Prices Regulation Act 1948.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 11.

WOOLLEN AND WORSTED YARNS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Prices Regulation Act 1948*, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 11.

Application.

2. This Order shall not apply to Fingering yarns.

Revocation.

3. Prices Regulation Order No. 2378 as amended by Prices Regulation Orders Nos. 2383, 3151, 3244 and 3279 made under Commonwealth National Security (Prices) Regulations is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

4. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
“Crossbred wool” means wool other than Merino wool.
“Merino wool” means—
 - (i) wool of 58's quality or higher; or
 - (ii) any mixture of wool containing 50 per centum or more of wool of 58's quality or higher which is recombod.

“ Resultant count ” means—

- (i) in the case of single-ply yarns—the actual count thereof;
- (ii) in the case of yarns other than single-ply—the count ascertained by dividing the count of the singlefold component strands of such yarn by the number of ply threads.

Wound Worsted Yarns Single-ply 24's Count Not Exceeding Specified Twist.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which wound worsted yarns single-ply 24's count of the quality specified in the second column of the First Schedule to this Order and not exceeding twelve (12) turns per inch may be sold to be—

- (a) where such yarns are undyed—the price specified in the third column of such First Schedule opposite to each such quality;
- (b) where such yarns are other than undyed—the prices specified in the First Schedule plus—
 - (i) where such yarns are spun from crossbred wool (other than bleached or pastel shade)—
 - other than marls—9½d. per lb.;
 - marls containing yarns which are undyed and have not been bleached—7½d. per lb.;
 - marls containing only dyed yarns, or yarns spun from coloured tops or mixtures of such yarns with bleached yarns—12d. per lb.;
 - (ii) where such yarns are spun from Merino wool (other than bleached or pastel shade)—
 - other than marls—12d. per lb.;
 - marls containing yarns which are undyed and have not been bleached—8½d. per lb.;
 - marls containing only dyed yarns or yarns spun from coloured tops or mixtures of such yarns with bleached yarns—14d. per lb.;
 - (iii) where such yarn is bleached or pastel shade—
 - wound in hanks—15d. per lb.;
 - wound other than in hanks—15d. per lb. plus the amount specified for winding such count from hanks to cones or cheeses in the tenth paragraph of this Order.

Wound Worsted Yarns Single-ply Other Than 24's Count Not Exceeding Specified Twist.

6. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which wound worsted yarns single-ply, in counts other than 24's, of the qualities specified in the second column of the First Schedule to this Order and not exceeding the number of turns per inch specified in the Third Schedule to this Order may be sold to be the maximum prices fixed by the provisions of paragraph 5 of this Order for sales of those yarns in 24's count of such qualities and not exceeding twelve (12) turns per inch less or plus the amount as specified in the second column of the Second Schedule to this Order according to the count of such yarn.

Wound Worsted Yarns Other Than Single-ply.

7. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which wound worsted yarns other than single-ply may be sold to be—

- (a) where such yarns are knitting twist yarns—the maximum prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for single-ply yarns of such count and quality plus the amount as specified in the second column of the Fifth Schedule to this Order according to the count of such yarn;
- (b) where such yarns are weaving twist yarns and not exceeding the number of turns per inch specified in the Seventh Schedule to this Order for such count of yarn—the maximum prices fixed by sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph for knitting twist yarns plus the amount set out opposite such count of yarn in the Sixth Schedule to this Order.

Wound Worsted Yarns Exceeding Specified Twist.

8. (1) I fix and declare the maximum prices at which wound worsted single-ply yarns in which the number of turns per inch exceeds the turns per inch specified in the Third Schedule to this Order for such count of yarn, or wound worsted weaving yarns other than single-ply in which the number of turns per inch exceeds the turns per inch specified in the Sixth Schedule to this Order for such count of yarn, may be sold to be the maximum prices fixed for such yarns by the foregoing provisions of this Order plus, for each additional turn per inch above the turns per inch so specified, the amount specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Order for such count of yarn.

