ADMINISTRATIVE DIVISION.

Clerk, Class "C1," Department of Agriculture.

Yearly Salary.—£527, minimum; £579, maximum.

Duties.—To prepare salary sheets, pay salaries, and perform duties incidental thereto; to prepare financial and other statements as required, and to perform special duties as directed.

Qualifications.—To have a thorough knowledge of the Regulations respecting public accounts of the Superanuation Acts and Acts administered by the Department of Agriculture, and to be conversant with the Regulations governing Group Taxation.

PROFESSIONAL DIVISION.

Medical Superintendent (Female), Classes "B1" and "A," Children's Welfare Branch, Royal Park, Department of Chief Secretary.

Yearly Salary.—£800, minimum; £900, maximum, subject to a charge of 10 per cent. of total emolument payable by way of salary for quarters and allowances.

Inspector, Grade I., Department of Water Supply.

Duties.—Under the direction of the District Officer, to supervise works such as the construction of regulators, bridges, subways, and meter outlets, and the maintenance and repair of channels and structures; control all material and equipment on charge to the centre; supervise the distribution of water, and control private diversions from streams and lakes.

Qualifications.—Capacity for handling men and supervising gangs of men. Ability to set out works, structures, and channels from plans, and experience in effecting repairs and maintenance of such works. Experience in the regulation and distribution of water; ability to keep the necessary records, and to make arithmetical computations in connexion therewith. Knowledge of water requirements for orchards, vineyards, crops, pastures, and grasses grown under irrigation, and the method of preparation of land for same. A knowledge of the locality is desirable.




