AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2 and 6 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No.
5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted
that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any
time, and from time to time, upon the request of the
Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government
Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase
or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thorough-
fare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a
public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and
thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become
and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public high-
way within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in
force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Cranbourne
has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which
has been used as a street by the said Council within the
said shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now
therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the
Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the
Executive Council of the said State, do by this
Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter
described, and situated within the Shire of Cranbourne
aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of
the said Act, viz.:—

1. The code of signals, clearly and conspicuously printed or painted on a metal plate, shall be posted in full view of the engine driver, and shall also be displayed at each working plat.

3. Every pump shaft shall be provided with a separate knocker of a different tone, independent of those used for winding.
4. When a cage has been left suspended at or in front of a level, no person shall attempt to make use of such cage, or to put on or take off tools or material, without first giving three knocks for "Hold Fast" which shall be answered by the engine driver moving the cage slightly.
5. On receiving the signal "4 pause 3"—"Holes charged ready for firing," the engine driver shall answer by moving the cage or bucket slightly, and at the same time one of the party to be moved shall stand by the knocker line until the men are on the cage or bucket when he shall knock "1."
6. The signal "4" means "men on," and care shall be taken that no other signal conflicts with it.
7. The signal for "Serious Accident"—"15"—implies that a doctor and an ambulance are required.
8. An approved system of communication between the bracman and the engine driver shall be installed, in addition to the knocker line, and may consist of—
 - (a) a plate having painted thereon in legible figures the number of the level to which men wish to ascend or descend;
 - (b) indicator boards or dials, one of which is erected at the brace and connected with another having a bell attachment in the engine room; or
 - (c) a speaking tube fitted up between the brace and a point in the engine room convenient to the engine driver; or
 - (d) a telephone or other electrical system of communication.

