PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF
THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the *Local Government Act 1946* provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor in Council may, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the council of any municipality (not being a city or town, extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of that Act to the municipal district of such municipality, or any part thereof:

And whereas the Councils of the Borough of Koroit and the Shire of Berwick have requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal districts of such municipalities, and the Council of the Shire of Yea has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the Township of Yea within the municipal district of such municipality:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1946* to the municipal districts of the Borough of Koroit and the Shire of Berwick, and to the Township of Yea, within the municipal district of the Shire of Yea:

And do further provide that the said Regulations (other than those contained in Parts I. and II. of chapter 8 thereof) shall come into operation in the above-mentioned municipal districts, and part of municipal district, of the said municipalities on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and that the Regulations contained in the said Parts I. and II. of chapter 8 shall come into operation therein on the ninth day of February, 1948.

SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS
OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section two of section four of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council, after consultation by the Chief Secretary of Victoria with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim any period as the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria or any specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may proclaim different summer periods in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas the said Chief Secretary and the said Minister have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the period commencing on the twenty-sixth day of November, 1947, and ending on the twenty-ninth day of February next following to be the summer period in respect of the parts hereinafter specified of the country area of Victoria, that is to say:—

The Eighteenth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the City of Mildura and the Shires of Birchip, Karkaroc, Mildura, Walpeup, and Wycheproof;

The Twentieth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Borough of Swan Hill, and the Shires of Cohuna, Kerang, and Swan Hill.

VARIATION OF SPECIFICATIONS FOR SCHEMES OF PRIVATE STREET CONSTRUCTION, CITY OF MOORABBIN.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government (Private Street Construction) Act 1947*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, being satisfied that owing to shortages in supplies of cement or other required materials the works provided for in schemes adopted by the Council of the City of Moorabbin for the construction of Le Page-street, Railway-parade, Henry-street, Viola-crescent, and Railway-street north, Hightt, being private streets within the municipal district of the said city, which works were commenced prior to the commencement of the said Act, cannot be satisfactorily executed in accordance with the specifications, maps, plans, sections, and elevations in the schemes pursuant to which the works were commenced, doth by this Order, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, authorize the Council of the City of Moorabbin to execute the works with the following variations of the said specifications:—

In lieu of clauses contained in the respective specifications commencing with that headed "Roadway" and ending with that headed "Buffer Pitches," there shall be substituted:—

Rolling and Blinding.

(a) *Bottom Coat.*—Unless otherwise ordered crushed rock shall be used for the bottom coat and shall be thoroughly consolidated by watering, dragging, trafficking, and rolling and must be approved before spreading of the top coat is commenced. Spreading shall commence at a point on the road surface nearest the source of supply, and shall continue from that point so that the spread material will be consolidated by vehicles used for cartage and other traffic. The whole of the crushed rock shall be tipped on to flat iron sheets and spread therefrom. Should metal be ordered for the bottom coat, it shall be blinded with a light coat of clean approved gravel, or if no gravel is obtainable on the job with toppings. This metal is to be first rolled with the Council's roller before any blinding is applied. When sufficiently rolled it will be blinded with a light coat of gravel or toppings as ordered and again rolled. The same conditions for rolling shall apply to the consolidation of crushed rock as for metal.

(b) *Top Coat.*—The top coat shall consist of approved 2-in. metal spread to a uniform depth of 4 inches and rolled as specified for bottom coat and blinded with screening as specified herein. Three-quarter inch screenings shall be spread thinly and uniformly at a rate not exceeding 1 cubic yard to 120 square yards of surface, and shall be rolled, broomed, and watered in. Screenings shall be gradually added until the voids are well filled and level with the top of the coarse metal. Care must be taken to avoid forming a mat on the surface by using excessive screenings. Half-inch screenings shall then be

spread, broomed, and rolled and watered in until the small voids are well filled to the surface of the metal. Surface voids in particular must be completely filled. Quarter-inch screenings shall then be spread, broomed, and rolled and watered in until the small voids are well filled to the surface of the metal. Should any excess be on the surface of the metal, they shall be swept off so as to expose the face of all coarse stones. The contractor will be required to supply his own watercart for the above watering. All brooming and watering as specified above shall be included in the contractor's price for supplying and spreading of screenings.

Application of Bituminous Emulsion.

Bituminous emulsion of approved specification shall be then applied at the rate of 4 gallons per square yard, and allowed to penetrate the road until no free mixture is observed on the surface.

The company supplying the emulsion shall carry out the spraying with an approved sprayer.

Covering.

A light layer of 1-in. screenings shall then be spread at the rate of about 1 cubic yard to 120 square yards, and broomed and rolled into the road. The whole of the road shall be traversed by the roller at least twice after application of the covering of screenings. Contractor shall broom the screenings, as ordered, during rolling operations. Traffic should be allowed on the road during this period unless mud is being brought to the surface.

Bitumen Sealing.

A seal coat of bitumen of 80/100 penetration, which has been steadily and uniformly heated in a suitable heater to between 325° and 375°F., shall be applied at from 0.25 to 0.33 gallons per square yard of road surface. After application the bitumen shall be immediately covered with 8-in. (5/8-in.) screenings at such rate as shall be determined by the engineer and rolled with a power roller.

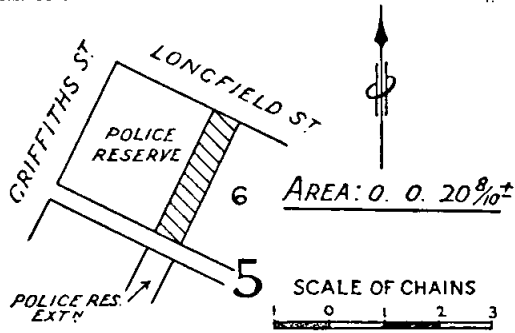

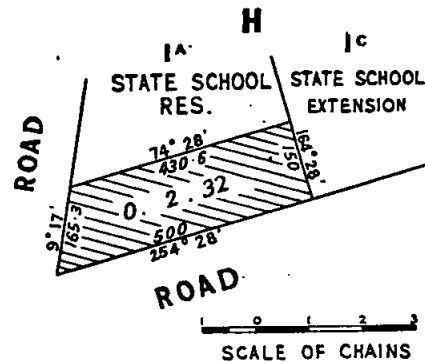

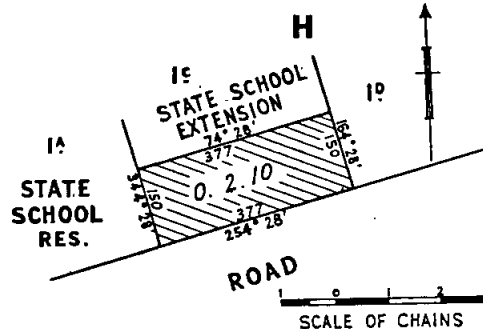
