PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the Vermin and Nozious Weeds Act 1928 (No. 3799), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare the plant named hereunder to be a noxious weed for the purposes of the above Act within the City of Brunswick, viz.:

Foeniculum Vulgare, Gaertn, "Fennel."
