AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Covernor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

W HEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Governmen Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division I, section 5, of the said Lant Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases i b the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 6 and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 16 of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935, it is enacted that when a product has been declared a commodity and a Board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by proclamation—

- (a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the proclamation or on from and after a later date specified in the proclamation be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof; and
- of the Board as the owner thereof; and

 (b) make such further provisions as will enable the Board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the same: And whereas by a proclamation made on the 9th day of December, 1935, under the provisions of section 6 of the said Act the Governor in Council declared onions to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Order made on the 26th March, 1936, the Governor in Council appointed a Marketing Board in relation to onions and assigned to such Board the name of "The Onion Marketing Board": Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on and from the fifth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, all onions shall subject to and in accordance with the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 be divested from the producers of onions and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Onion Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any onions coming into existence within two (2) years from the fifth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, all onions and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Onion Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any onions coming into existence within two (2) years from the fifth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight they shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Onion Marketing Board as the owner thereof and to enable the Onion Marketing Board as the owner thereof and to enable the Onion Marketing Board as the owner thereof and to enable the Onion Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as the Onion Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by







In pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947 and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Compensation Regulations 1948 and shall come into operation upon publication in the Government Gazette.
- 2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, "Act" means the *Vegetation Diseases* (Fruit Fly) Act 1947 and "Schedule" means Schedule to these Regulations.
- 3. (1) Every claim for compensation by an owner or occupier of land in a proclaimed area who has, in compliance with the requirements of a notice given under section 4 of the Act, removed fruit from trees growing on such land before such fruit was ripe shall be in the form in the First Schedule or to the like effect.
- (2) Every such claim shall be lodged with the Minister within six months of the expiration of the time within which under the terms of the notice the fruit in question was required to be removed from the trees and disposed of.
- 4. Every certificate of an inspector for the purposes of sub-section (3) of section 6 of the Act shall be in the form in the Second Schedule or to the like effect.
- 5. Where the Minister is satisfied (whether upon a certificate of an inspector under the last preceding regulation or otherwise) that any owner or occupier of land in a proclaimed area has, in compliance with the requirements of a notice given under section four of the Act, removed fruit from trees growing on such land before such fruit has ripened, he shall give a certificate to that effect in the form in the Third Schedule or to the like effect.
- 6. Every reference by the Minister of a claim for hearing and determination by a court of petty sessions or a county court (as the case may be) shall be in the form in the Fourth Schedule or to the like effect.
- 7. (1) Upon receipt of any such reference from the Minister the clerk of petty sessions or registrar (as the case may be) shall set the reference down for hearing and determination at the earliest practicable sittings of the court having regard to the provisions for a summons and the service thereof hereinafter appearing and shall thereupon issue a summons in the form in the Fifth Schedule or to the like effect calling on the Minister and the claimant to appear before the court in order that the reference may be heard and determined.
- (2) The provisions of the Justices Acts and the rules thereunder or of the County Court Act 1928 and the rules thereunder (as the case may be) relating to the service of a summons upon a complaint for a civil debt recoverable summarily or of a summons to a plaint (as the case requires) shall with such adaptations as are necessary apply to the service of such summons.
- 8. The provisions of the Justices Acts and of the rules made thereunder or of the County Court Act 1928 and of the rules thereunder (as the case may require) relating to the summoning attendance and conduct of witnesses shall apply with such adaptations as are necessary to any reference by the Minister of a claim for compensation for hearing and determination by a court of petty sessions or a county court
- 9. Upon the determination of a claim for compensation by a court the clerk or registrar thereof shall upon the application of any person applying for the same issue a certificate of determination in the form in the Sixth Schedule or to the like effect.

- 10. (1) Whenever a court of petty sessions hearing a claim for compensation under these Regulations determines that the claimant shall pay costs to the Minister or to any other person such order shall be enforceable in the same manner and to the like extent as would an order of such court made on the hearing of a complaint for a civil debt recoverable summarily.
- (2) Whenever a county court hearing a claim for compensation under these Regulations determines that the claimant shall pay costs to the Minister or to any other person, such order shall be enforceable in the like manner and to the like extent as would an order of such court made on the hearing of a plaint under the *County Court Act* 1928
- 11. No fees shall be demanded by any clerk or registrar in respect of any matters or things done or sought to be done in consequence of the reference under these Regulations of a claim for compensation for hearing and determining by a court of petty sessions or county court (as the case may be).
- 12. Upon the hearing of a claim for compensation in a court of petty sessions or county court the claimant may appear personally or by his counsel or solicitor and the Minister may appear by his counsel or solicitor or by any person authorized in that behalf by him.




