Country Fire Authority Acts.

SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section two of section four of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council, after consultation by the Chief Secretary of Victoria with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim any period as the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria or any specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may proclaim different summer periods in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas the said Chief Secretary and the said Minister have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the period commencing on the fifteenth day of December, 1948, and ending on the thirty-first day of March next following to be the summer period in respect of the parts hereinafter specified of the country area of Victoria, that is to say:—

The Second Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the City of Bendigo, the Borough of Eaglehawk and those portions of the municipal districts of the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye within the aforesaid fire control region;

The Third Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Cities of Geelong and Geelong West, the Town of Newtown and Chilwell, and those portions of the municipal districts of the Shires of Corio and South Barwon within the aforesaid fire control region;

The Seventh Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Borough of Queenscliffe and the Shires of Bannockburn, Barrabool, Bellarine, Leigh and Winchelsea, and those portions of the municipal districts of the Shires of Corio and South Barwon not within the third fire control region;

The Tenth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Town of Sale, and the Shires of Alberton, Avon, Maffra, Morwell, Rosedale, South Gippsland and Traralgon;

The municipal districts of the Shires of Omeo and Orbost in the Eleventh Fire Control Region;

The Twelfth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Shires of Alexandra, Mansfield and Yea;

The municipal district of the Shire of Eltham in the Thirteenth Fire Control Region;

Those portions of the Fourteenth Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the City of Chelsea and the Shires of Bacchus Marsh, Dandenong, Gisborne, Kilmore, Newham and Woodend, and Romsey, and those portions of the municipal districts of the Cities of Moorabbin and Heidelberg, and of the Shires of Braybrook, Broadmeadows, Doncaster and Templestowe, Mulgrave, Werribee and Whittlesea, within the aforesaid Fire Control Region;

Those portions of the Sixteenth Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Town of Ararat and the Shires of Ararat, Lexton and Ripon;

Those portions of the Seventeenth Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Shires of Arapiles and Kowree;

Those portions of the Twenty-first Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Borough of Castlemaine and the Shires of Huntly, Metcalfe and Maldon, and those portions of the municipal districts of the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye not within the Second Fire Control Region;

Those portions of the Twenty-second Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Shires of Euroa, Goulburn, McIvor, Pyalong, Seymour and Violet Town; and

Those portions of the Twenty-fourth Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Shires of Bright, Towong, Upper Murray and Yackandandah.

2. DEMURRAGE.

(A) In every case in which it is prescribed in any By-law of the Commissioners for the time being in force that the unloading of goods from a truck shall be performed by the owner or consignee, the period allowed for unloading after the placing of any truck shall be as specified hereunder, and if the unloading of goods from such truck be not completed within that period, demurrage at the rates specified shall be imposed and levied :—

- (i) at a private siding at the location to which the goods have been consigned ;
- (ii) at a public siding at the location to which the goods have been consigned if the consignee of the goods is at the same time incurring demurrage on a truck already placed at the said siding.

The provisions of this By-law shall become effective as from 1st December, 1948.

THE GEELONG HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

SUPERANNUATION REGULATIONS.—AMENDING REGULATION.

THE Geelong Harbor Trust Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers contained in the Geelong Harbor Trust Acts, hereby make the following amendments in and to the Regulations of the Trust, and known as the Superannuation Regulations, which Regulations were approved by the Governor in Council on the fourth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, and amended by a Regulation so approved on the twenty-eighth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and forty-five.

1. Section 2 shall be amended as follows:—

(a) In the interpretation of "Contributor" by substituting for paragraph (a) and (b) the following paragraph:—

"Any person who shall have completed one year's continuous regular employment in the service and was at the time of commencement of such service under the age of fifty-nine years and who within two calendar months next after the completion of such one year's service or the date of the coming into operation of this paragraph, whichever happens later, having made application to the Commissioners has been notified that his application has been approved."

(b) After the interpretation of "service" by deleting the words "the qualifying service" and paragraphs (a) and (b) of the interpretation of "the qualifying service."

