PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby proclaim that that portion of the Waterworks District of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust comprised within the boundaries of the area described in the Schedule of the Order in Council dated the 13th day of January, 1948, increasing the extent of the Waterworks District of the said Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust, shall be and become an "Urban District" for the purposes of and within the meaning of the said Acts, and shall be known as Picola Urban District.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this seventeenth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, and in the twelfth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.

PROFESSIONAL DIVISION.

Field Geologist, Class "C1," Department of Mines.

Yearly Salary.—£527, minimum; £579, maximum.

Duties.—To perform geological, topographical, and underground surveys.

Qualifications.—To hold a University Degree with Geology as a major subject, or equivalent qualifications; to be competent to carry out surface and underground surveys, and to prepare plans and reports thereon; to have had experience in geological survey work, and to be able to identify rocks, minerals, and fossils.

Assistant (Male), Class "C," Public Library Branch, Department of Chief Secretary.

Yearly Salary.—£449, minimum; £501, maximum.

Duties.—To undertake investigations into the available reference information over a wide field of subjects, as required; to prepare bibliographies; to supervise the work of assistants in this section.

Qualifications.—To possess a University Degree, preferably in Arts or Science, or other special educational qualifications that may be regarded as equivalent to the possession of such a degree, and to have library experience and training qualifying for admission to the Australian Institute of Librarians; to have wide general knowledge and familiarity with library reference material and aids to bibliographical research. Some knowledge of modern languages is desirable.

Assistant (Male or Female), Class "D," Public Library Branch, Department of Chief Secretary.

Yearly Salary.—Male—£286, minimum; £436, maximum.
Female—£286, minimum; £364, maximum.

Duties.—To guide metropolitan and country readers in their choice of reading, prepare reading lists and bibliographies on selected subjects, and catalogues of new accessions for public distribution.

Qualifications.—To have a University Degree, or to have made some progress towards the attainment of such degree; to be eligible by examination or experience for admission to the Australian Institute of Librarians; to have a good general knowledge of books and of contemporary affairs.

Assistant (Male), Class "D," Public Library Branch, Department of Chief Secretary.

Yearly Salary.—£286, minimum; £436, maximum—commencing salary according to experience and qualifications.

Duties.—To classify and index the official and private documentary material in the Library; to inspect and select Government documents in other departments; to have sub-charge of the Victorian Historical Collection; and to undertake researches into matters pertaining to local history.

Qualifications.—To possess a University Degree in Arts; to have a detailed knowledge of Australian history, and some experience in handling Government publications and archival material.

Assistant (Female), Class "E," Public Library Branch, Department of Chief Secretary. (Three vacancies.)

Yearly Salary.—£143, minimum; £260, maximum.

Duties.—To assist generally in the professional work of the Public Library.

Qualifications.—To have passed qualifying examinations for entrance at the University of Melbourne, or to hold the Preliminary Certificate of the Australian Institute of Librarians, and to have had experience in library work.

Applicants will be submitted to a suitable test to prove their qualifications and aptitude for library work.

TECHNICAL AND GENERAL DIVISION.

Field Officer, Department of Agriculture.

Yearly Salary.—£358, minimum; £436, maximum.

Duties.—To assist in the conduct of horticultural experiments, and such other work as may be directed from time to time.

Qualifications.—Diploma of the Dookie Agricultural College, or its equivalent, and preferably some experience in horticulture.

Inspector of Explosives, Explosives Branch, Department of Chief Secretary.

Yearly Salary.—£331, minimum; £409, maximum.

Duties.—To carry out the duties of an Inspector of Explosives, as directed by the Chief Inspector of Explosives.

Qualifications.—To have a good general education and ability to compile reports; to have a good physique, personality, and tact; to be industrious, of sober habits, able to drive a car, and preferably between 25 and 35 years of age. A knowledge of the properties and use of explosives and of the Explosives Act and Regulations would be an advantage.

Inspector, Grade I. (Ouyen), Department of Water Supply.

Yearly Salary.—£357, minimum; £383, maximum.

Duties.—Under direction, to supervise and control maintenance of works, the construction of new works, and the distribution of water in the Ouyen Centre; to direct the work of inspectors (sand drift), overseers, rangers, and repair gangs, and keep all necessary records in connexion with the work; to supervise urban reticulation supplies.

