ESSENTIAL SERVICES ACT 1948.

At Government House, Melbourne, the eighteenth
day of November, 1948.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 2 of the *Essential Services Act 1948* that "Essential Service" means any of the services therein enumerated (including *inter alia* transport) provided to the public by the persons or bodies mentioned in the said section or any other person or body specified (whether generally or specially) by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* in relation to such service: And whereas it is expedient to specify for the purposes of such definition the persons and bodies hereunder mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, in pursuance of the hereinbefore recited powers and of all other powers him thereunto enabling, doth by this Order specify in relation to the service of transport for the purposes of section 2 of the *Essential Services Act 1948* the following persons or bodies providing such service to the public of Victoria, viz.:—any person or body who provides the service of carrying passengers or the service of carrying goods by sea or by any other form of water transport.

And the Honorable John Gladstone Black McDonald, as Deputy for the Honorable the Premier of the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
