HIS MAJESTYS GAOL, GEELONG.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Gaols Act* 1928 it is provided that the Governor in Council may by notice in the *Government Gazette* proclaim buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places and premises as public gaols, prisons, houses of correction or penal establishments and may from time to time by like notice revoke any proclamation so made:

And whereas by notice published in the *Government Gazette* of the fifth day of February, 1947, the Governor in Council proclaimed as from and inclusive of such day all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places and premises erected, built, enclosed or maintained upon or within the area set out and described in the Schedule thereunder to be a public gaol, prison, house of correction and penal establishment until the title of "His Majesty's Gaol, Geelong":

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this notice—

1. Revoke the Proclamation published as aforesaid in the *Government Gazette* of the fifth day of February, 1947.

2. Proclaim all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places and premises erected, built, enclosed or maintained upon or within the area set out and described in the Schedule hereunder to be a public gaol, prison, house of correction and penal establishment under the title of "His Majesty's Gaol, Geelong."

SCHEDULE.

Three acres thirty-three perches, more or less, City of Geelong, Parish of Corio, County of Grant: Commencing on the northern side of Little Myers-street at the south-eastern angle of Crown allotment 21, section 14; bounded thence by the eastern boundary of that allotment bearing northerly to Myers-street; by Myers-street bearing easterly to Swanston-street; by Swanston-street bearing southerly to Little Myers-street aforesaid; and thence by the latter street bearing westerly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 21, being the point of commencement.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act* 1946 (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Cranbourne has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street by the said Council within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Cranbourne aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.

Devon-road.

All that piece or parcel of land commencing at a point on a line bearing S. 80 deg. 50 min. E. 1,896 links from the south-western corner of Crown allotment 30, Parish of Sherwood, County of Mornington; thence bounded by lines bearing N. 8 deg. 30 min. E. 5,185.4 links, S. 81 deg. 30 min. E. 100 links, S. 8 deg. 30 min. W. 5,186.6 links, N. 80 deg. 50 min. W. 100 links to the commencing point.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING THE USE OF FISHING
NETS IN LAKE TYERS.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation provide as follows:—

1. Revoke the Proclamations made the twenty-second day of April, 1936, and the fourteenth day of July, 1941, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-ninth day of April, 1936, and the sixteenth day of July, 1941, respectively, regarding conditions governing netting in Lake Tyers.

2. The use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, shall be prohibited in Lake Tyers from the first day of September in each year to the thirty-first day of March in the following year (both days inclusive).

3. The use of nets to be employed in fishing in Lake Tyers between the first day of April and the thirty-first day of August (both days inclusive) in each year shall be restricted as follows:—

No person shall—

- (a) Use a "seine" or "hauling" net exceeding in length 200 fathoms.
- (b) Use "mesh" or "set" nets of a total length of more than 600 fathoms.
- (c) Use at the same time a "seine" or "hauling" net and a "mesh" or "set" net.
- (d) Use any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, between sunrise on Thursday in each week and Four p.m. on the following Friday.

NETTING IN BANCROFT BAY IN THE GIPPSLAND
LAKES.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made the seventeenth day of February, 1931, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of February, 1931, respecting prohibition of netting in Bancroft Bay in the Gippsland Lakes.

BAG LIMIT FOR BREEM TAKEN FROM THE
SYDENHAM INLET AND THE BEMM RIVER.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation provide that no person shall on any one day, during the period from the first day of November in each year to the thirty-first day of August next following (both days inclusive), take from the waters set out hereunder more than ten (10) bream, or have in his possession more than ten (10) such fish taken from the said waters:—

WATERS REFERRED TO.

- (1) The Sydenham Inlet.
- (2) The Bemm River downstream from the falls on such river.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING NETTING
RESTRICTIONS IN TAMBOON INLET.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made the seventh day of August, 1939, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the ninth day of August, 1939, respecting netting restrictions in Tamboon Inlet, and provide as follows:—

1. The use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, shall be prohibited in Tamboon Inlet within an imaginary line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such inlet enter the ocean, from the fifteenth day of October in each year to the thirtieth day of April in the following year (both days inclusive).

2. The use of nets to be employed in fishing between the first day of May in each year and the fourteenth day of October next following (both days inclusive) shall be restricted in the above-mentioned inlet as follows:—

No person shall—

- (a) Use a "seine" or "hauling" net exceeding in length 400 fathoms.
- (b) Use a "mesh" or "set" net of any kind.
- (c) Use any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, between the hours of Ten a.m. on Thursday in each week and Ten a.m. on the following Friday.

