PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 8 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

WHEREAS by paragraph (c) of section 40 of the Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1928 it is provided that Part II. of the said Act shall have effect as regards any municipal district outside any milk area on such date as such district is proclaimed by the Governor in Council to be subject to the provisions of Part II. of the said Act: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof do by this my Proclamation declare the municipal district of the Shire of Numurkah to be subject to the provisions of Part II. of the aforesaid Act on and from the first day of January, 1949, on which date Part II. of the said Act and all Regulations and Orders now in force or which may from time to time be made under Part II. of the said Act shall come into operation and be of full force and effect in such municipal district.

Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947 (No. 5258). AMENDING PROCLAMATION DECLARING A PROCLAIMED AREA.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c.,

WHEREAS by the Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may amend any proclamation made in accordance with the provisions of section 3 of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation amend the Proclamation made on the 13th January, 1948, as follows:—

In paragraph (a), by deleting the words "Shires of Orbost and Tambo" and substituting in lieu thereof the words "Shire of Orbost (with the exception of the Parish of Tildesley West), and the Parish of Suggan Buggan in the Shire of Tambo."

By deleting paragraph (b) and substituting in lieu thereof the following paragraph:—

"(b) Require the occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to-

(1) Thoroughly spray all the following fruit and/or vegetables growing upon the said land with a solution of 0.1 per cent. dichloro-diphenyl-trichloroethane (DDT) immediately the fruit

has set, and thereafter at intervals not exceedhas set, and thereafter at intervals not exceeding twenty-one (21) days until such fruit and/or vegetables have been harvested:—Apples, apricots, cherries, citrus fruits, figs, gooseberries, guavas, loquats, medlars, nectarines, passion fruit, peaches, pears, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, tomatoes, peppers, egg fruit, rock melons, water melons, citron (jam) melons and cucumbers.

- (2) Apply to the foliage of each apple, apricot, cherry, citrus, fig, guava, loquat, medlar, peach, pear, persimmon, plum and quince tree and of each passion vine growing upon the said land at least six (6) fluid ounces of a spray consisting of 2 oz. tartar emetic and 2½ lb. sugar dissolved in 4 gallons of water.
 - (i) At intervals not exceeding seven (7) days commencing at least five (5) weeks prior to the normal date of ripening of fruit on the variety of tree or vine on which the treatment is required and continuing until all that variety has been harvested or removed from the trees or vines, and
 - (ii) In the case of the variety of trees or vines which are last to be harvested or have their fruit removed for a further period of one month after the whole of the fruit thereon has been harvested or removed." ..

In paragraph (c), by deleting the words "any fruit or any case or package which has contained fruit" and substituting in lieu thereof the words "any of the following fruit and/or vegetables, or any case or package which has contained such fruit and/or vegetable:—Apples, apricots, cape gooseberries, cherries, citrus fruits, figs, gooseberries, guavas, loquats, medlars, nectarines, passion fruit, peaches, pears, persimmons, plums. prunes. quines tomatoes pears, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, tomatoes, peppers, egg fruit, rock melons, water melons, citron (jam) melons and cucumbers.'

After paragraph (d) by adding the following additional paragraph:

- "(e) Require the occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to-
- ne proclaimed area to—

 (1) Gather all of the following fruit and/or vegetables which have fallen or been severed from the tree or plants and dispose of all such fruit and/or vegetables by boiling for fifteen (15) minutes or burning or burying under at least eighteen (18) inches of earth not later than Noon each day:—Apples, apricots, cape gooseberries, cherries, citrus fruits, figs, gooseberries, guavas, loquats, medlars, nectarines, passion fruit, peaches, pears, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, tomatoes, peppers, egg fruit, rock melons, water melons, citron (jam) melons and cucumbers. cucumbers
- (2) Remove all split or damaged fruit and all out-of-season fruit from trees or plants and destroy or treat them in such manner as may be directed by an inspector. For the purpose of this Proclamation all citrus fruit which does not ripen with the main citrus crop shall be deemed to be out of season."

