Country Fire Authority Acts.

VARIATION OF SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section two of section four of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council, after consultation by the Chief Secretary of Victoria with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim any period as the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria or any specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may proclaim different summer periods in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas by the said sub-section it is further enacted that any Proclamation so published shall remain in force until revoked, amended, or varied by a subsequent Proclamation so published:

And whereas a Proclamation was issued on the twenty-third day of November, 1948, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-fourth day of November, 1948, proclaiming the period commencing on the twenty-first day of November, 1948, and ending on the thirty-first day of March next following to be the summer period in respect of certain parts of the country area of Victoria, that is to say, the Eighteenth Fire Control Region (comprising the municipal districts of the City of Mildura and the Shires of Birchip, Karkaroc, Mildura, Walpeup, and Wycheproof) and the Twentieth Fire Control Region (comprising the municipal districts of the Borough of Swan Hill and the Shires of Cohuna, Kerang, and Swan Hill):

And whereas a further Proclamation was issued on the third day of December, 1948, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the eighth day of December, 1948, proclaiming the period commencing on the said eighth day of December, 1948, and ending on the thirty-first day of March next following to be the summer period in respect of certain parts of the country area of Victoria including those portions of the Seventeenth Fire Control Region comprised by the Shires of Dimboola, Kaniva, Lowan, and Warracknabeal:

And whereas it is deemed expedient that the aforesaid Proclamations should be varied:

And whereas the Chief Secretary and the Minister of Forests have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Acts, do by this my Proclamation vary the aforesaid Proclamations issued on the twenty-third day of November, 1948, and the third day of December, 1948, respectively, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-fourth day of November, 1948, and the eighth day of December, 1948, respectively, by proclaiming that in respect of the said Eighteenth and Twentieth Fire Control Regions and those portions of the said Seventeenth Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the said Shires of Dimboola, Kaniva, Lowan, and Warracknabeal the summer period shall end on the twenty-eighth day of February, 1949.

BUTTER QUOTA.

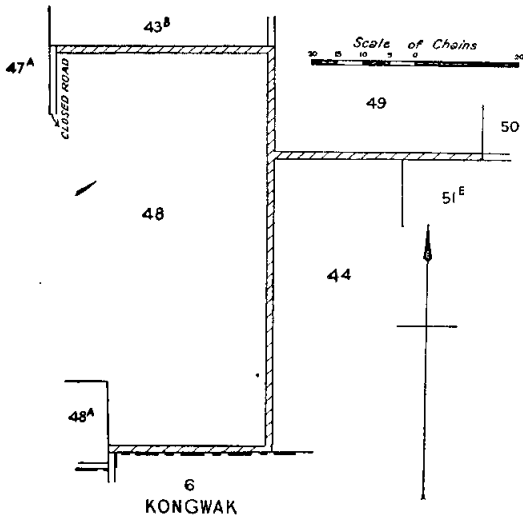

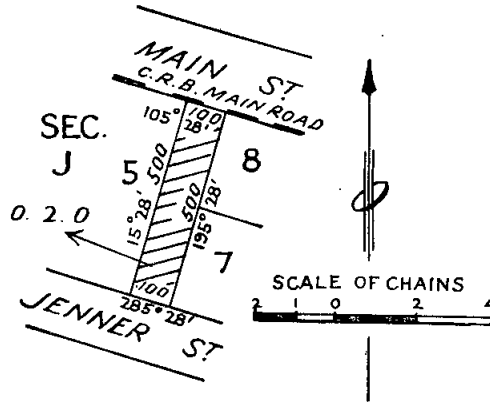

REGULATIONS UNDER THE COAL MINE WORKERS' PENSIONS ACT 1942, AMENDED.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 34 of the *Coal Mine Workers' Pensions Act 1942* (No. 4932), His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following amendments to the Regulations under the said Act, that is to say:—

(1) Clause 10 is hereby rescinded, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following:—

"Determination of Period of Disqualification from Receiving Pension where Damages are Recovered or Received by Mine Worker or by Dependant Independently of Workers' Compensation Acts.