Qualifications.—To be capable of supervising and directing work of overseers and rangers, repair gangs, teams, and mechanical plant, sand-drift prevention and sand removal, and new construction of channels and structures; to have ability to control the distribution and regulation of water through the district, the measurement of sand in channels, and costing of works; to have a knowledge of plumbing and pumping plants.

Assistant Head Attendant, Mental Hospital, Royal Park, Department of Health.

Salary.—£383 a year.

Duties.—To assist Head Attendant in management of Mate Division, and to prepare leave-sheets and other records as directed by the Head Attendant; to act as Head Attendant in his absence.

Qualifications.—Ability to direct and control staff and patients, and to keep records relating thereto; to have had some experience as Acting Head Attendant.

Assistant Preparator, National Museum Branch, Department of Chief Secretary.

Yearly Salary.—Juniors, according to age; adults, £325 minimum, £351 maximum.

Duties.—To assist the Preparators in the collection, preservation, and display of museum specimens.

Qualifications.—To possess an approved Technical School Certificate, or to have attained an equivalent standard of education; also ability to undertake modelling and casting in plaster and plastics.

Electrical Mechanic, Mental Hospital, Ararat, Department of Health.

Yearly Salary.—£357, minimum; £370, maximum.

Duties.—Under the direction of the Engineer, to maintain wiring and electrical equipment, to undertake minor electrical installations, and to assist the Engineer generally.

Qualifications.—To hold "A" Grade Wiring Licence. Possession of a Boiler Attendant's Certificate would be desirable.

Upholsterer, Mental Hospital, Ballarat, Department of Health.

Yearly Salary.—£331, minimum; £344, maximum.

Duties.—To manufacture and repair mattresses and pillows, to repair upholstered furniture, carpets, and other similar articles, as required, at Mental Hospitals, Ballarat and Ararat, and Pleasant Creek Special School, Stawell.

Qualifications.—To have had experience as an upholsterer, and to possess ability to control mental patients.

Inspector, Grade II. (Bendigo Centre), Department of Water Supply.

Yearly Salary.—£305, minimum; £344, maximum.

Duties.—To supervise the work of meter readers, and the repair and testing of water meters of sizes varying from half an inch to 6 inches; to supervise the work of licensed plumbers, as far as the relevant sections of the Coliban By-laws are concerned.

Qualifications.—A good general knowledge of Bendigo, Eaglehawk, and districts within the Coliban Urban, and of the location of water mains in these towns is essential; to be competent to control outdoor staff, and to keep proper records of all meters repaired and tested; to be familiar with the mechanism and parts of the various makes and sizes of meters used in the district.

Attendant, Public Library Branch, Department of Chief Secretary. (Five vacancies.)

Yearly Salary.—Juniors, according to age; adults, £312 minimum, £338 maximum.

Duties.—To perform the general duties of an Attendant in the Public Library, collating and preparing books for the shelves, arranging books on shelves, and obtaining books from the stacks, &c.

Qualifications.—Good appearance and suitability for attending to the public, educated either up to Proficiency Certificate or to the Merit Certificate, with approved library experience.

Senior Water Bailiff (Tongala), Department of Water Supply.

Salary.—£318 a year.

Qualifications.—To be experienced in the regulation and distribution of water required by each bailiff for his section; to possess an intimate knowledge of water requirements for orchards, crops, pastures, and grasses grown under irrigation in the district; to have had experience in channel and drain construction and maintenance.

Ranger (Murtoa Centre), Department of Water Supply.

Yearly Salary.—£279, minimum; £292, maximum.

Duties.—To control and regulate the domestic and stock watering in portion of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, to attend to supervise repairs and maintenance of channels and structures, and to supervise channel cleaning.

Qualifications.—To be capable of regulating the supply of water to block holders, and to have a knowledge of water requirements; a knowledge of channels in the district, and ability to supervise teams engaged on channel sand cleaning, and to measure channels for cleaning.

Water Bailiff (Maffra-Sale), Department of Water Supply.

Yearly Salary.—£279, minimum; £292, maximum.