PROHIBITION OF ALL FISHING IN OR THE TAKING OF FISH FROM CERTAIN WATERS FROM 1st SEPTEMBER TO 31st OCTOBER (BOTH DAYS INCLUSIVE) IN EACH YEAR.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made the 25th day of March, 1947, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 26th day of March, 1947, respecting prohibition of fishing in certain waters and prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from the following waters at any time during the period from the first day of September to the thirty-first day of October (both days inclusive) in each year:—

Avon River.—Below or downstream from Clydebank Bridge and in Lake Wellington within a quarter of a mile of any portion or point of the mouth of such river.

Bemm River.—Below or downstream from the falls on such river.

Betka River.—The whole.

Brodribb River.—Below or downstream from the Princes Highway Bridge.

Cann River.—Below or downstream from the Princes Highway Bridge.

Genoa River and backwaters thereof.—Below or downstream from the Princes Highway Bridge at Genoa.

Lake Tyers.—The whole, together with Boggy Creek, Ironstone Creek, and Stony Creek, which flow into the said lake.

Latrobe River.—Below or downstream from the Swing Bridge, and in Lake Wellington within a quarter of a mile of any portion or point of the mouth of such river.

Mallacoota Inlet.—The whole of the Top or Upper Lake (including all arms thereof and also that portion known as "The Narrows") within or inside an imaginary line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side of "The Narrows" to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of "The Narrows" enter the Lower or Bottom Lake of Mallacoota Inlet.

Mitchell River.—(a) Below or downstream from the waterworks or pumping station weir, near Bairnsdale, and in Lake King within the area near the mouth of such river in which netting is prohibited by Proclamation made the tenth day of January, 1933, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the eleventh day of January, 1933.

(b) The channel or cut in the left bank of the Mitchell River, near Eagle Point, which joins such river and Jones Bay of Lake King.

(c) Jones Bay, of Lake King, within a radius of a quarter of a mile of the mouth of the channel or cut referred to in paragraph (b) where such cut enters the said bay.

(d) The backwater of the Mitchell River between the Clifton Creek Bridge and the junction of such backwater and the Mitchell River.

McLennan Straits.—The whole of McLennan Straits between Lake Wellington and Lake Victoria, and also in Lakes Wellington and Victoria within a distance of a quarter of a mile of any portion or point where the waters of McLennan Straits join such lakes.

Nicholson River.—Below or downstream, and including the backwater of such river, from the Sarsfield Bridge on the Omeo Highway, and within the area near the mouth of such river in which netting is prohibited by Proclamation made the 19th day of May, 1925, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 27th day of May, 1925.

North Arm (Lakes Entrance).—The whole, including Mississippi Creek.

Perry River.—Below or downstream from Perry River Bridge, on the Bengworden-road, to the junction of such stream and the Avon River.

Salt Creek.—Below or downstream from the bridge on the Princes Highway, and in Lake King within a quarter of a mile of any portion or point of the mouth of such creek.

Snowy River, and all lagoons, lakes, and backwaters connected therewith below or downstream from the Princes Highway Bridge.

Sydenham Inlet.—The whole.

Tambo River.—

(a) Below or downstream from the Tambo River Bridge at Bruthen.

(b) Bridle Creek (a tributary of the Tambo River).

(c) The backwater of the Tambo River at Mossiface.

(d) Within the area near the mouth of such river in which netting is prohibited by Proclamation made the 21st day of October, 1935, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 23rd day of October, 1935.

Tom's Creek.—Below or downstream from the Bengworden-road Bridge, and in Lake Victoria within a quarter of a mile of any portion or point of the mouth of such creek.

Wallagaraugh River and tributaries.—Below or downstream from the New South Wales border.

Wingan Inlet.—The whole, including the Wingan River below or downstream from the falls on such river.

RESTRICTIONS ON FISHING BOATS AND NETS IN THE TOP OR UPPER LAKE OF MALLACOOTA INLET.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 7 of the *Fisheries Act* 1928 (No. 3683) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Proclamations to provide for the more effectual government, management, protection, and improvement of fish and any waters in which fishing may be carried on, and may prescribe any matters or things which are authorized or required to be prescribed or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying the aforementioned Act into effect: And whereas by section 9 of such Act any Proclamation so made may be varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the aforesaid provisions of the *Fisheries Act* 1928, do by this my Proclamation:—

1. Revoke the Proclamation made the thirteenth day of May, 1932, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the eighteenth day of May, 1932, respecting restrictions on fishing boats and nets in the Genoa and Wallagaraugh Rivers at Mallacoota.

