Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby increase the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1 and 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

Qualifications.—A good knowledge of the Water Acts, a knowledge of the incidence of rating, and experience in rate collecting; ability to conduct negotiations and correspondence, and to represent the Commission in proceedings for recovery of rates. A working knowledge of the Land and Local Government Acts and the possession of municipal clerkship or accountancy qualifications are desirable.

PROFESSIONAL DIVISION.

Hydrographic Engineer, Class "B," Investigations and Designs (Hydrographic Section), Department of Water Supply.

Yearly Salary.—£670, minimum; £722, maximum.

Duties.—To supervise the work of the Hydrographic Branch.

Qualifications.—To possess a Degree in Civil Engineering or other recognized engineering qualification, extensive experience in river gauging operations in the field and office, and in the investigation of water resources, as well as in the preparation of reports as to the practicable limits of water conservation on various streams, a thorough knowledge of the River Murray Agreement insofar as the distribution of waters is concerned, administrative ability, and a knowledge of the work of the Branch and its activities.

Senior Draughtsman, Class "C1," Department of Public Works.

Yearly Salary.—£527, minimum; £579, maximum.

Duties.—To prepare preliminary sketches, contract plans, details, and specifications for modern buildings.

Qualifications.—To be a registered architect or to possess equivalent qualifications, to be fully qualified in the subject of building construction, and experienced in draughtsmanship as applied to at least one of the following types of buildings:—Schools, public hospitals, sanatoria, police stations, law courts, penal establishments, offices, or other major structures for State purposes.

Mechanical Engineer, Grade III, Class "C1," Department of Water Supply.

Yearly Salary.—£527, minimum; £579, maximum.

Duties.—To supervise and control the working and general maintenance of three steam and one crude oil pumping stations within the Millewa district.

Qualifications.—To possess a First-class Engineer's Certificate issued by the Board of Trade or other recognized qualification in mechanical engineering. To have had practical experience in the supervision, operation, and maintenance of large mechanical pumping installation. A thorough knowledge of the operation and maintenance of water tube boilers, high-speed steam engines, crude oil engines, and centrifugal pumps is essential.

Forester, Grade II, Class "D," Department of State Forests.

Duties.—To control district staff, stores, and equipment, silvicultural operations, utilization of forest produce and measures for fire protection, and to make recommendations re forest estate alterations and forest offences.

Qualifications.—To be a graduate of the School of Forestry, Creswick; to have a thorough knowledge of the Forests Acts and Regulations, and experience of field and office methods and procedure in the Department.

Assistant Hydrographer, Class "D," Investigations and Designs (Hydrographic Section), Department of Water Supply.

Duties.—To assist in the collection of stream flow and survey data, and in the construction and maintenance of gauging stations and equipment.

Qualifications.—To possess the School Leaving Certificate of the University of Melbourne, or its equivalent, and training and experience in the use of survey instruments; to have some experience in the compilation of plans and working drawings; to be able to handle boats and to drive a motor vehicle. Experience on construction work is desirable.

Assistant Entomologist, Class "E" or Class "D," National Museums Branch, Department of Chief Secretary.

Duties.—To assist Head Attendant in management of male division, and to prepare leave sheets and other records as directed by the Head Attendant. To act as Head Attendant in his absence.

Qualifications.—Ability to direct and control staff and patients, and to keep records relating thereto. To have had some experience as Acting Head Attendant.

Electrical Mechanic, Mental Hospital, Ararat, Department of Health.

Yearly Salary.—£367, minimum; £380, maximum.

Duties.—Under the direction of the Engineer, to maintain wiring and electrical equipment, to undertake minor electrical installations, and to assist the Engineer generally.

Qualifications.—To hold "A" Grade Wiring Licence. Possession of a Boiler Attendant's Certificate would be desirable.

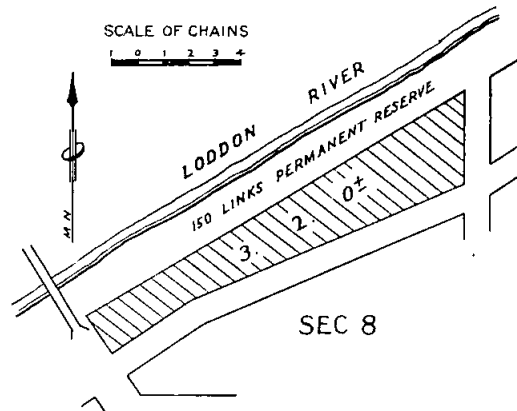

AMENDMENT TO FOREST REGULATIONS 1925.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred upon him by the Forests Acts and of all other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

CITATION.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Forests (Amending) Regulations 1948.

