COUNTRY ROADS (FOREST ROADS AND STOCK ROUTES) ACT 1943 (No. 4953).

PROCLAMATION OF FOREST ROAD

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 (1) of the *Country Roads (Forests Roads and Stock Routes) Act 1943* it is provided that the Governor in Council may on the recommendation of the Country Roads Board made after consultation with the Minister of Forests and the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey and on the recommendation of the Commissioner of Public Works by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim any road or any part of any road to be a Forest road for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas the Country Roads Board (after consultation with the Minister of Forests and the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey) and the Commissioner of Public Works have recommended that the road described in the Schedule hereunder be so proclaimed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby proclaim the said road to be a Forest Road for the purposes of the said Act.

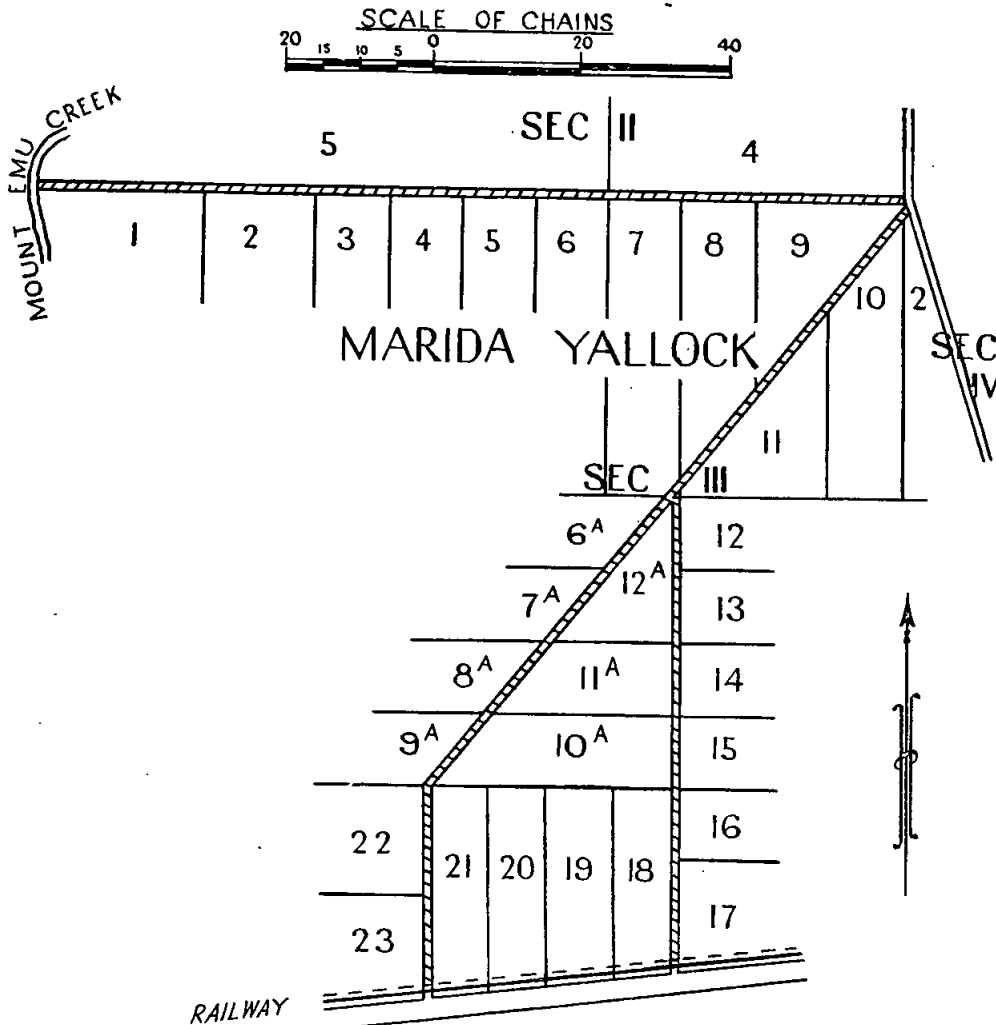
UNUSED AND UNMADE ROADS CLOSED—PARISHES OF GALLA AND MARIDA YALLOCK.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of section 6 of the *Soldier Settlement Act 1946* (No. 5179), do by this my Proclamation direct that the unused and unmade roads as described hereunder, be closed, that is to say:—

Parish of Galla, County of Hampden, being the road between allotments 107A, 107B, 138A, 138B, 143A, 143B, 160B and allotments 108A, 108B, 137A, 137B, 144A, 144B, 159A, 159B.—(G.3⁽⁵⁾) (D.453)

Parish of Marida Yallock, County of Hampden, being the road indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(M.84⁽²⁾) (D.110)

PORTS IN VICTORIA.—ADDITION TO PORT RULES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1928* (No. 3723) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of the Ports in Victoria and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharves; and any such limits, boundaries, rules and regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended or repealed and others substituted in their stead:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this Proclamation repeal that part of the Port Rules (Explosives) Part II., Division 1, clause 3, relating to the Port of Port Phillip, which rules were made by Proclamation on the 25th November, 1913, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 3rd December, 1913, and amended by Proclamation on the 27th August, 1946, published in the *Government Gazette* on 4th September, 1946, and substitute the following in its stead, that is to say:—

AT THE PORT OF PORT PHILLIP.