2. Prohibit any person from doing any or all of the following things at any time throughout any year in respect of the waters of the Top or Upper Lake (including all arms thereof and that portion known as "The Narrows") of Mallacoota Inlet within or inside an imaginary line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side of "The Narrows" to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of "The Narrows" enter the Lower or Bottom Lake of Mallacoota Inlet:—

(a) Taking a boat with nets on board or attached thereto on to the said waters;

(b) Permitting a net to be on or attached to any boat upon such waters;

(c) Allowing any boat with nets on board to be upon the said waters.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING CONDITIONS
GOVERNING NETTING IN MALLACOOTA INLET.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation provide as follows:—

1. Revoke the Proclamation made the twenty-ninth day of April, 1947, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirtieth day of April, 1947, respecting conditions governing netting in Mallacoota Inlet.

2. Prohibit during the whole of each year the use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, in the whole of the Top or Upper Lake (including all arms thereof and that portion known as "The Narrows") of Mallacoota Inlet within or inside an imaginary line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side of "The Narrows" to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of "The Narrows" enter the Lower or Bottom Lake of Mallacoota Inlet.

3. The use of nets to be employed in fishing during the whole of each year shall be restricted in the Lower or Bottom Lake of Mallacoota Inlet as follows:—

No person shall—

(a) Use a "seine" or "hauling" net exceeding in length 300 fathoms.

(b) Use a "mesh" or "set" net of any kind.

(c) Use a "seine" or "hauling" net in a manner similar to that used for "mesh" or "set" nets. Any "seine" or "hauling" net shall, after having been shot or placed in the water, be continuously hauled from both ends of such net until the haul or "shot" has been completed, i.e., the wings of the net hauled out of operation and the fish in the bunt of the net.

If any such "seine" or "hauling" net during the operation of "shooting" or hauling becomes snagged or fouled so that the haul or "shot" cannot be completed the net shall be immediately lifted and not left set in the water.

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS, by virtue of the powers conferred by the *Town and Country Planning Act 1944* and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Act has been commenced by the Council of the Town of Colac (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority"), which hereby makes the following Interim Development Order:—

4. Any owner of any land who, after the publication of a copy of this Order, contravenes any of the provisions contained herein shall, when directed by notice, in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road, or other works, and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works, and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section (3) of the Act.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the Planning Scheme, in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Acts or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

For all such lands and tenements a rate of Seven pence in the pound of the valuation of such lands and tenements.

Provided that where a rate of Seven pence in the pound of such valuation would amount to less than 10s. the sum of 10s. is fixed as the amount of the rate to be paid in respect of any such lands and tenements.

The valuation of the said lands and tenements for the purpose of such water supply shall in every year be the valuation of such lands and tenements during such year or the previous year by the corporation of the City of Melbourne or the Council of the municipality in whose municipal district such lands or tenements are situated, or (if there be no such valuation) the valuation of such lands and tenements by some police magistrate.

AMENDMENT OF ORDER DECLARING THE GEELONG-BALLAN ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF CORIO, ETC.

THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) and all other powers thereunto enabling, doth by this Order direct that the Order made on the twentieth day of May, 1947, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 4th day of June, 1947, confirming a Resolution of the Country Roads Board, dated the twelfth day of May, 1947, and declaring, *inter alia*, the Geelong-Ballan road in the Shire of Corio to be a main road for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1928*, be amended in the manner following, that is to say:—

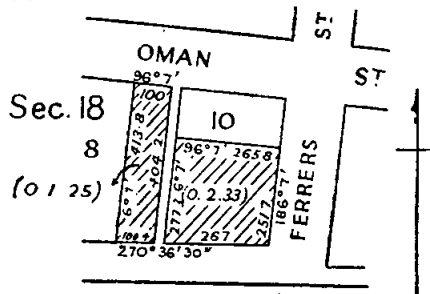

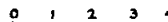

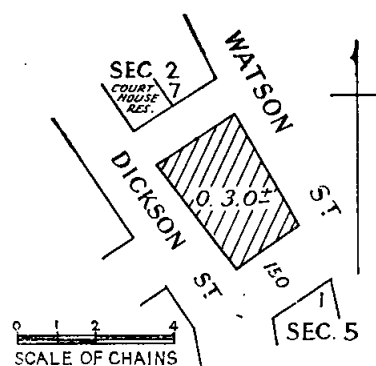

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 535 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. In these Regulations—

“Proper authority” means—

(a) in the case of the alignment of any street or road vested in the Crown or in any authority representing the Crown—the Surveyor-General;

(b) in the case of the alignment of any other street or road—the Commissioner of Titles.