AMENDMENTS.

2. The Forests Regulations 1925, made on the 7th day of April, 1925, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th day of April, 1925, as amended from time to time, are amended as follows:—

(a) After the interpretation of "users" there shall be inserted the following interpretation, viz.:—

"'Vehicle' includes a tractor, whether running on wheels or on tracks, and any other mechanical contrivance, whether running on wheels or on tracks, used or capable of being used for the transportation of persons or goods or for haulage purposes."

(b) Paragraph (h) of Regulation 53 thereof and Regulation 60 thereof are hereby revoked.

(c) For Regulation 76, as amended, there shall be substituted the following Regulation:—

"76. (a) A forest officer, upon application being made to him in that behalf, may issue to any person a licence to take a vehicle into a forest area.

(b) Every such licence shall be in the form or to the effect of the Twenty-fourth Schedule hereto, and shall remain in force for three months from the date of the issue thereof unless sooner suspended or cancelled by the Commission.

(c) The fee payable for every such licence shall be as follows:—

(d) Subject to the next succeeding sub-regulation, no person shall for the purpose of removing forest produce therefrom take any vehicle into any portion of a State forest unless he is the holder of a licence issued under this Regulation and appropriate to the vehicle in question.

(e) The last preceding sub-regulation shall not apply to any person—

(i) who is the holder of a current licence to cut or obtain specified forest produce from a specified portion of any State forest; or

(ii) to any person under contract to the Commission to remove specified forest produce from a specified portion of a State forest—
whilst (in either case) he is so removing such produce."

(d) At the end of the Twenty-third Schedule, there shall be inserted the following Schedule:—

The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in the said trade in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after the 13th day of April, 1948, on, from, and after which date all indentures of apprenticeship heretofore executed under the provisions of the Acts and Regulations made in respect of the aforesaid trade shall be deemed to be amended accordingly:—

- (a) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—
 - 1st year—at the rate of 27s. 0d. per week.
 - 2nd year—at the rate of 37s. 0d. per week.
 - 3rd year—at the rate of 49s. 9d. per week.
 - 4th year—at the rate of 72s. 3d. per week.
 - 5th year—at the rate of 98s. 9d. per week.
- (b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of four years—
 - 1st year—at the rate of 37s. 0d. per week.
 - 2nd year—at the rate of 49s. 9d. per week.
 - 3rd year—at the rate of 72s. 3d. per week.
 - 4th year—at the rate of 98s. 9d. per week."

- (a) in any daily newspaper office any employer may employ apprentices or additional apprentices in the trade of Process Engraving so that the total number of apprentices employed by such employer at such trade in such office shall not at any time exceed twelve;
- (b) in all other places any employer may employ apprentices or additional apprentices in the trade of Process Engraving so that the proportion of apprentices to journeymen employed by him at any time shall not be in excess of one to every two journeymen or fraction of two journeymen employed by such employer in such trade as at the first day of March, 1948.

Any apprentice employed pursuant to this proviso in excess of the proportion or number authorized to be employed by any other provision of these Regulations shall at all times be disregarded in calculating the number of apprentices who may be employed pursuant to any other provision of these Regulations.

Provided further that the number of apprentices employed in any one section of any employer's business (colour etching and half-tone etching being deemed to be one section), whether pursuant to this proviso or otherwise, shall not be in excess of the proportion of one apprentice to one journeyman.

BY-LAW No. 164.

Controlling the Introduction and Use of Liquor in Parks.

A By-law of the City of Heidelberg, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and particularly under and with reference to section 769, and numbered 164, for regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in any parks and gardens of the City used as pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Heidelberg, with the consent of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. No malt or spirituous liquor of any kind shall at any time, directly or indirectly, be sold in portion of the parks or reserves.

2. The Council also reserves the right to prohibit the introduction of malt or spirituous liquors into such parks or reserves.

3. In the event of any person desiring to bring into parks or reserves for consumption any malt or spirituous liquors it will be necessary for such person to make special application to the Council for permission.

4. Notwithstanding the granting of any such permission the Council, through the Town Clerk or the Officer in Charge of the parks or reserves, may order the distribution of liquor to be temporarily or permanently suspended at any time.

