stand or platform to prevent damage to the built-up formation by vehicles using the stand or platform.

8. All persons who have, prior to this By-law coming into operation, erected or commenced to erect or are using any stand or platform shall, within three months of the coming into operation of this By-law, make written application to the Council, as provided in paragraphs 3 and 4 of this By-law.

9. The Council may, on giving notice in writing to the owner or occupier, order that any stand or platform, whether erected before or after the coming into operation of this By-law, shall be forthwith removed.

10. All such stands or platforms as are erected in pursuance of this By-law shall be maintained by the owner or occupier thereof, and shall be kept repaired to the satisfaction of the engineer, on the owner or occupier receiving fourteen days' written notice so to do.

11. All such notices as aforesaid shall be in writing under the hand of the engineer or other authorized officer of the Council, and shall be served by pre-paid registered post, addressed to the owner or occupier at his last known place of abode.

12. On the refusal, failure, or neglect of the owner or occupier to remove or repair, as the case may be, such stand or platform after the expiration of the period of the notice as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the Council with its workmen or agents to remove such stand or platform, and dispose of the materials as it deems fit, and to reimburse itself from the proceeds of such disposal for all expenses incurred by it in such removal and disposal.

13. A register of all such stands or platforms shall be kept by the Council, and on approval being granted the Council shall issue to the owner or occupier a registered number therefor, which shall be affixed and kept affixed on the front bearer of the stand or platform. A charge to cover the cost of the numbers shall be made which shall be paid on the issue of the said number.

14. Any person who shall be guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than One pound, and not more than Twenty pounds: Provided, however, that if the offence continues after the period provided in the notice to be served on the owner or occupier to a penalty not exceeding One pound per day for every day the offence continues.

15. No action shall lie against the Council or the engineer for refusing to grant an application for the erection of any milk or cream stand, nor for any damage or loss to any such stand or platform, or to any milk or cream can, or to the contents thereof.

16. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Mortlake.

Resolution for passing this By-law, number 21, of the Shire of Mortlake agreed to by the Council the 1st day of August, 1947, and confirmed the 5th day of September, 1947.

SHIRE OF ROCHESTER.

By-LAW No. 22.

A By-law of the Shire of Rochester, made under the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria, and numbered 22, for determining, applying, dispensing with, or regulating such matter or things as are left to be determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council of the said Shire under the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria, and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Rochester order as follows:—

Minimum Area, Depth, and Width of Frontage.

1. The minimum area, depth, and width of frontage specified in column 3 of table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria (hereinafter called the Regulations), are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage of land on which a building shall be constructed throughout those portions of the municipal district set out and described in the First Schedule hereto.

Distance from Street Alignment.

2. (a) The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building from the street alignment of any land is hereby specified as 15 feet.

(b) No person shall construct any building closer to the street alignment of any land than 15 feet.

Sites Below Minimum Requirements.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations, any person may—

(a) construct a building of Class I. occupancy on land having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage, or at a lesser distance from boundaries, than those specified in column 3 of table 803 of the Regulations, or in clause 2 of this By-law, or

(b) construct a building of Class III., V., VI., VII., or VIII. occupancy, or a building to which a building of Class IV. occupancy is attached, on land having an area, depth, or width of frontage less than that prescribed in clause 809 of the Regulations in any case where on the date of commencement of the Regulations such land existed as a separate allotment, and has not since been reduced in area, or is shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the Council, and lodged in the Office of Titles.

Rear Access.

4. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged with the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations, the requirements of clause 811 of the Regulations are hereby dispensed with.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

(a) All that land contained within the Township of Rochester described in the *Government Gazette* 1855/2761, together with Crown allotments 63, 64, 65, 66, 67, 68, 69, 70, 71, 72, 80, 81, 82A, 82B, 83, 84, 85, 86, 87, 88, 89, 90, 91, 92, 93, and 94, Parish of Rochester West.

(b) That portion of the Township of Gunbower within the Shire of Rochester, and the subdivided portion of Crown allotment 7c, Parish of Patho, commencing at the north-east corner of said Crown allotment 7c; thence westerly along the Murray Valley Highway a distance of 36 chains to Market-street; thence southerly along that street to the railway reserve; thence easterly along the said reserve to the eastern boundary of Crown allotment 7c; thence northerly by that boundary to the point of commencement.

(c) All that land contained within the Township of Bamawm (known as Lockington), described in the *Government Gazette* 1915/4640, together with the subdivided portions of Crown allotments 112 and 174, having a depth of 20 chains to the south, Parish of Bamawm, and that portion of Crown allotments 175A, Parish of Bamawm, and 126A, Parish of Pannobamawm, between the State Rivers and Water Supply channel and the road to the east for a depth of 20 chains.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Rochester on the 18th day of December, 1946, and confirmed by the Council of the Shire of Rochester on the 29th day of January, 1947.