(c) At the end of the section by substituting for the final provision the following provision:—

"In respect of any person who prior to the coming into operation of the amended interpretation of 'Contributor' hereinbefore contained has been accepted as a contributor the Regulations shall be read and construed as if such amended interpretation was in operation at the time of such acceptance."

2. The proviso to section 7 shall be amended as follows:—

(a) By substituting for paragraph (a) the following paragraph:—

"(a) Where a contributor being of the age of 45 years or more is accepted as a contributor on or after the date of coming into operation of this paragraph."

(b) By inserting in paragraphs (b) and (c) after the word "contributor" the words "being then of the age of forty-five years or more."

3. Section 14 shall be amended by substituting for sub-section (b) the following sub-section, such amendment to come into operation on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine:—

"(b) Notwithstanding anything in the preceding sub-section, after the coming into operation of this paragraph the half-yearly amount of contribution by the Commissioners in respect of a contributor shall be in no case lower than one-half of the annual sum deducted from his wages in accordance with the provisions of section 7."

4. Section 19 shall be amended by inserting the following provision at the end of the section:—

"Provided that, subject to the interest of any contributor arising under the provisions of section 18, the Commissioners shall have the power to withdraw from the fund and pay into the 'General Harbor Trust Fund' the whole or any part of the amount of the said contributions and interest thereon."

SEVERANCE OF AREA FROM THE SHIRE OF
MULGRAVE AND ANNEXATION TO THE CITY OF

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this present Order sever from the municipal district of the Shire of Mulgrave the area hereinafter described, and doth annex the portion so severed to the municipal district of the City of Oakleigh, and doth constitute the annexed district a new subdivision to be known as the East Ward of such city, and doth re-define the boundaries of the municipal district of the City of Oakleigh, and the North, South, and West Wards thereof, and of the municipal district of the Shire of Mulgrave and the subdivisions thereof, in the manner hereinafter set forth and described:—

Men's Hairdressing—

1st year—at the rate of 30s. 0d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 45s. 0d. per week.
3rd year—at the rate of 65s. 0d. per week.
4th year—at the rate of 102s. 6d. per week.

Ladies' and Men's Hairdressing—

1st year—at the rate of 30s. 0d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 45s. 0d. per week.
3rd year—at the rate of 65s. 0d. per week.
4th year—at the rate of 102s. 6d. per week.
5th year—at the rate of 130s. 0d. per week.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "CANN RIVER PUBLIC PURPOSES RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 13th July, 1948, as a site for Public purposes in the Township of Cann River, Parish of Noorinbee, and known as "Cann River Public Purposes Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve."

The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding 30 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, athletic, cycling, or other sports or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a charge not exceeding 3s. may be made for admission of each adult person to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who offends against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way any buildings, fences, gates, seats, asphalt, netting, posts, play devices, trees, shrubs, flowers, tracks, pitches, courts, water pipes, water taps, drainage pipes, erections, enclosures, or fittings in the Reserve, and no person shall light or tend any fire therein, except in the fireplaces provided for that purpose.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or in any way injure or disfigure any of the fences, gates, seats, buildings, erections, or fittings in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, fruit peel, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles therein.

5. No person shall put into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or any other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, tracks, or any structure or erection in the Reserve.

9. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized sport, including tennis, football, cricket, foot-racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may determine.

10. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No person, except a labourer or workman employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

12. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his work and duty.

13. Every person or club using the tracks, pitches, courts, yards, seats, buildings, rooms, erections, enclosures, and conveniences provided and erected in the Reserve, may be charged such fees and rents for the use thereof as the Committee of Management may from time to time consider reasonable and consistent with these Regulations. The moneys received in fees and rents shall be expended on the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and a statement thereof shall be forwarded annually to the Board of Land and Works.

14. Persons renting or hiring any site, stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fête, games, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Ten Pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such site, stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such site, stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee. All persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

15. No person shall publicly address any assembly or assemble with any other person or persons for the purpose of hearing any public address within the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

16. No male person shall enter or use any place, room, or building set apart for the use of females, and no female person shall enter or use any place, room, or building set apart for the use of males. The provisions of this clause shall not apply to a male person under the age of seven years.