Qualifications.—Experience in the control and regulation of the supply of water to irrigators, and ability to keep the necessary records and make arithmetical computations in connexion therewith; a knowledge of water requirements for crop and grasses grown under irrigation, the methods of preparation of land for same, and methods of channel and drain construction and maintenance.

Shorthand Writer and Typist (Female), Grade III, Department of Public Works.

Yearly Salary.—£260, minimum; £273, maximum.

Duties.—To undertake shorthand writing duties, and to assist in office work generally.

Qualifications.—To be a competent typist, and to be qualified to take shorthand notes of representations made by deputations, and to transcribe same.

Seamstress, Mental Hospital, Kew, Department of Health.

Yearly Salary.—£220, minimum; £233, maximum.

Duties.—To make up and repair clothing and bedding, and to supervise patients working in the sewing room.

Qualifications.—To be a competent needlewoman and machinist, and to be experienced in the care and management of mental patients.

QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

I, ALEXANDER HENRY DENNETT, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of butter at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for butter as follows:—

The proportion shall be fifty-four point one seven per cent.

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of March, 1948.

CHEESE QUOTA.

I, ALEXANDER HENRY DENNETT, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of cheese at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for cheese as follows:—

The proportion shall be fifty point nought nought per cent.

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of March, 1948.

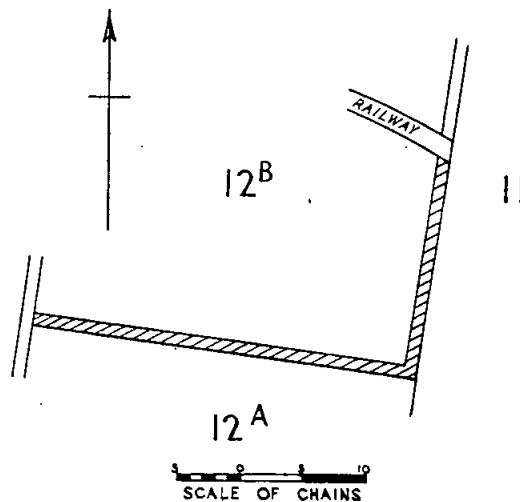

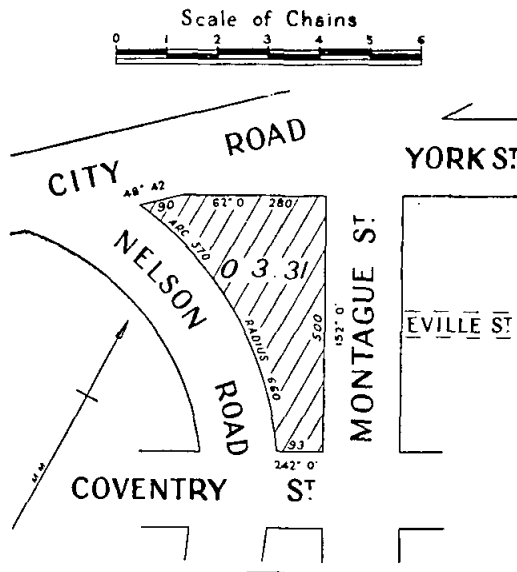

 - (1) gather, pick up, cut, pluck, dig up, remove or have in his possession while in the Reserve, or take away therefrom, any live or dead timber, or any plant life;
 - (2) ring-bark or strip or remove bark from any tree, bush or shrub.
4. No person shall dig or remove soil or other material in or from the Reserve.
5. No person shall remove, displace or damage any fixture or fitting on the Reserve.
6. No person shall put into the Reserve, nor permit to stray thereon, any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals.
7. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer empowered by the Committee in the proper execution of his work and duty.
8. The lighting of fires within the Reserve is strictly prohibited.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "MOSSVALE PARK" RESERVE, PARISHES OF ALLAMBEE EAST AND MARDAN.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of such portions of the permanent reservation for Public purposes along the Tarwin River, in the Parishes of Allambree East and Mardan, as are indicated by red colour on plan marked A/13.8.47 attached to Lands Department correspondence C.90281, and known as the "Mossvale Park" Reserve, hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve," such reservation having been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

REGULATIONS.

