REGULATIONS.—PART III.—SALARIES, INCREMENTS, AND ALLOWANCES.

Public Service Act 1946.

The Public Service Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Public Service Act 1946*, hereby amends the Public Service (Public Service Board) Regulations as follows:—

REGULATIONS.—PART II.—PROMOTIONS AND TRANSFERS.

After Regulation 47 the following Regulations are inserted:—

General.—Shorthand Writer and Typist (Female), Grade IV.

47A. No person shall be appointed to the office of Shorthand Writer and Typist (Female), Grade IV., unless she is licensed under the provisions of the *Evidence Act 1928* as a shorthand writer and is experienced in reporting depositions and interviews.

General.—Assistant (Female), Grade I.

47B. Any officer who has passed the School Intermediate Examination of the University of Melbourne, or an examination at least equivalent thereto, may, with the approval of the Board, be promoted from the office of Assistant (Female), Grade I. to the office of Assistant (Female), Grade II. on the completion of a period of twelve months' service on a salary of £221.

REGULATIONS.—PART V.—TRAVELLING EXPENSES.

DIVISION II.—REIMBURSEMENT OF CERTAIN OFFICERS FOR EXPENSES.

After sub-regulation (13) of Regulation 85, the following sub-regulation is inserted:—

Department of Public Works.—Ports and Harbours.

(14) When rations are not provided, an allowance at the rate of £32 a year in lieu of rations shall be paid to officers and members of the crews of the S.S. *Rip* and the dredges *Pioneer*, *Matthew Flinders*, and *Lady Stanley*: provided that no such allowance shall be paid—

- (a) during any week-ends when the vessel is in Melbourne to obtain fuel or stores;
- (b) during any period, not exceeding six weeks in the aggregate in any calendar year, when the vessel is laid up for overhaul or for any other purpose; and
- (c) during any period when, in the opinion of the Board, the vessel is laid up owing to the unjustifiable action of the crew or any member thereof.

These Regulations shall have effect as on and from the 1st February, 1947.