17. No person shall intrude or enter upon any playground or oval within the Reserve while any organized game or sport is being played or conducted thereon. The provisions of this clause shall not apply to any player, competitor, or official actually taking part, competing, or assisting in the conduct of any such organized game or sport.

18. Any person committing in any part of the Reserve, or in any of the buildings, structures, or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations:—

- (a) Assaulting any other person.
- (b) Being drunk.
- (c) Crossing or trespassing on the playing ground during any cricket match, football match, cycling race, or sports, or during practice at football, cricket, cycling, or sports.
- (d) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (e) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
- (f) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (g) Improperly interfering with or interrupting any cricket match, football match, cycling race, or any athletic or other sports or holiday amusements, or any practice thereat.
- (h) Obtaining admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.

19. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any goods or articles of any description without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

20. Any person, club, or society, having obtained permission of the Committee of Management to use any dressing shed, pavilion, or other structure, shall maintain and leave same in a clean and tidy condition. No water tap or shower shall be left running, nor shall any room or enclosure be left unlocked after use.

21. No person shall force open any locked gate or door to any enclosure, room, or building in the reserve, nor shall any person use any unauthorized key to open any lock on such gate or door.

22. Should any person receive from any member, officer, or employee of the Committee of Management any key or keys for the unlocking of any doors or gates in the Reserve, he shall return such key or keys in good order and condition.

23. All keys shall be returned to the caretaker of the Reserve, or to the Secretary of the Committee of Management before sunset of the day on which such keys were received, unless otherwise allowed or directed by the Committee of Management.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "MOORNGAG PUBLIC HALL AND RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 21st November, 1887, as a site for Public Recreation, and by Order in Council of 7th September, 1948, as a site for the additional purpose of a Public Hall in the Parish of Rothesay, and known as the "Moornag Public Hall and Recreation Reserve," herein-after referred to as the "Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 52 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for public meetings, dances, entertainments, cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding five shillings (5s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

11. No person shall play in any competition, tournament, or inter-club game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury, or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No person, except a labourer or workman employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

14. No person or body of persons shall use the Reserve, or any structure thereon, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and then only subject to such terms and conditions and the payment of the fees as are fixed by such Committee.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "GOULBURN PARK RESERVE," SEYMOUR.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of 12th February, 1890, 31st December, 1930, and 26th August, 1947, for Public Recreation in the Township and Parish of Seymour, all of which lands are together known as the "Goulburn Park Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. Subject as hereinafter appears, the Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 52 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for swimming, carnivals, fêtes, sports, holiday amusements, or band recitals, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for admission for every adult and One shilling for every child to the Reserve.

2. The Committee of Management shall have power to let the Reserve, or any portion thereof, to any person, club, or association, subject to the payment of such rent and/or fees, and on such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

3. No club or association of any kind, having for its object physical recreation, or any member or members of any club or association, nor any other person, shall play, swim, practise, train, or engage in any game of sport or athletic exercise within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, unless any such person is at the time of playing or swimming a member of any club which is duly authorized to play in the Reserve or use the swimming pool and appointments at such time; providing that any person not otherwise offending against these Regulations may enter on the Reserve and swim in the pool and use the appointments on paying to the club or association for the time being leasing the Reserve, or to the Committee of Management, a fee not exceeding One shilling per day, or part thereof.

4. No person shall—

(a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and for maintaining good order in the Reserve the Committee of Management or its employees or officers may refuse any person admission to the Reserve or any structure therein;

(b) climb or jump over the gates, fences, seats, tables, signboards, building equipment, notices, fittings, or other improvements in or around the Reserve, nor stick therein or thereon any bills, or in any way injure, damage, deface, write, or paint on or otherwise mark any rocks, gates, fences, seats, tables, buildings, equipment, notices, signboards, or other improvement, structure, or fittings therein or thereon, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones, mud, or any missiles of any kind therein;

(c) remove or displace any board, plate, or fittings or written notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Committee of Management in the Reserve;

(d) damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, or cut reeds or other vegetation in the Reserve.

