## PROCLAMATION

## COUNTRY ROADS (FOREST ROADS AND STOCK ROUTES) ACT 1943 (No. 4953).

## PROCLAMATION OF FOREST ROAD

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 (1) of the *Country Roads (Forest Roads and Stock Routes) Act 1943* it is provided that the Governor in Council may, on the recommendation of the Country Roads Board made after consultation with the Minister of Forests and the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey, and on the recommendation of the Commissioner of Public Works by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, proclaim any road or any part of any road to be a forest road for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas the Country Roads Board (after consultation with the Minister of Forests and the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey) and the Commissioner

of Public Works have recommended that the roads described in the Schedule hereunder be so proclaimed: Now therefore the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby proclaim the said roads to be forest roads for the purposes of the said Act.

## SCHEDULE.

*Shire of Otway.*

*Forrest-Apollo Bay-road.*—Commencing at its junction with the Beech Forest-Mount Sabine road at a point on the eastern boundary of the Experimental Farm Reserve, Parish of Olangolah, distant 4 chains, more or less, north-easterly from the intersection of the old Government road through that reserve and the said eastern boundary; thence south-westerly and south-easterly to and through State forest to the north-western angle of allotment 16A, Parish of Wongarra (S.P. 300); thence south-easterly and south-westerly to its junction with Skene's Creek road near the northern angle of allotment 59A, Parish of Olangolah.

*Shires of Healesville and Upper Yarra.*

*Reefton Spur-road.*—Commencing at a point on the western boundary of allotment 2A, Parish of Brimbonga, distant 175 deg. 33 min. 585.4 links from the north-western angle of that allotment, at its junction with the Woods Point-road; thence westerly to and across the bridge over the Yarra River to the eastern boundary of allotment 9, Parish of Manango; thence generally north-westerly and north-easterly through the allotment last named to an angle in the said eastern boundary distant 217 deg. 50 min. 51 links from the north-eastern angle of that allotment (S.P. 4761); thence north-easterly and north-westerly through State forest to its junction with the Marysville-Woods Point road (tourists') at a point distant 120 chains generally south-easterly from the crossing of that road over the Cumberland Creek.

#### RATING BY-LAW No. 27.

#### The Ballarat Sewerage District.

THE Ballarat Sewerage Authority, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Sewerage Districts Acts, doth hereby make the following By-law:—

#### HENLEY ON THE MARIBYRNONG.

#### Notice to Boatmen and Others.

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that Henley on the Maribyrnong will be held on Saturday, 7th February, 1948, and that persons in charge of motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day and night shall observe the following Regulations, viz.:—

## REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Fruit and Vegetables  
Acts 1928* (No. 3687), 1936 (No. 4421), and 1946 (No. 5173), the  
Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of  
the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council  
thereof, doth hereby amend the Regulations made under the provisions  
of the said Acts on 11th November, 1935, as follows, that is to say:—

In Regulation 4—(Part 1—Definitions), after the definition of  
"Falsely packed" insert the following definition:—

"'Firm' when used in relation to tomatoes means that the  
tomato is not broken, puffy, shrivelled, soft, water soaked or  
affected by leaky cracks."

and after the definition of "Immature" when used in relation to  
potatoes, insert the following definition:—

"'Immature' when used in relation to tomatoes means  
immature in the opinion of an Inspector or that the fruit has  
not attained its full growth and that the skin has not changed  
from dull green to a bright-green colour and the flesh surround-  
ing the seeds has not changed from a light-green colour to a deep-  
amber or to an amber tinged with pink."

In Regulation 19—(Sixth Schedule—Grade Standards for  
Tomatoes) in paragraph (c) after the word "of" in the first line  
insert the word "firm" and in paragraph (d) after the word "of" in  
the first line insert the word "firm" and in place of paragraph (e)  
substitute the following paragraph:—

"(e) Tomatoes described as "green" shall consist of firm

and which are sound and free from disease. Such

REGULATIONS ALTERED AND AMENDED.

THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and in pursuance of the Land Acts, doth hereby approve the following alterations and amendments to the Regulations under the Land Act 1928 which appeared in the Government Gazettes of 8th August 1930 and 28th September, 1932.

In Schedule 49 (licences which do not confer any exclusive right to enter on Crown lands) for the portion of such Schedule appearing on page 2114 of the Government Gazette of 8th August 1930 amended as shown in the Government Gazette of 28th September, 1932 relating to the removal of sand and loam from unappropriated Crown lands at Sandridge Bend and Port Melbourne there shall be substituted the following:—

