Country Fire Authority Acts.

VARIATION OF SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF
SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF
VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section two of section four of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council, after consultation by the Chief Secretary of Victoria with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim any period as the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria, or any specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may proclaim different summer periods in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas by the said sub-section, it is further enacted that any Proclamation so published shall remain in force until revoked, amended, or varied by a subsequent Proclamation so published:

And whereas by Proclamations issued on the thirtieth day of November, 1948; the third day of December, 1948; the thirteenth day of December, 1948; and the twenty-first day of December, 1948, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the first day, the eighth day, the fifteenth day, and the twenty-second day of December, 1948, respectively, different summer periods expiring on the thirty-first day of March, 1949, were proclaimed in respect of different parts of the country area of Victoria, including the parts of the said country area specified in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas it is deemed expedient that the aforesaid Proclamations should be varied in the manner hereinafter described:

And whereas the Chief Secretary and the Minister of Forests have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Acts, do by this my Proclamation vary the aforesaid Proclamations by proclaiming that the summer period in respect of the parts of the country area of Victoria, which are specified in the Schedule hereto, shall end on the sixteenth day of March, 1949.

SCHEDULE.

The First Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the City of Ballarat, the Borough of Sebastopol, and certain portions of the municipal districts of the Shires of Ballarat and Buninyong.

The Second Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the City of Bendigo, the Borough of Eaglehawk, and certain portions of the municipal districts of the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye.

The Third Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Cities of Geelong and Geelong West, the Town of Newtown and Chilwell, and certain portions of the municipal districts of the Shires of Corio and South Barwon.

The Sixth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Town of Colac and the Shires of Colac, Hampden, Heytesbury, and Otway.

The Seventh Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Borough of Queenscliffe, the Shires of Bannockburn, Barrabool, Bellarine, Leigh, and Winchelsea, and those portions of the municipal districts of the Shires of Corio and South Barwon not within the Third Fire Control Region.

The Eighth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Borough of Wonthaggi, the Shires of Bass, Berwick, Cranbourne, Flinders, Frankston and Hastings, Mornington, and Phillip Island, also French Island.

The Ninth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Shires of Buln Buln, Korumburra, Mirboo, Narracan, Warragul, and Woorayl.

The Tenth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Town of Sale and the Shires of Alberton, Avon, Maffra, Morwell, Rosedale, South Gippsland, and Traralgon.

The Eleventh Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Shires of Bairnsdale, Omeo, Orbost, and Tambo.

The Fifteenth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Boroughs of Clunes, Daylesford, and Maryborough, and of the Shires of Ballan, Bungaree, Creswick, Glenlyon, Grenville, Kyneton, Newstead and Mount Alexander, Talbot, and Tullaroop, and those portions of the municipal districts of the Shires of Ballarat and Buninyong not within the First Fire Control Region.

The Sixteenth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Town of Ararat, the Borough of Stawell, and the Shires of Ararat, Avoca, Lexton, Ripon, and Stawell.

Those portions of the Seventeenth Fire Control Region, comprised by the municipal districts of the Town of Horsham and the Shires of Dunmunkle and Wimmera.

The Nineteenth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Boroughs of Inglewood and St. Arnaud, and the Shires of Bet Bet, Charlton, Donald, Kara Kara, and Korong.

The Twenty-first Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Borough of Castlemaine and the Shires of East Loddon, Gordon, Huntly, Maldon, Metcalfe, and Rochester, and those portions of the municipal districts of the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye not within the Second Fire Control Region.

The Twenty-second Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Boroughs of Echuca and Shepparton, and the Shires of Deakin, Euroa, Goulburn, McIvor, Numurkah, Pyalong, Rodney, Seymour, Shepparton, Tungamah, Violet Town, and Waranga.

And the Twenty-third Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Borough of Wangaratta and the Shires of Benalla, Oxley, Rutherglen, Wangaratta, and Yarrawonga.

PUBLIC HIGHWAYS—SHIRE OF FERN TREE GULLY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned which have been used as streets by the said Council within the said Shire be so declared to be public highways: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the lands used as streets hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Fern Tree Gully aforesaid, to be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAYS.—SHIRE OF FERN TREE GULLY.

