Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said *Act* provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 6 and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

*Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1928.*DECLARING A MUNICIPAL DISTRICT TO BE SUBJECT
TO PART II. OF ACT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by paragraph (c) of section 40 of the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1928* it is provided that Part II. of the said Act shall have effect as regards any municipal district outside any milk area on such date as such district is proclaimed by the Governor in Council to be subject to the provisions of Part II. of the said Act. Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation declare the municipal district of the Shire of Newstead and Mount Alexander to be subject to the provisions of Part II. of the aforesaid Act on and from the first day of April, 1948, on which date Part II. of the said Act and all Regulations and Orders now in force or which may from time to time be made under Part II. of the said Act shall come into operation and be of full force and effect in such municipal district.

*Local Government Act 1946.*PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF
THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the *Local Government Act 1946* provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the Council of any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part LXIX. of that Act to the municipal district of such municipality, or any part thereof: And whereas the Council of the Borough of St. Arnaud has requested that the operations of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal district of such municipality: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1946* to the municipal district of the Borough of St. Arnaud, and do further provide that the said Regulations (other than those contained in Parts I. and II. of chapter 8 hereof) shall come into operation in the above-mentioned municipal district of the said municipality on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and that the Regulations contained in the said Parts I. and II. of chapter 8 shall come into operation therein on the first day of June, 1948.

PUBLIC HIGHWAYS.—SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Dandenong has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been used and reserved as streets by the said Council within the said shire, be so declared to be public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the lands used and reserved as streets hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Dandenong aforesaid, to be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

SHIRE OF DANDENONG.—PUBLIC HIGHWAYS.

All that piece of land being part of Crown portions 36, 37, and 43, Parish of Dandenong, County of Bourke, commencing at a point on the north boundary of Princes Highway, distant 179 ft. 0½ in. by that boundary from its intersection with the east boundary of Gladstone-road; thence by lines bearing north 89 deg. 50 min. east 3,373 ft. 0½ in.; thence south 0 deg. 10 min. east 66 feet, south 89 deg. 50 min. west 3,294 ft. 9½ in. to the north boundary of Princes Highway; thence by that boundary bearing north 50 deg. west 102 ft. 3½ in. to the point of commencement, and being that portion of David-street between Princes Highway and Cleeland-street coloured brown on plan of subdivision No. 3232, lodged in the Office of Titles.

All that piece of land being part of Crown portion 22, Parish of Dandenong, County of Bourke, and commencing at a point 165 feet from the intersection of the south side of Douglas-street and the west side of Frank-street, and bounded on the east by the west side of Frank-street by a line bearing south 34 deg. 49 min. west for a distance of 10 feet; thence by a line bearing north 55 deg. 11 min. west for a distance of 206 ft. 3½ in.; thence by a line bearing north 34 deg. 49 min. east for a distance of 10 feet; thence by a line bearing south 55 deg. 11 min. west for a distance of 206 ft. 3½ in. to the commencing point.

DANGEROUS DRUGS.

ADDITIONS TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THE SIXTH SCHEDULE TO THE
"POISONS ACT 1928."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 38 of the *Poisons Act 1928*, as amended by section 5 of the *Poisons Act 1930*, power is conferred on the Governor in Council by Proclamation, on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, to add to paragraph (2) of the Sixth Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1928* the name of any substance or preparation the name of which is not included in paragraph (1) of the said Schedule, but, which is likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill effects of such a nature as to make it expedient in the opinion of the Board to add the name thereof to the said paragraph (2); and to declare that

Division 2 of Part III. of the said Poisons Act shall apply to the said substance or preparation in the same manner as it applies to the substances and preparations included in the said paragraph (2): And whereas the name of the substances or preparations known as—

1. Amidopyrine and its salts and preparations thereof.
2. Streptomycin and its salts and all other antibiotic metabolites, whether derived from natural sources or produced by synthetic means and preparations thereof.
3. Thiourea and preparations thereof.
4. Thiouracil, methyl, ethyl, propyl, or other derivatives of Thiouracil and preparations thereof.
5. Synthetic anti-histamine drugs including—
 - (a) Benzhydryl alkamine ethers, such as Benadryl.
 - (b) Derivatives of ethylenediamine, such as Antergan, Pyribenzamine, Neo-antergan.
 - (c) Imidazole analogues, such as Antistine,

are not included in paragraph (1) of the said Schedule, but each one is likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill effects of such a nature as to make it expedient in the opinion of the said Board to add the name thereof to the said paragraph (2) of the said Sixth Schedule: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the said Board, do by this my Proclamation add to paragraph (2) of the Sixth Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1928* the names of—