5. Every person shall exercise reasonable and proper care in the use of any portion of the Reserve, dressing rooms, conveniences, or appurtenances therein.

6. No person shall, without the consent of the Committee of Management, light any fire in the Reserve, except in a place set apart by the Committee for the purpose. No such fire shall be left burning unattended, and before lighting such fire such person shall make provisions for extinguishing the same either by water or loose earth, and before leaving shall effectually extinguish the same.

7. Every person whilst in the Reserve shall take special precaution against the risk of fire.

8. All fees prescribed herein shall be paid to the secretary or specially authorized officer of the Committee of Management, on demand.

9. No person shall camp on any portion of the Reserve, except in those parts specially set apart for the purpose by the Committee of Management, and then only after obtaining a written permit subject to such conditions and the payment of such fees as are hereinafter provided.

10. The charges for camping in the area set apart are as follows:—A sum not more than Two shillings (2s.) for one night for a car party not exceeding six persons; for each additional person a sum of Six pence (6d.) per night, and for a party not exceeding six persons Five shillings (5s.) per week.

11. Camp sites whilst occupied by a camp party must be kept in a clean, sanitary, and tidy condition, and before a camp party leaves the Reserve such party shall collect and place in the receptacles provided for the purpose all refuse, litter, or garbage produced at the camp sites allotted to such party.

12. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. No person shall bathe or prepare to bathe in the Reserve, unless clad in a bathing costume which meets with the approval of the Committee of Management.

14. No person above the age of fourteen years shall enter or play on swings or other appliances erected on any children's playground, but parents and other attendants shall be at liberty to enter the playground to watch the children who are in their charge.

15. The swings and other appliances erected in the children's playground shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five minutes, if any other child or children shall be waiting for them.

16. No child shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the children's playground, except for the purpose for which they are respectively provided.

17. Every person in the children's playground shall obey the directions of any duly authorized officer of the said Committee of Management in respect of his or her conduct therein.

18. No person shall carry or discharge any firearms within the Reserve.

19. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and no dog shall be allowed to enter the swimming pools in the Reserve.

20. No fête, concert, carnival, or aquatic display shall be held in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management, nor shall fees for admission to the Reserve on days on which fêtes, concerts, carnivals, or aquatic displays are held be charged without the consent of such Committee.

21. No assemblies for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place on the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

22. No person shall offer for sale within the Reserve, or deliver therein, any article or commodity without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management being first obtained.

23. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or any structure or erection in the Reserve.

24. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs, nor shall any person, without lawful excuse, enter any area enclosed for a special purpose.

25. No person shall drive any motor cycle or other vehicle of any kind, or ride any bicycle, motor cycle, or horse, except on a road or parking area made for the purpose in the Reserve, and then only as near as practicable to the left-hand side of such road.

26. All persons using the conveniences provided by the Committee of Management shall pay such charges for the use of same as shall be fixed by the said Committee.

27. No person shall park any motor car, cycle, or other vehicle, or tether any horse, within the Reserve, excepting at such areas as are set apart by the Committee of Management for the purpose, and any person using such area shall obey any order given by the said Committee, the curator, or other employee or officer of such Committee, and pay, on demand, a fee not exceeding One shilling per day for entrance or use of such parking area.

28. The Committee of Management shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of the swings or other appliances in the children's playground, nor from any cause howsoever arising within the Reserve.