5. No application will be considered unless it is received in sufficient time to permit it being dealt with by the Committee of the whole Council and sets out the approximate number of persons and the quantity of liquor desired for their use.

6. The applicant must obtain any permit necessary in accordance with the provisions of the *Licensing Act 1946*.

The Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 3rd February, 1948, and confirmed on the 22nd March, 1948.

TOWN OF ARARAT.

BY-LAW No. 75.

A By-law of the Town of Ararat, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and the *Police Offences Act 1928*, and numbered 75, for the purpose of regulating traffic.

No person shall park any commercial vehicle exceeding 20 feet in length in Barkly-street between Queen-street and View Point-street, and in Ingor-street, between Barkly-street and High-street, with the exception of the north side of Barkly-street between Vincent-street and Queen-street, between the hours of Nine o'clock in the forenoon and Six o'clock in the afternoon on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, and on Saturdays between the hours of Nine o'clock in the forenoon and One o'clock in the afternoon, unless and only while delivery of goods is being made from such vehicle to premises in the vicinity.

2. No person shall park any vehicle which is transporting petrol, methylated spirits, benzene, naphtha, or any other product of petroleum or other volatile fluids in Barkly-street between King-street and View Point-street, in Ingor-street between Barkly-street and High-street, and in Vincent-street between High-street and Moore-street, unless and only while such vehicle is delivering petrol or petrol products aforementioned to any petrol pump or premises.

TOWN OF HORSHAM.

BY-LAW No. 31.

A By-law of the Town of Horsham, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 31, for prohibiting the sale of goods from stalls, motor cars, carts, trucks, barrows, boxes, baskets, crates, bags, or other vehicles or receptacles standing or placed on any street, road, or public place within an area of the municipal district, and to regulate traffic in streets and footways.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Horsham order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context—
“Street” and “road” respectively mean a street or road being a public highway, and include every public highway.
“Public place” means a public place within the meaning of section 3 of the *Police Offences Act 1928*.
“Footway” means every footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or clear public place within the Town of Horsham habitually used by pedestrians, and not vehicular traffic.
“Council” means the Municipal Council of the Town of Horsham.

2. By-law No. 29 is hereby repealed.

3. No person shall sell any goods from stalls, motor cars, carts, trucks, barrows, boxes, baskets, crates, bags, or other vehicles or receptacles standing or placed on any street, road, or parts thereof, or public place within the following area in the Town of Horsham, that is to say, that area bounded by a line commencing at the north-east corner of the intersection of Urquhart-street and Baillie-street; thence westerly along the north side of Baillie-street to the point of intersection of the continuation of the west side of Darlot-street; thence southerly along the west side of Darlot-street to the point of intersection of the continuation of the south side of Hamilton-street; thence easterly along the south side of Hamilton-street to the south-east corner of the intersection of Hamilton-street and Urquhart-street; thence in a northerly direction along the east side of Urquhart-street to the point of commencement.

4. Without prejudice to the provisions of the foregoing paragraph—

- (a) No person in any street or footway shall sell or offer for sale any goods in a manner calculated to obstruct or hinder members of the public in the free and proper use of such street or footway.
- (b) Every such person shall move on upon being so requested by any officer of the Council, or any member of the Police Force.

5. Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

6. This By-law shall, except as expressly herein provided, apply to and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Town of Horsham.

SHIRE OF ELTHAM.

BY-LAW No. 25.

A By-law of the Shire of Eltham made under the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria, and numbered 25, for determining, applying, dispensing with, or regulating such matters or things as are left to be determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council of the said Shire of Eltham under the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria, and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Eltham order as follows:—

1. The minimum area, depth, and width of frontage specified in column 3 of table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria (hereinafter called the Regulations), are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage of land on which a building shall be constructed throughout the whole of the municipal district.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations, any person with the approval of the Council of the Shire of Eltham may—

- (a) construct a building of Class I, occupancy on land having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage, or at a lesser distance from boundaries than those specified in column 3 of table 803 of the Regulations; or
- (b) construct a building of Class III, V., VI., VII., or VIII, occupancy, or a building to which a building of Class IV, occupancy is attached, on land having an area, depth, or width of frontage less than that prescribed in clause 809 of the Regulations,

in any case where, on the date of the commencement of the Regulations, such land existed as a separate allotment and has not since been reduced in area or is shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the Council, and lodged in the Office of Titles.
