Prices Regulation Act 1948.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 33.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Prices Regulation Act 1948*, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

CITATION.

1. This Order is cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 33.
2. Prices Regulation Order No. 10 is amended by inserting in Clause 2 thereof the following definition:—

“Landed Cost” means, in relation to the sale of any imported Kitchenware — English Enamelware — Aluminiumware — Tinned Steel and Cast Holloware by any person, the aggregate of the purchase price paid or payable by that person to any overseas supplier for those goods after deduction of any trade discount but before deduction of any cash discount, overseas office or forwarding agent's charges actually incurred but not exceeding 2½ per centum on the gross invoice value, insurance, freight, exchange calculated at telegraphic transfer rate, duty, wharfage and stacking charges, customs entry and customs agent's charges (except insofar as any item of transport from wharf or bond store is concerned) but not including any sales tax paid.

BOOT AND SHOE REPAIRS—VICTORIA.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Prices Regulation Act 1948*, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 34.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 3380 issued under the National Security (Prices) Regulations is hereby revoked.

Maximum Rates.

3. I fix and declare the maximum rates at which the services specified in the Schedule to this Order may be supplied in Victoria to be the rates specified therein.

Exhibition of Price List.

4. Every person who supplies or offers to supply any of the services specified in the Schedule to this Order, the maximum rate for which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, particulars of the maximum rates fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the supply by him of those services.

Fixation of Maximum Rates by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum rate at which any service the maximum rate for the supply of which is fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order and which is specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be supplied in Victoria by any person to whom such notice is given to be such rate as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 35.

FURNITURE—RETAIL.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Prices Regulation Act 1948*, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner for the State of Victoria hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 35.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 3024 made under the Commonwealth National Security (Prices) Regulations is hereby revoked.

Definition.

3. In this Order unless the contrary intention appears "furniture" includes domestic or office furniture, standard lamps, table lamp stands, ice chests, ice refrigerators, smokers' stands and sets, fire screens, fire kerbs and sets manufactured of metal, wood or other materials or any combination of metal, wood and other materials; interior blinds, curtains, drapes, loose covers, cushions, and other made-up or manufactured soft furnishings.

Maximum Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which furniture may be sold by retail to be the sum of the following:—

- (a) The purchase price paid or payable to the manufacturer of such furniture plus Commonwealth sales tax paid in relation thereto;
- (b) an amount equal to 42½ per centum of (a);
- (c) the cost (if any) actually incurred by the supplier of such furniture to the seller by retail for packing and charged by him to that seller;

(d) where the retail seller has incurred any cost—

- (i) in transporting such furniture from any place within a radius of 15 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne, to the premises of that retail seller outside that radius; or
- (ii) in transporting such furniture from any place within a radius of 5 miles from the principal post office of any place in Victoria other than a place within the area defined in sub-paragraph (i) above, to the premises of the retail seller outside that radius; or
- (iii) for insurance charges during transit as aforesaid—
an amount equal to the cost of transport and insurance so incurred;

Provided that where Commonwealth sales tax is payable in relation to any furniture at a rate greater than 10 per centum such sales tax shall, for the purposes of computing the amount referred to in sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph, be deemed to be payable at the rate of 10 per centum.

5. No amount shall be included for cost of transport or insurance in the computation of any maximum price in pursuance of the provisions of paragraph 4 of this Order unless such amount is recorded by the retail seller in his books of account.

Exhibition of Maximum Prices.

6. (a) Every person who sells furniture by retail shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, a notice or notices, clearly and distinctly setting forth the retail selling price of all such furniture which is from time to time displayed or offered for sale at any such place or places of business.

(b) I hereby approve of the following form for the notice or notices referred to in the last preceding sub-paragraph, that is to say:—

A separate price card or cards specifying the price of each article or suite of furniture so as to clearly and properly associate such price with each article or suite of furniture.

Notice in Writing.

7. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any article or suite of furniture may be sold by retail by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to such person.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE BOTTLE COVERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the trade of making bottle covers of straw" has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That, as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in February, 1949, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

* The Board has determined, in accordance with section 25 (1) of the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, that the trade is so unskilled that no apprentice shall work in the trade.

BUILDING OF STACKS.

3. An employee shall receive, in addition to the wage prescribed above, 1s. per day for each day on which he is engaged in supervising the building and/or thatching of stacks.

OVERTIME.

5. For work done outside the hours specified in clause 4 { Time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.
For work done within the hours specified in clause 4 but in excess of 40 hours in any week ..

SPECIAL RATES.

6. (a) Weekly Employees:—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Melbourne Cup Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Kyneton Cup Day (only within the Shire of Kyneton), and Ballarat Cup Day, (only within the Shires of Ballarat, Creswick, Bungaree, and Lexton), but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-mentioned holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(b) Piece-workers:—Ordinary piece-work prices with the addition of one day's pay at ordinary weekly employees' rates shall be the rate for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Melbourne Cup Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Kyneton Cup Day (only within the Shire of Kyneton), and Ballarat Cup Day (only within the Shires of Ballarat, Creswick, Bungaree, and Lexton), but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-mentioned holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

PAYMENT FOR HOLIDAYS.