Every person who contravenes or fails or comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "HASTINGS FORESHORE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the lands in the Parish of Tyabb, reserved by Orders in Council of 28th June, 1928, and 12th July, 1937, as sites for Public purposes, and of the land in the Parish of Tyabb, reserved by Order in Council of 24th January, 1876, as a site for Recreation purposes, all of such lands being together known as the "Hastings Foreshore," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve." The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall bathe from the Reserve unless decently attired in a suitable bathing costume.
3. No person shall climb or jump over any of the fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats, or other improvements therein, or otherwise disfigure, injure, or destroy the said fences, trees, seats, or other improvements.
4. No person shall discharge any firearms or air-gun, or carry any pea-rifle, or take, displace, or remove any bird's nest or nest of any animal in or from the Reserve.
5. No person shall cut, saw, dig, move, or displace any trees, bough, live or dead timber, wood or other material which may be in or around the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.
6. No person shall throw or cause to be thrown any stone, or other substance, or play football, cricket, hockey, rounders, golf, or any other game with a hard or semi-hard ball on the Reserve, except in portions set apart for the purpose.
7. No person shall stick or affix, place or cause to be placed any advertisement, bill, notice, or placard on any fence, rock, cliff, tree, latrine, seat, improvement, or building in or around the Reserve, and the Committee or its duly authorized officer may remove any such advertisement, bill, notice, or placard affixed, stuck, or attached in contravention of these Regulations.
8. No person shall, on the Reserve—
 - (a) light a fire or burn any material, except with the consent of the Committee or in places set apart for the purpose by the Committee;
 - (b) break glass of any kind or leave or deposit any matter or thing injurious to persons;
 - (c) deposit or leave any bottle, glass, tin, can, orange peel, waste paper, garbage, or litter of any kind, except in a receptacle provided for that purpose by the Committee.
9. No person shall erect any bathing box, boatshed, or other building or construction on the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such conditions and terms as may be imposed by the Committee and to the payment to such Committee of the fees prescribed by it. Any person who is granted permission to erect a bathing box or boatshed shall not transfer nor sublet such bathing box or boatshed to another person without first obtaining approval, in writing, from and paying the transfer fee to the Committee.
10. No person shall moor, use, place, or leave any boat on the Reserve without the permission of the Committee, in writing, first obtained.
11. No person shall erect any tent, booth, or other such structure, nor offer for sale or hire any article within the Reserve or within any structure thereon without the permission of the Committee first obtained.
12. No person shall reside in any bathing box, boat house, or any other structure erected on the Reserve, nor shall any person use any such structure for the purpose of storing furniture or goods other than boats, winches, or boat and fishing gear.
13. The Committee shall have full power to order the removal of any building, structure, or erection which has been placed, erected, or established on the Reserve—(a) without its consent, or (b) which has not been kept properly painted, or (c) which in its opinion has not been satisfactorily maintained, or (d) upon which the occupancy has not been renewed, or (e) for any other

reason it may deem good and sufficient, and no person shall neglect or refuse to remove any such building, structure, or erection from the Reserve within fourteen (14) days after the Committee has sent, by registered post to his last-known address, a notice requiring him to remove such building, structure, or erection.

14. In the event of any such refusal or neglect as mentioned in Regulation 13 hereof continuing for more than fourteen (14) days after the receipt of the said notice, the Committee may remove such building, structure, or erection without prejudice to any proceedings which might be taken against such person for so refusing or neglecting to comply with these Regulations.

15. No person shall drive, ride, leave, or park any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle, or other vehicle on the Reserve, except in an area set apart for the purpose by the Committee hereinafter referred to as "parking area." Any person being the driver or person in charge of any such motor vehicle shall not use or enter with any motor vehicle a parking area unless he shall pay on demand to the duly authorized officer such charge or fee as shall from time to time be fixed by the Committee in respect of such motor vehicle. Payment of such charge or fee shall empower such motor vehicle to remain for one day between the hours of sunrise and sunset on any parking area so set apart, provided that the driver or person in charge of such motor vehicle shall park the same in such a place and manner as he shall be required by the duly appointed authorized officer, and shall otherwise conform to these Regulations.

16. The Committee may set apart a portion or portions of the Reserve as and for the purpose of a camping area, and may fix and collect fees or other charges for entering and use of any such area.

17. No person shall camp on or use as a camp any portion of the Reserve, except such portion, or portions thereof, as are specially set apart by the Committee for the purpose.