2. Notwithstanding any exemption granted by the Surveyor-General from any provision of the *Survey Co-ordination Act 1940*, notice of intention to commence any survey for the purpose of fixing an alignment under section 535 of the *Local Government Act 1946* shall be given to the Surveyor-General on the form prescribed by Regulations under the *Survey Co-ordination Act 1940*. Upon receipt of such notice, the Surveyor-General shall direct the attention of the proper officer of the council to any survey information known to him which may limit the scope of the necessary survey for the purpose of the alignment.

3. Every standard survey mark established under the aforesaid section shall be established in accordance with the provisions of the Regulations under the *Survey Co-ordination Act 1940*, and notwithstanding that a copy of any plan is provided to the Council, a separate sketch plan showing the position of each standard survey mark shall also be provided to the Surveyor-General in accordance with the Regulations under the *Survey Co-ordination Act 1940*.

4. Every alignment survey shall conform to the appropriate standards of accuracy prescribed for title surveys by Regulations under the *Land Surveyors Act 1942*.

5. Every plan prepared under the aforesaid section shall, as far as possible, conform to a standard size prescribed by Regulations under the *Survey Co-ordination Act 1940*.

6. Every alignment plan prepared under the aforesaid section and these Regulations shall be certified by a licensed surveyor, and show the position of walls, fences, buildings, and other permanent structures along the side of the street in question, and such other information as is, in the opinion of the proper authority, necessary for the fixing of the alignment.

7. Where the Surveyor-General or the Commissioner of Titles, as the case may be, approves of any alignment fixed by a licensed surveyor under the aforesaid section, the plan shall be endorsed “Alignment approved” and signed by the proper authority.

BOROUGH OF BENALLA CONSTITUTED AND SHIRE OF BENALLA REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203) it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council may, from time to time, make Orders amongst other

things to constitute any part of Victoria not exceeding in area nine square miles and having no point in such area distant more than six miles from any other point therein, and containing a population of inhabitant householders not less than five hundred, a borough:

And it is further enacted that every Order constituting any new borough shall assign a name to such borough, describe the boundaries thereof, determine of how many members the council shall consist, determine whether the municipal district constituted is to be subdivided or not, and, in case it is to be subdivided, name and describe the subdivisions:

And it is further enacted that every Order severing any district from any subdivided municipal district may abolish the subdivisions and either constitute the municipal district an unsubdivided municipal district or re-subdivide the same; and as regard every subdivision of which portion only is severed, may cancel such subdivision and annex the residue thereof to some other subdivision, and that every Order under the provisions of Part II. of the said Act shall be published in the *Government Gazette* and shall take effect as from the day specified in the Order in that behalf, or if no day is specified, as from the day of the publication of the Order in the *Government Gazette*:

And whereas a request has been submitted to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Act that a certain area described in such request, being the whole of the Central Riding of the Shire of Benalla, be severed from the Shire of Benalla and constituted a separate municipality under the name and title of the Borough of Benalla; and whereas the proposal set out in such request has been submitted to and carried at a poll of ratepayers entitled to vote in respect of property held in such area:

Now, therefore, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth, by this Order, constitute a borough to be named the Borough of Benalla; and doth order that the boundaries of the said borough, and those of the Shire of Benalla as reduced, and the boundaries of the subdivisions of the said shire be those hereunder set forth and described; and doth further order that the municipal district of the said Borough of Benalla be unsubdivided, that the Council of the said borough consist of nine members, and that this Order take effect as from the first day of September, 1948.

BOROUGH OF BENALLA (CONSTITUTED).

REGULATIONS No. 3.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Authorities Superannuation Act 1947*, the Lieutenant Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Local Authorities Superannuation Regulations No. 3.

(2) In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Act” means the *Local Authorities Superannuation Act 1947*.

