



Every such boat registered under the Fisheries Acts shall, so as to indicate the fact that it is registered, have the letter "V" followed by the registration number in numerals painted legibly on both bows of the boat, outside, clear above the water line. Such letter and numerals shall be not less than 3 inches in height, and shall be well clear of any other letters or numerals which may be on the boat, and shall be kept legibly painted, in white paint on a dark ground, or in black paint on a light ground. ground.

- 5. When two boats are engaged or employed by a licensed fisherman at the same time in the one fishing or oystering operation, the smaller boat shall be deemed to be a "tender" to the larger boat. ### Health Act 1928 CITY OF PRAHRAN.

By-LAW No. 207.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1928 and of all other powers thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Prahran, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City, for the purpose of carrying the provisions of the said Act with regard to the subject dealt with into execution within its jurisdiction, makes the following By-law, being By-law No. 207, that is to say:—

- 1. No person shall, within 40 feet of a dwelling-house, 1. No person shall, within 40 feet of a dwelling-house, living-room, or sleeping-out tent, establish or construct a fowl yard or pigeon loft or enclosure, or cause one to be established or constructed, or within such distance, permit any land or place to be used afresh or for the first time as a fowl yard or pigeon loft or enclosure, or keep or permit any poultry or pigeons to be kept or remain in any yard or enclosed land, without the written permission of the Council, and any such permission may, if deemed necessary, be revoked by the Council.
- 2. Every person who shall disobey such an order of the Council, or shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such breach, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
- 3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the City of Prahran.
  - 4. By-law No. 116 is hereby repealed.

The Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Land Act 1928, and all other powers him thereunto enabling, doth hereby rescind Chapter IV.—Survey—of the Regulations under the Land Act 1928 made on the fifth day of August, 1930, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette of the 8th day of August, 1930, at pages 2087 to 2150, as amended by Order of the 13th day of November, 1947, published in the Victoria Government Gazette of the 19th day of November, 1947, page 5739, and in lieu thereof substitute the following, that is to say:—

### Chapter IV.-Survey.

- 1. The methods to be employed by surveyors engaged in making surveys for the Department of Crown Lands and Survey shall be those set forth in the Land Surveyors Regulations Part 2 Gazette No. 324, dated the 16th July, 1947.
- 2. No survey shall be held to be a survey under the direction of the Board of Land and Works within the meaning of section 169 of the Land Act 1928 unless the Surveyor-General shall be satisfied of its accuracy and no Crown grant for any allotment shall be issued by the Department of Crown Lands and Survey unless the Surveyor-General shall be satisfied that the boundaries thereof have been defined on the ground in accordance with these Regulations.
- 3. Whenever it may be found necessary to adjust a boundary, an area or description of land for which a Crown lease or Crown grant has been issued, the Surveyor-General shall certify as to the correctness of such adjustment and for such certification there shall be charged such fee, if any, as he may direct.
- 4. A demand for the fee chargeable for survey shall issue to the applicant to whom a portion of Crown lands has been recommended or to whom it is to be granted, and such fee shall be paid even though the land has been previously surveyed and may or may not require further survey.

Should payment not be made within one month of the date of such demand having issued, the application may be deemed to have been abandoned.

- Subject to the approval of the Secretary for Lands, where the survey fee exceeds £25, a deposit may be paid as follows:—
  - (a) Where the fee exceeds £25 but does not exceed £50 a deposit of £25.
  - (b) Where the fee exceeds £50—a deposit of 50 per cent. of the fee.

Any balance of the survey fee remaining after payment of the deposit shall be paid in equal half-yearly instalments with the first twelve rents under the lease. Such instalments shall be added to and form part of the rent or instalments of any land under lease and be recoverable accordingly.

- All moneys paid towards the cost of surveys shall be credited to Revenue No. 7 Fees Lands.
- 7. The Surveyor-General, upon payment of the prescribed fee, or, if he deems it advisable, prior to such payment, shall give instructions for the survey to be made.
- 8. Every contract surveyor shall execute all orders for survey promptly upon receipt of instructions, comply with such instructions and with any additional instructions in regard to a survey that may be given him and furnish a monthly progress report on the work in hand.

9. District Surveyors, or Staff Surveyors, when instructed by the Surveyor-General, shall periodically inspect and check with chain and theodolite the work done by contract surveyors and submit a report and field notes of such check survey to the Surveyor-General.

In the event of an error or defect in such work being discovered, the contract surveyor concerned shall rectify same at his own cost.

- 10. Every contract surveyor shall be paid for his services in accordance with the fees prescribed by these Regulations and all claims for payment shall be checked by the Examining Draughtsman and certified by the District Surveyor and Surveyor-General.
- 11. The fee to be collected from an applicant for, the survey of any portion of Crown land shall be in accordance with the Schedule of Fees prescribed hereunder.

The scale applicable shall be determined by the Surveyor-General in accordance with the following:—

#### First Scale.

Generally level or gently undulating country, cleared or sparsely timbered, or with ground cover such as bracken, black-berry or furze up to three feet in height or mallee scrub.