18. No person shall camp on or use a camping area or any camping lounge or convenience appurtenant to a camping area, except during the period covered by a permission, in writing, of the Committee or its authorized officer, and on the payment of such fees as are fixed by the Committee, and any such permission may be granted subject to conditions deemed reasonable by the Committee.

19. Any person entering a structure, tent, or shelter or parking a caravan in any camping area shall abide by such directions as may be given by the Committee or its duly appointed officer.

20. The person to whom permission is issued by the Committee, or its authorized officer, to use a site in a camping area shall be deemed to be the person who erected on such site any structure, tent, or shelter, or who parked a caravan pursuant to such permission, and such person shall keep the site thus occupied in such camping area in a clean, sanitary, and tidy condition, and before vacating such site shall collect and place in the receptacle provided for the purpose all refuse, litter, or garbage from the site.

21. Any permission issued by the Committee or its authorized officer to a person for use of a camping area may be cancelled or withdrawn by such Committee or its authorized officer, and subsequent to such cancellation or withdrawal a proportionate refund of any fees or charges paid in advance shall be refunded, and the Committee or its authorized officer at its or his discretion may deduct and retain from any such proportionate refund a sum as it or he determines will be necessary to clear up and put in order the site vacated.

22. All persons using any conveniences provided on the Reserve by the Committee shall on demand pay a fee which shall from time to time be indicated.

23. Every person holding or purporting to hold any receipt or permission, in writing, issued by the Committee shall, on demand by any member of such Committee or any officer thereof or any member of the Police Force or any bailiff of Crown lands, produce such receipt or permission.

24. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless such dog is and continues to be controlled by a chain, cord, or leash, without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

25. The Committee may from time to time fix and collect fees or other charges for entering and using any facilities provided by it on the Reserve for bathing and/or bathers.

26. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission of the Committee in writing first obtained.

27. No person, except workmen employed on the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees, shrubs, or grass.

28. No person shall play or perform in any band of music or deliver or read any public speech, lecture, prayer, sermon, or address of any kind, sing any sacred or secular song, enter into any public discussion, or hold or take part in any public assemblage on the Reserve, except with the consent of the Committee in writing first obtained.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

BOROUGH OF ST. ARNAUD.

BY-LAW No. 70.

A By-law of the Borough of St. Arnaud, made under the Local Government Act and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria, and numbered 70, for determining, applying, dispensing with or regulating such matters or things as are left to be determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council of the Borough of St. Arnaud under the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria, and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of St. Arnaud order as follows:—

Brick Area.

1. In the area set out and described in the first schedule hereto and hereby prescribed as brick areas, and no person shall in such area construct, or cause to be constructed, any building the external walls of which are of material other than brick, stone or concrete, excepting out-buildings.

Minimum Area, Depth, and Width of Frontage, Class I. and II. Occupancy.

2. The minimum area, depth and width of frontage specified in column 3, of table 803, of the Uniform Building Regulation, Victoria (hereinafter called the Regulations), are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth and width of frontage of land on which a building shall be constructed throughout the whole of the Borough of St. Arnaud.

Distance from Street Alignment, Class I. and II. Occupancy.

3. (a) The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building from the street alignment of any land is hereby specified as 15 feet.

(b) No person shall construct any building closer to the street alignment of any land than 15 feet.

Sites below Minimum Requirements.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations, any person may—(a) construct a building of Class I occupancy on land having a lesser area depth or width of frontage, or at a lesser distance from boundaries than those specified in column 3, of table 803 of the Regulations, or, in clause 3 of this By-law (as the case may be); or

(b) Construct a building of Class III, V, VI, VII, or VIII occupancy or a building to which a building of class IV occupancy is attached on land having an area, depth or width of frontage less than that prescribed in clause 809 of the Regulations in any case where, on the date of commencement of the Regulations, such land existed as a separate allotment, and has not since been reduced in area, or is shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles.

Rear Access.

5. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council, and lodged with the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations, the requirements of clause 811 of the Regulations are hereby dispensed with.