“Policy” means an Endowment Insurance Policy effected or deemed to have been effected under sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 5 of the Act.

2. If any permanent employee to whom Part I. of the Act applies ceases to be a permanent employee during the currency of a policy on his life, and if such permanent employee shall—

(a) within one month after his ceasing to be a permanent employee give to the Board notice in writing under his hand that he desires to take over such policy; and

(b) pay to the Board—

(i) such rateable proportion of any premium paid by any authority in respect of such policy as relates to the unexpired balance of the then current period covered by such premium; and

(ii) any moneys due or owing to any authority or the Board in respect of such policy—

the Board shall deliver such policy to such permanent employee. Any moneys received by the Board pursuant to sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (b) of this Regulation and such proportion of any moneys received by the Board pursuant to sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (b) of this Regulation as are due or owing to any authority shall be paid by the Board to the authority concerned.

3. If any permanent employee to whom Part I. of the Act applies shall die during the currency of any policy on his life, the Board shall pay and apply all moneys received by it under such policy in consequence of the death of such permanent employee firstly in the payment to the Board of all moneys due or owing to it in respect of or relating to such policy, or by such permanent employee, secondly in the payment to any authority of such rateable proportion of any premium paid by such authority in respect of such policy as relates to the balance of the then current period covered by such premium which is unexpired at the death of such permanent employee and any other moneys due or owing to any authority in respect of such policy, and thirdly in the payment of the balance (if any) of such moneys then remaining to the legal personal representatives of such permanent employee.

4. (1) If any permanent employee to whom Part I. of the Act applies ceases to be a permanent employee during the currency of a policy on his life, and fails within one month after his ceasing so to be

a permanent employee to give to the Board notice in writing under his hand that he desires to take over such policy, the Board may cancel such policy and the Insurance Company which issued the same shall thereupon pay the surrender value thereof to the Board, whose receipt shall be a sufficient discharge to the Company for the payment of such surrender value and for the release of the Company from any further liability under such policy.

(2) The Board shall apply such surrender value firstly in or towards payment to the Board of any moneys due or owing to it in respect of or relating to such policy, or by such permanent employee, secondly in the payment to any authority of such rateable proportion of any premium paid by such authority in respect of such policy as relates to the balance of the then current period covered by such premium which is unexpired at the time of such permanent employee ceasing to be a permanent employee, and any other moneys due or owing to any authority in respect of such policy, and thirdly in the payment of the balance (if any) then remaining to such permanent employee.

5. The decision of the Board as to what amounts are due to the Board and to any authority shall, for the purposes of these Regulations, be final and conclusive.

6. Any permanent employee to whom Part I. or Part II. of the Act applies and who is a minor may do, execute, suffer and perform for the purposes of the Act, as effectually as if he were of full age, any act, deed or matter which, if he were of full age, he would, under the Act, be required or empowered to do, and in particular, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, he may—

- (a) enter into any contract of insurance;
- (b) assign any policy of insurance to the Board;
- (c) execute acquittances and releases.

7. Any permanent employee to whom sub-section (4) of section 10 of the Act applies may elect to effect insurance in accordance with Part I. of the Act and to discontinue his contributions to the Local Authorities Provident Fund by lodging with the Board a proposal for insurance in accordance with sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 5 of the Act.

8. (1) Whenever a permanent employee to whom Part I. of the Act applies fails, within the time appointed by Regulation 4 of the Local Authorities Superannuation Regulations No. 2, to lodge with the Board either a proposal for insurance for an amount appropriate to his case, or an application in the prescribed form for the acceptance by the Board of a subsisting policy or policies on his life in lieu or partly in lieu of effecting such insurance, the Board may send to him a notice in writing informing him of such failure and notifying him that, if within twenty-one days of the service of such notice he fails to remedy such failure, the Board will, in accordance with the powers given to it by section 25 of the Act, proceed to complete for and on his behalf such form or forms as may be required by any insurance company in accordance with any agreement made between it and the Board, and that upon the Board so doing such permanent employee shall be bound by the terms of such form or forms as if he had duly signed the same himself.

(2) Any such notice in writing may be served by the Board either personally or by putting the same into the post in a pre-paid envelope addressed to the permanent employee in question at his address last known to the Board, and any notice so posted shall conclusively be deemed to have been served on the permanent employee at the expiration of twenty-four hours from the time of posting.