1. Amidopyrine and its salts and preparations thereof.
2. Streptomycin and its salts and all other antibiotic metabolites, whether derived from natural sources or produced by synthetic means and preparations thereof.
3. Thiourea and preparations thereof.
4. Thiouracil, methyl, ethyl, propyl, or other derivatives of Thiouracil and preparations thereof.
5. Synthetic anti-histamine drugs, including—
 - (a) Benzhydryl alkamine ethers, such as Benadryl.
 - (b) Derivatives of ethylenediamine, such as Antergan, Pyribenzamine, Neo-antergan.
 - (c) Imidazole analogues, such as Antistine.

And declare that the provisions of Division 2 of Part III. of the *Poisons Act 1928* shall apply to the said substances or preparations, namely, to—

1. Amidopyrine and its salts and preparations thereof.
2. Streptomycin and its salts and all other antibiotic metabolites, whether derived from natural sources or produced by synthetic means and preparations thereof.
3. Thiourea and preparations thereof.
4. Thiouracil, methyl, ethyl, propyl, or other derivatives of Thiouracil and preparations thereof.
5. Synthetic anti-histamine drugs, including—
 - (a) Benzhydryl alkamine ethers, such as Benadryl.
 - (b) Derivatives of ethylenediamine, such as Antergan, Pyribenzamine, Neo-antergan.
 - (c) Imidazole analogues, such as Antistine,

in the same manner as it applies to the substances and preparations included in the said paragraph (2).

The foregoing addition to part (2) of the Sixth Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1928* was recommended by the Pharmacy Board of Victoria by resolution at its meeting held at Melbourne on the 18th day of December, One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, the said substances or preparations being likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill effects of such a nature as to make it expedient, in the opinion of the Board, to add the names as aforesaid.

Medical Act 1928.

PHARMACY BOARD OF VICTORIA.

FURTHER REGULATIONS.

UNDER and by virtue of the powers in that behalf conferred by Part III. of the *Medical Act 1928* the Pharmacy Board of Victoria (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") with the approval of the Governor in Council doth make the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Pharmacy Regulations 1947" and shall be read and construed as one with the Pharmacy Regulations 1930, 1931, 1933, 1934, 1935, 1939, 1944, and 1945 which regulations and these Regulations may be cited together as the Pharmacy Regulations.

EXAMINATIONS.

2. Regulation 40 and Appendix A of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 are hereby rescinded and the following regulations shall be substituted therefor, namely:—

The preliminary examination shall be held in the month of November in each year and at such other times as the Board may from time to time determine.

3. Pass standard.—The marks for a pass in any subject prescribed for the Preliminary Examination shall be not less than 50 per cent. of the maximum marks allotted thereto, but a candidate who gains an average of 50 per cent. of the aggregate marks allotted for all of the subjects for which he presents himself at the one examination shall be entitled to be passed in each subject the marks gained in which are not less than 40 per cent. of the marks allotted to that subject.

If at such subsequent examination the marks gained by a candidate, added to the marks gained by him in the subjects in which he passed at a prior examination, aggregate 50 per cent. or more of the possible marks for a complete examination, he shall be awarded a pass in the subjects offered, provided that he shall not be passed in any subject in which he gains less than 40 per cent. of the possible marks.

4. In Regulation 41 after the word "English" add the words "two papers one in English Expression and one in English Literature."

5. In Regulation 44 in place of the words "ten days" substitute "fourteen days."

6. The time-table in Regulation 47 (11) is hereby rescinded.

7. Regulation 54 is hereby amended by substituting under the heading Preliminary Examination the word "paper" for the word "subject," in line two and by deleting under the heading Intermediate Examination, the words "All subjects £3" and by adding thereto after the words—

"Three subjects £2" the words—

"Four subjects £3 and
Five subjects £3 10s."

