THE CONSTITUTION ACT AMENDMENT ACTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by The Constitution Act Amendments Acts and of other powers thereto enabling me, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation divide the electoral provinces set out in the Schedule hereto into divisions and do specify in such Schedule the names and boundaries of such divisions. of such divisions.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this sixth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, and in the thirteenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.

SCHEDULE.

AMES AND BOUNDARIES OF DIVISIONS OF ELECTORAL PROVINCES OF THE LEGISLATIVE

In the following descriptions, wherever the boundary described runs along a river, creek, road, or street, the centre of such river, creek, road, or street shall be taken to be the boundary line. Where any boundary of a municipal district or part of a municipal district or of a proclaimed area is specified in these descriptions, it shall be taken to be the boundary existing on the first day of December, 1949:

- 1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied for the supply of water for domestic purposes upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated by it within the Ballarat Water Supply District:—
 - (a) Of any tenements (other than land on which there is no building) the annual municipal valuation whereof does not exceed Eleven pounds, Fifteen
 - whereof does not exceed Eleven pounds, Fitteen shillings per annum.

 (b) Of any such tenement the annual municipal valuation whereof exceeds Eleven pounds, a rate of One shilling and three pence in the pound on the net annual municipal value.

 (c) Of lands on which there is no building, a rate of One shilling and three pence in the pound on the net annual municipal value.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year beginning the 1st day of January, 1950, and ending the 31st day of December, 1950, and shall be payable on the 31st day of January, 1950, at the office of the Water Commissioners, Ballarat.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Commissioners is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.
- 4. The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Commissioners in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons.





REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "TARWIN LOWER RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated 15th July, 1947, as a site for Recreation purposes in the Township of Tarwin, and known as the "Tarwin Lower Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve," such reservation having been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

 - - (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
 - (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.

 (c) Use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve.

 - (d) Bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
 - (e) Obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person under authority from the Committee or em-ployed by it at the Reserve in the execution of his lawful duties.
 - (f) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or on any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- 3. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of 4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.

5. No club, association, society, or person shall hold any entertainment, performance, show, or ceremony on any part of the Reserve without the authority of the Committee

first obtained.

6. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.
7. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle, or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for that purpose by the Committee.
8. No person shall take part in any games, sports, or entertainments of any kind in the Reserve at any time without the permission of the Committee first obtained.
9. No person, club, or other body using the Reserve shall damage any building thereon or the fittings of such building, and in the event of such damage occurring during their occupancy thereof such person, club, or other body shall be responsible for such damage, and shall pay to the Committee the cost of making good and repairing such building or fittings.

No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or walk on the beds or borders, or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever

therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.

11. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for that purpose by the

12. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect therein any buildings or any other structure without the consent

of the Committee first obtained.

13. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, pigs, goats, or other animals without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

No person shall sell or ouer for sale any article in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee first had and obtained, and then only subject to such conditions

as such Committee may determine.

15. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any

part of the Reserve.

16. No organized sport shall be played in the Reserve on Sundays without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

The minimum area, depth, and width of frontage specified in column 3 of table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations (Victoria) (hereinafter called "the Regulations"), are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage of land on which a building shall be constructed throughout the whole of the Borough of Echuca.

Sites Below Minimum Requirements.

- 3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations, the said Council, upon written application being made to it, may permit any person to—
 - (a) construct a building of Class I. occupancy on land having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage or at a lesser distance from boundaries than those specified in column 3 of table 803 of the Regulations or in this By-law;
 - (b) construct a building of Class III., V., VI., VII., or VIII. occupancy or a building to which a build-ing of Class IV. occupancy is attached, on land having an area, depth, or width of frontage less than that prescribed in clause 809 of Regulations.

Provided in all such cases that on the day of commencement of the Regulations such land existed as a separate allotment and has not since been reduced in area, or was shown on a plan of subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles.

4. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council, and lodged with

the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations, the Council may, upon written applica-tion being made to it, dispense with the requirements of clause 811 of the Regulations.
