PROCLAMATION

COUNTRY ROADS (FOREST ROADS AND STOCK ROUTES) ACT 1943 (No. 4953).

PROCLAMATION OF FOREST ROAD

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 (1) of the *Country Roads (Forest Roads and Stock Routes) Act 1943* it is provided that the Governor in Council may on the recommendation of the Country Roads Board made after consultation with the Minister of Forests and the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey, and on the recommendation of the Commissioner of Public Works, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim any road, or any part of any road, to be a Forest road for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas the Country Roads Board (after consultation with the Minister of Forests and the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey) and the Commissioner of Public Works, have recommended that the road described in the Schedule hereunder be so proclaimed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim the said road to be a Forest road for the purpose of the said Act.

SCHEDULE. (No. 1)

Shires of Narracan, Mansfield, and Upper Yarra.

Walhalla road.—Commencing at the southern angle of allotment 10, section D, Parish of Tanjil; thence generally north-easterly through that parish and the Parish of

Tanjil East to and across the bridge over the Tyers River near the north-western angle of allotment 1A, section B, of the parish last named; thence north-easterly, generally north-westerly, north-easterly, and easterly through the Township of Gould (Survey Plan 2536) to the north-eastern angle of allotment 22H, section B, Parish of Tanjil East; thence north-easterly and generally northerly to a point on the southern boundary of allotment 11A of the section last named distant 30 links from the south-eastern angle thereof; thence generally north-easterly through the allotment last named and north-westerly through allotments 13 and 13, section C, Parish of Moondarra, to the eastern boundary of the allotment last named (Survey Plan 2537); thence north-westerly to a point on the south-western boundary of allotment 14, section C, distant 345 links from the southern angle of allotment 14A of the said section; thence north-westerly and north-easterly through the said allotments 14 and 14A, and north-easterly and north-westerly through allotment A3, section C, to the north-eastern angle of allotment 12B of the section last named (Survey Plan 1654); thence north-westerly to and through allotment 12, and north-westerly and generally northerly through allotments A1, 8, and 8F, all of section C, to a point on the northern boundary of the allotment last named distant 598.6 links from the north-eastern angle thereof (Survey Plans 1654 and 832); thence northerly, north-westerly, and generally north-easterly to a point on the south-western boundary of allotment 4B, section B, Parish of Moondarra, distant 885.7 links from the southern angle of that allotment; thence north-easterly through the allotment last named and allotment 4A, section B, to the eastern boundary of the said allotment 4A (Survey Plans 833 and 1959); thence north-westerly crossing the railway line near the Erica Railway Station to the western boundary of allotment 4, section B, Parish of Moondarra; thence generally north-easterly through that allotment and allotments 5, 5c, 6, and 7, section B, north-easterly and south-easterly through a recreation reserve, and south-easterly, south-westerly, and south-easterly through allotment 11A of the said section to a point on the southern boundary of that allotment distant 363.8 links from the south-western angle thereof (Survey Plan 2032); thence south-easterly and north-easterly to a point on the southern boundary of allotment 10, section B, distant 164 links from the south-western angle of the allotment last named; thence north-easterly and north-westerly through that allotment, north-westerly and south-easterly through allotment 11B, section B, and south-easterly, south-westerly, and south-easterly through the said allotment 10 to the southern boundary of the allotment last named; thence south-easterly, generally easterly and north-easterly to and across the bridge over the Thomson River near the confluence of the said river and Stringers Creek; thence north-easterly and generally northerly through the Parish of Walhalla, and including the Country Roads Board road deviations through allotments 17A, 18A, 18, and 19, Township of Walhalla (Survey Plans 999 and 4656) to the northern boundary of the parish last named; thence generally northerly and north-westerly through the Parish of Wurutwun, across the bridge over the Aberfeldy River, and through the Parish of Telbit to the northern boundary of the parish last named; thence generally north-westerly and northerly along the boundary between the Parishes of Baw Baw and Wurutwun to the southern boundary of the Parish of Toombon; thence north-westerly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 4B of the parish last named; thence generally north-westerly to the Township of Aberfeldy; thence generally north-westerly, north-easterly, and north-westerly, via the Country Roads Board deviation of the old mining track along the spur dividing the Jordan River and the Aberfeldy River catchments to the Great Dividing Range; thence generally north-westerly, south-westerly, and westerly via the Country Roads Board deviation of the old mining track along the Great Dividing Range to its junction with the Woods Point and Mansfield-Woods Point roads in the Town of Matlock, Parish of Matlock.

CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS TO BE OBSERVED
BY PERSONS DEALING IN SKINS OF KANGAROOS,
WALLABIES OR WATER RATS.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation:—

(a) Revoke the Proclamation made the 25th day of June, 1940 and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 26th day of June, 1940 respecting the conditions and restrictions to be observed by persons dealing in skins of water rats.

(b) Revoke the Proclamation made the 29th day of April, 1942 and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 6th day of May, 1942 respecting conditions and restrictions to be observed by persons dealing in skins of kangaroos, wallabies and/or water rats.

(c) Prescribe the following conditions to be observed by all persons engaged in buying, selling, consigning, marketing, or storing the skins of kangaroos, wallabies and/or water rats whether taken or killed or destroyed in Victoria or elsewhere:—

(1) In this Proclamation (if not inconsistent with the context) "official mark" means the official mark referred to or mentioned, as being affixed to or branded on any kangaroo, wallaby and/or water rat skin.

(2) Every such person shall keep in a suitable book a true and faithful record showing in respect of all skins of kangaroo, wallaby and/or water rat bought, sold, consigned, marketed or stored by him, the names and addresses of the persons from whom such skins were obtained, or to whom they were consigned, sold, or otherwise disposed of, with the dates of the respective transactions, and the numbers and kinds of skins in each case; such book shall be open for inspection at all reasonable times during business hours by the Inspector of Fisheries or any assistant to the said Inspector, or any member of the Police Force. All such records shall be kept in a strongly bound book with consecutively numbered pages, and such book shall be used for no other purpose than for keeping the aforesaid records. The Inspector of Fisheries or any officer authorized in writing by him may take possession of all or any of such records for purposes of inspection and checking.

(3) Every such person shall, on the fifteenth and last days of each month, forward to the Inspector of Fisheries a true and correct statement, in writing, setting out the number of skins of kangaroo, wallaby and/or water rat which he has in his possession on the said day, the number purchased and sold since the previous return and the names and addresses of the persons from whom such skins were bought or to whom they were sold respectively.

(4) Any person consigning kangaroo, wallaby and/or water rat skins to a place outside Victoria shall, at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to the date on which it is proposed that such skins shall leave Victoria, give to the Inspector of Fisheries, in writing, full particulars of the skins proposed to be so consigned, the number of bales or packages in the consignment, the identification marks on such bales or packages, the name of the ship (if any) by which such skins will be carried, and the name and address of the consignee. At the same time the exporter or consignor or his authorized agent shall produce to the Inspector of Fisheries all invoices or other documents relating to the purchase of the said skins.

(5) No person shall sell, consign, market, or store the skins of kangaroo, wallaby and/or water rat, unless such skins have first had the official mark affixed thereto by the Inspector of Fisheries or any officer authorized by him.

(6) No person other than the Inspector of Fisheries, or any officer authorized by him, shall perforate or otherwise stamp or mark the skin of any kangaroo, wallaby and/or water rat in such a way, as to suggest, that the official mark has been affixed thereto.

(7) No person shall permit or allow the skin of any kangaroo, wallaby and/or water rat which has come into his possession, to be taken away or removed out of such possession until the official mark has been affixed thereto.

(8) No person shall cure, treat, tan, or preserve, or prepare for tanning or preservation by any method whatsoever the skin of any kangaroo, wallaby and/or water rat or place any preserving substance thereon, until the official mark shall have been affixed to such skin.

