PROCLAMATION

POTATO MARKETING BOARD REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Marketing of Primary Products Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Potato Marketing Board" Regulations 1948.

2. Interpretation of Terms.—In construing these Regulations, the following words, if not inconsistent with the context or subject matter, shall have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them (that is to say):—

"The Act" means the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935* (No. 4337).

"Board" means the Potato Marketing Board constituted and appointed under the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*.

"Person" includes any body of persons corporate or unincorporate, and any firm of partners.

"Producer" means a producer as defined by the Act who produces potatoes within Victoria.

"Schedule" means the Schedule to these Regulations.

"Secretary" means the Secretary of the Potato Marketing Board, and includes any person appointed by the Board to act as Secretary during the absence of the Secretary.

3. At all meetings of the Board at which the Chairman is present, he shall preside. In the absence of the Chairman through any cause whatsoever the Board shall elect from those members in attendance one who shall be Deputy Chairman for that meeting.

4. The Board shall meet on such dates, at such places, and at such times as the Chairman may in his discretion from time to time determine, but the Chairman, if so requested by any two members of the Board, shall call a special meeting of the Board at any time.

5. The Secretary shall cause to be delivered to each member of the Board a notice, in writing, or by telegraph, of any ordinary or special meeting two clear days before the date of such meeting, provided that, if in the opinion of the Chairman it is desirable in the case of an emergency to do so, shorter notice may be given to each member of any special meeting.

6. If at the time appointed for a meeting a quorum is not present, one-half hour from the time so appointed shall be allowed for the formation of a quorum and, if at the expiration of that period no quorum is present, the meeting shall lapse.

7. If the meeting lapses through the absence of a quorum, the business set down for such meeting shall be the business, or included in the business of the next meeting of the Board.

8. At all meetings of the Board, save as herein provided, every member shall vote.

9. The Secretary shall keep proper minutes of all resolutions, business, and proceedings made or transacted at each meeting of the Board, which shall be submitted to the members for confirmation and, when confirmed, shall be signed by the Chairman. Any entry in the minute book, and signed by the Chairman, that any resolution has been carried or lost at any meeting shall be conclusive evidence of that fact.

10. All correspondence shall be signed by the Chairman, Secretary, Manager, or other person authorized by the Board.

11. The Secretary or any other person authorized by the Board shall receive and account for all moneys paid to the Board, and each day shall bank moneys received by him at a bank selected by the Board. Only the Secretary or such person authorized for that purpose may endorse cheques for collection on behalf of the Board, and all cheques so endorsed shall be passed through the Board's bank account.
12. (a) All accounts due and payable by the Board, other than accounts for potatoes delivered to the Board, shall be passed by the Board, provided that the Secretary, with the approval of the Chairman, may make payments not exceeding £150 in the aggregate in anticipation of and subject to the confirmation of the Board at its next regular meeting following any such payment or payments.
- (b) Where the Board has appointed an agent to accept delivery of potatoes on its behalf, it may authorize such agent to pay to the producers of or other persons by or for whom such potatoes were delivered to the Board the moneys due to such producers or other persons by the Board for such potatoes.
13. (a) All accounts due by the Board which exceed Two pounds shall be paid by cheque signed by any two members of the Board, and countersigned by the Secretary.
- (b) All accounts not exceeding Two pounds may be paid from a petty cash account, the standing balance of which shall not at any time exceed Ten pounds.
14. The Secretary to the Board shall have the custody of the common seal of the Board, which shall be kept in such place as the Board directs, and when not in use shall be kept in a place of safe custody secured by lock and key.
15. The common seal shall not be affixed to any document except by the authority of a resolution of the Board. In every case where the common seal is authorized to be affixed to any document, such seal shall be affixed only in the presence of at least two members of the Board (one of whom shall be the Chairman or Deputy Chairman), who shall sign every such document, which shall be countersigned by the Secretary.
16. The order of business at any meeting shall be as follows:—
- (i) Reading and confirmation of minutes of previous meeting.
 - (ii) Matters arising from the minutes of previous meeting.
 - (iii) Correspondence.
 - (iv) Statement of receipts and payments since the previous meeting.
 - (v) Accounts.
 - (vi) Matters relating to servants, agents, and officers of the Board.
 - (vii) Such other matters as any member of the Board desires to bring before the Board.
17. A resolution of the Board shall not be revoked or altered unless notice of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration is given in writing to each of the members two days at least before the meeting at which the revocation or alteration is to be proposed.
18. There shall be conspicuously displayed at least every twelve months in the Board's public office a full and explicit statement of the Board's receipts and expenditure, stock transactions, and liabilities for the period since the last preceding statement was so displayed.
19. At least every year there shall be similarly displayed a full and explicit balance-sheet of the Board, audited in accordance with section 11 of the Act.
20. The statement and balance-sheet referred to in Regulations 18 and 19 shall remain displayed until they are replaced by any subsequent statement and balance-sheet, and shall be available for perusal and copying at reasonable hours by any person.
21. The certificate to be issued by the Board in accordance with and subject to section 24 of the Act shall be in or to the effect of Form 1 of the Schedule and shall be in triplicate. One copy, to be marked "Producer's copy," shall be delivered to the producer of or other person by or for whom the potatoes referred to in the certificate were delivered; one copy, to be marked "Board's copy," shall be delivered to the Board or its authorized agent; and the remaining copy, to be marked "Receiver's copy," shall be retained by the person receiving the potatoes on behalf of the Board.