Purpose of Licence.	Fee to be Paid.	Right to be Conferred by Licence.
For removal of sand from unappropriated Crown land in the City of Port Melbourne	Three shillings (3s.) per cubic yard for the full capacity of the vehicle in which the sand is removed, provided a quantity of approved filling material at least equal to the sand removed is brought to the area and deposited where required by the Officer in Charge  In any case where for good reason, authority is given for sand to be obtained without insistence on the requirement to provide approved filling material, the fee for each cubic yard shall be increased by three shillings (3s.)	1. Sand shall be removed only from the area set apart for that purpose, which area is hereinafter referred to as the "Sand Ground." 2. Every person wishing to remove sand shall, on entering the Sand Ground, pay to the Officer in Charge the prescribed fee and shall receive a "sand permit" for each load. 3. The Officer in Charge shall endorse on such "sand permit" the name of the sand-carter by whom the same is to be used, as well as the date and hour of issue. 4. Sand shall be removed only between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 4 p.m. on days when the Sand Ground is open for business. 5. No sand permit shall be applied for after the hour of 3 p.m. 6. The Sand Ground will not be open for business on Saturdays, Sundays, or proclaimed public holidays. 7. Every person loading or moving sand within the sand ground shall produce his permit to any bailiff of Crown lands when called upon so to do. 8. Every such person shall, before departure from the Sand Ground, surrender his "sand permit" to the Officer in Charge or his deputy. 9. Any person found loading or moving sand from the Sand Ground without a "sand permit," or any person found loading or moving sand from Crown lands outside the Sand Ground with or without a "sand permit," shall be summoned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any member of the Police Force to appear before justices of the peace to answer for such offence. 10. The Officer in Charge shall decline to issue a "sand permit" to any person who may be guilty of any breach of these Regulations. 11. Any person convicted of illegally procuring sand from Crown lands shall be excluded from the Sand Ground for the periods set forth hereunder, as the case may require:— 1st offence, one (1) month; 2nd offence, three (3) months; 3rd offence, six (6) months. The conditions for the removal of loam shall be similar to those provided for the removal of sand.
For removal of loam from unappropriated Crown lands in the City of Port Melbourne	Two shillings (2s.) per cubic yard on the terms provided for the removal of sand

TEACHING SERVICE (GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL) REGULATIONS  
AMENDED.

THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act* 1946 doth hereby amend Regulation 5 of the Teaching Service (Governor in Council) Regulations made on the twenty-ninth day of October 1946 and published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirtieth day of October 1946 in the manner following, that is to say:—

To the heading of the Regulation after the words "in the Armed Forces" there shall be added the words "and for War Widows."

Revoke clause 6 and substitute therefor the following clause:—

"6. A person honourably discharged after having served in the armed forces in connexion with the war commencing in the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, or a war widow eligible for training under the Commonwealth Reconstruction Training Scheme, and who, prior to the commencement of such war, was not a classified teacher or a student teacher, may be awarded a studentship—

- (a) for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, provided that he has served as a temporary teacher for a period approved by the Director and that he possesses the following qualifications:—
- (i) the applicant shall be not less than eighteen years of age and not more than thirty-five years of age, and shall be of suitable character and personality;
  - (ii) he shall have passed the School Leaving examination of the University of Melbourne, or shall hold an approved equivalent or higher qualification;
- (b) for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate or for the Trained Commercial Teacher's Certificate or for the Trained Manual Arts Teacher's Certificate or for the Trained Domestic Arts Teacher's Certificate provided that he possesses the following qualifications:—
- (i) the applicant shall be not less than eighteen years of age and not more than thirty-five years of age and shall be of suitable character and personality;
  - (ii) he shall have passed the examinations prescribed for entry to his particular course in Regulation 12 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations, or shall hold an approved equivalent or higher qualification.

Holders of studentships under the provisions of this clause shall, during the course of training, be paid allowances at the rates of salary for the time being payable to adult temporary teachers male or female as the case may be and in addition the appropriate adult cost of living allowance."

Revoke clause 7 and substitute therefor the following clause:—

"7. The holder of a studentship under clause 6 of this Regulation shall on completion of his course be placed in the subdivision prescribed for his particular course in clause 23 of Regulation 12 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations."

And the Honorable Wilfred Selwyn Kent Hughes, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

AMENDMENT OF BREAD MAKING AND BAKING  
TRADE REGULATIONS (No. 1).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts and the Acts Interpretation Acts, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. Regulation 10 of the Bread Making and Baking Trade Regulations (No. 1) shall be and the same is hereby rescinded as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in January, 1948.

2. Such rescission shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person or any liability of any person under the said rescinded Regulation before the commencement of these Regulations.

3. For the said rescinded Regulation substitute the following:—

"10. The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in the said trade in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in January, 1948, on, from, and after which date all indentures of apprenticeship heretofore executed, under the provisions of the Acts and Regulations made in respect of the aforesaid trade shall be deemed to be amended accordingly:—

(a) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—

1st year—

1st six months—at the rate of 33s. per week.  
2nd six months—at the rate of 33s. 10d.  
per week.

2nd year—

1st six months—at the rate of 36s. 4d. per  
week.  
2nd six months—at the rate of 40s. 9d. per  
week.

3rd year—

1st six months—at the rate of 46s. 5d. per  
week.  
2nd six months—at the rate of 54s. 9d. per  
week.

4th year—

1st six months—at the rate of 64s. per week.  
2nd six months—at the rate of 74s. 11d.  
per week.

5th year—

1st six months—at the rate of 88s. 1d. per  
week.  
2nd six months—at the rate of 102s. 10d.  
per week.

(b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of four years—

1st year—

1st six months—at the rate of 36s. 4d. per  
week.  
2nd six months—at the rate of 40s. 9d. per  
week.

2nd year—

1st six months—at the rate of 46s. 5d. per  
week.  
2nd six months—at the rate of 54s. 9d. per  
week.