10. The disqualification under sub-section (1) of section 13 or under sub-section (3) of section 9 shall cease to have effect on the expiration of a period of weeks ascertained by dividing the total amount of the damages recovered in respect of the injury to or death of the mine worker (as the case may be) less out of pocket expenses paid in respect of such injury or death and recovered in such damages, by a weekly rate in the case of a single man or dependant of Four pounds, or in the case of a married man of Five pounds, plus the sum of ten shillings for each dependent child or step-child under the age of sixteen years."

(2) Clause 15 is hereby rescinded, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following:—

"Disclosure of Other Pensions or Allowances.

15. Where a pension has been awarded under the Act and at any time thereafter the person to whom such pension has been awarded or any dependant of such person receives, or would but for the Act be entitled upon application to receive, any amount from any age, invalid or widow's pension or wife's allowance under the Commonwealth Act known as the *Social Services Consolidation Act 1947*, or as an allowance under the *Coal Mines Regulation Acts*, or as compensation under the *Workers' Compensation Acts* or as damages recovered independently of those Acts, such person shall within seven days after such receipt or becoming entitled to receive, furnish to the Registrar a statement in writing signed by such person setting forth particulars of each and every amount which he or any dependant so receives or becomes entitled to receive, as the case may be."

(3) Clauses 18 to 22 inclusive are hereby rescinded, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following clauses 18 to 20:—

"Contributions by Individual Mine Workers.

18. (a) The Tribunal as soon as possible after receiving from the actuary an estimate of the total amount of the contributions necessary to be paid to the Tribunal in any year or part of a year to which his report relates shall determine the weekly or fortnightly rate, or rates, of contributions, as the case may be, which shall be required to be paid by each individual mine worker.

(b) The Registrar as soon as practicable after the determination by the Tribunal of the rate, or rates, of contributions payable by each individual mine worker shall, in writing, notify each respective owner of the rate or rates thereof and the period during which such contributions shall be payable by individual mine workers.

(c) The amount of the weekly or fortnightly contributions from time to time payable by each individual mine worker, so determined and notified by the Registrar, shall be deducted by each owner on each pay day from the amount payable by such owner to any mine worker employed by him.

(d) Within three days (or such further time as the Tribunal may approve) after the deduction by any owner of the amount of any weekly or fortnightly contribution payable by a mine worker such owner shall complete and forward to the Registrar a return of mine workers' contributions in such a form as the Tribunal shall direct and shall with such return forward to the Registrar all mine workers' contributions deducted by him for the period covered by the return.

Certain Contributions Due and Unpaid by Mine Worker.

19. Where through no fault of a mine worker his contributions fall into arrear, the Tribunal on his application may permit the amount of such arrears to be paid in instalments or in such other manner as it may determine: Provided that no mine worker shall be required to pay in any one week or fortnight an amount in excess of double the normal rate of his contributions.

Contributions by Individual Owners.

20. (a) Within three days (or such further time as the Tribunal may approve) after the close of each week or fortnight falling within the period during which in accordance with the notification received by him from the Registrar under these Regulations he is required to deduct from each mine worker employed by him the amount of such worker's contribution; every owner shall forward to the Registrar an amount equal to three times the total of the contributions paid for each such week or fortnight by the mine workers employed by him in such week or fortnight, as the case may be.

(b) The first of such weeks or fortnights shall end on the sixth or thirteenth day of September, 1947, as the case may be.

(c) The Tribunal may in any particular case if it sees fit permit an owner to pay his contributions by four-weekly instalments and in the event of any such permission being given to any owner paragraph (a) of this regulation in its application to such owner shall be read and construed as though for the words 'week or fortnight' wherever occurring therein there were substituted the expression 'four weeks'."

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions of the Police Regulation Acts, doth hereby amend as follows the "Police Regulations" made by the Governor in Council on the fifth day of August, 1947, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the seventh day of August, 1947 (that is to say):—
