Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 21 OF THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1934 (No. 4275).

I, Raymond Henry Beers, Secretary for Labour, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, hereby make, and issue the following adjusted Determination of the Wages Board referred to hereunder showing adjusted rates and prices to operate from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in November, 1948.

Clauses, other than clause 2, of the said Determination shall remain in force, provided that in lieu of the additional amounts prescribed in Note (a) to Parts I. and II. of the piecework schedule in Clause 14 there shall be substituted the following amounts for males and females respectively:—(a) 43s. 6d. and 22s. 9d. in Part I., and (b) 44s. 9d. and 22s. 9d. in Part II.