#### Second Scale.

Undulating to hilly country, thickly timbered with trees up to twelve inches in diameter with ground cover, such as in the stringy bark, messmate and gum country of the South Gippsland, Ballarat, Daylesford and Beechworth districts, or in the grey box and iron bark timbered areas of the Maryborough and Chiltern districts, and sparsely timbered or open country with steep slopes.

#### Third Scale.

Swampy country with dense scrub over three feet in height; hilly and mountainous country heavily timbered with dense undergrowth as in the Otway, Grampians, North Gippsland and North-East districts.






SCALE OF CHAINS





All proceedings which at the date of the publication of this Order were pending before any Board abolished by this Order in respect of premises situated within the said metropolitan area or within the Western Riding of the Shire of Braybrook, that portion of the Shire of Broadmeadows which is north of the northern boundaries of the Parishes of Jika Jika and Doutta Galla, the Eastern Riding of the Shire of Eltham, and the Eastern Riding and Southern Riding of the Shire of Lillydale, shall be transferred to the Metropolitan Fair Rents Board constituted under this Order. tuted under this Order.
- 5. All proceedings which at the date of the publication of this Order were pending before any Board in respect of premises situated in any part of Victoria other than—

(a) the said metropolitan area; or
(b) the Western Riding of the Shire of Braybrook,
that portion of the Shire of Broadmeadows
which is north of the northern boundaries of
the Parishes of Jika Jika and Doutta Galla, the
Eastern Riding of the Shire of Eltham, and the Eastern Riding and Southern Riding of the Shire of Lillydale,

- 4. The sum of Sixty-five thousand pounds shall be repaid and interest upon the balance of the principal outstanding from time to time shall be paid, on the dates and in the manner set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

#### REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the *Prices Regulation Act* 1948 and of all other powers him thereunto enabling, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, this is to say:—

#### Citation and Interpretation.

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Prices Regulations (Victoria) No. 2.

(2) In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, "Act" means the Prices Regulation Act 1948.

Production of Balance Sheets and Other Accounts and Statements.

- 2. (1) A trader who sells or has for sale any goods or supplies or carries on any service, upon being required so to do by the Commissioner by notice in writing, shall produce to the Commissioner—
  - (a) all balance-sheets, manufacturing, trading, profit and loss, production and revenue accounts and all production, financial and statistical and similar statements prepared by the trader or on his behalf in relation to his business of selling goods or supplying or carrying on a service; and
  - (b) all documents of any kind (including documents of the kind referred to in section 22 of the Act) which relate to the conduct of the business including the sale of the goods or the supply or carrying on of the service,

which are specified in the notice, and shall leave those balance-sheets, accounts, statements and documents with the Commissioner or furnish him with copies thereof.

- (2) Where any balance-sheet, account, statement or document required to be produced to the Commissioner is in the possession or control of any person other than the trader to whose business it relates, that person shall, upon being required so to do by the Commissioner, by notice in writing, produce to and leave with the Commissioner that balance-sheet; account, statement or document.
- (3) A trader or other person who has been required to produce to the Commissioner any balance-sheet, account, statement or document, shall, if the Commissioner so requires, permit the Commissioner to make a copy of, or to take an extract from that balance-sheet, account, statement or document.

### Commissioner May Require Returns to be Furnished.

- 3. (1) The Commissioner may by notice, require any person to furnish to him or to an authorized officer within a time and in a form specified in the notice, a return setting forth to the best of the person's knowledge and ability, the following particulars or such of them as are specified in the notice, namely:—
  - (a) the quantity of any goods in his possession or under his control at the date specified in the notice;
  - (b) the cost to that person of those goods;
  - (c) the methods and principles in accordance with which he arrives at that cost;
  - (d) Where the maximum price of the goods has not been fixed in pursuance of the provisions of the Act, the prices, wholesale or retail, at which, and conditions on which, he has sold, sells, or proposes to sell the goods;
  - (e) the price, wholesale or retail, charged by the person on the thirty-first day of August, 1939, or on such other date as the Commissioner specifies, for the goods and the conditions of any such sale; and
  - (f) such further particulars as are specified in the notice.
- (2) The Commissioner may by notice, require any person or body of persons engaged in the supply or carrying on of any service to furnish to him, or to an authorized officer, a return setting forth to the best of the person's knowledge and ability such particulars relating to such service as are specified in the notice.
- (3) Any notice given under this regulation may be either a notice given to such person individually or a notice to such persons or a class of such persons generally; and such last-mentioned notice shall be published in the Government Gazette and in such newspapers (if any) as the Commissioner directs.
  - (4) The return shall be verified by statutory declaration.
- (5) A person required to furnish a return in pursuance of this regulation shall not wilfully furnish any false or misleading return.