3rd year—

1st six months—at the rate of 64s. per week.  
2nd six months—at the rate of 74s. 11d.  
per week.

4th year—

1st six months—at the rate of 88s. 1d. per  
week.  
2nd six months—at the rate of 102s. 10d.  
per week."

AMENDMENT OF CARPENTRY AND JOINERY  
TRADES REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts and the Acts Interpretation Acts, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. The Carpentry and Joinery Regulations (Nos. 1 and 2) shall be and the same are hereby rescinded as from 1st day of January, 1948.

2. Such rescission shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person or any liability of any person under the said rescinded Regulations before the commencement of these Regulations.

3. For the said rescinded Regulations substitute the following:—

## SHORT TITLE.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Carpentry and Joinery Regulations (No. 1)."

## INTERPRETATION.

2. In these Regulations—

"Acts" mean the Apprenticeship Acts.

"Applicant" means an applicant for apprenticeship employed on probation.

"Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.

"Registrar" means the Registrar of Apprenticeship.

"Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commission.

## APPLICATION OF REGULATIONS.

3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the apprenticeship trades of Carpentry and/or Joinery.

## APPLICANTS FOR APPRENTICESHIP TO APPLY FOR CERTIFICATE.

4. Applications by persons desiring to become apprentices in the said trades shall be in the form contained in the Third Schedule to General Regulations (No. 1) made under the Acts.

## APPLICANTS MAY BE EXAMINED.

5. Applicants for apprenticeship in the said trades may be required to submit themselves for examination at the time and place determined by the Commission to prove that they possess the preparatory educational qualifications required for entry into apprenticeship in such trades. Provided that any such applicant shall be exempted from such examination—

## Exemptions.

(a) If he possesses any one of the following educational qualifications, or, in the opinion of the Commission the equivalent thereof—

(i) The Intermediate Technical or Junior Technical Certificates of the Education Department of Victoria, the School Intermediate Certificate, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.

(ii) The satisfactory completion, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission, of a three years' course of study in a Junior Technical School or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.

(b) If he satisfies the Commission, in accordance with sub-section (2) of section 18 of the Act, that he has not had sufficient opportunity to obtain the preparatory educational qualifications prescribed for entry into the said trades.

## MINIMUM AGE FOR ENTRY INTO APPRENTICESHIP.

6. The minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trades as apprentices or applicants for apprenticeship on probation shall be fifteen years.



## TERM OF APRENTICESHIP.

7. The term of apprenticeship in the said trades shall be five years.

## FORM OF INDENTURES OF APRENTICESHIP—GENERAL FORM.

8. The standard form of indentures of apprenticeship in each of the said trades, and the terms, covenants, and conditions thereof, shall be in the form contained in the Second Schedule to General Regulations (No. 2) made under the Acts with the following additions thereto:—

*Additional Covenants, &c., to General Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.**Employer's Covenants.*

At the end of paragraph (c) (i) add the following proviso:—

Provided that where he is temporarily unable to provide such work as will keep the apprentice fully employed during any ordinary working week or month, he may, with the approval of the Commission, employ the apprentice for such less time in any such week or month as may, on the application of such employer, be determined by the said Commission, at wages proportionate to those which he is required, under the provisions of this paragraph, to pay to the apprentice when employed during the whole of any ordinary working week or month—

(c) (iii) Make no deduction from the wages of the apprentice in respect of any time lost by reason of compulsory attendance at classes for instruction in subjects of the apprenticeship course.

(c) (iv) In the event of the employer being unable, owing to lack of orders, or through financial difficulties, to find employment and training for the apprentice, or to arrange for the transfer of the apprentice to another employer as provided for under the Acts, the Commission may on application made in that behalf by the employer, and after satisfying itself that the circumstances justify such action, arrange for the suspension of the indentures for such period as it determines, or for the cancellation of the indentures.

(f) Not require or allow the apprentice while under the age of eighteen years to attend winches, sling timber, or work power-driven machinery.

(g) Not hold the apprentice responsible for any faulty work or for any damage or injury done to material, work or machinery, tools or plant, other than wilful damage or injury, during the course of his work.

(h) In the event of the apprentice, while in his service, having his clothes or tools spoilt by acid, sulphur, or other deleterious substances, recompense the apprentice to the value of the loss sustained, unless such loss was occasioned by the carelessness or neglect of the apprentice.

(i) Not keep more than one day's pay in hand.

*Apprentice and Parent or Guardian's Covenants.*

(c) At all times while in the employment of the employer conduct himself in a courteous, obedient, and proper manner.

*Mutual Agreements.*

At the end of paragraph (3), add the following provisos:—

Provided further—

(i) That where the apprentice is required under the provisions of the proviso to paragraph (c) (i) hereof to work for less time than full time in any ordinary working week or month; or

(ii) that where the indentures of any apprentice are suspended for any period by the Commission,

the total period of time not served by the apprentice by reason of either of the above-mentioned provisions shall, at the option of the apprentice, be included in the term of his apprenticeship, or be added to the term of his apprenticeship. In the event of such period being added to the term of his apprenticeship, the apprentice shall be paid for such period at the wages rates prescribed in respect of the last year of his apprenticeship.

