SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS
OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section two of section four of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council, after consultation by the Chief Secretary of Victoria with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim any period as the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria or any specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may proclaim different summer periods in respect of different parts of the said country area: And whereas the said Chief Secretary and the said Minister have consulted accordingly: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the period commencing on the twenty-fifth day of November, 1948, and ending on the thirty-first day of March next following, to be the summer period in respect of the parts hereinafter specified of the country area of Victoria, that is to say:—

The Eighteenth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the City of Mildura and the Shires of Birchip, Karkaroc, Mildura, Walpeup, and Wycheproof;

the Twentieth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Borough of Swan Hill, and the Shires of Cohuna, Kerang, and Swan Hill.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-third day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, and in the twelfth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.

PUBLIC SERVICE ACT 1946.

THE Public Service Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Public Service Act 1946*, hereby amends the Public Service (Public Service Board) Regulations as follows:—

REGULATIONS—PART I.—APPOINTMENTS TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE, PROFESSIONAL, AND TECHNICAL AND GENERAL DIVISIONS.

Sub-regulation (3) of Regulation 21A is amended by deleting the word "twenty" and substituting the word "five" in lieu thereof.

Sub-regulation (5) of Regulation 21A is amended by deleting the word "Mathematics" and the words "at School Leaving Standard," wherever appearing.

Sub-regulation (6) of Regulation 21A is amended by deleting the words "Mathematics, 150."

Sub-regulation (7) of Regulation 21A is amended by deleting the words "subject of examination" and substituting the words "of the subjects of English, General Knowledge, and Handwriting and at least 100 marks in General Intelligence."

Sub-regulation (9) of Regulation 21A is amended by deleting the word "Mathematics" and substituting the word "Handwriting" in lieu thereof.

Regulation 22A is revoked, and the following Regulation is inserted in lieu thereof:—

22A. Candidates for appointment as Draughtsmen in the Professional Division, Class "E," shall be required to enter for competitive examination in Practical Mathematics at the standard of School Leaving Mathematics I. and II., and in Penmanship.

TEACHING SERVICE (TEACHERS' TRIBUNAL) REGULATIONS.

THE Teachers' Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1946*, hereby amends Regulation 15 of the Teaching Service (Teachers' Tribunal) Regulations made on the 29th day of October, 1946, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirtieth day of October, 1946, in the manner following, that is to say:—

Rescind the whole of Regulation 15, and substitute therefor the following:—

REGULATION 15.

Staffing of Primary Schools.

1. Head Teachers shall be appointed to or retained in primary schools in accordance with the following scale:—

A Head Teacher of the Special Class to or in a school—

- (a) which has a net enrolment of at least 840 pupils, or
- (b) which has a net enrolment of at least 740 pupils, and is a training school, or a central school, or a school with post-primary classes, or
- (c) which has a net enrolment of at least 600 pupils and is recommended by the Director and approved by the Tribunal as an experimental school.

A Head Teacher of the First Class to or in a school with a net enrolment of at least 330 pupils.

A Head Teacher of the Second Class to or in a school with a net enrolment of at least 120 pupils.

A Head Teacher of the Third Class to or in a school with a net enrolment of at least 50 pupils.

A Head Teacher of the Fourth Class to or in a school with a net enrolment of at least 20 pupils.

A Head Teacher of the Fifth Class to or in a school with a net enrolment of less than 20 pupils.

2. Assistant Teachers shall be appointed to or retained in primary schools in accordance with the following scale:—

A Male Assistant of the First Class to or in a school which is classified in the Special Class.

A Male Assistant of the Second Class to or in a school with a net enrolment of at least 280 pupils.

A Male Assistant of the Third Class to or in a school with a net enrolment of at least 200 pupils.

Two Male Assistants of the Third Class to or in a school with a net enrolment of at least 400 pupils.

Three Male Assistants of the Third Class to or in a school with a net enrolment of at least 600 pupils.

A Female Assistant of the Special Class to or in a school classified in the Special Class—

- (a) which has a net enrolment of at least 400 pupils in the Infant Department, or
- (b) which has a total net enrolment of at least 400 pupils under the control of the Infant Mistress in the Infant Department and the Junior Department or part of the Junior Department, or
- (c) which has a net enrolment of at least 300 pupils in the Infant Department and is a training school or has an Infant Department detached from the main building.

A Female Assistant of the First Class to or in a school with a net enrolment of at least 440 pupils except in a school with a Female Assistant in the Special Class.