8. Appendix "B" of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 is hereby rescinded and the following Regulation is made:—

Intermediate Examination.

(a) The Intermediate Examination shall be held in the month of November in each year and at such other times as the Board shall from time to time determine.

(b) *Subjects of examination.*—The Intermediate Examination shall consist of written and practical exercises in the following subjects, namely:—

- (1) Inorganic and practical chemistry.
- (2) Organic chemistry.
- (3) Materia medica Part I.
- (4) Materia medica Part II. (Pharmaceutics).
- (5) Pharmaceutical botany.

(c) *The pass standard.*—A candidate at the Intermediate Examination must obtain not less than 50 per cent. of the total marks allotted to each of the subjects in order to secure a pass.

A candidate who passes in three subjects may, on the recommendation of the examiners, be permitted to present himself for examination in the remaining subjects as single subjects at a subsequent examination.

(d) *Examination syllabus and text books.*—The syllabus of the Intermediate Examination shall be as prescribed by the Board from time to time and published in the Official Handbook issued by the Board annually.

The Board shall publish each year in its Official Handbook a list of recommended text books for each subject of the Intermediate Examination.

9. Appendix "C" of the Pharmacy Regulations 1939 is hereby rescinded and the following Regulations shall be substituted therefor, namely:—

Final Examination.

(a) The Final Examination shall be held in March, June, September, and December in each year on such days as may be fixed by the Board.

(b) *Subjects of examination.*—The syllabus of the Final Examination shall be as prescribed by the Board from time to time and published in the Official Handbook issued by the Board annually.

The Board shall publish each year in its Official Handbook a list of recommended text books for each subject of the Final Examination.

(c) *The pass standard.*—The percentage of marks necessary to secure a pass in the Final Qualifying Examination shall be not less than 60 per cent. of the maximum marks in each subject.

A candidate who passes in three subjects may on the recommendation of the examiners be permitted to present himself for examination in the remaining subjects as single subjects at a subsequent examination.

The preceding Regulations were made at a meeting of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria held at Melbourne on Thursday, the 18th day of December, 1947.

DANGEROUS DRUGS REGULATIONS 1947.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Poisons Acts His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria doth make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1947" and shall be read and construed as one with the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1930, 1931, 1932, 1934, 1945, 1946, 1946 (No. 2), 1946 (No. 3), and 1946 (No. 4).

2. Regulations 31, 32, 33, and 34 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1930 as amended by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1931, 1934, 1946, 1946 (No. 2), and 1946 (No. 4) and the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1946 (No. 3) are hereby rescinded and the following Regulations shall be substituted therefor, namely:—

PART II.

Specified Drugs.

31. (1) The specified drugs to which this Part of the Regulations apply are the substances and preparations included in paragraph (2) of the Sixth Schedule to the *Poisons Act* 1928 and any other substance or preparation added thereto by proclamation.

(2) No person shall have in his possession any specified drug unless such drug has been lawfully obtained under the provisions of these Regulations.

(3) No person shall supply or dispense any specified drug except upon the written prescription of a medical practitioner or a registered veterinary surgeon:

Provided that a pharmaceutical chemist may supply for bona fide veterinary purposes any of the sulphonamides or substituted sulphonamides, or a preparation containing any of the sulphonamides or substituted sulphonamides or penicillin and preparations thereof without a prescription from a veterinary surgeon in places where it is not reasonably practicable to obtain such a prescription; and provided also that in places where it is not reasonably practicable to obtain a prescription from a veterinary surgeon, a person holding a licence as a general dealer in poisons under the *Poisons Act* 1928, may supply in the unopened original container as supplied by the manufacturer for veterinary use a proprietary preparation consisting of or containing any of the sulphonamides or substituted sulphonamides, which is unsuitable for human use, and is packed in a container labelled in accordance with the provisions of the Poisons Regulations and bearing in addition the words "For Veterinary Use" in prominent letters.