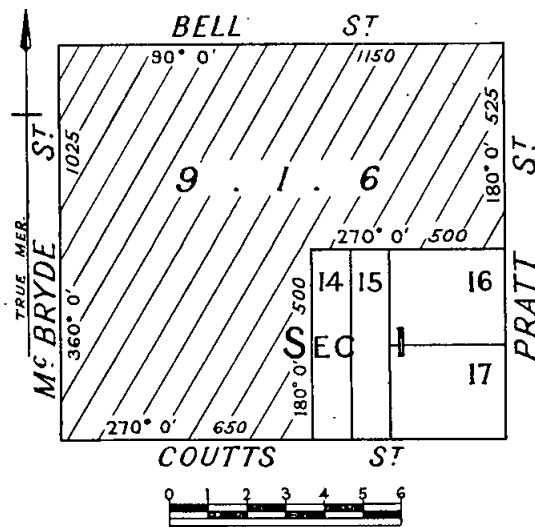

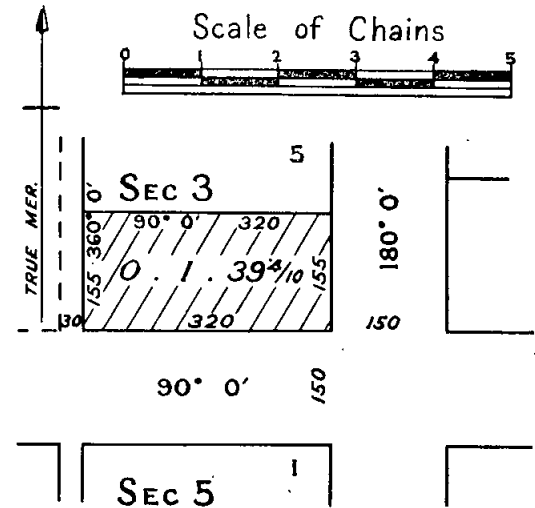

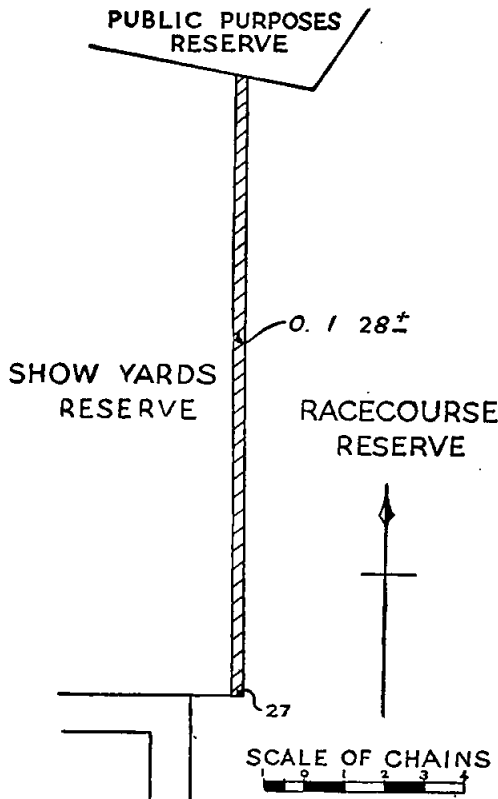

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF BROADFORD, KNOWN AS THE "BROADFORD RECREATION RESERVE."

"No person shall play, practise or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management previously had and obtained."

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with this Regulation shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty

of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.—(Rs.1851.)

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. Except where definite quantities are specified the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates. The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor articles of any of the several kinds enumerated in the schedule the purchase of which is, in the opinion of the Tender Board, necessary in order to meet special circumstances or special requirements.

2. Under this contract goods may be ordered by any Department of the Commonwealth, but it shall be optional on the part of the contractor to supply.

3. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. *The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture.* In the event of the tender having been accepted for goods manufactured within the Commonwealth or within any other part of the British Empire (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall, if required by the Government, bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied.

4. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., shall be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. The contractor must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

5. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Departments requiring the goods, which shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and return the order to the contractor, who will attach it to his claim for payment.

6. Supplies ordered for delivery in the Melbourne District are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purpose of this contract, the Melbourne District will include a radius of 6 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office. For supplies outside that radius the goods must be delivered free on rails at Flinders-street or Spencer-street Railway Stations as required.

7. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officer ordering the supply.

8. Orders must receive prompt execution; in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in clause 7, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In the event of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as provided in clause 8.

10. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after the delivery of the goods, the account to be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. Where practicable, the use of more than one account form for each Department or sub-Department must be avoided. The rates and the quantities quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the

schedule. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case, he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. The members of Boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as provided in clause 8.

13. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of clauses 15 and 16 of these Conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding Fifty pounds as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as provided in clause 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay to terminate the contract forthwith and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

14. All goods forwarded under this contract shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned, on a legibly-written business label.

15. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any Department excepting Departments of the Commonwealth, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Office or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver the original at the Tender Board Offices, the duplicate to be forwarded to the consignee in accordance with clause 16, and the quintuplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of Commonwealth Departments, however, the Commonwealth consignment note only, which accompanies the order, must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note must not be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as is provided in clause 13.

16. Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred thereby will be deducted as provided in clause 8.

17. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing on the consignment note, an intimation to that effect failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount thereof to be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

18. The contractor is not at liberty to transfer his contract under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. Should it be found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract and forfeit the security money.

19. The contract entered into under these conditions is not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Department of Public Works through the Board of Land and Works, or by the State Rivers and Water Supply, Forests, and Electricity Commissioners, or the Country Roads Board, or for the Railways Department, or for supplies for Technical, High, or Higher Elementary Schools, or for connexions and fittings for Drills and Batteries, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

20. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in section 152 of the *Customs Act 1901-36*, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice, in writing, from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last-known place of business or abode.

The foregoing provision shall not apply where the contract is for definite quantities of imported goods to be delivered at stated times, as stipulated in the schedule, and any alteration in the duty of Customs or Telegraphic Transfer rate of exchange affecting the goods included in such contract shall be to the accounts of the Government; adjustments to be based on the F.O.B. and C.I.F. prices of the goods, respectively, and the Telegraphic Transfer rate ruling at the time of delivery of the goods.

21. Under no circumstances, other than those mentioned in clause 20, will the contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. CITY OF COBURG.

BY-LAW No. 71.

A By-law of the City of Coburg to amend or add to By-law No. 62.

THE Council of the City of Coburg does hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act, order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall be read and construed as one with By-law No. sixty-two (62), a By-law of the City of Coburg, made under sub-section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, for the purpose of regulating traffic, street processions, and the prevention of nuisances and accidents.

LOCAL RULES.