1. All persons shall be admitted to the Reserve (but not to any stand or building erected thereon) from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
2. The Committee may appoint days upon which the Reserve or some well defined part thereof may be set apart for the purpose of holding agricultural shows, cricket matches, football matches, croquet matches or tournaments, golf matches or tournaments, sports, fêtes,

aces, or holiday amusements, and on any of the days so set apart the following charges may be made and taken, namely:—

- (a) For the admission of every adult person, motor vehicle, or other vehicle to the Reserve, such sum as the Committee may from time to time determine, not exceeding Five shillings.
 - (b) For the admission of every adult person to the grandstand and enclosure of the Reserve, such additional sum not exceeding Five Shillings, as the Committee may from time to time determine.
3. The Committee may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful games, recreations or sports, and may from time to time grant any person, club, or association, upon such terms and conditions as it may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of the grounds so set apart.
4. Upon application in writing, not less than fourteen days prior to the required date, any club, association, or person, may be granted the exclusive use of the Reserve, or any well defined part thereof, for the holding of any agricultural show, cricket match, football match, croquet match or tournament, tennis match or tournament, golf match or tournament, sports, fête, races, or holiday amusements, and may (subject to the provisions of these Regulations), charge for the admission thereto of adult persons, motor vehicles or other vehicles, and shall, if required, pay to the Committee, or its authorized officer, such charges as the said Committee may from time to time deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, such charges to be paid upon the application being granted. The Committee may, however, refuse any such application.
5. Any person, club, or association renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure in the Reserve may be required to deposit with the Committee or its authorized officer, any sum, not exceeding Twenty pounds, by way of guarantee that due care will be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and the Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage or injury from the sum of money so deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons, clubs, or associations so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee in reference to the Reserve, or any stand, building, erection, or enclosure thereon, and every such person, club, or association shall be responsible that all rubbish, paper, glass, and other debris is removed from the Reserve at the conclusion of such renting or hiring.
6. If any person, club, or association be granted the exclusive use of the Reserve, or any part thereof, for the holding of any agricultural show, match, tournament, sports, fête, races, or holiday amusements under Regulation 5 of these Regulations, then, upon any day set apart for the holding of such agricultural show, match, tournament, sports, fête, races, or holiday amusements, no person shall enter the Reserve (or the portion thereof set apart for the holding of such agricultural show, match, tournament, sports, fête, races, or holiday amusements, as the case may be) without the production of a ticket of admission issued by the Committee or the person, club, or association, having authority to occupy the Reserve, or part thereof, for the time being, but no ticket of admission shall be of avail except on the date or during the period for which the same is issued, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any stand, building, erection, or enclosure within the Reserve unless so specified on the ticket, and every such ticket shall be produced, and, if for one day only, be surrendered on demand to the gatekeeper or other person authorized to collect the same.
7. No person, club, or association shall conduct, assist, or take part in conducting any entertainment in or on the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and then only subject to such conditions and to the payment of such fees as the said Committee may determine.
8. No person shall drive any motor or other vehicle, or ride any bicycle, motor cycle, or horse in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee or its authorized officer.
9. No person shall park any motor vehicle on the Reserve except at such place or places set apart for that purpose by the Committee.
10. No person shall damage in any way any tree, plant, shrub, flower, fence, gate, seat, building, stand or structure, or any turf, croquet green, bowling green, or tennis court in the Reserve, or jump or climb upon or over, or stick bills upon any of the buildings, fences, or gates on the Reserve, or leave or deposit any rubbish, paper, glass, or other debris in the Reserve, or roll or throw any stone or missile of any kind therein.
11. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, or fitting for the exhibition of any Regulations, or notice fixed or set up by the Committee in the Reserve.
12. No person shall erect on the Reserve any building, booth, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
13. No person shall put or bring into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or train or exercise any horse in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
14. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
15. No person shall light any fire in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
16. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord.
17. No person shall camp in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
18. No person shall, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, erect in the Reserve any post, rail, fence, pole, tent, stand, building, or structure.
19. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any part therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
20. No person shall spit or expectorate or commit any nuisance on the paths or in or on any stand, structure, or erection in the Reserve.
21. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or occupation of a bookmaker in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee or its authorized officer first obtained, and then only in such portion or portions thereof as may be set apart for that purpose.
22. No person shall carry or discharge firearms in the Reserve, or snare or destroy any wildfowl therein.
23. No person shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, do or perform any of the following acts in or on the Reserve:—
- (a) Dig up, displace, or interfere with any soil, loam, gravel, or material.
 - (b) Gather, pick up, cut, pluck, dig up, remove, or have in his possession while in the Reserve, or take away therefrom any part of any tree, bush, shrub, flower, grass, ferns, or any other vegetation.
 - (c) Ring-bark, or strip, or remove bark from any tree, bush, or shrub.
24. No person shall remove any soil, loam, gravel, or material from the Reserve.
25. No person shall bathe from the Reserve without permission of the Committee first obtained.
26. Any person committing any of the following offences within the Reserve shall (in addition to any other penalty to which such person may be liable therefor) be liable to be ejected from the Reserve, namely—
- (a) Being drunk.
 - (b) Using profane, abusive, insulting, threatening, indecent, or obscene language.
 - (c) Assaulting any person or behaving in a riotous or disorderly manner.
 - (d) Wilfully interfering with or disturbing any lawful entertainment, performance, game, race, sports, amusement, match, or tournament, to the annoyance, detriment, or discomfort of any person or persons engaged or taking part in any such entertainment, performance, game, race, sports, amusements, match, or tournament.
 - (e) Obtaining admission to or being found in any part of the Reserve when not entitled to admission thereto under these Regulations.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