22. The notice to be given by a producer in accordance with section 28 of the Act shall be in or to the effect of Form 2 of the Schedule.

23. The notice to be given by any person claiming to be entitled to any bill of sale, mortgage, charge, lien, pledge, interest, trust, or encumbrance whatsoever of or upon or over any of the commodity delivered to the Board, or claiming to be the true owner of such commodity shall be in or to the effect of Form 3 of the Schedule.

24. The Board may replace any lost or damaged certificate issued in accordance with section 24 of the Act, provided that such duplicate certificate shall be clearly stamped across the face thereof with the words "Duplicate only."

25. Every producer or other person delivering potatoes to the Board shall tender with each consignment of potatoes intended for delivery to the Board a certificate of merchantable quality from such officer of the Department of Agriculture, or other person as is approved (whether generally or in any particular case) in that behalf by the Minister of Agriculture, indicating the quality of the potatoes comprised in the consignment. The issue of a removal certificate, under the *Vegetation and Vines Diseases Act 1928*, in respect of the said potatoes shall be deemed to be in compliance with this Regulation.

26. The certificate of refusal to be given to a producer in accordance with the Act shall be in or to the effect of Form 4 of the Schedule.

27. The Board may, in every sale, or agreement for sale, of potatoes by the Board to any person, insert conditions, and fix a sum as and by way of liquidated damages for any breach of condition, which damages shall be recoverable accordingly.

28. (i) Every producer of potatoes who has planted at least one half (½) acre with potatoes is hereby required to register with the Board at its office in Melbourne within the times hereinafter prescribed the following particulars:—

- (a) His full name and address.
- (b) If potatoes are being produced under a Share Farming or Partnership Agreement the names and addresses of the shareholders or partners and the proportionate shares of each.
- (c) The variety and the area of each such variety.
- (d) The locality or localities where such potatoes are planted.
- (e) Loading station at which producer desires to deliver potatoes to the Board.

(ii) Such producers shall supply the Board with the above-mentioned particulars within the following times:—

- (a) In respect of potatoes planted between 1st June and 31st August in any year—within seven days of completion of planting or by 7th September, whichever is the earlier.
- (b) In respect of potatoes planted between 1st September and 24th January next following—within seven days of completion of planting.

(iii) Every producer who fails to register any or all of the particulars above mentioned with the Board within the time specified shall be guilty of an offence and be liable to a penalty not exceeding £25.

(iv) Every producer who wilfully registers with the Board any particulars required by these Regulations, which are false or misleading shall be guilty of an offence and be liable to a penalty not exceeding £25.

CITY OF MORDIALLOC.

By-LAW No. 97.

A By-law of the City of Mordialloc, made under section 197, sub-section (1) of clause 39 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 97, for prohibiting or regulating cattle being allowed to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Mordialloc order as follows:—

1. By-laws Nos. 65 and 75 are hereby repealed.
2. No person being the owner or having the possession, care, charge, custody, control, or supervision of any cattle shall allow such cattle to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence, and not being land hereinafter excepted from the operation of this By-law.

3. Any person who is guilty of a breach of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for a first offence to a penalty of not less than One pound and not exceeding Ten pounds, and for a second or subsequent offence, to a penalty of not less than Five pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district, with the exception of that area within the Mordialloc Ward, commencing at the south-east corner of Lower Dandenong-road and Warren-road; thence southerly along Warren-road to White-street; thence easterly along White-street to Chute-street; thence southerly along Chute-street to Park-street; thence westerly along Park-street to the fence on the boundary of Attenborough Park; thence along such fence and by a prolongation therefrom in a south-westerly direction to the Mordialloc Creek; thence easterly along the Mordialloc Creek to Boundary-road; thence northerly along Boundary-road to Lower Dandenong-road; thence westerly along Lower Dandenong-road to the commencing point.

The Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 23rd day of August, 1948, and confirmed on the 27th day of September, 1948.

TOWN OF HORSHAM.

By-LAW No. 32.

NOTICE is hereby given that By-law No. 32 was passed by the Council of the Town of Horsham on 6th July, 1948, and confirmed on 3rd August, 1948, and approved by the Governor in Council on 24th August, 1948.

A summary of the provisions of this By-law is as follows:—

1. No person shall leave standing or allow to remain standing a motor car or other vehicle (whether unattended or not)—

- (a) outside the Town Hall, Horsham,
- (b) outside the building known as the 20th Century Theatre,
- (c) outside the building known as the Horsham Theatre,

during the time concerts and other entertainments or meetings are taking place in the respective buildings.

2. 1. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or any property in the said parks, reserves, lands, or grounds, or throw stones or any missile, beat carpets, dry clothes, or commit any nuisance, or light fires therein, or leave bottles therein, paper, orange peel, cast-off clothing, or any litter.

2. No person shall climb or jump over the seats or fences in or around the said parks, reserves, lands, or grounds, or lie on the seats, or stick bills on the fences, gates, posts, or trees, or cut letters or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

3. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord. No dog shall be allowed in the Reserve except as above provided, and all dogs, goats, pigs, and poultry found in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation, to be recovered before any justice, for any damage done.

4. No children under five (5) years of age shall be allowed in the said parks, reserves, lands, or grounds, unless in the charge of adult friends or nurses.

5. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly or objectionable manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in the said parks, reserves, lands, or grounds any act of indecency, shall be liable to be forthwith removed by the curator or other authorized officer or servant of the Council, or by a constable, and shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

6. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the Council shall ride or drive any bicycle, tricycle, motor car, or other vehicle in the said parks, reserves, lands, or grounds, without permission, in writing, having been granted by the Council.

7. The Council shall have the power to hold entertainments or performances in the parks and to make a charge for admission thereto, such charge being that fixed by the Council from time to time, not exceeding Five shillings for every adult person.

8. The Council shall have the power to let, with or without the payment of a fee, the parks, reserves, lands, or grounds to any club, association, or person for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, or sports, the fee to be charged for the letting of the parks shall be that deemed by the Council to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and shall not exceed Ten pounds for any one day; and the Council shall authorize such club, association, or person to make a charge for admission thereto, such charge not to exceed Five shillings for each adult person.

9. The maximum charge or fee for admission to such parks, reserves, lands, or grounds shall be Five shillings for each adult person.

10. No person, except the members of the Council, the Shire Secretary, Shire Engineer, and employees of the Council on duty, shall enter any portion of such parks, reserves, lands, or grounds when a charge is made for admission, without first paying the fee charged, unless otherwise authorized by the Council.

11. No person, unless he be guilty of an offence under this By-law, shall be required to leave during any entertainment or sports after he has paid for admission, until he has been tendered the amount of the admission fee paid by him.

12. No person shall carry firearms in or through the parks, reserves, lands, or grounds, or shoot, snare, or destroy any birds therein, unless by authority of the Council.

13. No person shall engage in training or in cricket, football, tennis, lacrosse, or any like games in the parks, reserves, lands, or grounds without the written authority of the Council and payment of any fees or charges that may be fixed from time to time by the Council, consistent with these Regulations.

14. No person shall by unseemly conduct interfere with any entertainment, performance, or sport or interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within such parks, reserves, lands, or grounds.

15. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or occupation of a bookmaker in the parks without the permission, in writing, of the Council, and then in and on such portion or portions thereof as may be set apart for that purpose.

16. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder or interrupt in their work of the Council's employees engaged in the parks, reserves, lands, or grounds, by conversation or otherwise.

17. No person shall sell or offer for sale within such parks, reserves, lands, or grounds any article of food, or drink or any other commodity or operate any money-making amusement, without the written permission of the Council.

18. No person shall remain in such parks, reserves, lands, or grounds at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Council or by a constable to leave the same.

19. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in such parks, reserves, lands, or grounds.

20. No person shall assemble in the parks, reserves, lands, or grounds for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, without the permission, in writing, of the Council.

21. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act of default contrary hereto shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

22. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the enclosures afore-mentioned.

23. By-law No. 86 is hereby repealed.