(10) That the apprentice shall be paid the same allowances as are from time to time paid by the employer to journeymen in the same trade for meal money, fares, travelling time, country work, and other matters, or, where

such allowances are proportionate to the rates of pay received by journeymen, the apprentice shall be paid only such proportion thereof as the rates of pay of the apprentice bear to such journeymen's minimum rates of pay.

(11) That in the event of the employer's premises being destroyed or partly destroyed by fire, preventing for a period the proper tuition of the apprentice in the said trades, he may, with the approval of the Commission, be employed during such period on the performance of such other work for the employer as may be agreed upon between the employer and the said Commission.

## RATES OF PAY OF APRENTICES.

9. The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows:—

- 1st year—at the rate of 31s. 6d. per week.
- 2nd year—at the rate of 42s. per week.
- 3rd year—at the rate of 58s. per week.
- 4th year—at the rate of 81s. per week.
- 5th year—at the rate of 106s. per week.

## TOOL ALLOWANCE.

10. A tool allowance of 2s. per week shall be payable to apprentices in their third, fourth, and fifth years of apprenticeship.

## RATES FOR OVERTIME WORKED.

11. Where overtime (i.e., work done on Sundays and public holidays or outside ordinary working hours) is worked, the apprentice shall be paid by the employer additional wages for such overtime at the rate of time and a half, double time, or at such other rate (as the case may be) as the employer may for the time being be obliged to pay to journeymen employed by him in the same trade.

## STANDARD OF AND INCREASED RATES OF PAY FOR PROFICIENCY.

12. Should the apprentice in the first year pass in the subjects prescribed for that year of the apprenticeship course and attain a standard of proficiency as certified by the Commission of not less than an average of 70 per cent. of the possible marks allotted to such subjects at the annual examinations, he shall for the second year of the apprenticeship course be paid the sum of 5s. per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage, and should the apprentice attain the aforesaid standard of proficiency in any year (other than the first year) in the subjects prescribed for that year of the apprenticeship course, he shall for the next succeeding year be paid the sum of 2s. 6d. per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage.

## PROPORTION OF APRENTICES TO JOURNEMEN.

13. The number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the said trades shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to every three journeymen or fraction of three journeymen employed by such employer, except in the case of joinery mills or joinery workshops, where the number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the said trades shall not exceed the proportion of two apprentices to every three journeymen or fraction of three journeymen employed by such employer.

For the purposes of this Regulation an employer working at the trades shall be deemed to be a journeyman, and the number of journeymen employed at any time shall be deemed to be the average per working day of the number of journeymen employed in the said trades by such employer during the period of six months immediately preceding such time.

## APRENTICESHIP COURSE—CLASSES FOR INSTRUCTION.

14. (a) The classes for instruction in the subjects of the apprenticeship course for the said trades shall be as set out in the Schedule hereto, but any apprentice or applicant who has the necessary qualifications may, subject to the approval of the Commission, be permitted to enter the classes prescribed for any year of the said course.

## STANDARD OF EDUCATION TO BE ATTAINED BY AN APRENTICE.

(b) The standard of education to be attained by an apprentice—

- (i) in the subjects of the first, second, and third years of his apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify to proceed to the classes for instruction prescribed for the next succeeding year, and
- (ii) in the subjects of the fourth year of the apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify in respect to education for the "final certificate" of the Commission,

shall be not less than 50 per cent. of the possible marks at the annual examinations approved by the Commission in each of the subjects prescribed for such year of the said

course, or such average percentage of marks in all of the said subjects deemed by the Commission to be equivalent thereto.

#### TRADE EXPERIENCE REQUIRED OF AN APPRENTICE.

15. The trade experience to be obtained by an apprentice in his apprenticeship course shall include gradual and complete instruction, to the satisfaction of the Commission, in the following processes (as the case may be):—

##### Carpentry—

All phases of the trade, including the correct methods of using all tools commonly used in connexion with the carpentry trade.

The construction, erection, alteration, and repair of the timber framework and timber coverings of buildings; form building, framing, and timber construction work in connexion with concrete, brickwork, plaster, and other commonly used building materials; the erection of interior woodwork of buildings; and the making of such woodwork where made on the job.

The fixing of floors, doors, window frames and sashes, skirtings, mouldings, panelling, stairs, mantles, cases and built-in fixtures, and the fixing of building hardware and fittings as generally carried out by the carpenter.

##### Joinery—

All phases of the trade, including the correct methods of using all tools commonly used in the joinery trade.

The preparation of timber, and the making and repair of timber fittings used in connexion with buildings, including doors, door frames, window sashes and frames, cupboards, stairs, panelling, metal shop fronts, and fittings.

##### Carpentry and Joinery—

All phases of each trade as above prescribed—and the employer shall, by the best means in his power, teach and instruct, or cause to be taught and instructed, the apprentice in the said processes.

#### PAYMENT OF SCHOOL FEES.

16. The school fees of apprentices or applicants for attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction for the first, second, and third years of their apprenticeship course shall be paid by such apprentices or applicants, but on the receipt by the employer of a report from the Commission that any such apprentice or applicant has secured during the period covered by the report a record of not less than 80 per cent. of the possible attendances at the prescribed day and evening classes respectively, the employer shall refund to the apprentice or applicant the school fees so paid by him for such period of instruction.