(2) This paragraph shall not apply to marl yarns.

Unwound Worsted Yarns.

9. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which worsted yarns dyed or undyed may be sold unwound to be the maximum prices fixed for wound yarns by the foregoing provisions of this Order less—

- (a) where the resultant count does not exceed 12's—1½d. per lb.;
- (b) where the resultant count exceeds 12's—1½d. per lb. plus ¼d. per lb. per resultant count for each resultant count by which the resultant count exceeds 12's.

Winding from Hank to Cone or Cheese.

10. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which worsted yarns which have been wound from hank to cone or cheese may be sold to be the maximum prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for such count and quality of yarn plus—

- (a) where the resultant count of such yarn does not exceed 10's—3½d. per lb.;
- (b) where the resultant count of such yarn exceeds 10's—3½d. per lb. plus ¼d. per lb. per resultant count for each resultant count by which the resultant count exceeds 10's.

Scoured Yarns.

11. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which wound worsted yarns which have been scoured may be sold to be—

- (a) where such yarn is scoured and wound in hanks—4d. per lb.;
- (b) where such yarn is scoured and wound other than in hanks 4d. per lb. plus the allowance for winding from hanks to cone or cheese specified in paragraph 10 of this Order.

Woollen Yarns.

12. I fix and declare the maximum price at which dyed or undyed woollen yarns of any ply or quality or wound or unwound may be sold by any person to be such price as is fixed by notice in writing to such person by me.

Cartons, Cases, &c.

13. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum prices at which any of the yarns specified in the foregoing provisions of this Order may be sold together with cases, cartons or any other container for such yarn to be—

- (a) where such case, carton or other container is not returnable to the seller—the prices specified in the foregoing provisions of this Order plus the actual cost to the seller of such cases, cartons or other containers;
- (b) where any sum of money is refundable on the return of such case, carton or other container—the maximum prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order plus the amount to be refunded as aforesaid, or the cost of such case, carton or other container plus 50 per centum thereof, whichever is the lesser.

14. I fix and declare the maximum price at which cases, cartons or any other container used for the packing of woollen and worsted yarns may be sold by a seller of such yarn at a separate price to be the cost to that seller of those cases, cartons or any other container.

Regain.

15. (1) The maximum prices fixed by or under the provisions of this Order or any notice in pursuance thereof are based on a maximum percentage moisture regain of—

- (a) the regain at which a seller sold such yarn on the twentieth April, 1943, or, if no such sale was made on that date, the last preceding date on which such sale was made; or
- (b) 18½ per centum,

whichever is the lesser.

(2) For the purpose of this Order any sale of yarn at a regain greater than that specified in sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph shall be computed so that for every amount of 1 per cent. or part thereof the percentage moisture regain exceeds that specified as the maximum for this Order, the maximum prices fixed by the preceding provisions of this Order shall be reduced by 1½ per centum of such price.

16. The maximum prices fixed by the provisions of this Order include free delivery to the purchaser's store where such store and the seller's mill are both situated—

- (a) within the Melbourne metropolitan area; or
- (b) the same proclaimed area,

as the case may be. In any other case, the maximum prices so fixed include delivery free on rail or free on board, as the case may be.

Sales in Lots of Less Than 100 lb.

17. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order where worsted yarns are sold in lots of less than 100 lb. per lot, the maximum prices for such sales shall be the maximum prices fixed by such foregoing provisions of the Order plus the sum of 4d. per lb. in each case.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

18. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any kind of woollen or worsted yarn specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Invoicing.

19. Every person who sells any yarn to which this Order applies shall in respect of every such sale supply to the buyer an invoice on which is set out, in respect of such yarn—

- (a) the quality thereof;
- (b) the ply and the count thereof;
- (c) if the number of turns per inch is greater than is specified in the Third or Seventh Schedules (as the case may be) the actual number of turns per inch thereof;
- (d) the colour thereof;
- (e) the form of package and weight thereof; and
- (f) a statement as to whether the yarn is dry, bleached, scoured, &c., or in oil.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 13.

