AMENDED REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PARK AND GARDENS IN THE PARISHES OF BYLANDS AND GLENBURNIE, AND KNOWN AS "THE KILMORE PARK."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulais given to the board of Land and works to make Regula-tions and to rescind any Regulation in respect of the care, protection, and management of any land which has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers

conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind clause 22 of the Regulations made by the Board of Land and Works on 24th February, 1930, and in lieu thereof make the following Regulation in respect of the lands temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of 24th January, 1911, 31st August, 1915, and 21st December, 1926, as a site for a Public Park and Gardens in the Parishes of Bylands and Glenburnie, and known as "the Kilmore Park," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve":—

#### AMENDED REGULATION.

22. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable section 9 of the Lana Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds Ten pounds.