(9) Every person shall, upon receiving into his possession any unmarked or unstamped skins of kangaroos, wallabies and/or water rats submit the same to the Inspector of Fisheries within three days of such receipt who, on being satisfied that the same have been lawfully obtained, shall make his official mark on each such skin.

(10) Any person committing a breach of any part of this Proclamation shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than two pounds (£2) nor more than twenty pounds (£20).

Police Regulation Act 1946.
POLICE FORCE OF VICTORIA.

DETERMINATION (No. 12) OF THE POLICE CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

THE Police Classification Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Police Regulation Act 1946*, hereby makes the following Determination, that is to say:—

Sick Leave.

1. Subject to this Determination, the Chief Commissioner of Police may, in cases of illness, grant leave of absence to every member of the Police Force.

2. In the case of illness of a member of the Police Force, the conditions under which the Chief Commissioner of Police may grant leave of absence shall be as set out hereunder.

3. (a) In the case of members joining the Police Force on or subsequent to the 1st day of June, 1948, the basis for determining the amount which may be granted, when sick leave with pay is approved, shall be ascertained by crediting the member of the Police Force with the following periods, such sick leave to be cumulative:—

	Leave on full pay.
On admission to the Police Force	15 days.
On completion of one year, and each year's service thereafter	12 days.

(b) In the case of members who were in the Police Force prior to the 1st day of June, 1948, the basis for determining the amount which may be granted, when sick leave with pay is approved shall be ascertained by crediting the member with any sick leave standing to his credit which has accumulated under the provisions of any other regulations prior to the commencement of this Determination, and by the addition of twelve days per annum on the subsequent anniversary dates of the member's appointment. Provided, however, that any accumulation of half pay sick leave standing to the credit of such members of the Police Force under any regulations prior to this Determination, shall be divided by two, and the resultant number shall be credited as full days and then applied in accordance with this Determination.

4. Where the Chief Commissioner of Police is satisfied that the illness of a member of the Police Force is directly attributable to or is aggravated by his service in the war which commenced in the year One thousand nine hundred and fourteen or in the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, apart from any sick leave which may be standing to his credit, he may be granted special sick leave with full pay up to but not exceeding eight days in the aggregate during any year of service. Such special sick leave shall be cumulative provided that the total of accumulated leave under this provision standing to the credit of the member shall not at any time exceed sixty days.

5. To determine the sick leave for which a member of the Police Force is eligible at any time, all sick leave granted at full pay during his service after the coming into operation of this Determination shall be deducted from the appropriate period ascertained under the provisions of the preceding paragraphs.

6. After deduction has been made as provided in the preceding paragraphs, the period remaining shall be the amount of leave for which a member of the Police Force is eligible.

7. Notwithstanding the amount of sick leave standing to the credit of any member of the Police Force, continuous sick leave with pay shall not be granted for any period longer than fifty-two weeks. Where a member of the Police Force has had fifty-two weeks continuous sick leave with full pay, no further leave with full pay shall be granted until such member of the Police Force has completed a period of duty of not less than four weeks.

8. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph seven, if a member of the Police Force sustains bodily injury in the discharge of his duty or whilst on a journey necessary to enable him to report for duty or to return home after duty or contracts illness directly attributable to his duty of such a nature as to incapacitate him from duty, and the Chief Commissioner of Police is satisfied that such injury or illness was not contributed to by such member's negligence or misconduct, the Chief Secretary may, upon the recommendation of the Chief Commissioner of Police, approve of such injury or illness as "on duty," whereupon such member of the Police Force shall be granted sick leave on full pay during such incapacity until he has recovered or been dealt with under the provisions of Part 3, Division 2, of the *Police Regulation Act 1928*, and such leave granted under this clause shall not be regarded as a debit against the amount of sick leave standing to his credit.