BY-LAW No. 80.

A By-law, made under the provisions of the *Health Act* 1928, repealing By-law No. 33 of the City of Caulfield, and making a new By-law for the purpose of regulating or prohibiting the keeping of any place or of any animals, including birds, in the opinion of the Council offensive or injurious to health, or dangerous.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act* 1928 and of all other powers thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Caulfield, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Caulfield, makes and orders the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. By-law No. 33 is hereby repealed, as from the date of the coming into operation of this By-law.

2. In this By-law, unless the context or subject-matter otherwise indicates—

“Dwelling” means any building, or portion of a building, which is used or intended, adapted, or designed for living purposes, and includes a detached sleep-out or tent;

“Property” includes any tenement or land in separate occupation;

Words importing the masculine gender include the feminine, and words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular, and words relating to persons include corporations.

3. No person shall keep or permit or allow to be kept on any property any fowls, ducks, or geese—

(a) within a distance of 75 feet from the boundary of the street or road to which such property has a frontage; or

(b) within a distance of 10 feet from any other street or road of a greater width than 25 feet; or

(c) within a distance of 40 feet of any dwelling, whether on such property or not.

4. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such breach, and to a penalty not exceeding £5, or less than 20s., for each day during which such breach shall be continued by such person.

5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Caulfield.

CITY OF HEIDELBERG.

BY-LAW No. 165.

Regulating the Collection, Removal, and Disposal of Household Refuse.

A By-law of the City of Heidelberg, made under the provisions of the *Health Act* 1928 and any other enabling powers, and numbered 165, for regulating the collection, removal, and disposal of household refuse.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* and any other enabling powers, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Heidelberg, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. That all former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, be hereby repealed.

2. That this By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. That this By-law shall apply to and have operation in the City of Heidelberg, and unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every house, building, and premises therein.

4. That in this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter, “Proprietor” means the proprietor of any premises and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof. “Refuse” includes all wastes (except sewage and manure) of a domestic nature produced, accumulated in or about any house, building or premises.

5. That the proprietor of every house, building, or premises shall provide, keep, and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building, or premises.

6. That such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge, or other approved material, in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 3.5 cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man. It shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side lifting handles. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close fitting lid with flange overlapping the top of such receptacle to make it fly and rat proof, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom). No person shall place or cause to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been effectually drained and placed in an adequate amount of waste paper. The proprietor shall keep such receptacle in good order and wholesome condition.

7. That the proprietor shall cause at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse, such receptacle to be deposited close to and inside the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way except in the case of business premises built on the street alignment where such premises do not abut on a suitable right-of-way or land, on which such receptacle could be placed for collection or emptying.

On Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, from 7.30 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Abattoirs and slaughter yards shall not be open on Sundays, Good Friday, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Foundation Day, Easter Monday, or such other public holidays as may from time to time be determined by the Council.