A Female Assistant of the Second Class to or in a school with a net enrolment of at least 160 pupils and less than 440 pupils, or in a school with a Female Assistant in the Special Class.

A Female Assistant of the Third Class to or in a school with a net enrolment of at least 80 pupils.

Two Female Assistants of the Third Class to or in a school with a net enrolment of at least 650 pupils.

A Male or Female Assistant of the Fourth or Fifth Class to or in a school with a net enrolment of at least 40 pupils.

3. (a) Additional Assistants of Classes below the Third Class shall be appointed to or retained in schools in accordance with the following scale:—

(b) For each increase of 40 in average attendance above 839 an additional assistant shall be appointed.

(c) In schools classified in the Special Class a First Class Male Assistant shall be substituted for an additional assistant in the general staffing schedule.

(d) In schools with a Female Assistant in the Special Class a Second Class Female Assistant shall be substituted for an additional assistant in the general staffing schedule.

4. Student Teachers may be allotted to schools for training purposes. Where it is found necessary to use Student Teachers for staffing purposes in lieu of Assistants, two Student Teachers shall be considered to be the equivalent of one Assistant, and such Student Teachers shall be replaced if employed on relieving duty.

5. In any Primary School where secondary work is undertaken, the total net enrolment of both the Primary and Secondary Divisions shall be reckoned in determining the classification of the Head Teacher, but the classification of all other positions in the Primary School shall be determined on the basis of the attendance in the Primary Division of the school.

6. In any Primary School where Secondary School work is undertaken, the Assistant Teachers appointed to undertake the Secondary School work shall be allotted in accordance with the provisions of the Regulations made for or with respect to the allotment of staffs in Secondary Schools.

7. In a school held in buildings situated at a distance apart, and in other special cases approved by the Tribunal on the recommendation of the Director, an additional Assistant (or a Sewing Mistress) may be appointed.

8. A Sewing Mistress may be appointed to any school with a net enrolment of not less than 30 pupils or to any school which has no female teacher on the staff thereof, and which has a net enrolment of not less than fifteen girls.

9. A part-time Sewing Mistress may be appointed to two or more schools, each of which is in charge of a male Head Teacher and has a net enrolment of not less than ten girls:

Provided that in special circumstances a part-time Sewing Mistress may be appointed to a school when recommended by the Director and approved by the Tribunal.

10. When a new school is opened, teachers shall be allotted in accordance with the estimated average attendance at the school.

11. In addition to the number of classified teachers provided for, 60 relieving teachers may be appointed to and employed in Primary Schools.

12. The additional positions in Classes 1, 2 and 3 consequent on this Regulation shall be advertised by regular instalments in the *Education Gazette and Teachers' Aid* over the period extending from 1st January, 1949, to 31st October, 1950, and appointments shall be made from time to time by the Committee of Classifiers for the Primary Schools Division in order that the prescribed staffing schedule shall be fully operative from 1st January, 1951.

13. The following staffing schedule for assistants shall be observed in schools other than Special Schools:—

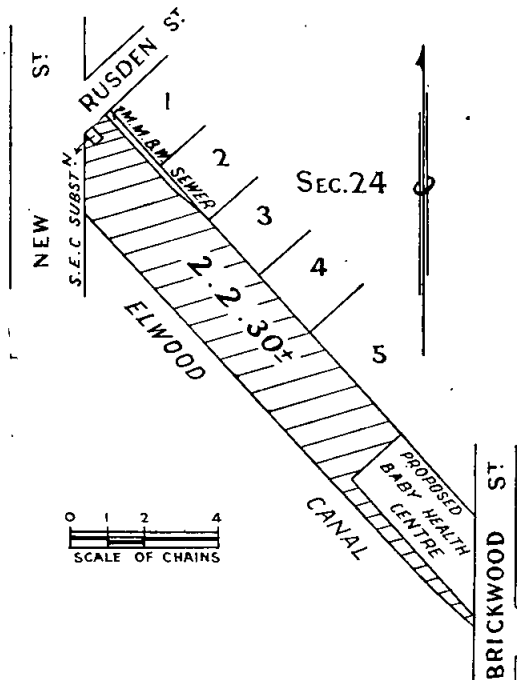

AMENDMENT OF BREAD MAKING AND BAKING
TRADE REGULATIONS (No. 1).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts and the Acts Interpretation Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. Regulation 10 of the Bread Making and Baking Trade Regulations (No. 1) shall be, and the same is hereby rescinded as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after the 17th day of November, 1948.

2. Such rescission shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person, or any liability of any person, under the said rescinded Regulation before the commencement of these Regulations.