32. (1) The provisions of the last preceding Regulation shall not apply to the sale by an unauthorized person of a specified drug to a duly qualified medical practitioner, a registered veterinary surgeon, a registered pharmaceutical chemist, or to any scientific or public institution, public hospital, or Government department (on the signed written order of the superintendent in immediate charge of any such institution, hospital, or department), or to a nurse employed by the Victorian Bush Nursing Association who furnishes a written order signed by a medical officer of the association, nor to the sale or supply by a wholesale druggist licensed under the provisions of these Regulations to persons authorized to sell or supply any of the specified drugs.

(2) No person other than a registered medical practitioner or a registered veterinary surgeon shall write and/or issue a prescription for a specified drug; provided that a registered dentist may issue a prescription for penicillin or any preparation of penicillin or for not more than six tablets of any drug of the barbituric acid group. Every such prescription issued by a registered dentist shall be marked by such dentist—"For Dental Treatment Only," shall bear the name and address of the said dentist, the name and address of the patient, and the date of issue of the prescription.

33. Every registered medical practitioner, registered veterinary surgeon and registered dentist, who writes and/or issues a prescription for a specified drug, shall indicate thereon the quantity of the drug to be supplied and the maximum number of times such prescription shall be dispensed. The prescription shall be written in ink, shall be dated and signed with the usual signature of the prescriber and shall specify his address and the name and address of the person for whom the drug is prescribed.

34. (1) No person, except as provided by these Regulations, shall dispense any prescription for any specified drug unless—

(a) Such prescription bears the signature of the medical practitioner or veterinary surgeon or dentist by whom it purports to be given;

(b) He has no reason to suppose that the prescription is not genuine.

(2) Such prescription shall not be dispensed more than once unless the prescriber has indicated on the face of the prescription that it is to be dispensed more than once or at a specific interval or intervals, or within a specified period not exceeding six months.

(3) The prescription shall be marked, stamped, or legibly inscribed by the dispenser in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 77 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930, and Regulation 15 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1935.

(4) The person who dispenses the prescription on the last occasion permitted under these Regulations as determined by clause (2) hereof shall in addition to the requirements of clause (3) hereof also stamp, mark, or inscribe in durable and legible letters across the prescription the word "cancelled."

(5) No person shall dispense a prescription for a specified drug if such prescription bears a date more than six months prior to its presentation.

(6) The provisions of Regulations 33 and 34 (2), (4), and (5) shall not apply to the sale or delivery of any specified drug by a registered pharmaceutical chemist on the certificate or written authority signed by a duly qualified medical practitioner, stating that any such drug is required for a person suffering from epilepsy or any chronic or malignant disease: Provided that such certificate or authority is dated and delivered to the registered pharmaceutical chemist by the medical practitioner prior to the first sale or delivery of such drug, and that the original prescription or written order is retained by the said chemist and attached to the prescription book opposite the entry required to be made by him under the regulations made under the *Medical Act 1928*: Provided further that no sales or deliveries shall be made after six months from the date of issue of such certificate or authority.

(7) The provisions of Regulations 33 and 34 (2), (4), and (5) shall not apply to prescriptions of registered medical practitioners for—

1. Preparations containing not more than $\frac{1}{2}$ grain per dose of barbituric acid and organic or metallic derivative of barbituric acid and not less than 5 grains of theobromine or not less than $\frac{1}{2}$ grain of ephedrine or not less than $1\frac{1}{2}$ grain of aminophyllin or not less than 1/300th grain of atropine.
2. Amidopyrine and its salts and preparations thereof.
3. Penicillin and its salts and preparations thereof.
4. Streptomycin and its salts and all other antibiotic metabolites whether derived from natural sources or produced by synthetic means and preparations thereof.
5. Thiourea and preparations thereof.

6. Thiouracil, methyl, ethyl, propyl, or other derivatives of thiouracil, and preparations thereof.
7. Synthetic anti-histamine drugs including—
 - (a) Benzhydryl alkamine ethers such as benadryl.
 - (b) Derivatives of ethylenediamine such as antergan, pyribenzamine, neo-antergan.
 - (c) Imidazole analogues, such as antistine.

