AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

· By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

Country Fire Authority Acts. SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section two of section four of the Country Fire Authority Act 1944 it is enacted that the Governor in Council, after consultation by the Chief Secretary of Victoria with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette proclaim any period as the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria or any specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may proclaim different summer periods in respect of different parts of the said country area: And whereas the said Chief Secretary and the said Minister have consulted accordingly: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Act 1944, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the period commencing on the first day of December, 1948, and ending on the thirty-first day of March next following to be the summer period in respect of the parts hereinafter specified of the country area of Victoria, that is to say:

Those parts of the Nineteenth Fire Control Region

Those parts of the Nineteenth Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Borough of St. Arnaud, and the Shires of Charlton, Donald, Kara Kara, and Korong;

Those parts of the Twenty-first Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Shires of Gordon, Rochester, and East Loddon;

Those parts of the Twenty-second Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Boroughs of Echuca and Shepparton and the Shires of Deakin, Numurkah, Rodney, Shepparton, Tungamah, and Waranga;

The Twenty-third Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Borough of Wangaratta and the Shires of Benalla, Oxley, Rutherglen, Wangaratta, and Yarrawonga; and

Those parts of the Twenty-fourth Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Shires of Beechworth, Chiltern, and Wodonga.

PROCLAMATION OF A MENTAL HOSPITAL

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

WHEREAS by section 34 of the Mental Hygiene Act 1928, as amended by Mental Hygiene Act 1933, it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time by Order published in the Government Gazette proclaim any house or building in Victoria provided by the State for the reception of insane persons a mental hospital and may by Order published as aforesaid revoke such Proclamation:

And whereas on the fifteenth day of May, 1945, a Proclamation was issued proclaiming the following buildings a mental hospital as from the said date:—

Ward A, Ward B, Ward C, the Farm Workers' Block described as the "Boys" Block, and the Nursery Block of Janefield Colony, situate at Janefield, in the Parishes of Nillumbik and Keelbundora, Counties of Evelyn and Bourke, as shown in the plan annexed hearch.

ALTERATION OF CONDITIONS RELATING TO REGISTRATION OF FISHING BOATS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

- I THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation repeal the Proclamation made the twenty-first day of December, 1936, and published in the Government Gazette of the twenty-third day of December, 1936, regarding registration of fishing boats, and provide as follows:—
- 1. No boat shall be engaged or employed by any person In fishing or in taking oysters or both in fishing and in taking oysters in Victorian waters unless such boat shall taking oysters in Victorian waters unless such boat shall have first been duly registered at the office of the Inspector of Fisheries, Melbourne, and a certificate of such registration issued in accordance with the form marked "A" hereunder. Such certificate shall be signed by the Inspector of Fisheries; provided however that it shall be within the discretion of the Minister to refuse to register any boat or to cancel the registration of any boat.
- 2. Applications for certificates of registration shall be according to the form marked "B" hereunder.
- 3. The fee to be charged for the registration under the 3. The fee to be charged for the registration under the Fisheries Acts of any boat to be engaged or employed in fishing or in taking oysters or both in fishing and in taking oysters shall be Ten shillings (10s.), and such registration shall remain in force from the day on which the certificate of the same shall be issued until the thirty-first day of December then next ensuing and no longer; provided that a registration of which a certificate is issued in the month of December in any year shall remain in force until the thirty-first day of December of the year then next ensuing. then next ensuing.
- 4. Every such boat registered under the Fisheries Acts shall, so as to indicate the fact that it is registered, have the letter "V" followed by the registration number in numerals painted legibly on both bows of the boat, outside, clear above the water line. Such letter and numerals shall be not less than 3 inches in height, and shall be well clear of any other letters or numerals which may be on the boat, and shall be kept legibly painted, in white paint on a dark ground, or in black paint on a light ground. light ground.
- 5. When two boats are engaged or employed by a licensed fisherman at the same time in the one fishing or oystering operation, the smaller boat shall be deemed to be a "tender" to the larger boat. One fee of Ten shillings (10s.) shall cover the registration of both boats when used in such circumstances. The "tender" shall have the

letters T over V followed by the registration number of the larger boat painted on both bows in the manner prescribed by paragraph 4 of this Proclamation.

6. No person shall permit the letter "V," with or without numerals, to be or remain on any boat if such boat is not registered at the office of the Inspector of Fisheries, Melbourne, as a boat licensed to be engaged or employed in fishing or oystering in Victorian waters.

Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928 (No. 3799). SIMULTANEOUS DESTRUCTION OF VERMIN ORDERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 11 of the Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928 (No. 3799) it is enacted that it shall be the duty of every occupier and of every owner of land from time to time to destroy all vermin on any land occupied or owned by him and on the adjacent half-width of all roads bounding or adjoining the same or any part thereof and to keep such land and half-width of roads clear and free of all vermin and for such purposes to do all necessary or proper acts or things: Provided that where on any road any formed part of the road or any bridge culvert cutting embankment channel drain or work or any stone gravel wood or material deposited on the road to be used in the construction or maintenance thereof is a harbor or cover for vermin it shall be the duty of the council of the municipality in the municipal district of which such harbor or cover is situate to destroy all vermin therein and to keep the same clear and free of all vermin:

And whereas by section 12 of the said Act it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, specify a day on from and after which any duty specified in the next preceding section shall in the whole or in part of Victoria specified in the Proclamation be simultaneously commenced continued and performed by every occupier and every owner of any land within the whole or such part of Victoria (as the case may be):

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do

hereby name the sixteenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, as the day on from and after which the duty specified by the said section 11 shall be simultaneously commenced continued and performed by every occupier and every owner of land within the whole of Victoria.



- BY-LAW No. 80.

 A By-law of the City of Kew, made under the provisions of sections 197, 222, and 719 of the Local Government Act 1946, and numbered 80, for preserving good order and decency in, providing for the management and use of, the charges for admission to, and the prevention of damage to the public baths (hereinafter called "the Kew Swimming Pool") off High-street, in the City of Kew, including all land, buildings, furniture, fittings, property, and effects used in connexion with the said public baths, and for imposing penalties for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law.
- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1946, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Kew order as follows:—
- 1. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the Government Gazette of Victoria.
- This By-law shall apply to and operate in the whole of that part of the municipal district of Kew wherein are erected the public baths off High-street, and all land and buildings used in connexion therewith.
- 3. By-law No. 56 of the City of Kew, providing for the preservation of good order and decency in and the management of and other matters relating to the public baths in the City of Kew, is hereby repealed.
- 4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter-
 - "Kew Swimming Pool" means the public baths off High-street, in the City of Kew, and all land and
 - buildings used in connexion therewith. tendant" means any person employed or authorized by the Council to carry out duties at the Kew Swimming Pool, and shall include the collector
 - as hereinafter defined.

 "Bathing dress" shall mean, when worn by females, a one-piece or two-piece bathing costume covering the chest and the lower part of the trunk, and, when worn by males, trunks covering the lower part of the trunk.

 "Collecter"
 - part of the trunk.

 "Collector" means any person authorized by the Council to accept payment for admission to the Kew Swimming Pool, or payment for hire of towels and bathing dress thereat.

 "Council" means the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Kew.

 "Pool" means such portion of "

 ool" means such portion of the Kew Swimming

 Pool which stands within the enclosure now
 erected and used as the said Public Baths, and
 shall include any enclosed addition which shall
 from time to time be made thereto or alteration
 thereof, and includes the swimming bath as herein

 "Swimming bath" means that portion of the pool usually filled with water.

 The masculine gender includes the feminine.

- 5. No person shall be admitted to the pool, unless he pays to the collector the charge for admission provided by this By-law and obtains a ticket authorizing such admission, and before being admitted to the pool delivers such ticket to an attendant if requested to do so.

 6. No person shall have any claim against the Council or its servants or its agents for any injury suffered while in the pool or in the swimping both.
- in the pool or in the swimming bath.

 7. No person shall enter or use the swimming bath, unless he has first used one of the cleansing showers
- 8. No person in an unclean condition or suffering from any skin infection or contagious disease shall use any portion of the pool, and no person who in the opinion of an attendant is in an unclean condition or who is suffering the standard of the pool and the pool from any such disease shall refuse or fail to leave the pool immediately upon being requested to do so by an attendant.

 9. No person shall use soap in any part of the pool,
- other than in the cleansing showers.
- 10. No person shall take into the swimming bath or use any substance or preparation which shall discolour or in any way pollute the water in the swimming bath.
- 11. No person shall commit any nuisance in or foul or pollute the water in the swimming bath.
 - 12. No person shall smoke in the pool.
- 13. No person shall spit in the pool or deface any portion of the pool or any furniture or fitting therein.