The school fees of apprentices for attendance at the classes for instruction prescribed for the fourth year of the apprenticeship course shall be paid by such apprentices.

In cases where the apprentice or applicant is prevented on occasions from attendance at the said classes through illness or accident, such occasions shall not be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage, provided that the employer may demand a medical certificate from the apprentice or applicant as proof of such illness or accident.

#### INCORPORATION OF GENERAL REGULATIONS.

17. The provisions of the following General Regulations, made under the Acts, shall apply in the said trades:—

General Regulations (No. 1), approved by the Governor in Council on the 18th day of September, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 19th day of September, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 2), approved by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of October, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 31st day of October, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 3), approved by the Governor in Council on the 10th day of December, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 12th day of December, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 4), approved by the Governor in Council on the 24th day of December, 1931, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 30th day of December, 1931.

General Regulations (No. 5), approved by the Governor in Council on the 9th day of December, 1932, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 4th day of January, 1933.

General Regulations (No. 6), approved by the Governor in Council on the 17th day of May, 1943, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 19th day of May, 1943.

#### ELECTROPLATING TRADE REGULATIONS (No. 1).

WHEREAS by section 39 of the *Apprenticeship Act 1928* (No. 3636), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for or with respect to providing for any matters which are or may be the subject of draft Regulations submitted by the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria: And whereas the said Commission has prepared and submitted to His Excellency the Governor in Council draft Regulations for or with respect to the matters hereinafter set out: Now, therefore, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

#### SHORT TITLE.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Electroplating Trade Regulations (No. 1)."

#### INTERPRETATION.

2. In these Regulations—

"Acts" mean the Apprenticeship Acts.

"Applicant" means an applicant for apprenticeship employed on probation.

"Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.

"Registrar" means the Registrar of Apprenticeship.

"Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commission.

#### APPLICATION OF REGULATIONS.

3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the following apprenticeship trade, viz:—

Electroplater—First Class.

APPLICANTS FOR APPRENTICESHIP TO APPLY FOR CERTIFICATE.

4. Applications by persons desiring to become apprentices in the said trade shall be in the form contained in the Third Schedule to General Regulations (No. 1) made under the Acts.

APPLICANTS MAY BE EXAMINED.

5. Applicants for apprenticeship in the said trade may be required to submit themselves for examination at the time and place determined by the Commission to prove that they possess the preparatory educational qualifications required for entry into apprenticeship in such trade. Provided that any such applicant shall be exempted from such examination—

*Exemptions.*

- (a) If he possesses any one of the following educational qualifications, or, in the opinion of the Commission, the equivalent thereof—
- (i) The Intermediate Technical or Junior Technical Certificates of the Education Department of Victoria, the School Intermediate Certificate, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.
  - (ii) The satisfactory completion, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission, of a three years' course of study in a Junior Technical School or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.
- (b) If he satisfies the Commission, in accordance with sub-section (2) of section 18 of the Act, that he has not had sufficient opportunity to obtain the preparatory educational qualifications prescribed for entry into the said trades.

MINIMUM AGE FOR ENTRY INTO APPRENTICESHIP.

6. The minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trade as apprentices or applicants for apprenticeship on probation shall be fifteen years.

TERM OF APPRENTICESHIP.

7. The term of apprenticeship in the said trade shall be as follows:—

- (a) In the case of persons entering the said trade under the age of seventeen years, a term of five years.
- (b) In the case of persons entering the said trade at or above the age of seventeen years, a term of four or five years, at the option of the contracting parties.

FORM OF INDENTURES OF APPRENTICESHIP—GENERAL FORM.

8. The standard form of indentures of apprenticeship in the said trade, and the terms, covenants, and conditions thereof shall be in the form contained in the Second Schedule to General Regulations (No. 2) made under the Acts, with the following additions thereto:—

*Additional Covenants, &c., to General Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.*

*Employer's Covenants.*

At the end of paragraph (c) (i), add the following proviso:—

Provided that where he is temporarily unable to provide such work as will keep the apprentice fully employed during any ordinary working week or month, he may, with the approval of the Commission, employ the apprentice for such less time in any such week or month as may, on the application of such employer, be determined by the said Commission, at wages proportionate to those which he is required, under the provisions of this paragraph, to pay to the apprentice when employed during the whole of any ordinary working week or month—

- (c) (iii) Make no deduction from the wages of the apprentice in respect of any time lost by reason of compulsory attendance at classes for instruction in subjects of the apprenticeship course.
- (c) (iv) In the event of the employer being unable, owing to lack of orders or through financial difficulties, to find employment and training for the apprentice, or to arrange for the transfer of the apprentice to another employer as provided for under the Acts, the Commission may on application made in that behalf by the employer, and after satisfying itself that the circumstances justify such action, arrange for the suspension of the indentures for such period as it determines, or for the cancellation of the indentures.
- (f) Not hold the apprentice responsible for any damage or injury done to materials, machinery, tools, or plant, other than wilful damage or damage due to carelessness.
- (g) Not require the apprentice to work on any holiday without his consent.

- (h) Not require the apprentice while under the age of eighteen years to work overtime or shift work unless he so desires.
- (i) Not require the apprentice, except in an emergency, to work overtime or shift work at times which would prevent his attendance at technical school as required by the Regulations.
- (j) Provide the apprentice with all tools necessary for carrying out his work.