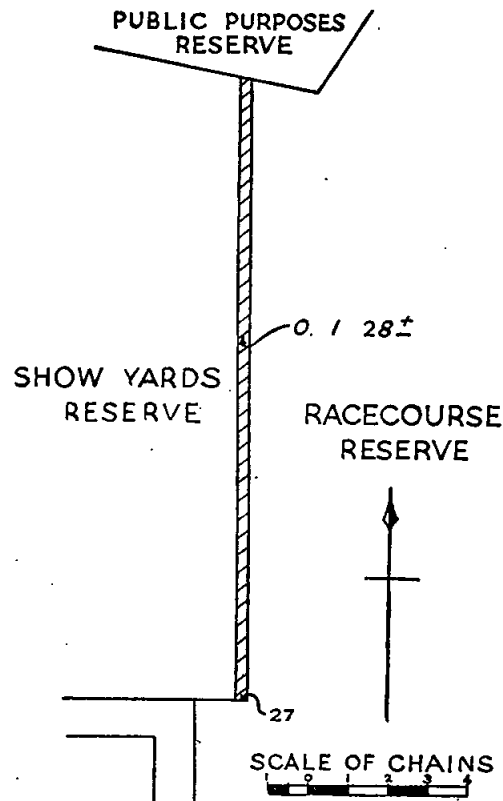

SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.

BY-LAW NO. 30.

A By-law of the Shire of Cranbourne, made under the Health Acts, and numbered 30, relating to the collection and disposal of nightsoil.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Acts and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Cranbourne, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Cranbourne, for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within its jurisdiction, makes the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matter and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed, and By-law No. 17 is hereby expressly repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the following parts of the municipal district, that is to say:—

Cranbourne Township.

(i) The whole of the Town of Cranbourne and Crown allotments 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, and 16, Parish of Cranbourne, County of Mornington.

Tooradin Township.

(vi) Allotments 17, 18, 43, 43A, and 43B, Parish of Koo-wee-rup, County of Mornington; and the Reserve lying immediately east of Crown allotments 10e and 10c, Parish of Yallock, and which is bounded on the north by the Koo-wee-rup-Longwarry road and on the south by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission drain.

Unless exempted by the Council, this By-law shall apply to every house, building, and premises in the above-mentioned parts of the municipal district.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"The Commission" means the Commission of Public Health.

"The Depot" means the depot for disposal of nightsoil provided by or for the contractor and approved by the Council.

"Inspector" means any officer authorized by the Commission or Council, and includes any acting or assistant inspector.

"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

5. The proprietor of any premises on which there is erected a pan-closet shall cause the space under the seat of each pan-closet on such premises to be prepared and kept prepared for the accommodation of a pan as prescribed herein, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for at all times, and shall cause each pan-closet to be kept in a fit state for such service.

6. The proprietor shall cause every pan-closet to be supplied with a pan for the reception of nightsoil, and shall (except when such pan is being exchanged) cause such pan to be always kept in proper position under the seat of each pan-closet, and shall also provide a lid capable of being fitted tightly to such pan when being removed from the premises whereon such pan-closet is situate to the depot, so as to prevent the spilling of the contents and the emission of offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia from the contents of such pan.

7. Such pan shall be cylindrical in shape and formed of galvanized iron of not less than 22 gauge or other approved material or materials, presenting on the inside and outside an impervious, hard, smooth, and durable surface, and those surfaces which come into contact with nightsoil shall also be free from any projections. It shall be watertight, strongly constructed, reinforced with metal bands where necessary, and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

Each pan shall have a capacity of 1½ cubic feet, and shall have an internal depth of 14 inches, a diameter of not less than 14 inches, and a suitable rim or lugs to permit an airtight lid to be affixed.

The seams of the pan shall be folded, grooved, and sweated with solder.

8. The proprietor of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a supply of liquid deodorant of lime, sawdust, or some other dry material efficient for deodorizing nightsoil, and shall cause all nightsoil which may be deposited in the pan in such pan-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

9. The proprietor shall provide every urinal with an approved apparatus for the regular automatic discharge into such urinal of sufficient approved deodorant for the purpose of keeping such urinal constantly deodorized.

10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops, water, or rubbish in any pan.

11. The proprietor of any premises whereon there is a pan-closet or urinal shall—

(a) maintain such pan-closet and urinal in good repair and in a cleanly condition; and

(b) when required by an inspector effectually disinfect such pan-closet or urinal and/or the contents thereof, and effect any repairs thereto that such inspector may deem necessary.