WHOLE WHEAT—CRUSHED OR GRISTED WHEAT—WHOLESALE
AND RETAIL.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Prices Regulation Act 1948*, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 13.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 2472 as amended by Prices Regulation Orders 2809 and 3036 made under the Commonwealth National Security (Prices) Regulations is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“By wholesale” means in relation to any sale of any wheat by any person or persons other than a grower or the Australian Wheat Board—

- (a) in relation to whole wheat—that the quantity sold is 10 tons 9 cwt. or over,
- (b) in relation to crushed or gristed wheat—that the quantity sold is 3 tons or over.

"By retail" means in relation to any sale of wheat whether whole or crushed or gristed that such a sale is not a sale as defined in this paragraph for sales by wholesale.

"Bushel" means—

- (a) in relation to whole wheat a weight of 60 lb.,
- (b) in relation to crushed or gristed wheat a weight of 60 lb.

"Ton" means—

- (a) in relation to whole wheat a long ton of 2,240 lb.,
- (b) in relation to crushed or gristed wheat a short ton of 2,000 lb.

Sales by Wholesale.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which whole or crushed or gristed wheat may be sold by wholesale by any person or persons other than a grower or the Australian Wheat Board to be—

- (a) in the case of wheat (other than crushed or gristed) the price paid or payable to the Australian Wheat Board plus the following margins:—

For sales ex railway truck—2d. per bushel.

For sales ex store—4d. per bushel.

- (b) in the case of crushed or gristed wheat—

- (i) the price paid or payable to the Australian Wheat Board for the whole wheat plus an amount calculated at One shilling per bushel; or

- (ii) £13 14s. per short ton, whichever amount is the lesser.

Sales by Retail.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which wheat including crushed or gristed wheat may be sold by retail in the lots as set out in the first column of the Schedule to this Order to be—

- (a) where sold ex truck—the sum of the following:—

- (i) the price paid or payable by the retailer;
- (ii) the cost of transport by rail from the railway station or siding nearest to the wholesaler's premises to the railway station or siding nearest to the purchaser's premises or place of business; and
- (iii) the margin as set out opposite to such quantity in the second column of the said Schedule.

- (b) where sold ex store—the sum of the following:—

- (i) the price paid or payable by the retailer;
- (ii) the cost of transport by rail from the railway station or siding nearest to the wholesaler's premises to the railway siding or station nearest to the retailer's premises or place of business; and
- (iii) the retail margin set out opposite to such quantity in the third column of the said Schedule.

- (c) where delivered ex store to the purchaser's premises—the sum of the following:—

- (i) the price specified in sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph for sales ex store of wheat including crushed or gristed wheat; and
- (ii) the actual cost of transport (if any) incurred by the retailer in relation to such delivery, but not exceeding in any case an amount calculated at the rate set out opposite such class and lot in the fourth column of the said Schedule.

Provided that no amount shall be added under the provisions of this paragraph for cost of transport unless such amount is recorded separately on an invoice delivered to the purchaser.

Delivery of Invoices.

6. Any person who sells wheat, including crushed or gristed wheat, at a maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by the provisions of this Order, shall deliver with such wheat an invoice specifying the number of bushels sold and the selling price thereof.

Hessian Container.

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, where wheat, including crushed or gristed wheat, is sold in a broken bag lot in a hessian container, the maximum price fixed for the sale of

such wheat shall, if the cost of the container is separately recorded on an invoice delivered by the retailer, be increased by an amount equal to such cost.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice in Writing.

8. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any wheat including crushed or gristed wheat may be sold by any person to whom notice in pursuance of this paragraph is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Prices Regulation Act 1948.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 14.