*Apprentice and Parent or Guardian's Covenants.*

- (c) At all times while in the employment of the employer conduct himself in a courteous, obedient, and proper manner.

*Mutual Agreements.*

(3) At the end of paragraph (3) add the following provisos:—

Provided further—

- (i) that where the apprentice is required under the provisions of the proviso to paragraph (c) (i) hereof to work for less time than full time in any ordinary working week or month; or
- (ii) that where the indentures of any apprentice are suspended for any period by the Commission, the total period of time not served by the apprentice by reason of either of the above-mentioned provisions shall, at the option of the apprentice, be included in the term of his apprenticeship or be added to the term of his apprenticeship. In the event of such period being added to the term of his apprenticeship the apprentice shall be paid for such period at the wages rates prescribed in respect of the last year of his apprenticeship.

(10) That the apprentice shall be paid the same allowances as are from time to time paid by the employer to journeymen in the same trade for meal money, fares, travelling time, country work, and other matters, or, where such allowances are proportionate to the rates of pay received by journeymen, the apprentice shall be paid only such proportion thereof as the rates of pay of the apprentice bear to such journeymen's minimum rates of pay.

(11) That the apprentice will replace any of the tools supplied for his use as hereinbefore provided if lost or broken through his own carelessness.

*Rates of Pay of Apprentices.*

9. The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in the said trades in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows:—

- (a) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—
 

1st year—	at the rate of	26s. 6d. per week.
2nd year—	at the rate of	36s. 0d. per week.
3rd year—	at the rate of	54s. 6d. per week.
4th year—	at the rate of	89s. 6d. per week.
5th year—	at the rate of	114s. 0d. per week.
- (b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of four years—
 

1st year—	at the rate of	30s. 6d. per week.
2nd year—	at the rate of	54s. 0d. per week.
3rd year—	at the rate of	89s. 6d. per week.
4th year—	at the rate of	114s. 0d. per week.

*Rates for Overtime Worked.*

10. Where overtime (i.e., work done on Sundays and Public Holidays or outside ordinary working hours) is worked, the apprentice shall be paid by the employer wages for such overtime at the rate of time and a half, double time, or at such other rates (as the case may be) as the employer may for the time being be obliged to pay to the journeymen employed by him in the same trade, provided that the rate shall not be less than 1s. 6d. per hour.

*Standard of Proficiency.*

11. Should the apprentice in any year pass in the subjects prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course and attain a standard as certified by the Commission of not less than an average of 75 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission to the subjects of Trade Theory and Practice prescribed for that year of such course, he shall be deemed to have attained the standard of proficiency for such year.

*Increased Rates of Pay for Proficiency.*

12. When an apprentice attains in any year the standard of proficiency prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course he shall—

- (a) for the first occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Two shillings per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage;

- (b) for the second occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Two shillings and six pence per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage;
- (c) for the third and/or fourth occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Three shillings per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage.

*Proportion of Apprentices to Journeymen.*

13. The number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the said trades shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to every three journeymen, or fraction of three journeymen, employed by such employer in such trade.

For the purposes of this Regulation an employer working at the trade shall be deemed to be a journeyman, and the number of journeymen employed at any time shall be deemed to be the average per working day of the number of journeymen employed in the said trade by such employer during the period of six months immediately preceding such time.

*Apprenticeship Course—Classes for Instruction.*

14. (a) The classes for instruction in the subjects of the apprenticeship course for the said trade shall be as set out in the Schedule hereto, but any apprentice or applicant who has the necessary qualifications may, subject to the approval of the Commission, be permitted to enter the classes prescribed for any year of the said course.

*Standard of Education to be Attained by an Apprentice.*

(b) The standard of education to be attained by an apprentice—

- (i) in the subjects of the first, second, and third years of his apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify to proceed to the classes for instruction prescribed for the next succeeding year, and
- (ii) in the subjects of the fourth year of the apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify in respect to education for the "final certificate" of the Commission—

shall be not less than 50 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission in each year of the subjects prescribed for such year of the said course, or such average percentage of marks in all the said subjects deemed by the Commission to be equivalent thereto.

*Payment of School Fees.*

17 (a) The school fees of apprentices or applicants for attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction shall be paid by such apprentices or applicants, but on the receipt by the employer of a report from the Commission that any such apprentice or applicant has secured during the period covered by the report a record of not less than 80 per cent. of the possible attendances at the prescribed day and evening classes respectively, the employer shall refund to the apprentice or applicant the school fees paid by him for such period of instruction.

(b) In cases where the apprentice or applicant is prevented on occasions from attendance at the said classes through illness or accident, such occasions shall not be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage provided that the employer may demand a medical certificate from the apprentice or applicant as proof of such illness or accident.

*Trade Experience Required of an Apprentice.*

18. The trade experience to be obtained by an apprentice in his apprenticeship course shall include gradual and complete instruction to the satisfaction of the Commission in the following processes:—

All classes of Electroplating and all things incidental thereto, including—

- (a) the preparation after polishing of materials for electroplating;
- (b) the electroplating of ware by electrolytic means;
- (c) the preparation, analysis and maintenance of solutions used;
- (d) in such establishments where electroplating is carried out, the colouring of metal and metallised surfaces; and
- (e) where the facilities exist, such instruction in polishing and finishing (not exceeding the period of six months) as will enable the apprentice to improve his knowledge of the trade of electroplating.