7. (a) Weekly Employees.—All weekly employees shall be entitled to the following holidays without any deduction in pay:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Melbourne Cup Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Fuel and Fodder Picnic Day (only those employed within the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Act and Orders in Council thereunder, and within the Shire of Kellor), Kyneton Cup Day (only within the Shire of Kyneton), and Ballarat Cup Day (only within the Shires of Ballarat, Creswick, Bungaree, and Lexton).

(b) Piece-workers.—All piece-workers shall be entitled to the same holidays as are granted to weekly employees, and they shall be paid for such holidays the amount for each holiday based on weekly wages as set out in this Determination.

(c) Any employee absent from his or her employment without reasonable cause on the day before or the day after a public holiday shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday.

REST PERIOD.

8. Every employee employed on time wages shall be allowed, each morning and afternoon, an interval of ten minutes for rest, such interval to count as time worked.

ORDINARY WEEK'S WORK.

9. The number of hours to constitute an ordinary week's work shall be forty.

TERMS OF ENGAGEMENT.

10. (a) Employees are to be engaged as weekly employees. A weekly employee is one engaged by the week and paid by the week, and whose engagement shall be terminable by one week's notice on either side, such notice not to be continued from week to week.

(b) After one full week's work, such notice shall be given by either employer or weekly employee, or in lieu of such notice, one week's wages shall be paid or forfeited as the case may be.

(c) A weekly employee to be entitled to the weekly wage shall be available, ready, and willing, to perform his or her usual work during the days and hours usually worked by such class of employee, and may be summarily dismissed for dishonesty, misconduct, neglect of duty, or for absence from work without reasonable cause, and in the event of such dismissal the employee shall be paid only for the time actually worked.

(d) Provided that an employer may deduct payment for any day upon which the employee cannot be usefully employed by reason of any strike, breakdown of machinery, or other cause for which the employer cannot reasonably be held responsible.

SICK LEAVE.

11. (a) No deduction shall be made from the wages of any employee who has had not less than three months' continuous service with the same employer and who is unavoidably absent through illness for not more than forty hours of working time, in any year of service, provided he or she has submitted within 24 hours of the commencement of such absence evidence satisfactory to the employer that the same is not the result of his or her own misconduct. Provided, further, that piece-workers shall be paid at the same rate as weekly employees for any such day or days that they are unavoidably absent on account of illness.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-clause (a) hereof if the full period of sick leave as prescribed in sub-clause (a) hereof is not taken in any year, such portion as is not taken shall be cumulative from year to year up to a period not exceeding 120 hours of working time which shall be the maximum amount of leave to which an employee may be entitled in any year without deduction of pay.

ANNUAL HOLIDAY.

12. The annual holiday shall be as prescribed by the provisions of the *Factories and Shops (Annual Holidays) Act 1946*, No. 5111, and any amendments which may be made thereto from time to time.

(In his or her own interests each employer of labour should obtain a copy of the above Act which may be purchased from the Government Printer, Melbourne, at a cost of 9d., plus postage.)

BOILING WATER.

13. Employers shall provide boiling water for the use of employees.

FIRST-AID OUTFIT.

14. Employers shall provide and continuously maintain at a place reasonably accessible to all employees an efficient first-aid outfit.

ACCOMMODATION FOR BICYCLES.

15. The employer shall provide in some suitable place, accommodation for employees to leave their bicycles.

PIECE-WORK.

16. (a) The lowest piece-work price to be paid for the making of bottle covers of straw shall be at the rate of 7s. per thousand covers, provided that to the weekly earnings of each piece-worker shall be added the sum of thirty-three shillings. Where less than forty hours is worked in any week by any piece-worker, a proportionate amount of such sum of thirty-three shillings shall be added in lieu thereof.

(b) Provided further that the weekly earnings of piece-workers shall be increased by 10 per cent.

PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.

17. The wages rates set out in clause 2 are based upon the following basic wage rates and, pursuant to the provisions of Section 21 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, the Board hereby determines that such rates shall be automatically adjusted as prescribed by clause 18. Provided that the wages of female adults of under six weeks' experience shall be 80 per cent. and thereafter 90 per cent. of the adult male rate and the wages of improvers shall be adjusted proportionately to adjustments of the basic wage, such rates to be calculated to the nearest 3d., half or less than half of 3d. to be disregarded.

The piece-work prices shall at the same time be increased or decreased in the same proportion as weekly rates for the same class of work.

ADJUSTMENT OF BASIC WAGE.

18. (a) For the purposes of this Determination, the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's 'all items' retail price index numbers" or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such index numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting, to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician.

(b) Until the beginning of the first pay period to commence in May, 1949, the amounts of the Basic Wage shall be as prescribed in clause 17.

(c) During each future successive period beginning with the first pay period to commence in a May, an August, a November, or a February, the amount of the needs basic wage shall be adjusted by the following method, namely, by multiplying the last published Commonwealth Statistician's "all items" retail price index number by the factor .087 taken to one place of decimals, the resultant whole number being the amount of the basic wage expressed in shillings, but should the decimal number reach .5 or more the basic wage shall be taken to the next higher shilling.