12. At least once a week, and in any case as often as may be necessary to prevent the level of the contents of such pan approaching within 2½ inches of the brim thereof, the pan in use shall be closed with a lid and removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council with the contents from the premises, and another pan thoroughly cleansed and in good order shall be left in its place.

13. Such contractor or person removing such pans shall report to the Council at the earliest available opportunity the discovery of any pan found to be overflowing or leaking, and shall forthwith cause the place whereon the contents have been dropped or spilled to be properly cleansed.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for that purpose shall cause all pans to be removed in a suitable covered vehicle in such manner as not to cause a nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness, and forthwith cause such vehicle to be removed to the approved depot. Whilst in such vehicle, all pans shall be completely covered from the view of persons other than the driver of such vehicle or his assistant.

15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of nightsoil shall cause such nightsoil to be deposited at the depot, and disposed of in such a manner as may be authorized by the Regulations.

16. If such nightsoil be disposed of in trenches, such trenches shall be not less than 9 or more than 18 inches in depth, nor exceed 2 feet in width, and the bottom thereof shall be broken up by suitable means to facilitate percolation of liquids, and the nightsoil shall be deposited therein in layers not more than 6 inches deep, and shall be left at such a depth that there shall be below ground level a covering of at least 6 inches in depth of clean, thoroughly broken-up soil upon the nightsoil and pan-washings when covered in.

17. No trench shall be used for the disposal of nightsoil where the bottom consists of rock or other impermeable material.

18. Immediately after the deposit of the nightsoil and washings in any trench, such trench shall be filled in with thoroughly disintegrated earth. The necessary fillings shall be obtained by excavation of another trench in a position parallel to but not less than 12 inches from the aforesaid trench required to be filled in, and using the materials so obtained as a covering over the nightsoil so deposited. Trenches shall be excavated and used and filled in in regular consecutive order.

19. Seed of grass or any forage or cereal crops or other such form of vegetable life, as the Council shall direct or approve, shall be seasonably planted or sown on any land into which nightsoil has been deposited, provided that vegetables or seed of vegetables shall not be planted therein or thereon until three months have elapsed since the last deposit of nightsoil in such land.

20. Every pan used for the reception or conveyance of nightsoil shall immediately on being emptied be thoroughly washed or otherwise cleansed. The resultant washings or other filth shall be disposed of in a similar manner as the nightsoil.

21. Every pan, after the disposal of its contents and after being cleansed in manner aforesaid and before it again leaves the depot or disposal ground, shall on every such occasion be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected by—

- (a) immediately after washing and scrubbing with water subjecting the pan to a current of steam from a boiler at 60 lb. pressure to the square inch for not less than two minutes in a steam-tight box or chamber, or
- (b) thorough washing and scrubbing in water, then rinsing in clean water, and finally submerging for not less than five minutes in an aqueous solution containing not less than 1 per cent. of accol, cyllin, kerol, izal, hycol, or other disinfectant of equal efficiency, or
- (c) thorough washing and scrubbing in water and afterwards submerging for not less than five minutes in boiling water, or
- (d) any other method approved in writing from time to time by the Commission.

22. The internal surface of every pan before it is first used shall be properly coated with well boiled tar, crude creosote, or other approved material, and such coating shall thereafter be renewed when deemed necessary by the Council, but not less than once a month.

23. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of nightsoil shall cause all vehicles used for the transport of pans to the depot to be properly constructed, kept clean and disinfected daily at the depot, and maintained in a proper state of repair.

24. The proprietor or any other person shall not remove any nightsoil from any premises except in accordance with this By-law.

25. The proprietor or any other person within the area defined by this By-law shall not bury nor cause to be buried any nightsoil in any yard, garden, or other place not being a place set apart for such purpose by the Council.

26. The inspector shall have full power to enter into or upon any premises, yards, or lands at any time for the purpose of inspecting closets, urinals, pans, receptacles, vehicles, plant, and all other things and places therein and thereon, and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this By-law.

27. Any person who by any wilful act or default shall contravene any of the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall for every breach of this By-law be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

Resolution for the passing of this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 7th day of November, 1947, and was confirmed on the 5th day of December, 1947.
