<b>IMPROVERS.</b>						
<i>Feather Duster Making Section.</i>						
Two male improvers to every worker receiving not less than 128s. per week of 40 hours.						
Two female improvers to every female worker receiving not less than 85s. per week of 40 hours.						
<b>IMPROVERS.</b>						
<i>Mop Making Section.</i>						
Two male improvers to every worker receiving not less than 128s. per week of 40 hours.						
Two female improvers to every female worker receiving not less than 85s. per week of 40 hours.						
<b>IMPROVERS.</b>

One improver to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than 128s. per week of 40 hours, or the prescribed piece-work prices.						

Clauses, other than clause 2, of the said Determination shall remain in force provided that in clause 14 the amount 26s. plus 10 per cent. whosoever appearing shall be amended to read 32s. plus 10 per cent.