*Incorporation of General Regulations.*

19. The provisions of the following General Regulations made under the Acts shall apply in the said trade:—

General Regulations (No. 1), approved by the Governor in Council on the 18th day of September, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 19th day of September, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 2), approved by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of October, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 31st day of October, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 3), approved by the Governor in Council on the 10th day of December, 1928, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 12th day of December, 1928.

General Regulations (No. 4), approved by the Governor in Council on the 24th day of December, 1931, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 30th day of December, 1931.

General Regulations (No. 5), approved by the Governor in Council on the 9th day of December, 1932, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 4th day of January, 1933.

General Regulations (No. 6), approved by the Governor in Council on the 17th day of May, 1943, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 19th day of May, 1943.

General Regulations (No. 7), approved by the Governor in Council on the 29th day of July, 1947, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 6th day of August, 1947.

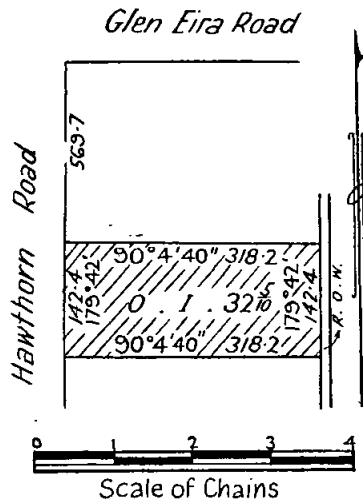

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "MARYBOROUGH BOTANICAL GARDENS RESERVE."**

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 22nd April, 1879, as a site for park and garden, and for dam and reservoir purposes, in the municipal district of Maryborough, and known as the "Maryborough Botanical Gardens Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve."

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and no society, club, picnic party, or other combined body shall be allowed to use the Reserve, without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names in the fences, trees, seats, or in any way damage or deface any of the buildings, fences, gates, seats, paving, or any property in or enclosing the Reserve, or leave or roll stones therein, or enter or pollute any water in the Reserve, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, or manure.

4. No person shall interfere with or remove any trees, shrubs, plants, fish, birds, or other property in the Reserve, or throw any stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance, or leave therein any glass, paper, or other litter, except in receptacles that may be provided for the purpose.

5. No person shall make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound, or shall play upon any musical or noisy instrument, or sing, in the Reserve, nor shall any person preach or declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to the members of the public in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

6. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in or enclosing the Reserve.

7. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and any person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve.

8. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve.

9. No person shall bring or allow to remain in the Reserve any cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, fowls, or other animals, and any such found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.

10. No person shall camp or light a fire in the Reserve.

11. No booth, tent, or other structure shall be erected in the Reserve, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

12. No person shall offer for sale within the Reserve any article or articles, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

14. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, or tablet, or any support, fastening, or fitting, used or constructed or adapted to be used for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice, and fixed or set by the Committee of Management in the Reserve.

15. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord.

16. No children under five (5) years of age shall be allowed in the Reserve, unless in charge of a parent or guardian.

17. No person shall carry or use firearms or fishing tackle in the Reserve, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

18. No person shall in any part of the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult, or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any curator or other servant of the Committee of Management thereof.

19. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the Committee of Management thereof, shall ride or drive any horse or any bicycle or motor vehicle in the Reserve.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE YAN YAN GURT RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land, which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 15th April, 1947, as a site for Recreation purposes in the Parish of Yan Yan Gurt, and known as the "Bambra Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve," such reservation having been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days, not exceeding fifty-two (52) in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football, or other matches, shows, sports, fêtes, musical performances, outdoor gatherings, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person to the Reserve, but no person shall be permitted to enter any of the buildings on the Reserve on days on which fees for admission are not being charged without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

2. No person shall—

- (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
- (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
- (c) Use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve.
- (d) Bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- (e) Obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person under authority from the Committee or employed by it at the Reserve in the execution of his lawful duties.
- (f) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or on any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

3. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto, as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.

5. No club, association, society, or person shall hold any sport, entertainment, performance, show, or ceremony on any part of the Reserve without the authority of the Committee first obtained.

6. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

7. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle, or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for that purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding 2s. for each vehicle.

8. No person shall take part in any games, sports, or entertainments of any kind in the Reserve at any time, without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person, club, or other body using the Reserve shall damage any building thereon or the fittings of such building, and in the event of such damage occurring during their occupancy thereof, such person, club, or other body

shall be responsible for such damage, and shall pay to the Committee the cost of making good and repairing such building or fittings.

10. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.

11. No person shall remove any wood or timber from the Reserve unless with the consent of the Committee first obtained and then only on such terms and conditions as shall be determined by the said Committee and approved of by the Board of Land and Works.

12. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for that purpose by the Committee.

13. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, pigs, goats, or other animals without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

14. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect therein any building or any other structure without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

15. No person shall sell or offer for sale any article in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee first had and obtained, and then only subject to such conditions as such Committee may determine.

16. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off, or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE HEATHCOTE RECREATION RESERVES.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the under-mentioned lands in the Town of Heathcote, hereinafter referred to as the "Reserves," such reservations having been placed under a Committee of Management, hereinafter referred to as the "Committee":—

- (a) The land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 31st March, 1913, as a site for General Recreation purposes in the Town of Heathcote.
- (b) The remaining portion of the lands temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of 7th July, 1873, and 5th April, 1887, as sites for Public Recreation in the municipal district of Heathcote.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserves shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days as the Reserves may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Three shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserves.

2. (a) No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and for maintaining good order in the Reserves the Committee or its employees may refuse any person admission to the Reserves or any structure therein.

(b) Climb or jump over the gates, fences, seats, tables, signboards, building equipment, notices, fittings, or other improvements in or around the Reserves, nor stick therein or thereon any bills, or in any way injure, damage, deface, write, or paint on or otherwise mark any rocks, gates, fences, seats, tables, buildings, equipment, notices, signboards, or other improvements, structure, or fittings therein or thereon, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

(c) Remove or displace any board, plate, or fitting, or written or printed notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice, fixed or set up by the Committee in the Reserves.

3. Every person shall exercise reasonable and proper care in the use of any portion of the Reserves' dressing rooms, conveniences, or appurtenances therein.

4. No person shall, without the consent of the Committee, light any fire in the Reserves, except in a place set apart by the Committee or as indicated by the curator for the purpose. No such fire shall be left burning or unattended, and before lighting such fire such person shall make provision for extinguishing the same either by water or loose earth. Every person whilst in the Reserves shall take special precautions against the risk of fire.

5. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport in the Reserves at any time, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and then only subject to such conditions as the Committee thinks fit.

6. All fees prescribed herein shall be paid to the secretary of the Committee, or other specially authorized officer, on demand.

7. No person shall play on the tennis court in the Reserves, except with the permission of the Committee, and then only by payment of such fees as may be fixed from time to time by the Committee.

8. No person shall enter the Reserves on any day set apart for cricket or football matches, cycling, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee, or any club, association, or person authorized to issue such ticket of admission, or by any club, association, or person renting the Reserves, or any part thereof, duly authorizing the admission of such person, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date or during the period provided thereon, and every such ticket shall be produced and, if for one day only, surrendered, on demand, to the gate-keeper or other person authorized to collect the same.

9. Upon application to the Committee, any club, association, or person may be granted the exclusive use of the Reserves for the holding of cricket or football matches, shows, sports, fêtes, bicycle races, or other amusements, and may charge for admission thereto of persons, subject to the provisions of these Regulations, and shall pay to the Committee such charges as the Committee may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

10. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any cricket or football matches, horse races, fêtes, coursing, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at the time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or any thing contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

11. No fête, concert, carnival, or aquatic display shall be held on the Reserves, without the consent of the Committee, nor shall fees for admission to the Reserves on days on which fêtes, concerts, or carnival be charged, without the consent of such Committee.

12. No assemblies for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place in the Reserves, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

13. No person shall offer for sale within the Reserves, or deliver therein, any article or commodity, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee being first obtained.

14. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or any structure or erections in the Reserves.

15. No unauthorized person shall interfere with, damage, or in any way destroy or have in his possession in the Reserves, or take away therefrom, any animal, bird, bird's egg or nest, or any live or dead or dressed timber, or any vegetation, tree, shrub, fern, plant, or flower.

16. No person shall bring into or have in his possession or discharge in the Reserves any rifle, firearm, sporting gun, or airgun, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee.

17. No person shall permit or suffer any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or other animals belonging to him or under his care or control to be at large in the Reserves, or to graze or wander over the same, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and upon payment of such fees as may be fixed by such Committee.

18. No person shall bring or allow any dog belonging to him or under his care or control to enter or remain in the Reserves, unless controlled by a leash, cord, or chain, and all dogs found swimming in any water or wandering in the Reserves shall be liable to be destroyed.

19. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserves, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, nor shall any person, without lawful excuse, enter any area made for the purpose in the Reserves.

20. No person shall drive any motor car or other vehicle of any kind, or ride any bicycle, motor cycle, or horse, except on a road or parking area made for the purpose, in the Reserves, and then only as near as practicable to the left-hand side of such road.

21. All persons using the conveniences provided by the Committee shall pay such charges for the use of same as shall be fixed from time to time by the said Committee.

22. No person shall park any motor car, cycle, or other vehicle or tether any horse within the Reserves, excepting at such area as is set apart by the Committee for the purpose, and any person using any such area shall obey any order given by the said Committee, the curator, or other employee of such Committee, and shall pay, on demand, a fee not exceeding Two shillings per day or Five shillings per week for use of such parking area.

23. No person shall drive any motor car or other vehicle of any kind, or ride any bicycle, motor cycle, or horse, within the Reserves, or in any parking area or along any road therein, recklessly or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, including the nature and to the amount of traffic which actually is at the time or which might reasonably be expected to be on any such road, parking area, or in the Reserves.

24. The Committee may at its discretion on such conditions and terms and at such times as it may from time to time permit persons, clubs, or association to use part or parts of the Reserves.

25. The Committee shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of the swings or other appliances in the children's playground, nor from any cause howsoever arising within the Reserves.

26. No person shall camp in the Reserves or erect therein any building or any other structure, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.