9. Any member of the Police Force claiming to have sustained injury or contracted illness directly attributable to his duty must furnish a report for the information of the Chief Commissioner of Police, setting out in detail the circumstances of such injury or illness, together with the names of any witnesses of the occurrence or any other evidence. Such report must be furnished as soon as practicable by the member concerned or by some other member of the Police Force to whom the circumstances are known or reported. When such claim is approved by the Chief Secretary on the recommendation of the Chief Commissioner of Police, the member of the Police Force concerned shall, in addition to full pay, receive medical attention and treatment at a hospital approved by the Chief Commissioner of Police.

10. For each week a member of the Police Force is absent on sick leave with full pay, the amount of sick leave standing to his credit shall be reduced by five days.

11. When the period of sick leave granted to a member of the Police Force with pay does not extend to a week, his appropriate credit shall be reduced by the number of days he would have been required to be on duty if he had not been absent on sick leave.

12. For the purpose of sick leave under this Determination, a week shall be deemed to be any period of seven consecutive days, inclusive of a Sunday.

13. For a period exceeding two days' absence, a member of the Police Force must forward a satisfactory certificate for a period not exceeding seven days, by a duly qualified medical practitioner, setting out the cause of such absence. Any extension of such leave may be granted subject to the receipt of a further satisfactory medical certificate, provided further that the Chief Commissioner of Police may require a medical certificate to be forwarded with respect to any period of absence.

14. Where the number of days during which a member of the Police Force is absent through illness in any year without a medical certificate exceeds five days in the aggregate, the number of days in excess of five shall not be granted as sick leave, but shall be deducted from his annual recreation leave, or be granted without pay.

15. If any member of the Police Force is certified by the Police Medical Officer or by some other duly qualified medical practitioner approved by the Chief Commissioner of Police to be suffering from pulmonary tuberculosis and to be probably curable, twelve months' sick leave of absence may be granted on full pay, provided that such sick leave may be made conditional on the member of the Police Force undergoing treatment in a specified sanatorium when so recommended by the Police Medical Officer or other duly qualified medical practitioner approved by the Chief Commissioner of Police. Any leave so granted in excess of the amount standing to his credit shall not be regarded as a debit against the member. Where any member of the Police Force who has received sick leave of absence as aforesaid is not so far recovered as in the opinion of the Police Medical Officer or other approved duly qualified medical practitioner to be able to resume his duties, and the Police Medical Officer or other approved medical practitioner is of the opinion that the member should receive further treatment and is probably curable, such member may be granted such further leave on such terms and conditions as the Chief Secretary may determine.

16. Where the Chief Commissioner of Police has reason to believe that a member of the Police Force is in such a state of health as to render him a danger to his fellow members, he may require such member to furnish a report as to his condition from a duly qualified medical practitioner, or may require him to submit himself for examination to the Police Medical Officer.

17. Upon receipt of a medical report, the Chief Commissioner of Police may direct the member of the Police Force to absent himself from his duties for a specified period, or if already on leave of absence, to continue on leave for a specified period, and any such absence shall be regarded as sick leave.

18. Any member of the Police Force who contracts an infectious or contagious disease shall report the matter to the Chief Commissioner of Police without delay, whereupon he shall be granted the usual terms of sick leave, provided that if so instructed by the Chief Commissioner of Police, he presents himself when directed for medical treatment. Where a member of the Police Force contracts an infectious or contagious disease and fails to report the fact as provided, he shall not be entitled to sick leave with pay under the provisions of this Determination.

19. Any member of the Police Force who is ill may on application attend the police hospital for medical examination, and male members of the Police Force may receive treatment subject to payment of the fees as fixed by the Governor in Council.

20. The Chief Commissioner of Police may order any member of the Police Force to attend at the police hospital for medical examination, and where such member so attends under the order of the Chief Commissioner of Police, such medical examination shall be free of charge.

21. The provisions of this Determination shall be read and construed so as not to deprive any member of the Police Force of any pension or benefit to which he is entitled under the provisions of the Police Regulation Acts.