WHEREAS on the 17th April, 1924, the Council of the municipality of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of St. Arnaud (hereinafter called "the undertakers") was granted an Order, under the Electric Light and Power Act 1915, cited as the Borough of St. Arnaud Electric Lighting Order No. 181, 1924 (hereinafter called "the said Order") to supply electricity within the municipality of the Borough of St. Arnaud: And whereas the undertakers have made application that the Governor in Council approve of the method of charging under the said Order as set out hereunder and have also made application to have the Fourth Schedule to the said Order amended so as to include the price determined by under the said Order as set out hereunder and have also made application to have the Fourth Schedule to the said Order amended so as to include the price determined by the Governor in Council as the price that may be charged for electricity supplied by the said method of charging and to make provision for the charging of a minimum monthly charge, it is recommended that the Governor in Council, pursuant to the provisions of section 13 of the Electric Light and Power Act 1928 and to the powers in that behalf reserved in clause 30 of the said Order, approve of the undertakers charging for electricity supplied by them to any consumer for normal residential use for lighting, cooking, heating, or power by a fixed periodical or service charge, whether any or no electricity is consumed, during the period for which it it payable, and a charge according to the amount of electricity supplied, and actermine that the price that may be charged by the undertakers for electricity supplied by the foregoing method shall not exceed the rates set out in the said Fourth Schedule calculated as therein provided, and amend the said Fourth Schedule to include the rates so determined, and to provide a minimum monthly charge irrespective of the amount of electricity consumed, or

the purpose for which such supply is given, by substituting the following sections 1, 2, 3, and 4 for sections 1 and 2 of the said Fourth Schedule, that is to say:—

Where the undertakers charge any consumer by the electrical quantity supplied to him, they shall be entitled

to charge him at the following rates:

For energy supplied for lighting purposes—1s. per unit.

For energy supplied for purposes other than lighting

—6d. per unit.

Section 2.

Where the undertakers charge any consumer by the electrical quantity contained in the supply given to him, they shall be entitled to charge him according to the rates set forth in section 1 of this Schedule, the amount of energy supplied to him being taken to be the product of such electrical quantity and the declared pressure at the consumer's terminals; that is to say, such a constant pressure at those terminals as may be declared by the undertakers under any regulations made under the Act. undertakers under any regulations made under the Act.

Section 3.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, the undertakers may charge any consumer a minimum charge of 5s. per month, irrespective of the amount of energy consumed or the purpose for which such supply is given, and exclusive of meter rent.

Section 4.

Where the undertakers charge any consumer by a fixed periodical or service charge, and a further charge according to the amount of energy supplied, they shall be entitled to charge him at the following rates:—

For Energy Supplied for Normal Residential Use for Lighting, Cooking, Heating, or Power.

Lighting, Cooking, Heating, or Power.

A service charge of 1s. 4d. per month for every assessable* room which does not exceed 350 square feet in floor area, plus 1s. 4d. per month for every 350 square feet of floor area, or odd fraction thereof, of every assessable room in such premises where such floor area exceeds 350 square feet (but the service charge in respect of any one room shall not exceed 4s. per month), and, in addition, for any amount of energy supplied, 3½d. per unit; but (subject to the minimum monthly charge provided for in section 3 of this Schedule) the amount chargeable to any consumer under this method shall not be higher than a sum calculated at the rate of 1s. per unit used in any month.

* Assessable room.—An assessable room is any room *Assessable room.—An assessable room is any room (whether lighted by electricity or not, and other than those exempted below) used or erected for use as a dining room, kitchen, bedroom, dressing room, sun room, ballroom, lounge, servery, library, billiard room, sleepout, laboratory, dispensary, gymnasium, or the like, or any enclosed verandah or vestibule used for such purpose. The following are normally exempt in assessing service charges:—Passages, pantries, lobbies, bathrooms, lavatories, cellars, entrance halls, porches, garages, private workshops, sculleries, and washhouses where not combined with kitchens, verandahs, and vestibules, unless such verandahs, when enclosed, are used for the purposes stated above.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 5,000 gallons.

DANGEROUS DRUGS REGULATIONS 1948.-No. 3.

U NDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Poisons Acts the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria doth make the Regulations following that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1948—No. 3" and shall be read and construed as one with the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1930, 1931, 1932, 1934, 1945, 1946, 1946 No. 2, 1946 No. 4, 1947, 1948 and 1948 No. 2.

PART II.

Specified Drugs.