For ships with explosives on board not exceeding two hundred and fifty (250) tons in weight:—

Westward of an imaginary line bearing 053 degrees to the Point Gellibrand Pile Lighthouse and southward of an imaginary line bearing 322 degrees to the outer end of the Truganina Jetty and exceeding a distance of one mile from the Shore:

For ships with explosives on board exceeding two hundred and fifty (250) tons and not exceeding four hundred (400) tons in weight:—

Within a radius of half a mile from a point distant 1.50 miles 129 degrees from the Triangulation Station on Point Cook:

For ships carrying service explosives:—

In addition to the foregoing areas within an area northward of the black light-buoy situated 3.66 miles 178 degrees from the Triangulation Station on Point Cook. From this buoy the area extends 1.60 miles 287 degrees, thence 0.75 miles 041 degrees, thence 1.60 miles 107 degrees, thence 221 degrees to the buoy at the point of commencement.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the

council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Cranbourne has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street by the said Council within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Cranbourne aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.—PUBLIC HIGHWAY.

Middle-road.

All that piece or parcel of land commencing at a point on a line bearing west 4181.7 links from the north-east corner of Crown allotment 92, Parish of Langwarrin, County of Mornington; and thence bounded by lines bearing south 4097.4 links, south 44 deg. 47 min., west 142 links, north 4198.2 links, east 100 links to the commencing point.

TEACHING SERVICE (TEACHERS' TRIBUNAL) REGULATIONS.

THE Teachers' Tribunal in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1946* hereby amends Regulation 4 of the Teaching Service (Teachers' Tribunal) Regulations made on the twenty-ninth day of October 1946 and published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirtieth day of October 1946 in the manner following, that is to say:—

For the heading "Transfer and Promotion of Teachers" substitute the heading "Appointments, Promotions and Transfers of Members of the Teaching Service."

After clause 6 there shall be added the following clauses:—

"7. (a) Where any person is appointed on probation to an office in the Teaching Service, the Director shall, on the expiration of the period of probation, report to the Tribunal as to the conduct of such person and the manner in which he has performed his duties, and the Tribunal may thereupon confirm or annul the appointment or extend the probation for a further period.

(b) The Tribunal may at any time during an extended period of probation, upon a report from the Director, confirm or annul the appointment.

(c) Upon the expiration of the extended period of probation of any probationer whose appointment has not been confirmed or annulled under the provisions of the last preceding sub-clause, the Tribunal shall, upon a report from the Director, confirm or annul the appointment.

(d) Where any appointment is annulled, the annulment shall take effect from such date as may be determined by the Tribunal."

"8. The provisions of clause 7 of this Regulation shall apply to any promotion or transfer to a professional position: Provided that, if at any time during the period of probation of a professional officer the Director reports to the Tribunal that the conduct of the officer and the manner in which he is performing his duties are satisfactory, the Tribunal may thereupon confirm such promotion or transfer."

*Teaching Service Act 1946.*TEACHING SERVICE (CLASSIFICATION, SALARIES AND
ALLOWANCES) REGULATIONS.

THE Teachers' Tribunal in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1946* hereby amends the Teaching Service (Classification, Salaries and Allowances) Regulations made on the nineteenth day of December, 1946 and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-seventh day of December, 1946 in the manner following, that is to say:—

PART IX.—ALLOWANCES.

- (1) Revoke clause 26 and substitute therefor the following clause:—

" 26. (a) Assistants (exclusive of lecturers) on the staffs of Teachers' Colleges and permanent assistants in training schools engaged in the work of training students shall be paid an allowance at the following rates:—

Male	£30 per year.
Female	£24 per year.

(b) Permanent assistants in secondary schools engaged in the training of secondary students shall be paid allowances at the following rates:—

Males	An allowance of £3 per student for each teaching term of three weeks' duration.
Females	An allowance of £2 8s. per student for each teaching term of three weeks' duration:

Provided that the total annual allowance paid to any assistant under this sub-clause shall not exceed the following:—

Males	£30 per year.
Females	£24 per year."

(2) A new clause 33 shall be added as follows:—

"33. 3. Clause 27 of the said By-law No. 17 shall be repealed and the following clause 27 substituted therefor:—

"27. No member shall speak more than once on the same question except when having been interrupted to ascertain whether there will be a seconder to the motion or amendment he desires to propose a member informs the Chairman that he will second the same or except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may be the mover or as the mover of the amendment last carried. And no member shall speak to any question after the mover shall have been permitted to reply."