22. Any member of the Police Force who is ill and unfit for duty shall notify the Officer in Charge of the police station to which he is attached of his inability to attend for duty and the nature of his ailment. Such notification shall, where practicable, be made half an hour before the time fixed for the commencement of such member's duty.

23. Any member of the Police Force who is the Officer in Charge of a police station and who is ill and unfit for duty shall report the fact as soon as practicable to the Officer in Charge of the Police District or Division to which he is attached.

24. Where a member of the Police Force is continuously absent from duty on account of illness beyond a period of thirteen weeks, he shall not be permitted to resume duty until the Police Medical Officer or some other duly qualified medical practitioner approved by the Chief Commissioner of Police has certified that he is fit to resume duty.

25. The Chief Commissioner of Police may approve of sick leave for a period not exceeding twenty-eight days being granted on the recommendation of the Police Medical Officer or other duly qualified medical practitioner approved by the Chief Commissioner of Police.

26. Where a member of the Police Force is absent on account of sickness, injury, or disability which is proved to be simulated, or such absence arises from improper or vicious conduct or excessive indulgence in alcohol or improper or illegal practice, he shall not be entitled to sick leave with pay under the provisions of this Determination.

27. Where the Chief Commissioner of Police has doubts as to the cause of illness or the reason for absence he may, before accepting a medical certificate, refer such certificate to the Police Medical Officer for report, or order the member concerned to attend the Police Medical Officer for examination.

28. Any member of the Police Force who is able and fails to attend the Police Medical Officer when so instructed by the Chief Commissioner of Police shall not be entitled to sick leave with pay under the provisions of this Determination.

29. The Chief Commissioner of Police, notwithstanding anything in this Determination, where he is of the opinion that any member of the Police Force is unfit through his mental or physical condition to continue in the Police Force, may direct that such member be examined by the Police Medical Board.

30. For the purpose of sick leave under this Determination, "Service" means continuous service, inclusive of any period of absence on leave, provided that in determining at any time the amount of sick leave standing to the credit of a member of the Police Force who has been absent on leave without pay (other than for the purpose of service with any Naval, Air, or Military expeditionary force, or the Commonwealth Defence Force) continuously for a period extending beyond six months, such period as is in excess of six months shall not be counted as service.

31. This Determination shall be deemed to have come into operation from the 1st day of June, 1948.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1948.

DENTAL MECHANIC TRADE REGULATIONS (No. 1).

WHEREAS by section 39 of the *Apprenticeship Act 1928* (No. 3636) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for or with respect to providing for any matters which are or may be the subject of draft Regulations submitted by the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria: And whereas the said Commission has prepared and submitted to His Excellency the Governor in Council draft Regulations for or with respect to the matters hereinafter set out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

SHORT TITLE.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Dental Mechanic Trade Regulations (No. 1).

INTERPRETATION.

2. In these Regulations—

"Acts" mean the Apprenticeship Acts.

"Applicant" means an applicant for apprenticeship employed on probation.

"Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.

"Registrar" means the Registrar of Apprenticeship.

"Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commission.

APPLICATION OF REGULATIONS.

3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the following apprenticeship trade, viz.:—

Dental Mechanic.

APPLICANTS FOR APPRENTICESHIP TO APPLY FOR CERTIFICATE.

4. Applications by persons desiring to become apprentices in the said trade shall be in the form contained in the Third Schedule to General Regulations (No. 1) made under the Acts.

APPLICANTS MAY BE EXAMINED.

5. Applicants for apprenticeship in the said trade may be required to submit themselves for examination at the time and place determined by the Commission to prove that they possess the preparatory educational qualifications required for entry into apprenticeship in such trade: Provided that any such applicant shall be exempted from such examination—

(a) If he possesses any one of the following educational qualifications, or, in the opinion of the Commission, the equivalent thereof:—

(i) The Intermediate Technical or Junior Technical Certificate of the Education Department of Victoria, the School Intermediate Certificate, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.

