AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division I, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2 and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

CLOSE SEASON FOR QUAILS OF CERTAIN SPECIES

PROCLAMATION.

ERTAIN PREMISES IN WHICH DANCING IS ENGAGED IN DECLARED TO BE PUBLIC BUILD-INGS AND REGISTRABLE PUBLIC BUILDINGS WITHIN THE MEANING OF THE HEALTH ACT 1928. CERTAIN

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependences in the Commonwealth of Australia,

By virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation rescind the Proclamation made on the 13th day of November, 1933, and published in the Government Gazette of the 15th day of November, 1933, on page 2851, in which certain premises wherein dancing is engaged in are declared to be public buildings and registrable public buildings within the meaning of the Health Act 1928, and in lieu thereof do hereby declare any building or part of a building, including boarding houses and eating houses, wherein persons (other than the occupier thereof and his family, employees, boarders, or guests) engage in dancing at any time whatsoever, to be a public building within the meaning of the Health Act 1928: And I do further declare any such building as is of a permanent character to be a registrable public building within the meaning of section One hundred and seventy-seven of the said Act:

Provided that this Proclamation shall not apply to the licensed premises or part of the licensed premises of a dincensed victualler, in respect of which special leave for dancing has been granted by a Licensing Court. BY virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts.

COUNTRY ROADS (FOREST ROADS AND STOCK ROUTES) ACT 1943,

PROCLAMATION OF FOREST ROADS AMENDED

WHEREAS by section 3 (1) of the Country Roads (Forest Roads and Stock Routes) Act 1943, it is provided that the Governor in Council may, on the recommendation of the Country Roads Board, made after consultation with the Minister of Forests and the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey, and on the recommendation of the Commissioner of Public Works, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette proclaim any road or any part of any road to be a forest road for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by Proclamation of the 5th day of June, 1945, and published in the Government Gazette of the 6th day of June, 1945, made, pursuant to the above section, the Drummond-Vaughan road in the Shires of Glenlyon and of Newstead and Mount Alexander, was proclaimed to be a forest road for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas the Country Roads Board (after consultation with the Minister of Forests and the Commissioner of Prown Lands and Survey) and the Commissioner of Public Works have recommended that the said Proclamation be amended: Now therefore that the said Proclamation be amended: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby amend the Proclamation made on the 5th day of June, 1945, and published in the Government Gazette of the 6th day of June, 1945, in the manner following, that is to say:—

SUPERANNUATION REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of section 37 of the Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928
(No. 3733) the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations, namely:—

- 1. In these Regulations, the Superannuation Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 16th day of December, 1927, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 24th day of January, 1928, and published in the *Government Gazette* and any Regulations amending the same, are hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations."
- 2. These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with the Principal Regulations, and as part thereof.
- 3. The Principal Regulations as altered or added to by these Regulations shall be known as the Melbourne Harbor Trust Superannuation Regulations 1927-1948.
- 4. The amendments made herein shall come into operation on Commence and from the thirtieth day of January One thosuand nine hundred ment. and forty-eight.
- 5. In Regulation 2—definition of "Employee"—for sub-clause Definitions. (b) there shall be substituted the following:—
 - (b) Any person who after the thirtieth day of January One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight shall have completed two years' (or in any special cases approved by the Commissioners, six calendar months') continuous regular employment in the service, and was at the time of the commencement of such employment under the age of 58 years, and who within three calendar months next after the thirtieth day of January One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, or within three calendar months next after the completion of such two years' regular employment or of such approval by the Commissioners (whichever is the earlier) shall lodge with the Commissioners a notice in the form in the Third Schedule to these Regulations.
 - 6. For Regulation 4, there shall be substituted the following:

 Interes
 - 4. The Commissioners shall on the first day of the months of January, April, July and October in every year credit the Account with interest for the preceding quarter on the average amount (being One hundred pounds or a multiple thereof) at the credit of the Account on the first day of each of the then last preceding three calendar months. The rate of such interest shall be the greater of either—
 - (a) That obtained by the State Superannuation Board constituted under Act No. 3408 of the Parliament of the State of Victoria in respect of its then latest investment of any portion of the Superannuation Fund established under the said last-mentioned Act, or
 - (b) Three pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.
- 7. At the end of Regulation 5 there shall be inserted the following Quinquennial sub-clause—
 - (4) For the purposes of the investigation the rate of interest assumed to be credited to the Account shall not be less than three pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.
- 8. After Regulation 6 the following Regulation is in-Qualification serted:———
 - 6A. The Commissioners may require any contributor to undergo a medical examination before permitting such contributor to increase his contributions to provide units of pension in any case where such contributor had previously become entitled to increase his contributions but had not elected to do so. In any such case the Commissioners may for any reason deemed by them sufficient exclude any contributor from increasing his contributions or may limit the amount by which he may increase his contributions and Regulation 12 shall have effect subject to this provision.

(i) A contributor whose wages immediately prior to the thirtieth day of January One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight exceeded six hundred and seventy-six pounds per annum, may within three months after that date, elect to increase the number of units for which he is contributing by a number not exceeding the difference between twelve and the number specified in column two of the scale contained in Regulation 10 opposite to the wages group within which his wages fell on that date.

(ii) If a contributor, the number of whose units has been increased consequent upon an election under this Regulation, retires within one year after the date of such election and is under the proviso to Regulation 26 entitled (not having chosen to take a refund) to a pension on the basis of an actuarial equivalent, then in computing such actuarial equivalent no account shall be taken of any additional units contributed for pursuant to such election, but the contributor shall have returned to him from the Account the actual amount of the contributions made by him in respect of such additional units.

(iii) Any increased contribution payable in pursuance of subclause (i) of this Regulation shall be payable as on and from the first pay day after the thirtieth day of January One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight.

- (iv) Nothing in this Regulation shall affect any right of a contributor to elect pursuant to Regulation 12 to increase the number of units for which he is contributing to a number not exceeding the number specified in column two of the scale contained in Regulation 10 opposite to the wages group within which his wages fall, or the operation of Regulation 12 in relation to any election thereunder.
- 11. For Regulation 12 there shall be substituted the follow-Increase in ing:-

12. (1) If the wages of a contributor are increased and by reason of that increase fall within a higher wages group in column 1 of the scale contained in Clause 10 of these Regulations, than the wages group in which it fell prior to the increase, he may, within three months from the pay day on which payment of wages at the increased rate is first actually made, elect to increase the amount of his contribution to an amount not exceeding the sum which will provide units of pension to the number specified in column 2 opposite to such higher wages group

Any increased contribution under this sub-clause shall be payable as from and inclusive of the pay day on which payment

of wages at the increased rate is first actually made.