2. No driver of a vehicle (other than a tram-car) shall leave or allow such vehicle to remain (whether attended or not) standing—

- (1) On the east side of that section of Sydney-road which lies between the north building line of Harding-street and a point 66 feet distant to the north thereof.
- (2) On the east side of that section of Sydney-road between the north building line of Sheffield-street and a point 72 feet distant to the north thereof.
- (3) On the west side of that section of Sydney-road from the south building line of Bell-street and a point 125 feet distant to the south thereof.
- (4) On the east side of that section of Sydney-road from the south building line of Bell-street to a point 97 feet distant to the south thereof.
- (5) On the west side of that section of Sydney-road from the north building line of Bell-street to a point 51 ft. 6 in. distant to the north thereof.
- (6) On the east side of that section of Sydney-road from the north building line of Bell-street to a point 109 ft. 9 in. distant to the north thereof.
- (7) On the west side of that section of Sydney-road from the north building line of Moreland-road to Allen-street, a distance of 195 feet from such building line to the north thereof.
- (8) On the side of that section of Sydney-road from the north building line of Moreland-road to Blair-street, a distance of 267 ft. 7½ in. from such building line to the north thereof.
- (9) On the north side of that section of Moreland-road from the west building line of Moreland-road to the right-of-way, a distance of 132 feet west of such building line.
- (10) On the north side of that section of Moreland-road from the east building line of Sydney-road to a point 173 feet distant to the east thereof.
- (11) On the south side of that section of Bell-street from the west building line of Sydney-road to the right-of-way 153 ft. 5 in. east of such building line.
- (12) On the north side of that section of Bell-street from the west building line of Sydney-road to the right-of-way 244 ft. 2in. east of such building line.
- (13) On the south side of that section of Bell-street from the east building line of Sydney-road to a point 218 feet distant to the east thereof.
- (14) On the north side of that section of Bell-street from the east building line of Sydney-road to a point 125 ft. 6 in. distant to the east thereof.
- (15) On that section of the north side of Munro-street which lies between the west building line of Sydney-road and a point 150 feet distant to the west thereof.
- (16) On that section of the south side of Munro-street which lies between the west building line of Sydney-road and a point 150 feet distant to the west thereof.

Provided that this clause shall not apply to any driver of a hackney carriage or licensed motor omnibus standing on any stand duly fixed or appointed by any public authority.

3. No person, between sunset and sunrise, shall, without reasonable cause or excuse (the proof whereof shall be upon any person charged), leave or allow a vehicle (other than a tram-car) to remain standing in any street in the City of Coburg for a continuous period exceeding six hours.

4. The owner or person apparently in control of any motor car or vehicle left standing (whether unattended or not) in any street or road shall, when requested by any officer of the Council, give to such officer information with respect to any person (other than the said owner or person apparently in control of such motor car or vehicle) who is or was the driver of such motor car or vehicle which may lead to the identification of any person who is leaving or has left such motor car or vehicle so standing in contravention to any By-law.

The resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 21st day of July, 1947, and confirmed on the 18th day of August, 1947.

CITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

2. Barkly-street, from Nicholson-street to Victoria-street on both sides of such street.

3. Hopkins-street, from Nicholson-street to Moore and Irving streets on both sides of such street.

4. Leeds-street, from Hopkins-street to Irving-street on both sides of such street.

5. Paisley-street, from Leeds-street to Nicholson-street on both sides of such street.

6. Anderson-street, between Birmingham-street and Willis-street on both sides of such street.

7. Ballarat-street, from Murray-street to Tarrengower-street on both sides of such street.

SHIRE OF ALEXANDRA.

BY-LAW NO. 16.

A By-law of the Shire of Alexandra, made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered 16 with reference to appointing in streets and roads, standing places for motor cars and other vehicles.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, and every other act or power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Alexandra doth hereby order as follows:—

1. *Definitions.*—In this By-law and the Schedule thereto unless the context otherwise requires—

"Township" means the Township of Alexandra.

"Council" means the Council of the Shire of Alexandra.

"Footpath" includes every footpath, thoroughfare, or other public place within the township habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicular traffic.

"Motor Car" means any conveyance propelled by mechanical power, and includes motor cycle and motor cycle and side-car.

"Parking Area" means any standing place for motor cars duly appointed by this Council under any By-law.

"Streets" includes every highway, road, carriage way, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the township other than a footpath.

"Vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human, animal, or mechanical power, and includes a motor car.

"Writing" includes printing, lithography and other modes of representing or reproducing words in the visible form.

2. *Parking Areas.*—The streets and public places, or parts thereof, respectively mentioned or set forth in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter called "Parking Areas") shall be and are hereby appointed by the Council as standing places for motor cars and other vehicles within the township.