(ii) The satisfactory completion, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission, of a three years' course of study in a Junior Technical School, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.

(b) If he satisfies the Commission, in accordance with sub-section (2) of section 18 of the Act, that he has not had sufficient opportunity to obtain the preparatory educational qualifications prescribed for entry into the said trade.

MINIMUM AGE FOR ENTRY INTO APPRENTICESHIP.

6. The minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trade as apprentices, or applicants for apprenticeship, shall be fifteen years.

TERM OF APPRENTICESHIP.

7. The term of apprenticeship in the said trade shall be five years.

FORM OF INDENTURES OF APPRENTICESHIP.—GENERAL FORM.

8. The standard form of indentures of apprenticeship in the said trade, and the terms, covenants, and conditions thereof, shall be in the form contained in the Second Schedule to General Regulations (No. 2) made under the Acts, with the following additions thereto:—

Additional Covenants, &c., to General Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.
Employers' Covenants.

At the end of paragraph (c) (i) add the following proviso:—

Provided that where he is temporarily unable to provide such work as will keep the apprentice fully employed during any ordinary working week or month he may, with the approval of the Commission, employ the apprentice for such less time in any such week or month as may, on the application of such employer, be determined by the said Commission, at wages proportionate to those which he is required, under the provisions of this paragraph, to pay to the apprentice when employed during the whole of any ordinary working week or month—

- (c) (iii) Make no deduction from the wages of the apprentice in respect of any time lost by reason of compulsory attendance at classes for instruction in subjects of the apprenticeship course.
- (c) (iv) In the event of the employer being unable, owing to lack of orders or through financial difficulties, to find employment and training for the apprentice, or to arrange for the transfer of the apprentice to another employer as provided for under the Acts, the Commission may, on application made in that behalf by the employer, and after satisfying itself that the circumstances justify such action, arrange for the suspension of the indentures for such period as it determines, or for the cancellation of the indentures.
- (f) Not hold the apprentice responsible for any damage or injury done to materials, machinery, tools, or plant, other than wilful damage or damage due to carelessness.
- (g) Not require the apprentice to work on any holiday, without his consent.
- (h) Not require the apprentice, while under the age of eighteen years, to work overtime or shift work, unless he so desires.
- (i) Not require the apprentice, except in an emergency, to work overtime or shift work at times which would prevent his attendance at technical school, as required by the Regulations.
- (j) Provide the apprentice with all tools necessary for carrying out his work.

Apprentice and Parent or Guardian's Covenants.

(c) At all times while in the employment of the employer conduct himself in a courteous, obedient, and proper manner.

Mutual Agreements.

(3) At the end of paragraph (3) add the following provisos:—

Provided further—

- (i) that where the apprentice is required, under the provisions of the proviso to paragraph (c) (i) hereof, to work for less time than full time in any ordinary working week or month; or
- (ii) that where the indentures of any apprentice are suspended for any period by the Commission,

the total period of time not served by the apprentice by reason of either of the above-mentioned provisions shall, at the option of the apprentice, be included in the term of his apprenticeship or be added to the term of his apprenticeship. In the event of such period being added to the term of his apprenticeship, the apprentice shall be paid for such period at the wages rates prescribed in respect of the last year of his apprenticeship.

(10) That the apprentice shall be paid the same allowances as are from time to time required to be paid by the employer to journeymen in the same trade for meal money, fares, travelling time, country work, and other matters, or, where such allowances are proportionate to the rates of pay received by journeymen, the apprentice shall be paid only such proportion thereof as the rates of pay of the apprentice bear to

such journeymen's minimum rates of pay prescribed by any competent industrial authority, or in any industrial agreement made pursuant to the Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1904-1947.

(11) That the apprentice will replace any of the tools supplied for his use as hereinbefore provided if lost or broken through his own carelessness.

RATES OF PAY OF APPRENTICES.

