

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "POMPAPIEL RECREATION RESERVE."

TION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as reenacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsover, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted, and whereas by subsection (1) (e) of the said section 181 of the Land Act 1928, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to apply all or any of the Regulations so made to any other land reserved as aforesaid and not conveyed to or vested in trustees, in any case where the persons, council, or body comprising the Committee of Management of such first-mentioned land are or is also appointed to be the Committee of Management of such other land: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred, doth hereby make the following Regulation:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE NATIONAL PARK IN THE PARISHES OF WANDILIGONG, TOWAMBA, DONDANGADALE, AND EURANDELONG.

DANGADALE, AND EURANDELONG.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as reenacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is
given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management
of any Crown land which has been reserved under the
Land Acts for any public purpose whatsover, and which
has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for
the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the
Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers
conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following
Regulations in respect of the reserves set out hereunder,
all of which are together hereinafter referred to as the
"National Park":—

(a) 2880 acres temporarily reserved by Order in

- ational Park":—

  (a) 2,880 acres temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 31st October, 1898, as a site for a National Park in the Parish of Wandiligong;

  (b) 23,100 acres temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 6th October, 1908, as a site for a National Park in the Parishes of Wandiligong, Towamba, Dondangadale, and Eurandelong, in addition to and adjoining site (a) above named;

  (c) 1,300 acres temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 20th November, 1934, as a site for a National Park in the Parish of Wandiligong, in addition to and adjoining sites (a) and (b) above named.

#### REGULATIONS.

- No person shall enter or remain in the National Park who may offend against decency or regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 2. No person shall remain in the National Park if the Committee of Management considers the activities or conduct of such person are contrary to the purposes or interests of the National Park, and on being so directed, either by the Committee or its duly authorized officer or bailiff of Crown lands, any such person shall leave the National Park forthwith.
- 3. No person shall, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management or its duly authorized officer, remove, cut, damage, interfere with or deface any rocks, (rees, shrubs, ferns, plants, signs, seats, tables, gates, posts, or fences in the National Park; or disfigure or write on or otherwise mark any rock, tree, sign, bridge, seat, gate, post, fence, wall, table, pillar, railing, or any building or other structure within the National Park Park.
- 4. No person (except as hereinafter provided) shall shoot, poison, trap, snare, hook, catch, or otherwise destroy, interfere with or take away any game, wild fowl, or any animal, bird, or fish of any description, or carry any firearms, poison, trap, snare, or gin within the National Park without first obtaining the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management or its duly authorized officer; provided always that from the first day of October in every year to the thirtieth day of April following, any person, being the holder of a Victorian trout fishing licence, may take trout from Lake Catani within the National Park by a rod and line. Such person shall use only one rod and line with one hook thereon, but shall not remove from the Lake trout less than eleven inches long, nor shall more than six trout be taken or be in possession of any such person in any one day. The hours of fishing shall be limited from sunrise until one hour after sunset. 4. No. person (except as hereinafter provided) shall hour after sunset.
- 5. No person shall light or maintain any fire within the National Park, except in fireplaces provided in buildings or in the camping area, without the permission of the Committee of Management or its duly authorized officer first obtained, and then only in such places as may be directed by the said Committee or its duly authorized
- officer.

  6. No person shall camp in the National Park, or erect therein any hut or other structure without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management or its duly authorized officer first obtained, and camping shall only be permitted at the authorized camping ground and on payment to the said Committee or its duly authorized officer of a fee of 5s. per week or part thereof, provided that no person shall camp for a period in excess of 28 days without first applying to and obtaining the permission, in writing, of the said Committee.

  7. Campers shall keep the ground and huts in a clean condition, deposit rubbish in the place or places provided, and shall take every precaution against bush or grass fires.

  8. The washing of cooking or eating utensils in Labe
- 8. The washing of cooking or eating utensils in Lake Catani is prohibited.
- 9. Within the National Park, no person, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained, shall:—
  - (a) Offer for sale or let for hire to the public any afficle or device,

    (b) Distribute any bill or like thing,

    (c) Solicit or gather money,

    (d) Take part in any public entertainment for gain,

    (e) Preach, declaim or deliver any address.

- 10. No person shall occupy any hut or other structure standing in the National Park without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and the conditions of and the fees payable for such occupation shall be as determined by the said Committee
- 11. No person shall bring into the National Park or allow to wander therein any horse, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and the owners of any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals found trespassing therein shall be liable to prose-cution for a breach of these Regulations.
- 12. No dog shall be allowed in the National Park without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and all dogs found therein without such permission shall be liable to be destroyed, and the owners thereof liable to prosecution.
- 13. No person shall bathe within the National Park, except in Lake Catani or such other place as may be set apart by the Committee of Management for the purpose, and every person so bathing shall be decently clad.
- 14. No person, except workmen employed in the National Park, shall enter any areas therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- 15. No person shall cut in the National Park or remove therefrom any live or dead timber without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- 16. No person, unless duly authorized in writing by the Committee of Management, shall ply for hire or carry passengers for fee or reward within the boundaries of the National Park.
- 17. No person, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, shall leave unattended any motor car, motor cycle, omnibus, motor truck, or other vehicle within the National Park except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee of Management, and every person so leaving any motor propelled vehicle shall, on demand by any authorized officer of the Committee of Management, pay the undermentioned fees: mentioned fees:
  - (a) for a motor car or motor cycle a fee not exceeding 1s. per day or part thereof;
  - (b) for an omnibus or motor truck carrying more than six persons a fee not exceeding 5s. per day or part thereof.
- 18. No motor vehicle, delivery cart, lorry, wagon, truck, van, or other vehicle of a gross loaded weight exceeding two (2) tons shall be allowed within the National Park, except on the road between the entrance to the Park and the Chalet (hereinafter called the "main road"), without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management
- 19. The Branch road to the Crystal Brook Reservoir from its junction with the road to the Horn shall be closed to all vehicular traffic except that authorized, in writing, by the Committee of Management.
- 20. The Country Roads Board officer controlling construction or maintenance works on the main road or the branch road to the Horn shall have full authority to close any of such roads against all traffic wherever, in his opinion, any of such roads is unfit for traffic, or the works being carried out necessitate the closing thereof. A notice "Closed against traffic" shall be sufficient evidence that the road is closed.
- 21. The bailiff of Crown lands or other officer appointed 21. The bailiff of Crown lands or other officer appointed by the Committee of Management controlling traffic on any roads within the National Park shall have full authority to close any of such roads against all traffic wherever, in his opinion, any of such roads is unfit for traffic, or wherever, for any other reason, the closing thereof is considered desirable. A notice "Closed against traffic" shall be sufficient evidence that the road is closed.
- 22. The Country Roads Board officer controlling construction or maintenance works on the main road or the branch road to the Horn, or the balliff of Crown lands or other officer appointed by the Committee of Management, controlling traffic on any road within the National Park, shall have full authority to stop the passage of any vehicle which is considered by him to be unsafe or which, in his opinion, would cause undue damage to the road.
- 23. The parking of motor cars and other vehicles on the road between Eurobin Falls Bridge and Carlile's Corner is prohibited, and drivers must not cause obstruction of the road by allowing cars or vehicles to be stopped on this section.

24. Motor vehicles shall not travel on the roads within the National Park at a speed greater than twenty (20) miles per hour, and the driver of any such vehicle shall slow down and sound the horn at all turns on the roads.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928 as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).—(Corres. Rs.121.)