#### Interpretation of Orders.

4. In any order made under the Act fixing the maximum price for the sale of any declared goods, the following expressions shall, unless the contrary intention appears in the order, have the meanings respectively assigned to them hereunder:—

"landed cost" means, in relation to the sale of any imported goods by any person, the aggregate of the purchase price paid or payable to the overseas supplier for those goods after deduction of any trade discount but before deduction of any cash discount, overseas office or forwarding agents' charges actually incurred, insurance, freight, exchange calculated at telegraphic transfer rate, duty wharfage and stacking charges, custom agents' charges (except insofar as any item of transport from wharf or bond store is concerned), and sales tax where paid;

"retail" used in relation to any such sale, shall be deemed to refer to a sale to a person for the purpose of consumption or use:

"wholesale" used in relation to any such sale, shall be deemed to refer to the sale or supply to a person for the purpose of re-sale (including, but without affecting the generality hereof, the sale or supply by an importer, manufacturer or producer to a manufacturer or a wholesale or retail trader); and

the maximum price fixed shall be deemed to include any charge for wrapping the goods.

- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1946 and every other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bairnsdale order as follows:—
- 1. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise re-
  - " Council " means the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale.
  - " Engineer means the officer appointed by the Council to carry out the duties of the shire engineer.

    "Stands or platforms" include any existing stand or
    platform on any road.
    "Formation" means that portion of the road prepared for the use of traffic and includes the pavement of the road.
- 2. The Council may authorize the owner or occupier of any property, who is engaged in dairy farming and the production of milk or cream to erect a stand or platform on any road to facilitate the collection of such milk or cream. No person other than an owner or occupier so authorized shall erect or commence to erect any such stand or platform.
- 3. Every such owner or occupier, prior to the erection of any such stand or platform, shall make written application to the Council for permission so to do, and shall not erect or commence to erect any such stand or platform without the written consent of the engineer, and where the stand or platform is to be erected on any State highway, main road, or tourist road without the further written consent of the Country Roads Board.
- 4. Every such owner or occupier in his application to the Council for permission to erect a stand or platform shall state-
  - (a) his full name, address, and occupation;

  - (a) his full name, address, and occupation;
    (b) the materials proposed to be used;
    (c) the dimensions and height of the proposed stand or platform from the ground;
    (d) the distance of the proposed stand or platform from the centre of the trafficable portion of the road;
    (a) the Crown allotment number of his property and the nature of his interest therein;
- and his application shall be accompanied by a sketch plan showing the location of the proposed stand or platform with regard to the formation and road boundaries, and the direction and course of travel to be made in collecting milk or cream therefrom.
- 5. Every such owner or occupier who is granted permission to erect a stand or platform shall-

  - (a) erect the same of sound materials approved by
    the engineer and in a workmanlike manner;
    (b) keep the same in good and substantial repair;
    (c) erect the same in such position approved by
    the engineer as will ensure that when cream or
    milk is being collected therefrom the collecting vehicle will not obstruct other traffic using the road:
  - (d) construct and maintain at his own expense such gravel or other tracks from the edges of the trafficable portion of the road to the stand or platform as the engineer may order;
  - (e) forthwith remove any stand or platform when ordered so to do by the Council.
- 6. Every owner or occupier in respect of whose property any stand or platform has been erected prior to the coming into operation of this By-law, and without the permission of the Council shall, within three months from the operation of this By-law, make written application to the Council as provided in clause 4 hereof.
- 7. The Council may, on giving notice in writing to the owner or occupier, order that any stand or platform whether erected before or after the coming into operation of this By-law, shall be forthwith removed.
- 8. On the refusal, failure, or neglect of any owner or occupier to remove or repair, as the case may be, any stand or platform erected, whether before or after the coming into operation of this By-law, for use in respect of property owned or occupied by him after fourteen days'

notice in writing from the Council it shall be lawful for the Council by its workmen or agents to remove such stand or platform, and to dispose of the materials thereof as it deems fit, and to reimburse itself from the proceeds of such disposal for all expenses incurred by it in such removal and disposal.

9. Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful act or this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not less than Two nor more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a second or subsequent of not less than Five nor more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence shall be liable to a penalty of One pound for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order of any court.

The owner or occupier, on fourteen days written notice from the Council, shall lop all trees, shrubs, or hedges, whether planted before or after the commencement of this By-law, on private property situate at the junction of any street or road, and within 10 feet therefrom, for a distance of 30 feet from the junction along both frontages to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in.

4. The owner or occupier, on fourteen days written notice from the Council, shall reduce to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in.

5. The Council may, at the expense of the owner concerned, or the failure of the owner or occupier to carry out any direction under clauses 3 and 4 of this By-law, give effect to such direction, and the amount of expense incurred may be recovered by the Council in a Court of Petty Sessions as al civil debt recoverable summarily.

6. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall for a first offence be liable to a penalty of not less than Two pounds nor more than Twenty pounds, and for any second or subsequent offence to a penalty of not less than Five pounds nor more than Twenty pounds, and any person guilty of a continuing offence shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order of any court.