9. The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in the said trades in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows:—

- 1st year—at the rate of 30s. 6d. per week.
- 2nd year—at the rate of 40s. 6d. per week.
- 3rd year—at the rate of 55s. 6d. per week.
- 4th year—at the rate of 81s. per week.
- 5th year—at the rate of 121s. 6d. per week.

RATES FOR OVERTIME WORKED.

10. Where overtime (i.e., work done on Sundays and public holidays, or outside ordinary working hours) is worked, the apprentice shall be paid by the employer wages for such overtime at the rate of time and a half, double time, or at such other rates (as the case may be) as the employer may for the time being be obliged to pay any journeymen who may be employed by him in the same trade, provided that the rate shall not be less than 1s. 6d. per hour.

PROPORTION OF APPRENTICES TO JOURNEYMEN.

11. The number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the said trade shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to every three journeymen, or fraction of three journeymen, employed by such employer in such trade.

For the purposes of this Regulation, an employer working at the trade shall be deemed to be a journeyman, and the number of journeymen, employed at any time, shall be deemed to be the average per working day of the number of journeymen employed in the said trade by such employer during the period of six months immediately preceding such time.

TRADE EXPERIENCE REQUIRED OF AN APPRENTICE.

12. The trade experience to be obtained by an apprentice in his apprenticeship course shall include gradual and complete instruction to the satisfaction of the Commission in the following processes:—

The manufacture and/or repair of dentures and other appliances fitted to the human mouth, and all things incidental thereto.

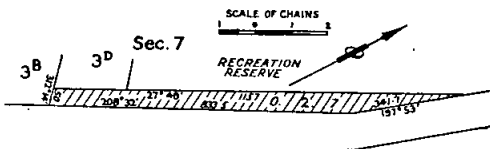

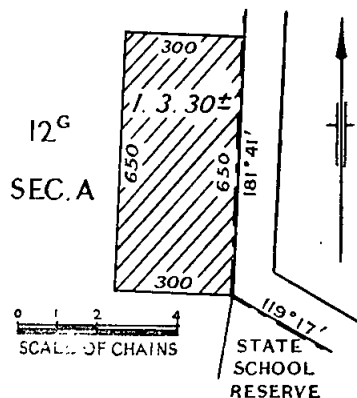

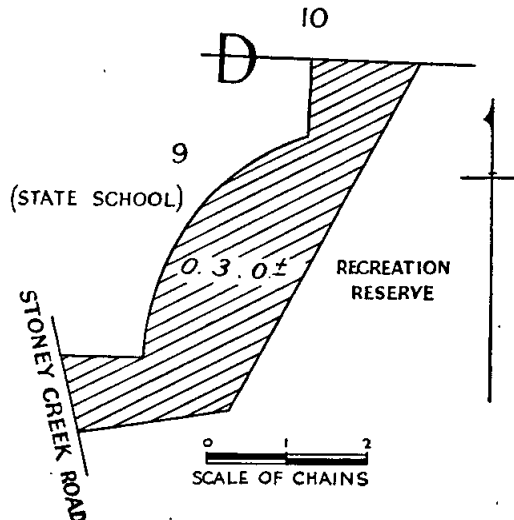

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS, by virtue of the powers conferred by the *Town and Country Planning Act 1944* and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Act has been commenced by the Council of the City of Chelsea (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority"), which hereby makes the following Interim Development Order:—

1. The development of all land referred to in the Schedule and the erection, construction, and carrying out of any buildings, roads, or other works on any of the said land is hereby prohibited.

2. Any person may apply to the Responsible Authority for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works, during the operation of this Order.

3. Any application for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any building, roads, or other works may be granted by the Responsible Authority, subject to such conditions as are specified in the permit, or may be refused.

4. Any owner of any land who, after the service of a copy of this Order contravenes any of the provisions contained therein, shall, when directed by notice in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road, or other works, and if the owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works, and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier, in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section (3), of the Act.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the Planning Scheme, in accordance with the *Town and Country Planning Act 1944*, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

7.