All that piece of land in the Parish of Scoresby, being the land shown as Elsie-street, and coloured brown on plan of subdivision numbered 11914, lodged in the Office of Titles, the boundaries of which are as follows:—Commencing at the north-east angle of Crown allotment 68 of the said parish; thence by lines bearing respectively 272 deg. 47 min. 1,432 ft. 2½ in., 245 deg. 42 min. 483 ft. 4½ in., 182 deg. 41 min. 56 ft. 1½ in., 65 deg. 42 min. 496 ft. 9½ in., 92 deg. 47 min. 1,384 ft. 11 in., 151 deg. 9 min. 10 ft. 6 in., and 29 deg. 32 min. 66 feet to the point of commencement.

THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST
COMMISSIONERS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928*,
the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the
following Regulations:—

1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the
21st October, 1942, approved by the Governor in Council
on 2nd November, 1942, and published in the *Government
Gazette* on the 27th November, 1942, and any amendment
thereto, are hereinafter referred to as "the Principal
Regulations."

2. Regulation No. 243 is repealed, and in lieu thereof
the following Regulation is substituted:—

"243. The Commissioners shall be under no responsi-
bility for a crane when in use by any hirer thereof,
and the persons using the crane, when hired on
behalf of the hirer, are to be deemed servants of the
latter, and not of the Commissioners. The hirer
shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Commis-
sioners from and against all actions, claims, and
demands arising out of the operation or use of a
crane during the period of hiring, except claims made
by an employee of the Commissioners for workers'
compensation under the Workers' Compensation Acts
of the State of Victoria, or any amendment thereof
for the time being in force, where the injury was not
due to the negligence of the hirer."

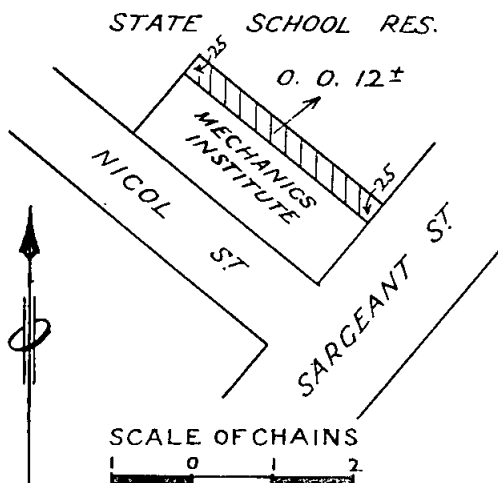

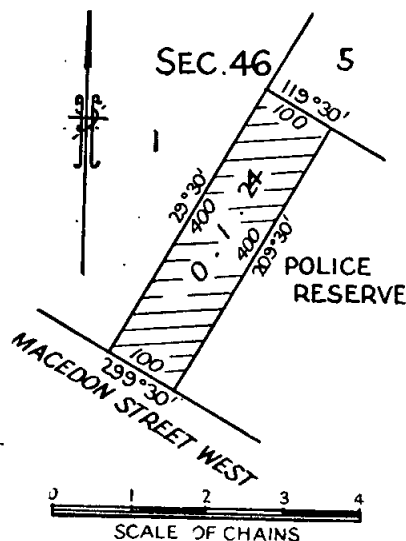

APPRENTICESHIP.

5. (a) Youths shall not be engaged in the following occupations except under indentures of apprenticeship for the periods and subject to the conditions hereinafter prescribed :—

Patternmaking, electrical fitting, engineering fitting and turning, first and second class engineering machining, first-class welding, engineering blacksmithing, jobbing moulding and/or coremaking, sheet metal (first-class bench work) motor mechanic.

(b) In the trades immediately hereinafter mentioned the proportion of apprentices which may be taken by any employer shall be as follows :—

Mechanical engineering—one apprentice for every 3, or fraction of 3, tradesmen.

Electrical fitting—one apprentice for every 3, or fraction of 3, tradesmen.