3. For the said rescinded Regulation, the following Regulation shall be substituted:—

"10. The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in the said trade in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after the 17th day of November, 1948, on, from, and after which date all indentures of apprenticeship heretofore executed under the provisions of the Acts and Regulations made in respect of the aforesaid trade shall be deemed to be amended accordingly—

(a) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—

1st year—

1st six months—at the rate of 36s. 7d. per week.
2nd six months—at the rate of 37s. 5d. per week.

2nd year—

1st six months—at the rate of 40s. 2d. per week.
2nd six months—at the rate of 44s. 11d. per week.

3rd year—

1st six months—at the rate of 51s. 4d. per week.
2nd six months—at the rate of 60s. 9d. per week.

4th year—

1st six months—at the rate of 70s. 10d. per week.
2nd six months—at the rate of 82s. 11d. per week.

5th year—

1st six months—at the rate of 97s. 8d. per week.
2nd six months—at the rate of 113s. 10d. per week.

(b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of four years—

1st year—

1st six months—at the rate of 40s. 2d. per week.
2nd six months—at the rate of 44s. 11d. per week.

2nd year—

1st six months—at the rate of 51s. 4d. per week.
2nd six months—at the rate of 60s. 9d. per week.

3rd year—

1st six months—at the rate of 70s. 10d. per week.
2nd six months—at the rate of 82s. 11d. per week.

4th year—

1st six months—at the rate of 97s. 8d. per week.
2nd six months—at the rate of 113s. 10d. per week.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE TOURISTS' RESERVE AT CUMBERLAND RIVER.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations, and to rescind Rules and Regulations, for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the area of Crown land in the Parish of Lorne, at the mouth of the Cumberland River, indicated by red colour on plan marked C/24.11.37 with Lands Department, correspondence C.83021, and known as the "Cumberland River Reserve," and hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve," in lieu of all Regulations previously made in respect of such area which are hereby rescinded.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person offending against decency in dress, conduct, and/or language shall remain on the Reserve.
2. All persons bathing from the Reserve shall be decently attired in a suitable bathing costume.
3. No person shall permit any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, or other animals to enter in or upon the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management, and any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, or other animals straying therein shall be liable to be impounded.
4. No person shall destroy, disfigure, break down, carry away, or otherwise injure or damage any buildings, fences, seats, or other erections, trees, shrubs, plants, or other vegetation in or upon the Reserve, nor post bills upon, or write, paint, or carve any words or other device upon such buildings, fences, trees, shrubs, seats, or other erections.
5. No person shall erect any bathing-box, boat-house, shed, or other structure upon the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and no such permission will be given to any person until such person has submitted, and the Committee of Management has approved of, the plans and specifications of such bathing-box, boat-house, shed, or other structure.
6. All buildings on the Reserve must conform to plans and Regulations as to position and design approved by the Committee of Management.
7. No person after having obtained the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management shall use or cause or permit to be used any bathing-box, boat-house, or other erection for residential purposes.
8. No person shall camp or erect any tent for residential purposes in or upon the Reserve except in such places as shall from time to time be set apart for such purposes, and then only on obtaining a permit to do so upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management shall determine.
9. No person shall bring or place any motor car, cycle, buggy, gig, cart, or other vehicle in or upon the Reserve, except in or upon such portions thereof as shall from time to time be set apart by the Committee of Management as parking areas.

10. All persons using such parking areas for the accommodation of any motor car, motor cycle, cycle, buggy, gig, cart, or other vehicle shall pay such fees as shall be from time to time fixed by the Committee of Management, but the maximum fee therefor shall not exceed the sum of Two shillings (2s.) per day.

11. No fires shall be lighted or material burned upon the Reserve unless by express permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

12. No person shall erect any booth, tent, or other structure on the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. No assemblies or meetings for fêtes, galas, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship or preaching, or public speaking, or meetings of a like character, shall take place upon the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

14. No person shall play or perform in any band of music, or take part in any entertainment of any kind, in or upon the Reserve for the purpose of gain without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

15. No person shall throw or cause to be thrown any stones or hard substance on the Reserve.

16. No person shall play cricket, football, hockey, rounders, baseball, golf, or any similar game with a hard or solid ball on the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management.

17. No person shall discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, air gun, or any firearms in or upon the Reserve except by permission of the Committee of Management.

18. No person shall engage or take part in any motor car or motor cycle racing upon the Reserve, and it shall be an offence for any person to ride or use any motor cycle, car, or other vehicle on the Reserve in any way or manner that may endanger the safety of or cause bodily harm to any person.