3. No person shall park a motor car or permit any vehicle owned by him to stand in any place in the township not being a parking area.

4. *Mode of Parking.*—Motor cars and other vehicles shall park in the township in the following manner, namely:—

(i) *In Grant-street*—

(a) Private motor cars shall park at an angle of 45 degrees to the kerb line in parts specially set apart for such parking. The rear of such motor cars shall not extend for any part outside the painted line marking the limits of parking.

(b) Commercial motor cars shall park parallel to the kerb line at such a distance that no part of the vehicle or load thereon shall extend beyond the painted line marking the limits of parking.

(c) Horses and carts shall park parallel to the kerb so that no part of the cart load or animal shall extend beyond the painted line marking the limits of parking.

(d) Bicycles shall not be parked at the building line, but shall be supported on the kerb off the footpath parallel to the kerb.

(e) There shall be no parking of any description along the centre line of the road.

(ii) *In Downey-street*—

All vehicles shall park parallel to the kerb so that the outer edge of the vehicle or load thereon shall not be of a greater distance than 11 feet from the kerb line.

(iii) *In Perkins-street*—

On the north side of the production of the west building line of Villeneuve-street to the production of the east building line of Myrtle-street motor cars shall be parked so that no part of the motor car, or the load thereon, shall extend beyond a distance of 22 feet from the north building line, and such motor cars shall be parked within such area either square to or at an angle to the kerb.

5. Subject, as hereinbefore provided, wherever Parking Areas are shown on streets by white lines, motor cars and vehicles shall park within the areas indicated thereby.

6. Every person shall in any Parking Area park a motor car or other vehicle—

(a) as directed by the Officer in charge of the Parking Area; or

(b) if no such Officer be present, such person shall park his motor car or vehicle in such a manner as to enable him to take his motor car or vehicle away without disturbance to other motor cars or vehicles already parked, and also in such a way as not to cause obstruction to the moving of other motor cars or vehicles from the respective places occupied by them.

7. There shall be only one line of vehicles parked on each side of the street.

8. Motor cars and other vehicles shall park in the direction in which they are travelling on the correct side of the street.

9. *Openings for Cross Traffic.*—The Council may by notice in writing under the hand or direction of the Shire President or, in his absence, of the Shire Secretary from time to time as may be convenient or necessary fix or appoint openings through any parking areas to permit of cross traffic, and also from time to time fix the hours during which such parking areas, or any of them, shall be available for use, or discontinue the same or any of them. No person shall obstruct any such openings as aforesaid by placing his vehicle therein or otherwise.

10. *Orders to be Observed.*—Every person in the township shall at all times observe and comply with any order or direction given under the authority of this By-law by any member of the Police Force or Officer of the Council.

11. Any person who neglects or refuses to immediately comply with or wilfully disobeys any order or direction given as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

12. *Penalty.*—Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not more than Five pounds for each and every offence.

SCHEDULE HEREINBEFORE REFERRED TO.

All streets of the Township of Alexandra shall on every day of the week be Parking Areas, except the following parts thereof, namely:—

(a) Any parts of any street required for access to any fire plug, petrol pump, right-of-way, lane, footpath, water trough, or crossing over footway at entrance to property, whether public or private.

(b) *Grant-street.*—Such parts as lie between two imaginary lines drawn the one parallel to the kerb on one side at a distance of 20 feet from such kerb, and the other parallel to the kerb on the other side at a distance of 20 feet from such kerb.

(c) *Downey-street*—

(i) *National Bank Corner*—North-east corner of the intersection of Grant and Downey streets back a distance of 50 feet from the eastern building line of Grant-street.

(ii) *Darmody's Corner.*—South-east corner of such intersection back a distance of 35 feet from the eastern building line of Grant-street.

(iii) *McNair's Corner.*—North-west corner of such intersection back a distance of 50 feet from the western building line of Grant-street.

(iv) *Barton's Corner.*—South-west corner of such intersection back a distance of 45 feet from the western building line of Grant-street.

(d) *At Post Office.*—Intersection of Webster-street and Downey-street within a distance of 30 feet back from each building line at such intersection.

(e) *Perkins-street.*—On the north side within 30 feet of the eastern building line of Grant-street.

(f) *General.*—Subject as aforesaid within 30 feet of each building line at all street intersections, and outside a distance of 16 feet from each kerb line.