Electrical mechanic—one apprentice for every 2, or fraction of 2, tradesmen.

Patternmaking—one apprentice for every 3, or fraction of 3, tradesmen.

Smithing—one apprentice for every 3, or fraction of 3, tradesmen.

Moulding—one apprentice for every 2, or fraction of 2, tradesmen.

(c) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices, the number of tradesmen shall be deemed to be the average number working during the immediately preceding six months, and in ascertaining such proportion, an employer actually working in any workshop shall be deemed to be a tradesman.

(i) The period of apprenticeship shall be as follows :—

If the apprentice when articulated is under the age of 17 years, five years; if over the age of 17 years, four or five years, at the option of the contracting parties.

(ii) An employer especially qualified to teach apprentices may, with the consent of the Secretary for Labour, or of the State Apprenticeship Commission, employ a greater proportion of apprentices to tradesmen than hereinbefore specified.

(iii) Minors may be taken on probation for three months, and, if apprenticed, such three months shall count as part of their period of apprenticeship.

(iv) Until further order, any contract of apprenticeship hereafter made may contain the following provision :—

If through lack of orders or through financial difficulties, the employer is unable at any time to find employment and training for an apprentice, and if a transfer to another employer cannot be arranged, the obligations and duties imposed by the indenture may with the concurrence of the apprentice and his guardian be suspended for a period agreed upon, or if no such agreement is arrived at, may be cancelled by the employer. The onus of proof of circumstances justifying such cancellation shall be on the employer.

This clause shall not apply to apprenticeship controlled by the State Apprenticeship Commission, but such Commission shall be free to adopt such schemes for suspension or cancellation of indentures as it may deem reasonable.

Wages per Week of 40 Hours.

(v) The minimum weekly rates of wage for apprentices shall be the undermentioned percentages of the contemporaneous needs basic wage prescribed for the area in which they are employed, and in addition thereto the constant and war loading specified, and in all contracts of apprenticeship hereafter made the employer shall covenant to pay wages at not less than such rates.

The sum of 4s. per week shall be added to the above rates in the case of apprentice patternmakers.

The total wages of apprentices shall be calculated to the nearest sixpence, any broken part of sixpence in the result not exceeding threepence to be disregarded.

An employee who is under 21 years of age on the expiration of his apprenticeship and thereafter works as a minor in the occupation to which he has been apprenticed shall be paid at not less than the adult rate prescribed for that classification.

(vi) The ordinary hours of employment of apprentices shall be the same in each workshop as those of journeymen in the trade the apprentice is learning.

(vii) No apprentice under the age of 18 years shall be liable to work overtime unless he so desires.

(viii) No apprentice shall work under any system of payment by results.

(ix) Any apprentice who cannot complete his full term of apprenticeship before reaching his 22nd birthday may, by agreement with his master, serve as an apprentice until he reaches the age of 23 years.

(x) The apprentice at the end of the calendar period of any year in which he has actually given service to the master upon less than the ordinary working days prescribed in the Determination for the trade, or in which he has unlawfully absented himself without the master's consent shall, for every day short of the said number of working days, and for every day of such absence, serve one day, and the calendar period of the succeeding year of his service shall not be deemed to begin until the said additional day or days shall have been served.

(xi) No employer shall, either directly or indirectly, or by any pretence or device, receive from any person or require or permit any person to pay or give any consideration in the nature of a premium or bonus for the taking or binding of any probationer or apprentice.

(xii) Apprentices attending technical colleges or schools and presenting reports of satisfactory conduct shall be reimbursed all fees paid by them.

(xiii) Apprentices shall be entitled to annual leave and sick leave in accordance with the provisions of clauses 10A and 14A of this Determination respectively.

UNAPPRENTICED MALE JUNIORS AND FEMALES.

6. (a) Subject to the exceptions hereinafter provided the minimum rates of wage for females and unapprenticed male juniors shall be the undermentioned percentages of the contemporaneous needs basic wage prescribed for the area in which they are employed and in addition thereto the constant loadings specified.
