ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

No. 5268. "An Act to provide, upon the Transfer and Surrender to His Majesty of certain Land at Burwood, for the Reservation of that Land as a Site for a Public Park and Children's Playground, for the Excision of a Part of certain Land at Camberwell permanently reserved as a Site for Public Gardens and for the Reservation of the Land so excised, together with the Land forming the existing Town Hall Site at Camberwell, as a Site for a Town Hall and for Municipal Purposes."

No. 5269. "An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Five million four hundred and thirty-seven thousand three hundred and seventeen pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight and One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine."

No. 5270. "An Act to amend the *Miners' Phthisis (Treasury Allowances) Act 1938.*"

No. 5271. "An Act to amend the Building Operations and Building Materials Control Acts."

DECLARING A MUNICIPAL DISTRICT TO BE SUBJECT TO PART II. OF ACT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by paragraph (c) of section 40 of the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1928* it is provided that Part II. of the said Act shall have effect as regards any municipal district outside any milk area on such date as such district is proclaimed by the Governor in Council to be subject to the provisions of Part II. of the said Act: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof do by this my Proclamation declare the municipal district of the Shire of Chiltern to be subject to the provisions of Part II. of the aforesaid Act on and from the first day of July, 1948, on which date Part II. of the said Act and all Regulations and Orders now in force or which may from time to time be made under Part II. of the said Act shall come into operation and be of full force and effect in such municipal district.

BY-LAW No. 64.

A By-law of the City of Geelong West, made under Part XXXV. of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 64, prescribing Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the Western Foreshore Park.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by Part XXXV. of the *Local Government Act 1946*, the Council of the City of Geelong West doth hereby make the following Regulations for the care, protection, control, and management of the Western Foreshore Park (hereinafter called the Park) which comprises all those the areas containing in all 9 acres 1 rood 31 6/10 perches, or thereabouts, and being:—

- (a) the land indicated by cross hachure on the plan annexed hereto, and thereon designated as "Rippleside";
- (b) the land indicated by hachure and cross hachure on the said plan, and thereon designated as "Western Foreshore," and which said Western Foreshore area extends in a northerly direction from a line drawn parallel to the northern boundary of allotment 1, section 42, City of Geelong, and situated 2 chains northerly therefrom to a line, being a prolongation of the southern side of Bell-parade and extending from the western boundary of that part of the Western Foreshore so vested in or acquired by the Commissioners easterly to high water mark.

Regulations.

1. In the construction and for the purpose of these Regulations, the following definitions shall apply:—

"The Council" shall mean the Council of the City of Geelong West.

"Vehicle" shall, where the context admits, mean any conveyance drawn or propelled by human or animal power.

"Motor car" shall mean any conveyance propelled by mechanical power, and includes a motor cycle.

2. The Park shall be open to the public at all times free of charge.

3. No person shall enter or remain in the Park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

4. No society, club, picnic party, or other combined body shall use the Park without the consent, in writing, of the Council.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, cut names on fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in or around the Park, or pollute any water therein, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, or manures, or any other property.

6. No person shall place any advertisement, bill, poster, or any other like sign in any part of the Park nor give out or distribute any hand-bills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers in the Park, or shall litter the same by scattering or throwing down hand-bills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers.

7. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, or other property in the Park or commit any nuisance, or leave in the Park any bottles, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter, except in such places as may from time to time be set apart by the Council.

8. No person shall erect in the Park any building, booth, tent, table, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or for the purpose of any game or amusement, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description without the permission, in writing, of the Council and then only subject to the payment of such fees and on such conditions as the Council may determine.

9. No person shall light any fire in the Park or do any act which may cause or be likely to cause damage by fire to anything growing or being therein.

10. No person, except workmen employed in the Park, shall walk upon any flower bed or enter plots therein which may be enclosed or used for plantations for young trees, shrubs, or flowers.

11. No person shall bring into the Park any dog, or allow any dog on any of the lawns in the Park, and all dogs, goats, and poultry found wandering in the Park shall be liable to be destroyed.

12. No person shall put any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals in the Park.

13. The Council shall have full authority and power to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Park and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Park (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

14. No person shall, without the written consent of the Council, engage in any organized game or sport or dancing in the Park on Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.

15. No person shall play any unlawful game, or make any wager for money, or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within the Park, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any keeper or other servant of the Council.

16. No person shall play any musical instrument, preach, deliver any address, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Park without the permission, in writing, of the Council being first obtained.

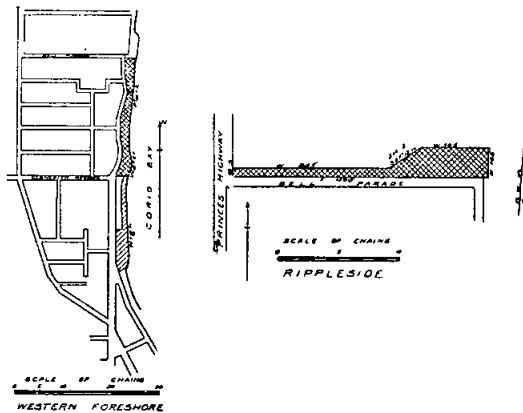
17. No person shall camp in the Park.

18. No person shall throw or cause to be thrown any stone, missile, or any hard substance in the Park, and no person shall play at cricket, hockey, football, golf, rounders, tennis, or any other game in the Park without the consent, in writing, of the Council.

19. No person shall spit or expectorate on the drives, paths, seats, or on any structure or erection in the Park.

20. No person shall drive any vehicle or motor car on any portion of the Park, except on the drives (if any) specially set apart for that purpose.

Every person by wilful act or default offending against this By-law shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