BRAN AND POLLARD—WHOLESALE AND RETAIL.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Prices Regulation Act 1948*, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 14.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 5, made under the *Prices Regulation Act 1948*, is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“by wholesale” means, in relation to any sale of bran or pollard, that the quantity sold is not less than 3 long tons of 2,240 lb. each;

“by retail” means, in relation to any sale of bran or pollard, that such a sale is not a sale by wholesale as defined in this paragraph;

“Melbourne and suburbs area” means all that area defined in the First Schedule to this Order;

“mill town area” means any area in which deliveries of bran or pollard were customarily made from a local mill to the purchaser's premises by the miller prior to 17th September, 1948;

“bushel” means, in relation to any sale of bran or pollard, 20 lb. in weight.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Wholesale—Melbourne and Suburbs.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bran or pollard may be sold by wholesale for delivery in the Melbourne and suburbs area to be—

- (a) where delivered free to purchaser's premises—the price specified in the second column of the First Schedule to this Order opposite to such area in the first column thereof;
- (b) where delivered ex mill or free to the railway station or siding most accessible to the purchaser's premises—the price specified in sub-paragraph (a) hereof less 2s. 6d. per ton; or
- (c) other deliveries—the price specified in sub-paragraph (a) hereof less the cost which would be incurred in transporting such bran or pollard to the purchaser's premises.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Wholesale—Outside Melbourne—Other Than Mill Town Areas.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bran or pollard may be sold by wholesale for delivery outside the Melbourne and suburbs area, except where the purchaser's premises are within a mill town area, to be—

- (a) where delivered to the railway station or siding most accessible to the purchaser's premises—the price specified in the second column of the Second Schedule to this Order according to the railway station or siding to which such bran or pollard is so delivered; or
- (b) where delivered on rail, but not free on rail, to railway station or siding most accessible to the purchaser's premises—the price specified in sub-paragraph (a) hereof less the freight which would be incurred in transporting such bran or pollard to such most accessible railway station or siding: Provided that—
 - (i) where such most accessible railway station or siding is on the Tatong line beyond Benalla or on the Whitfield line beyond Wangaratta, then in such case Benalla and Wangaratta respectively shall be deemed to be the most accessible railway station as aforesaid;
 - (ii) in the case of Portarlington, Dromana, Sorrento and Flinders—free on board Geelong or Melbourne shall be substituted for most accessible railway station or siding and railway station or siding as aforesaid.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Wholesale—Outside Melbourne—Mill Town Areas.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bran or pollard may be sold by wholesale for delivery outside the Melbourne and suburbs area in all cases where the purchaser's premises are within a mill town area to be—

- (a) where delivered free to the purchaser's premises—the price specified in the second column of the Second Schedule to this Order according to the railway station or siding to which those premises are most accessible;
- (b) where delivered ex mill or free to the railway station or siding most accessible to the purchaser's premises—the price specified in sub-paragraph (a) hereof less 2s. 6d. per ton; or
- (c) for other deliveries—the price specified in sub-paragraph (a) hereof less the cost which would be incurred in transporting such bran or pollard to the purchaser's premises.

Maximum Prices—Deliveries Under 3 Tons.

7. (1) The maximum prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order are for deliveries of 3 long tons (6,720 lb.) or more.

(2) Where deliveries are made of less than 3 long tons (6,720 lb.) and the seller has incurred freight costs which have not been charged to the purchaser, then the maximum prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order shall in each case be increased by an amount by which the freight incurred is greater than the proportional amount of freight on a 3 long ton truck lot basis.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Retail.

8. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bran or pollard may be sold by retail to be—

- (a) in respect of sales by millers—
 - (i) for deliveries in lots of 1 bushel or more—2s. 2d. per bushel; or
 - (ii) for deliveries in lots of less than 1 bushel—2s. 3d. per bushel; and
- (b) in respect of sales other than by millers—
 - (i) for deliveries to the purchaser's premises—
 - (aa) in bushel lots—2s. 8d. per bushel;
 - (bb) in bag lots—2s. 6d. per bushel; or
 - (ii) for deliveries ex store—
 - (aa) in bushel lots—2s. 6d. per bushel;
