### DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 21 OF THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1934 (No. 4275).

I, Raymond Henry Beers, Secretary for Labour, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, hereby make and issue the following adjusted Determination of the Wages Board referred to hereunder showing adjusted rates and prices to operate from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in August, 1948.

In the Starch, Starch Products and Cornflour section of the industry—

At any class of work except scraping and wrapping blocks or filling, weighing, labelling and casing starch.

In the Scap and Scap Powders and Scap Extract sections of the industry—

At wrapping or packing washing scap or scap extract.

In the Candles section of the industry—

At packing candles in boxes or wrapping or labelling candles.

In the Polishing Materials section of the industry—

At wrapping, packing, bottling, labelling, tinning or putting up, filling, weighing or closing.