2. Regulation 31 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1930 as amended by Regulation No. 2 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1932 is hereby further amended as follows:—

At the end of the said Regulation add the following proviso namely:—

- "Provided that the proprietor or manager of a butter factory on obtaining the written approval of the Pharmacy Board may obtain and supply for the treatment of mastitis in cattle a preparation of penicillin which is packed in tubes labelled 'Preparation of penicillin to be used only for administration to cattle for the treatment of mastitis'" or words to that effect.
- 3. The proprietor or manager of a butter factory wishing to obtain the approval of the Pharmacy Board to obtain and supply penicillin for the treatment of mastitis in cattle shall comply with the following conditions:—
 - (a) Apply to the Board in writing for such approval with a statutory declaration that he possesses satisfactory storage facilities for the storage of the penicillin including refrigeration and an undertaking that he will keep it so stored whilst in his possession.
 - (b) That he will only supply such preparation of penicillin to a stock owner for the treatment of bovine mastitis on the written request signed before delivery by such stock owner or his representative.
 - (c) That he will keep a proper record in a book kept for the purpose showing particulars of all supplies of penicillin preparations received by him together with the date of receipt thereof by him and also with the name and address of the manufacturer and wholesale supplier and the name and address of each person to whom such penicillin preparations are supplied together with the date of sale and the quantity sold.
- 4. The records required to be kept by these Regulations shall be preserved by the proprietor or manager of the butter factory for a period of at least two years and shall be produced on demand to any Inspector or other person authorized in writing by the Board for inspection at all reasonable times.
- 5. It shall be an offence under the Regulations for the proprietor or manager of a butter factory knowingly to supply penicillin or any preparation thereof for any other purpose than the treatment of mastitis in cattle.
- 6. The words in the proviso in lines 5 and 6 of Regulation 31 (3) of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1947 "In places where it is not reasonably practicable to obtain such a prescription" shall not apply to penicillin and preparations thereof supplied by a pharmaceutical chemist for bona fide veterinary purposes.

The foregoing Regulations were recommended by the Pharmacy Board of Victoria by resolution at a special meeting held at Melbourne on the twenty-fifth day of August One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight.







CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. Except where definite quantities are specified the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor articles of any of the several kinds enumerated in the schedules the purchase of which is, in the opinion of the Tender Board, necessary in order to meet special circumstances or special requirements.

- 2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. In the event of the tender having been accepted for goods manufactured within the Commonwealth or manufactured within any other part of the British Empire (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall, if required by the Government, bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for, and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied.
- 3. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores, and the stores shall be packed in such a manner as shall secure them from injury during transit, and until delivery such stores shall be at the risk of the contractor.
- 4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Education Department. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.
- 5. Supplies ordered for delivery in the Melbourne District are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne District will include a radius of 6 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office. For supplies outside that radius the goods must be delivered free on rails at Flinders-street or Spencer-street Railway Stations as required.
- Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Secretary, Education Department, or such other officer whom he may appoint.

- 7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in clause 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four nours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.
- 8. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as in clause 7.
- 9. The official order issued by the Education Department shall be forwarded by the contractor to the officer authorized to accept delivery, who shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods accepted and return the order to the contractor, who will attach same to his claim for payment.
- 10. All orders, duly receipted, shall be returned to the Education Department at the end of each month, accompanied by an account in the prescribed form for the articles supplied during the month, and, on receipt of same, the contractor shall be entitled to payment, due time to be allowed for the examination and verification of the claim.
- 11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the schedules. Delivery of the articles will not be deemed to have been made until they have been handed in good order and condition to the head teacher of the school or such other person as may be authorized to accept delivery, &c. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.
- 12. The members of Boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in clause 7.
- 13. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned. on a legibly-written business label.
- 14. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Office or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver the original at the Tender Board Offices, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with clause 15, and the quintuplicate to be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 17 of these conditions. Such mulct may be deducted as in clause 7.
- 15. Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred for same will be deducted as in clause 7.

- 16. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing, on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.
- 17. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of clauses 14 and 15 of these conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding Fifty pounds as the said Treasurer may direct and the amount may be deducted as in clause 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of one year from the date of such disqualification.
- 18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm, and, not in that of the individual—then the said Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract, and forfeit the security monev.
- 19. The contracts entered into under these conditions are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for supplies to Technical Schools, or by any article being made at any Government establishment and supplied for the use of the Education Department, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.
- 20. Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in section 152 of the Customs Act 1901-36, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice in writing from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect.