19. No person shall moor and/or use any boat in or upon the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

20. No person shall deposit, or cause to be deposited, any paper, bottles, fruit skins, food, or other litter or refuse in or upon the Reserve except in receptacles provided upon the Reserve for that purpose by the Committee of Management.

21. No person, except a workman or labourer duly authorized by the Committee of Management, shall enter upon any enclosure or plot upon the Reserve set apart or enclosed for the plantation of trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, or other vegetation.

22. No person shall break any glass of any kind upon the Reserve or leave thereon any substance likely to cause injury to another.

23. All fees payable and received for camping, agistment, parking of vehicles, use of bathing-boxes, sites for sheds, tents, booths, bathing-boxes, or other structure, or for any other purpose or purposes, shall be expended in the maintenance, upkeep, and improvement of the Reserve, and an account thereof furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

24. Camping Fees.—All persons using the Reserve for camping purposes shall pay such fees as shall from time to time be fixed by the Committee of Management, but the maximum fee therefor shall not exceed the sum of 3s. per night or 15s. per week, with addition of 1s. per week or 6d. per night for each adult in excess of five persons.

The Country Roads Board has been appointed a Committee of Management of the Reserve with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of that portion of the reserved Crown lands in the Parish of Bemm as is indicated in red on plan marked E/30.11.1939, attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.4216, and known as the "Sydenham Inlet Foreshore and Camping Reserve," and hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve" in lieu of all Regulations previously made in respect of such area which are hereby rescinded.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE TOURISTS' RESERVE AT WYE RIVER.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations, and to rescind Rules and Regulations, for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the lands temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of 23rd April, 1930, as a site for Public purposes in the Parishes of Kaanglang and Wongarra, at Wye River, and of the portions of the Reserve for Public purposes in the said parishes as are indicated by green tint on plan marked KW/14.4.30 with Lands Department correspondence Rs.3989 (but exclusive of the Great Ocean-road traversing the areas referred to), and known as "Wye River Foreshore Reserve," and hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve," in lieu of all Regulations previously made in respect of such areas, which are hereby rescinded.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person offending against decency in dress, conduct, and/or language shall remain on the Reserve.
2. All persons bathing from the Reserve shall be decently attired in a suitable bathing costume.

3. No person shall permit any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, or other animals to enter in or upon the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management, and any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, or other animals straying therein shall be liable to be impounded.

4. No person shall destroy, disfigure, break down, carry away, or otherwise injure or damage any buildings, fences, seats, or other erections, trees, shrubs, plants, or other vegetation in or upon the Reserve, nor post bills upon, or write, paint, or carve any words or other device upon such buildings, fences, trees, shrubs, seats, or other erections.

REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "WONTHAGGI RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the lands situate in the Township of Wonthaggi temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 25th August, 1911, as a site for Public Recreation, and by Order in Council of 18th September, 1923, as a site for Recreation purposes, such sites being together known as the "Wonthaggi Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days as the Reserve may be set apart by the Committee of Management for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions the maximum scale of fees which may be charged or taken for admission to the Reserve, and to any stand, building, erection, or enclosure for the time being thereon, exclusive of tax, shall be as follows:—

- (a) For the admission of each person to the Reserve, such sum as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine, not exceeding 2s. 6d.
- (b) For the admission of each person to any stand, building, erection, or enclosure, such sum as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine, not exceeding 10s. 6d.
- (c) For the admission of each saddle horse, exclusive of rider, such sum as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine, not exceeding 2s.
- (d) For the admission of any carriage, cart, or other vehicle, exclusive of passengers, drawn by one horse or other animal, such sum as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine, not exceeding 2s.
- (e) For the admission of any carriage, cart, or other vehicle, exclusive of passengers, drawn by two or more horses or other animals, such sum as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine, not exceeding 4s.
- (f) For the admission of any vehicle driven by motor power, exclusive of passengers, such sum as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine, not exceeding 4s.

2. On any occasion on which the Reserve is set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, as provided for in Regulation 1, the Committee of Management shall have the right to levy such charge as it deems fit for the use of the Reserve, or any part thereof, or any building or erection thereon.

3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission of the Committee of Management, in writing.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw any stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

6. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall drive, ride, or lead any animal or vehicle on any enclosure or track within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No public entertainment of any sort shall be conducted in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Fifty pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

14. No person or organization may make any charge for admission or offer any article for sale entitling persons to admission to the Reserve without the approval, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
