Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE COMMERCIAL CLERKS BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 21 OF THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1934 (No. 4275).

I, Raymond Henry Beers, Secretary for Labour, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts and in consequence of the provisions of a Determination of the Commercial Clerks Board, hereby issue an adjusted Determination showing the adjusted rates and prices to operate from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in November, 1947.
